EXHIBITIONS OPEN TO PUPILS OF COMMON SCHOOLS.

THE General Regulations framed by the Board of Education which are hereto subjoined have been laid before the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of § 8 of the Act 25 Vict. No. 149, and have been approved.

Rules for the Distribution of a Special Vote of Parliament for Exhibitions open to Pupils of Common Schools in Victoria.

During each year the Board of Education will award exhibi-tions to eight scholars of Common Schools in Victoria, in the manner and on the conditions hereinafter mentioned:—

- 1. The exhibitioner shall be selected upon competitive examinations open to all candidates under fifteen years of age, who shall have been during the year immediately preceding the examination continuously on the rolls of, and in attendance in, any of the Common Schools in Victoria.
- 2. The subjects for examination shall be those in Appendix B (Board's Regulations) set down for examination of the upper sixth class, together with (1) Euclid, (2) Algebra, and (3) Latin

- 3. Each exhibition shall be of the annual value of £35, tenable for six years upon the following conditions:--

 (A.) That the exhibitioner shall, at the commencement of the session following the award of the exhibition, become a student in one of the following public grammar schools, or such others as may hereafter be similarly subsidized by the State, viz. —Church of England Grammar School of Geolog.
 St. Patrick's College, Scotch College, and Wesley College, all of Melbourne, and the Church of England Grammar School of Geolog.
 (B.) The board shall, after baving learned the wish of the exhibitioners' parents or guardians, determine as to which of the above schools he shall attend, and during the time he continues to attend such school, he shall obtain at the end of each year a favorable report from the authorities of the same. If an unfavorable report be received, or if at any time the board shall be satisfied that the conduct of any exhibitioner has been disorderly or immoral, they may terminate his tenure of the exhibition and of all the advantages connected therewith.
 (C.) That at the end of the second year of his tenure he shall pass the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne.
 (D.) That during the fourth, fifth, and sixth years of his tenure he shall be a student of the Melbourne University enrolled as attending lectures, and that he shall in each year have kept as many courses of lectures as would have entitled him to admission to examination under 3rd clause, chapter XI. of the Regulations of the University.
 (E.) That at the end of the fourth year of his tenure he

(E.) That at the end of the fourth year of his tenure he shall pass the 1st B.A. degree examination at the University.

(F.) It will not be compulsory upon exhibitioners to become boarders in the Grammar Schools, but, if they should elect to become so, they will be received at the rate of £17 10s. per annum, to be paid by the exhibitioner in addition to the £35 per annum payable by the Board. Should they attend as day scholars only, residing with their friends, the Board will pay £10 per annum to the authorities of the school, and the belance of the annual value of the exhibition, namely £25, to parents or guardians of the exhibitioner.

(G.) In each case payments will be made quarterly. All payments, however, by the Board shall be conditional on moneys being placed at their disposal by the Legislature.

4. These rules shall take effect from the 1st January 1872.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 Amendment Act it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which licenses shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, upon the application in writing of the respective councils and road board mentioned in the first column of the annexed Schedule, do hereby proclaim the sires, boroughs, and road district, or parts thereof specified in the second column of such Schedule, with the exemptions specially therein named, to be districts within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for

THE BRALHBA COMMON.—The Cochrane's Goldfield Common necessaries.
