RULES FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF A SPECIAL VOTE OF PARLIAMENT FOR EXHIBITIONS OPEN TO PUPILS OF COMMON SCHOOLS IN VICTORIA.

During each year the Board of Education will award exhibitions to eight scholars of Common Schools in Victoria, in the manner and on the conditions hereinafter mentioned:—

1. The exhibitor shall be selected upon competitive examinations open to all candidates under fifteen years of age, who shall have been during the year immediately preceding the examination continuously on the rolls of, and in attendance in, any of the Common Schools in Victoria.

2. The subjects for examination shall be those in Appendix B (Board's Regulations) set down for examination of the upper sixth class, together with (1) Euclid, (2) Algebra, and (3) Latin or French.

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3. Each exhibition shall be of the annual value of £35, tenable for six years upon the following conditions:—

- (A.) That the exhibitor shall, at the commencement of the session following the award of the exhibition, become a student in one of the following public grammar schools, or such others as may hereafter be similarly subsidized by the State, viz.:—Church of England Grammar School, St. Patrick's College, Scotch College, and Wesley College, all of Melbourne, and the Church of England Grammar School of Geelong.
- (B.) The board shall, after having learned the wish of the exhibitor's parents or guardians, determine as to which of the above schools he shall attend, and during the time he continues to attend such school, he shall obtain at the end of each year a favorable report from the authorities of the same. If an unfavorable report be received, or if at any time the board shall be satisfied that the conduct of any exhibitor has been disorderly or immoral, they may terminate his tenure of the exhibition and of all the advantages connected therewith.
- (C.) That at the end of the second year of his tenure he shall pass the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne.
- (D.) That during the fourth, fifth, and sixth years of his tenure he shall be a student of the Melbourne University enrolled as attending lectures, and that he shall in each year have kept as many courses of lectures as would have entitled him to admission to examination under 3rd clause, chapter XI. of the Regulations of the University.
- (E.) That at the end of the fourth year of his tenure he shall pass the 1st B.A. degree examination at the University.
- (F.) It will not be compulsory upon exhibitors to become boarders in the Grammar Schools, but, if they should elect to become so, they will be received at the rate of £17 10s. per annum, to be paid by the exhibitor in addition to the £35 per annum payable by the Board. Should they attend as day scholars only, residing with their friends, the Board will pay £10 per annum to the authorities of the school, and the balance of the annual value of the exhibition, namely £25, to parents or guardians of the exhibitor.
- (G.) In each case payments will be made quarterly. All payments, however, by the Board shall be conditional on moneys being placed at their disposal by the Legislature.

4. These rules shall take effect from the 1st January 1872.

A PROCLAIMED ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for ten or more inhabitants of any part of Victoria not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district, and of whom each one shall possess property rateable under the said Act within the area next hereinafter mentioned, to sign and present to the Governor a petition setting forth that the area, which shall by metes and bounds be described in such petition, contains not less than forty square miles, and rateable property whereof the net annual value is not less than five thousand pounds, and praying that such area may be constituted a road district; and it is also enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon being satisfied that the statements set forth in the petition are true, and that it is desirable to comply with the prayer thereof, to constitute such part of Victoria, under such name as shall in and by the same Order in Council be assigned thereto, a new road district; and the words "proclaimed district" where used in the said Act shall be deemed to mean such new district: And whereas a petition signed by more than ten inhabitants of the area or part of Victoria hereinafter described, possessing rateable property in such area, has been presented to the Governor, setting forth the matters and things required by the said Act, and due notice of such petition has been published as provided by the said Act, and in compliance with the prayer thereof an Order in Council, bearing even date herewith, has been made to constitute the said area a new road district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby constitute and proclaim the part of Victoria hereinafter described to be a new road district, under the name assigned thereto in and by the Order in Council hereinbefore mentioned, that is to say:—

THE PHILLIP ISLAND ROAD DISTRICT.

Commencing at low-water mark on Phillip Island at a point north of the north-east angle of portion 158, near Newhaven; thence northerly, westerly, southerly, and easterly by low-water mark of the said island to the point of commencement; thence by a direct line north to low-water mark on Churchill Island; thence northerly, westerly, southerly, and easterly to the commencing point on the last-named island.

DISTRICTS WHERE CERTIFICATES MAY BE GRANTED FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES CHARGEABLE WITH FEE OF £10.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 Amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, upon the application in writing of the respective councils and road board mentioned in the first column of the annexed Schedule, do hereby proclaim the shires, boroughs, and road district, or parts thereof specified in the second column of such Schedule, with the exemptions specially therein named, to be districts within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for

which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained the Governor may by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of this Part of this Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut trees of less diameter than ten inches at a height of two feet above the surface of the ground on Crown lands in the parishes in the county of Talbot herein named, that is to say:—

THE PARISH OF CARISBROOK,
THE PARISH OF BET-BET,
THE PARISH OF WAREEK,
THE PARISH OF CRAIGIE,
THE PARISH OF AMHERST,

BEALIBA COMMON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Act; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas the notices prescribed by the said Act have been given: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

THE BEALIBA COMMON.—The Cochrane's Goldfield Common, proclaimed on the 6th July 1863, and increased by a proclamation dated the 23rd February 1871, comprising in the whole about 4000 acres, shall be and is hereby proclaimed a common under the provisions of the 58th section of *The Land Act 1869*, and shall be designated the Bealiba Common.—(71 C. 11440.)

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined, shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

BARTON RUN.—Commencing at the point where the Lexington run crosses the summit of the Mount William Range; thence by that range and a line, being the eastern boundary of the Mount Burchet run, bearing southerly and south-westerly to the Wannan run; thence by that run bearing south-easterly to the Yarram-yarram run; thence by that run bearing south-easterly to the Mount William run; thence by that run bearing north-easterly and easterly to the Mount William Plains run; thence by that run and by the Burrumbweep run, bearing north-easterly to the Lexington run aforesaid; and thence by that run westerly to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.
