PART II. OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDING STATUTE 1867" EXTENDED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310), it is amongst other things enacted, that this Part (that is to say, Part II.) of this Act shall apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, has been in force, and all or some of the provisions of this Part shall also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council may at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the above recited Act 31 Vict. No. 310, shall apply to the road district hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE PHILLIP ISLAND ROAD DISTRICT.

REGULATIONS AS TO APPLICATIONS FOR LICENSES UNDER PART II., § 49, OF "THE LAND ACT 1869."

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the second day of October 1871.

WHEREAS by the 110th section of *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor shall have power from time to time to make, alter, or rescind rules, regulations, and orders to provide for the mode by which any land or allotment shall be surveyed and boundaries adjusted; for prescribing the form of, and the conditions and mode of applying for licenses and leases to be issued under the before-mentioned Act, and the conditions upon which the same shall be issued; for imposing any reasonable charge for surveys or fee for any Crown grant or other document issued under the authority of the said Act; for providing for all proceedings, forms of grants, leases, licenses, and other instruments; and for the execution of all other matters and things arising under and consistent with the said Act and not therein expressly provided for, and for the more fully carrying out the objects and purposes and guarding against evasions and violations of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order make the rules, regulations, and orders following:—

1. Lists of applications under part II. and section 49 of *The Land Act 1869* appointed to be heard by a Local Land Board, shall be inserted by district surveyors prior to such hearing in a newspaper published in the town wherein such applications will be heard, or in a newspaper published in a town nearest to the land applied for, or generally circulated in the district wherein such land is comprised.

2. The cost of such insertion shall be defrayed by the applicants, through the district surveyor, prior to the hearing of their applications.

3. District surveyors may distribute amongst contract surveyors surveys to be made under part II. and section 49 of the said Act, in their respective districts, instead of handing to one contract surveyor the whole of the applications for surveys of land within any such surveyor's district.

4. The Board of Land and Works shall have power from time to time and at any time to reduce the fees payable by any licensee under the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, when the application, under the 31st section of *The Land Act 1869*, of such licensee to purchase the land so held by him cannot be granted on the ground of such land being auriferous or other reasons of a public nature.

And the Honorable James Macpherson Grant, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission shall have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any general roll or supplementary roll or ordinary electoral roll or roll of rate-paying electors, the Governor in Council may take all such measures as may be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or may declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission; and every such Order in Council shall state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and shall be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the preparation of the Rolls of Rate-paying Electors for the several divisions of the Electoral Provinces and Districts named in the third column of the schedule hereto annexed has been unavoidably impeded by reason of the non-receipt by the Electoral Registrars for such divisions of the Lists of Ratepayers within the time fixed by the Acts Nos. 279 and 334 from the several officers named in the first column of the same schedule, but such lists have since been received by the Registrars aforesaid, and the names appearing thereon are included in the rolls for the respective divisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council; under and by virtue of the power in him vested by the 68th section of the Act No. 279, doth hereby declare valid the Rolls of Rate-paying Electors for the divisions of the Provinces and Districts hereunder mentioned, containing the lists of names so omitted to be sent as aforesaid, viz:—

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE DISCIPLINE ACT  
1870."

THE Governor in Council has, in pursuance of the provisions of *The Discipline Act 1870* (34 Victoria No. 389, § 8) made the Regulations hereto subjoined, and all previous regulations under the said Act are cancelled.

MILITARY AND NAVAL FORCES IN THE SERVICE OF HER  
MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT IN VICTORIA.

CONSTITUTION AND ESTABLISHMENT.

1. *Authority under which raised and formed.*—These forces are engaged under *The Discipline Act 1870*. They are subject to the provisions of the Act, and to all regulations made thereunder by the Governor in Council.

2. *Appointments and engagements.*—The Military and Naval Forces in the service of Her Majesty's Government in Victoria will, subject to such rules and regulations as may from time to time be made, altered, or amended by the Governor in Council, be under the general direction, control, and supervision of officers appointed by commission under the hand of the Governor and seal of the colony.

3. *Commissions.*—Commissions under the hand of the Governor and seal of the colony will be issued to all persons serving in the said forces above the rank of warrant, petty, or non-commissioned officers.

4. *Appointments and promotions.*—All promotions of officers are to be submitted for the approval of the Governor in Council by the commandant of the said forces if serving in the land force, and by the senior naval officer if serving in the naval force.

5. All warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers will, subject to such conditions and restrictions as may from time to time be imposed, be appointed, on behalf of the Governor, by the commandant of the said forces if serving in the land force, and by the senior naval officer if serving in the naval force.

6. *Submission and acceptance of resignations.*—All proposed resignations of officers are to be submitted for the acceptance of the Governor in Council.

7. *Notification of appointments, &c., in the "Gazette."*—All appointments, promotions, and resignations of commissioned officers are to be inserted in the *Gazette*, in the terms conveying the Governor's approval or acceptance of such appointment, promotion, or resignation.

8. *To take oath.*—Every person is required, before he is subject to the provisions of the Act, to take the oath prescribed by the Act.

9. *Transmission of oaths.*—All oaths administered and subscribed in accordance with the provisions of this Act shall be transmitted by the justice or officer, as the case may be, before whom the same were taken to the commandant if serving in the land force, and to the senior naval officer if serving in the naval force.

COMMAND, RANK, AND PRECEDENCE.

10. *Formation on parade.*—It is to be understood that, on parade, forces are to be distributed and drawn up in the mode which the officer commanding may judge most convenient and best adapted to the purposes of the service.

11. *Precedence.*—Relative precedence of forces is determined by the date on which the Governor in Council has accepted their services under the Act.

12. *Precedence in the colonies.*—Precedence among the different branches of the colonial forces is to be regulated in accordance with Her Majesty's regulations and the established principles of military subordination.

DRILL AND EXERCISE.

13. *Exercise and evolutions.*—The regulations for the exercise and evolutions of the various branches of H.M. service are to be carried out, and the most exact adherence to the system therein established is required of all officers.

14. *Uniformity of system.*—These regulations prescribe the adoption and the practice of an uniform system of exercise and drill, and it is of the highest importance that this principle of uniformity should be strictly observed and maintained.

ALARM SIGNAL.

15. The general alarm signal on which the forces are to assemble will be as provided by orders to be issued as required by the commandant of the forces.

DISCIPLINE.

16. *Prevention of crime.*—A commanding officer cannot pay too much attention to the prevention of misconduct, but he must bear in mind that the positive absence of misconduct, and not its screened existence, is the criterion of a well-established discipline. In all first offences, not of an aggravated character, mild reproof and admonition are to be tried; and punishment is not to be resorted to until a repetition of the offence shall have shown that the milder treatment has not been productive of the desired effect.

17. *Treatment of subordinates.*—As it is desirable to keep up in all ranks a proper feeling and high sense of honor, by which the correct and willing discharge of duty will be best ensured, officers, warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers of every rank, should be impressed with the advantage which they individually, their own force, and the service at large, will derive from the adoption towards their subordinates of a system of command and treatment which shall be free from coarse and irritating language. If reproof be necessary, it is to be conveyed in such a manner and in such terms, as will make an impression, without hurting the feelings of the individual. If acts of intentional neglect and of insubordination should take place, the means of correction and punishment authorized by the regulations of the service are to be resorted to, and they will have double effect if not preceded by coarse and abusive language; indeed, it will probably be found that such acts will become comparatively rare, as the duty will be done more cheerfully and zealously.

18. *Reproving warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers.*—Officers are to avoid reproving warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers for any irregularity, neglect of duty, or awkwardness, in the presence or hearing of their subordinates, lest they should weaken their authority and lessen their self-respect; unless it shall be necessary for the benefit of example that the reproof be public, or that it shall have been provoked by repeated neglect or irregularity.

19. *Punishment of warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers.*—Warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers are not to be subjected to minor punishments; and when it is necessary to confine them for any offence, they are to be placed under arrest and not made prisoners except in extreme cases, when it is necessary, in the interests of the public service, to ensure their safe custody.

20. *Resignations.*—Warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers are not to be allowed, by resigning their situation, to escape trial by court, except by the special sanction of the commandant if serving in land force, or of the senior naval officer if serving in the naval force. Occasional instances, however, may occur in which warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers, finding themselves unequal to perform the duties of their situation, may be allowed to resign their rank.

21. *Arrest.*—No person placed in arrest has a right to demand a court upon himself, or to persist in considering himself under the restraint of such arrest, or to refuse to return to the exercise of his duty, after he shall have been released by proper authority. It by no means follows that any such person conceiving himself to have been wrongfully put in arrest, or otherwise aggrieved, is without remedy: a complaint is afterwards open to him, if preferred in a proper manner. A person in close arrest is not allowed to leave his quarters or tent. If he be in arrest at large, he may be restricted to such limits as his commanding officer may direct.

22. *Proving men forbidden.*—Men suspected of being drunk are not to be put through their turnings or drill, for the purpose of ascertaining their condition.

23. *Restoring arms to prisoners.*—When a man, either before the investigation of an offence, or whilst undergoing punishment, has been deprived of his arms, they are not to be restored to him without an order from his superior officer.

24. *Defaulters.*—Defaulters are not to be required to bring up any portion of their punishment which they may have been prevented from undergoing by reason of their being in hospital or employed on duty.

25. *Recording characters.*—It is important that a uniformity of system should exist as to the mode of estimating and recording the characters of warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers and men. With this view the following terms only are to be used, viz.:—Very good, good, fair, indifferent, bad; and in order to make an estimate of character, officers are primarily to ground their opinions on the documentary records. A man's deportment, his cleanliness, and the manner in which he has performed his several duties, should at the same time be considered in his favor. On a man being sworn in, any certificates of character he may have produced will be stamped "sworn in," and will be retained by the officer commanding until he leaves the service, when they will be delivered up to him stamped with the name of his corps or vessel and the words "transferred," "resigned," or "dismissed," as the case may be.

26. *Dress and appearance.*—The dress and appearance as well as the demeanour of persons serving under this Act should, on all occasions and in all situations, be such as to create a respect for the service; men permanently engaged are not, without permission to go beyond the precincts of their barracks or vessels, unless properly dressed in uniform, and are not to smoke in the streets when in uniform.

27. *Wearing side arms.*—Warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers only are permitted to wear side arms off duty.

28. *Civility and courtesy to be used to all ranks of society.*—A commanding officer should impress upon the men under his command, by every means in his power, the propriety of civility and courtesy in their intercourse with all ranks and classes of society, and should particularly caution them to pay proper deference and respect to magistrates and all civil authorities. All persons in uniform not on duty under arms are to take off their caps in the presence of a magistrate in a civil court.

29. *Praise or censure of superiors forbidden.*—Deliberations or discussions among any class of men serving under this Act, having the object of conveying praise, censure, or any mark of approbation towards their superiors or any others in Her Majesty's service, are strictly prohibited, as being subversive of discipline and an assumption of power which belongs to those to whom command and discipline are entrusted.

30. *Anonymous complaints.*—Making anonymous complaints or publishing comments on military or naval subjects without permission through the medium of the press is strictly prohibited.

31. *Transfers.*—When any person is transferred to any civil Government department the sheets of the defaulters' book applying to him shall be forwarded to the head of such department.

32. *Persons charged with serious offences.*—A man charged with committing a serious offence should be put in confinement, and ought not to be permitted to perform any duty whatever (except carrying his own arms and accoutrements in marching) until his case is disposed of. If, however, by error, such an offender has been permitted to perform any duty, he shall not thereby be absolved from liability to punishment for his offence; but may, if the proper authority shall think fit, be summarily punished, or be brought to trial before a court, according to the circumstances of the case.

33. *Confinement before disposal.*—Accused persons are not to be kept in custody for a longer period than twenty-four hours without having their case inquired into, and either summarily disposed of or reported to superior authority.

34. *Taking man in custody.*—When a warrant, petty, or non-commissioned officer has occasion to confine a man for any offence, he should invariably obtain the assistance of one or more persons of a similar rank to the offender to conduct him to the guard-room, and should himself avoid in any way coming in contact with him—except under unavoidable circumstances.

35. *Drunkenness.*—Men in a state of drunkenness are, if possible, to be confined alone, until sober, and not in the guard room, where they are often provoked to acts of violence and insubordination; they are to be visited at least every two hours by a warrant, petty, or non-commissioned officer, and an escort, in order that their condition may be ascertained; and should any suspicion arise that they are suffering from disease a medical officer is forthwith to be sent for.

#### DISCHARGE OR DISMISSAL.

36. *Dismissal.*—Any person not holding a commission under this Act may, by the order of the commandant if serving in the land force, and of the senior naval officer if serving in the naval force, be discharged for unfitness, reduced in rank, or dismissed for negligence or misconduct, independently of any other punishment to which he may by law be subject.

37. *Discharge.*—On the discharge of any man from the forces his "defaulter's sheet" must be filed for reference, and on the application, written or personal, of any one who has been discharged, a printed certificate of character will be made out, in accordance with his sheet, signed by the commandant if serving in the land force, and by the senior naval officer if serving in the naval force, and furnished to him, and no other certificates of character or service are to be given. No certificates of character are given to those who have been dismissed.

38. All dismissals will be notified in the *Government Gazette*.

39. Any person allowed to leave at his own request must make good the cost of his kit and uniform, fair wear excepted, the amount of which his commanding officer shall assess.

#### PUNISHMENTS.

40. *Place of confinement.*—The commandant of the said forces and the senior naval officer may set apart places on shore or afloat for infliction of solitary confinement under the 27th clause of the Act.

41. *Awards by officers.*—Commanding officers are in all instances to report in writing to their superior officer any punishment awarded by them to men under their command.

42. *Right of option not permitted.*—It would be inconsistent with subordination for a commanding officer to admit of the right of option or appeal from any of the above awards, but he may, if he think proper, vindicate the justice of his first order by resorting to the alternative of a court.

43. *Imprisonment.*—Imprisonment in cells, or in corresponding places on board ship, is, as much as possible, to be reserved for cases of drunkenness, riot, or violence, and, in aggravated cases, should be followed by extra duty and drills.

#### OFFENCES.

44. All persons regularly serving under *The Discipline Act of 1870* will be subject to be brought before the court therein provided if charged with any of the following offences:—

- Mutiny and sedition.
- Violence to superior.
- Disobedience of orders.
- Disrespect to superior officers.
- Desertion.
- Absence without leave.
- Betraying the watchword.
- Giving false alarms.
- Sleeping on post, or quitting it without orders.
- Quitting the ranks without orders.
- Breaking arrest, escape from prison.
- Allowing escape of prisoner.
- Frequent drunkenness.
- Drunk on duty.
- Malingering, &c.
- Signing false returns.
- Any disgraceful conduct.

All acts, conduct, disorders, and neglects which officers, warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers and men may be guilty of to the prejudice of good order and military discipline, though not specified in the foregoing cases, shall be taken cognizance of according to the nature and degree of the offence, and the offender shall suffer such punishment as the court may award.

#### COURTS.

45. *Authority for constitution, &c., of courts.*—The Act lays down rules for the constitution of courts, and defines the powers with which they are invested.

46. *Investigation of charges.*—All serious charges preferred against all persons serving under this Act, and the circumstances on which they are founded, are to be carefully inquired into, in order to ascertain that the case is a proper one for investigation by a court, and that there is sufficient evidence to substantiate the charges. It should be borne in mind that to prefer accusations which cannot be maintained is a practice highly inconvenient and injurious to the service.

47. *Courts on officers.*—Whenever it can be arranged without serious inconvenience to the service, the military or naval members of a court assembled for the trial of an officer are to be of equal, if not superior, rank to the prisoner.

48. *Separate trial for each prisoner.*—Any number of prisoners may be tried together for an offence committed collectively, but when more prisoners than one are tried by the same court, and they are arraigned upon separate and distinct charges, the court is to be re-sworn at the commencement of each trial, and the proceedings of each trial are to be conducted and recorded separately.

49. *Adjournments.*—It is important that every trial by court once begun should, as far as possible, proceed with strict regularity and without interruption to its conclusion. The court have the power of granting an adjournment, but they

should in no case permit an adjournment for the purpose of obtaining further evidence, either on behalf of the prosecution or of the prisoner, unless they are satisfied that such adjournment and production of further evidence will not render the trial unjust, and ought reasonably to be allowed, in order to assist the course of justice. Great care is therefore to be taken, both by the prosecuting officer and the prisoner, to have ready at the trial all the witnesses and documents which they may desire to produce in support of their respective cases.

50. *Copy of charge to be given to prisoner.*—The accused is to be furnished, within a reasonable time before the trial, with a copy of the charge to be preferred against him.

51. *Instructions in framing charges.*—In framing charges, care is to be taken to render them specific in names, dates, and places, but all non-essential minutiae are to be avoided.

52. *Charges of "disgraceful conduct."*—A charge of "disgraceful conduct" is never to be preferred unless the offence is clearly of a felonious or fraudulent nature, or of a cruel, indecent, or unnatural kind.

53. *Charges of drunkenness.*—No person under the rank of a non-commissioned officer is to be brought to trial by court-martial on a first charge of drunkenness only. If, however, he is to be tried for another offence, a charge of drunkenness may be added as a separate charge. In cases of frequent drunkenness the evidence given from the defaulters' book is to specify the date, place, and circumstance of each previous instance of drunkenness. The entries in the defaulters' book are to be conclusive evidence of the previous instances of drunkenness therein stated.

54. *Plea of prisoner.*—In every case in which a prisoner pleads guilty, the court is, notwithstanding, to receive, and to report in the proceedings, such evidence as may afford a full knowledge of the circumstances, as it is essential that the facts and particulars should be known to those whose duty it is to report on the case, or who have discretion in carrying the sentence into effect.

55. *Former convictions, age, &c.*—After any person has been found guilty of the charge or charges preferred against him, the court is to inquire into and record the prisoner's former convictions (if any), and any sentence which he may be undergoing; also his age, service, general character, and any decorations or other honorary rewards he may be in possession of. These particulars are required for the guidance of the court in awarding punishment, as well as for that of the confirming authority in sanctioning the award. The evidence under this head is to be given, whenever possible, by a commissioned officer who is not a member of the court.

56. *Minutes of proceedings.*—The minutes of the proceedings of all courts-martial are to be fairly and accurately recorded in a clear and legible hand, without erasures. When interlineations, which should be avoided as much as possible, are necessarily made, they are to be verified by the president's initials. The pages are to be numbered, and the sheets, when more than one, are to be fastened together. Care is to be taken that sufficient space, at least half a page, is left, immediately below the signature of the president, for the signature and remarks of the confirming authority.

57. Whenever a court is re-assembled for the purpose of revising their proceedings, the letter, order, or memorandum, or a copy thereof, containing the instructions to the court, and the reasons for requiring the revision, is to be attached to, and form part of, the proceedings.

58. *Sentences remitted or proceedings quashed.*—When any person has been tried and sentenced by a court, and his punishment has been wholly remitted, his conviction is to be recorded; but when the proceedings of a court are quashed on account of their illegality, or from any other circumstances, such person is to be relieved from all consequences of his trial, and all record of it is to be erased.

#### BOOKS.

59. *General instructions.*—The books to be kept are shown in the annexed table. The authorized forms are supplied on requisition. Each book contains a page of instructions as to the mode in which it is to be kept, and such instructions are to be strictly adhered to. All entries made therein are to be carefully examined by the commanding officer, and the books are to be produced for inspection at such times as may be directed by superior authority.

- Order book.
- Casualty diary.
- Letter book.
- Return book.
- Register of furloughs.
- Defaulters' book.

60. *Order book.*—All issued orders by the commandant of the forces or the senior naval officer, or by the officer commanding a corps, are to be pasted in a book in original as they are received. The volumes are each to be numbered and indexed.

61. *Casualty diary.*—A casualty book is to be kept at the head-quarters of every corps and on board every vessel, in which all changes of service are to be inserted daily.

62. *Letter book.*—The letter book is to contain the entry of all official letters. It is to contain an alphabetical index, and a separate index for the public departments.

63. *Return book.*—Copies of all returns transmitted to the Ordnance department or to the commandant are to be kept in a book and arranged in order of date.

64. *Defaulters' book.*—This book is to contain the name of every warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officer and man serving under commanding officers. An entry is to be made of every case of conviction by the court established under the Act or by a court of criminal judicature, or of any punishment involving imprisonment, forfeiture of pay, extra duty exceeding seven days.

65. *Conviction by the civil power.*—All convictions by a magistrate or by a civil court, whether involving imprisonment or a fine in lieu thereof, are to be entered in the defaulters' book.

## ENROLMENT AND ENGAGEMENT.

ENROLMENT AND ENGAGEMENT FOR CLASS B OF THE  
ARTILLERY CORPS.

66. Every person desirous of being registered as a candidate for Class B of the Artillery Corps, from which all appointments to the Police, Penal, or Gaol departments will be made, must present personally a written application for enrolment.

67. Candidates must be under thirty years of age; at least five feet nine inches in height, smart and active, of a strong constitution, and free from any bodily complaint or defect, and will have to undergo a strict medical examination. If required for subsequent mounted duty in the Police the standard of height will be reduced by one inch.

68. They must be able to read and write well, and must produce satisfactory testimonials of character; and, if they have served in any other force or Government department, must also produce their discharge therefrom.

## 69. VICTORIAN NAVAL RESERVE.—

(1.) The persons whose services are engaged as Naval Forces in the services of Her Majesty's Government in Victoria to be occasionally employed shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, and to the following regulations, be formed into a corps to be called The Victorian Naval Reserve.

(2.) The Victorian Naval Reserve shall consist of such commissioned, warrant, or petty officers and seamen as may from time to time be duly appointed or engaged under the provisions of the said Act, and who shall be entitled, subject to these regulations, each to receive an annual allowance or retainer of sixteen pounds for 1st class petty officers, fourteen pounds 2nd class petty officers, twelve pounds A.B. seamen.

(3.) All members of the Naval Reserve, when called out by proclamation for actual service, shall be entitled to receive during such period of actual service pay and allowances: the commissioned officers at such rates as the Governor in Council may from time to time direct, and the warrant or petty officers and seamen according to the average rates ruling in the port of Melbourne for petty officers and A.B. seamen during the three months preceding such proclamation.

(4.) All members of the Naval Reserve, when called out by proclamation for actual service, will be appointed to such ship or service as the Governor in Council may direct, and if serving beyond the actual limits of Victoria in company with any of Her Majesty's ships of war, will be subject to the orders of the commissioned officer commanding such ship or ships: Provided always that such orders shall not extend to impressment into any other service, or removal of any member of the Reserve from the ship or service of Her Majesty's Government in Victoria.

(5.) No person is to be accepted who is under five feet five inches in height, or above forty years of age, nor unless he is a British subject, free from physical defect, and in health, character, and every other respect eligible.

(6.) Every applicant must have served afloat either as a seaman, waterman, fisherman, boatman, shipwright, sailmaker, or be now engaged as a ballast craftsman, or in some occupation directly connected with shipping.

(7.) The applicant must produce certificates of good character, or must otherwise satisfy the commanding officer that his character and conduct have been good.

(8.) Any member of the Naval Reserve who after being enrolled is discovered to have been at the time of enrolment laboring under disease, or to have sustained injury which incapacitates him, and who has concealed such disease or injury, or who is discovered to have made any false representation or to have produced any false papers on the occasion of enrolment, will at once be struck off the list, and will forfeit all claim to retainer or other advantages of the service.

(9.) No member of the Naval Reserve may, so long as he remains in the Reserve, be enrolled in any other corps.

(10.) When any person is enrolled in the Naval Reserve, a certificate of his enrolment will be delivered to him by the commanding officer who enrolls him. This certificate must be taken care of, as it will constitute the proof of his title to the retainer, and other advantages of the service. It must be produced every time he appears at drill, in order that the requisite entries may be made.

(11.) All entries on certificates must be made or counter-signed by a commissioned officer of the Naval Reserve, and by such officer only.

(12.) If any member of the Naval Reserve accidentally loses his certificate, he should make application to his commanding officer.

(13.) With the exception hereinafter mentioned, no express restriction is laid on the occupation of a member of the Naval Reserve, whilst belonging to the Reserve, provided that he complies with the conditions mentioned below, and especially with that condition which requires him to appear before some commissioned officer, once every six months, unless he obtains leave of absence for a longer period.

(14.) Every member of the Naval Reserve must present himself to some commissioned officer of the Reserve in the colony of Victoria, and must produce his certificate to that officer at intervals not exceeding six months each. Consequently, no member of the Reserve may expect to obtain leave of absence (unless under special circumstances) to be away from the colony of Victoria on any voyage which there is reason to expect will exceed six months. Commanding officers will be informed from time to time, under what conditions, and in what manner, this leave can be given.

(15.) Before leave is given a member of the Naval Reserve must satisfy his commanding officer that he is not in arrears for drill.

(16.) The Government of Victoria reserve to themselves full discretion to withhold leave of absence at any time when an emergency arises.

(17.) It will be the duty of every member of the Naval Reserve, on every fresh engagement he may make for service at sea, to appear before his commanding officer, produce his certificate, and give notice of the nature and length of the proposed voyage or employment, which notice must be repeated on every fresh engagement or change of ship or employment. But where such member of the Naval Reserve is engaged under the same agreement, in a succession of short voyages in a coasting ship or steamer, he need not give such notice each voyage.

(18.) It will also be the duty of every member of the Naval Reserve to give notice to his commanding officer of any change of residence, or of the place to which letters and notices are addressed for him. Such notice must be given on the first opportunity subsequent to the change.

(19.) The commanding officer will enter and sign the particulars of the engagement in his certificate, and will, if he has obtained permission to be absent more than six months, note the fact in his certificate.

(20.) If any member of the Naval Reserve, without special leave, engages for a voyage away from the colony of Victoria which will probably last more than six months, he will be liable to forfeit all claim to his retainers, and to the benefits of the service: and if he breaks the conditions as to half-yearly appearance, or fails to give notice to his commanding officer of his intended employment, or of his change of abode or address, whenever it occurs, as required by the above regulations, he will have his retainers stopped, and cannot have them restored except on special application made through his commanding officer to the officer commanding the naval force in the service of Her Majesty's Government in Victoria.

(21.) In event of the Naval Reserve being called out by proclamation, every member of the Naval Reserve is bound to serve ashore or in any vessel belonging to or employed by the Government of Victoria, under penalty of being treated as a deserter, and forfeiting all claim on the Government.

(22.) The special object of the Naval Reserve being to obtain the services of a picked body of seamen and others, "trained to the use of arms" it is essential that every member shall be drilled so as to obtain a thorough practical knowledge of the mode of using great guns and small arms.

(23.) The drill will comprise great gun, rifle, pistol, and cutlass exercises, and naval duties generally.

(24.) The time for which each member of the Naval Reserve will be required to drill in each year is twenty-five days, to be made up of one hundred and fifty hours, exclusive of reviews. Time occupied in travelling or being transported to and from the place of drill will be allowed, at the discretion of the commanding officer.

(25.) All members of the Naval Reserve who, without satisfactory cause, neglect to attend drill, or who during drill absent themselves without leave, are liable to the loss of the retainer in addition to such penalty as the Act provides.

(26.) Each member of the Naval Reserve may, if the exigencies of the service admit, be allowed to drill in different districts, and may also be allowed to make up one week's continuous drill, which will be reckoned as forty-eight hours or six days, should the nature of his employment require it. This will enable him to take his drill at different places, and also make up his time, should he without any negligence on his own part have fallen in arrear.

(27.) The time during which a member of the Naval Reserve is absent from drill on account of sickness or accident, unless caused at drill, does not count as part of the drill. On his being removed from the sick list, he must perform the proper term of drill required by the regulations. The period of drill to be entered in the certificate is not to include the time during which he is on the sick list unless from accident or injury caused at drill.

(28.) The place of drill will either be some ship, battery, or drill-ground ashore.

(29.) The entire number of shore drills will not be allowed, unless by special authority, to count for more than one hundred hours. The remaining number of hours required for drill must be afloat, either in boats or vessels belonging to the Government of the colony of Victoria. The officer commanding the naval force in the service of Her Majesty's Government in Victoria may at his discretion alter the details of drills, either afloat or ashore, as circumstances may require.

(30.) When the Naval Reserve is called out for drill afloat, no day's drill will be counted for more than eight hours.

(31.) Notices will be posted in conspicuous places in the different Naval Reserve divisions, naming the hours of mustering for drill either afloat or ashore.

(32.) Arrangements will be made to transport members of the Naval Reserve to and from the drill ship free of expense. The time of drills afloat will count from the time they first embark until they are again landed.

(33.) Members of the Naval Reserve when on drill will be rated as able seamen, commissioned, warrant, or petty officers excepted, who will rate according to their grade and distinctions.

(34.) Members of the Naval Reserve when being drilled afloat for one entire day or days will be victualled according to the same scale as seamen in the Government vessels.

(35.) They will each be supplied with uniform, which must be kept in good condition.

(36.) Drills ashore not to exceed two hours, drills afloat not to exceed three hours, unless upon occasions which will be previously notified.

(37.) Any member of the Naval Reserve injured at drill may be sent for treatment into hospital, or medical aid may be procured by his commanding officer.

(38.) A list of defaulters will from time to time be prepared, showing those members of the Naval Reserve who have not completed their drill. It will be the duty of officers to warn them of the effect of neglect. But if no such personal notice

is given; they will, notwithstanding, be held responsible for non-attendance.

(39.) The annual retainer will be paid in four quarterly instalments when required. The quarters are to be considered as commencing on the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October in each year. A proportionate reduction will be made in the retainer on account of the first broken quarter.

(40.) When a member of the Naval Reserve applies for payment of retainer he must produce his certificate, and satisfy the commanding officer by the entries in his certificate that he has complied with the conditions as to drill, leave of absence, and appearance before some commissioned officer, and if it should appear to such officer that the conditions of the Reserve have been broken, he will forward the certificate to the officer commanding the naval force in the service of Her Majesty's Government in Victoria.

(41.) If he can show that his absence was unavoidable, or any other conditions or rule of the service have been broken through unavoidable circumstances, he may make a special application to have his retainer renewed. Payment of the retainer will not be allowed for the time of absence.

(42.) In the event of the death of a member of the Naval Reserve, the balance of any retainer which may be due to him will be paid to his widow or children (if any). Application for payment of the balance of retainers due to the deceased should be made through the commanding officer.

(43.) When a member of the Naval Reserve, after being called out by proclamation, is released from actual service, his certificate will be returned to him, with the requisite entries of service made therein.

(44.) After the termination of one year, reckoned from the date of certificate, any member of the Naval Reserve will, on giving three months' notice in writing, be entitled to his discharge: provided he is not at the time required by proclamation for actual service, and that no apprehension of danger to the colony exists, of which the Governor in Council is to be the sole judge.

(45.) The Naval Reserve will be continuously maintained unless disbanded or broken up by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.

(46.) Any member of the Naval Reserve, when not called out for actual service, may, under special circumstances, with the consent of the officer commanding the naval force of Her Majesty's Government in Victoria, obtain his discharge from the Reserve on payment of the sum of £2, if required to replace his uniform.

(47.) Any member of the Naval Reserve may be discharged from the Reserve after fifty-five years of age or for inefficiency or physical inability to serve, or may be dismissed for misconduct in addition to loss of retainer and such other penalty as the Act provides.

(48.) A member of the Naval Reserve, if wounded or injured on service or on drill, will be entitled to the same pension to which any other seaman in the Colonial Navy of Victoria would be entitled for a similar wound or injury; but such pension cannot, except by special permission, be paid in any place not within the colony of Victoria.

#### ENGAGEMENT OF PERSONS REGULARLY EMPLOYED.

70. The period for which all persons regularly employed under the Act will be sworn in will be for one year, after the expiration of which period any such person can obtain his discharge on giving three months' notice of his intention to apply for the same: Provided always, that at the time no apprehension of danger to the colony exists, of which the Governor in Council is to be the sole judge.

#### RULES OF THE TORPEDO AND TELEGRAPH CORPS.

THE following Rules of the Torpedo and Telegraph Corps have received the approval of the Governor in Council.

#### RULES OF THE TORPEDO AND TELEGRAPH CORPS.

1. No person shall be eligible for admission to the corps unless he possess one or more of the following qualifications:—

- A knowledge of civil engineering or surveying.
- A knowledge of practical telegraphy, engineering, or electrical science.
- A knowledge of engineering or mechanical drawing.
- A knowledge of practical chemistry.

2. Any candidate for admission to the corps shall send an application in writing to the officer commanding, setting forth his special qualifications for enrolment; and the name, address, and profession or occupation of such candidate shall be posted for one week in the orderly room.

3. If any member of the corps be desirous of objecting to the admission of a candidate, he shall set forth his objections to the officer commanding; and all applications for admission to the corps and objections thereto shall be subject to the final consideration and decision of the three senior officers.

4. Any member changing his permanent address must give notice of the same in writing to the officer commanding within fourteen days of such change.

5. Any member neglecting to attend such musters appointed for the instruction of members of the corps as may be necessary

to render him effective in his duties will be liable to be struck off the roll of the corps.

6. All excuses for absence from parade or from the ordinary musters of the corps must be forwarded in writing to the officer commanding within fourteen days of the time upon which the absence occurred.

7. An account shall be kept by the officer commanding between the corps and each of its members, wherein the member shall be debited with all the liabilities incurred by the corps on his behalf, and credited with all sums earned by him as an effective.

8. If on the 1st of July in any year a member's debit exceed his credit by One pound (£1) or upwards, he shall be fined the amount of such difference: provided always that the amount of such fine shall not in any case exceed Two pounds (£2), and that the officer commanding may, at his discretion, enforce only one-half of the fine. The amount paid under this rule shall be placed in the bank to the credit of the member paying it.

9. If a member at any time desire to quite the corps under the provisions of the Act, he shall be fined the amount, if more than Ten shillings (10s.), whereby his debit exceeds his credit: provided that no such fine shall exceed Two pounds (£2), and that the whole or the half may, at the discretion of the officer commanding, be remitted.

10. At any meeting of the corps the senior officer present may take the chair.

11. The commanding officer may at any time convene a special meeting of the corps, and must do so on the written requisition of six (6) members, provided the subject to be dealt with be not of a military nature, or, in the opinion of the officer commanding, connected with the discipline of the corps.

No such special meeting shall be held to be duly convened unless notice of it shall have been given at a parade of the corps, or by circular issued to every member four days previous to the day of meeting.

No business shall be transacted at the meeting other than that notified in such requisition.

## MINING ON RAILWAY RESERVE, SANDHURST DISTRICT.

THE Governor in Council has authorized James Eagan Wall, hereinafter styled James Eagan Wall and party, subject to the conditions, restrictions, and regulations hereby imposed and made by the Governor in Council and subject to conditions, restrictions, and regulations imposed and made by the Board of Land and Works in an instrument of even date herewith, to occupy for mining purposes the piece of land described in the schedule hereto, which forms a part of the lands reserved or set apart or used for railway purposes.

1. The said James Eagan Wall and party shall not nor will sink shafts upon or otherwise break the surface of the said land, or use or occupy the surface thereof in any way, unless and until they shall have obtained the permission in writing of the Commissioner of Railways and Roads.

2. The said James Eagan Wall and party shall not nor will mine, or make any drive, gallery, or work under the said land at a depth less than one hundred feet from the natural surface thereof.

3. It shall be lawful at any time for any officer authorized by the Commissioner of Railways and Roads or by the Minister of Mines, together with such person or persons as such officer may require for assistance, to visit and examine the shafts, galleries, drives, airways, and waterways on, under, or in connection with any workings within the said land, and to use any machinery therewith connected, whether the shafts, galleries, drives, airways, and waterways be within the said land or not, so that they be connected with any workings on or within the said land; and all persons employed in connection with such workings shall afford all necessary facilities to such officer and his assistants as may be required for the purposes of and with a view to such inspection.

4. The Engineer-in-Chief of Railways, or other officer authorized as aforesaid, may order that the galleries, drives, ways, passages, &c., be stowed, if necessary, or may order that such masonry or other works of art be made and erected at the cost of the said James Eagan Wall and party as in his opinion may be required for the support of the surface or as a precaution against any contingent damage to the railway; and thereupon the said James Eagan Wall and party shall cause the work so ordered to be well and truly done with all reasonable speed.

5. Previous to occupying any portion of the said land the said James Eagan Wall and party shall deposit in the hands of the Receiver and Paymaster at Sandhurst the sum of Fifty pounds sterling, as a guarantee that they will observe and fulfil these conditions, such deposit to be retained until the said persons shall relinquish the land described in the schedule and discontinue mining operations; and if the said conditions, restrictions, and regulations shall then have been observed and fulfilled, the said deposit shall be returned to the depositors, but if any of them shall not then have been observed or fulfilled, then the whole, or such part of the sum so deposited as aforesaid as the Governor in Council shall think fit, shall by an Order of the Governor in Council be declared forfeited, and shall thereupon become public money, and be applied accordingly.

6. In case any person or persons employed in the mining operations hereby authorized shall in any way violate any of the above conditions, it shall not be lawful for him or them any longer to mine under, upon, or within the said land, or to continue in any way to occupy the same; and the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge whether or not any condition has been violated.

7. The Commissioner of Railways and Roads, or any person authorized by him in writing, shall have at any time power to order the immediate discontinuance of any mining operations within or under any part of the said land, whether the above conditions shall have been observed or not, and the mining operations shall thereupon be immediately discontinued; and an order in writing served on any one of the miners, or a written

order posted on any part of the land described in the schedule, shall be sufficient notice.

8. The Governor in Council may at any time revoke this Order.

## SCHEDULE ABOVE REFERRED TO.

## COURT OF INSOLVENCY.—ALTERED RULES.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Insolvency Statute 1871*, we, the Honorable Robert Walsh, Her Majesty's Attorney-General for Victoria; Wriothesley Baptist Noel, Esq.; and the Honorable Samuel Henry Bindon, being the Law Officer and two of the Judges of the Court of Insolvency appointed by the Governor in Council, under the provisions of the said Statute, to frame the Rules of Practice of the said court for the purposes in the said *Insolvency Statute 1871* mentioned, do order, and direct that the rules 13, 16, 17, 19, 21, 22, 37, and 99 be repealed; and that the following shall be the rule instead of rule 13:—

## DEBTOR'S SUMMONS.

1. As to a debtor's summons the following rules shall be made:—

- (I.) A debtor's summons, according to the form in the schedule, may be granted by the court.
- (II.) A creditor desirous that a debtor's summons may be granted must file an affidavit of the truth of his debt, and lodge the summons.
- (III.) The particulars of demand shall be expressed with reasonable and convenient certainty as to dates and all other matters, but no objection shall be allowed to the particulars unless the court shall consider that the debtor has been misled by them.
- (IV.) Every debtor's summons shall have the name and place of business of the attorney actually suing out the same; but in case no attorney shall be employed for the purpose, then with a memorandum expressing that the same has been sued out by the creditor in person.
- (V.) There shall be on the debtor's summons, in addition to an intimation of the consequences of neglect to comply with the requisitions of the summons, a notice to the debtor that, if he disputes the debt and desires to obtain the dismissal of the summons, he must file an affidavit with the chief clerk within fourteen days, stating that he is not so indebted, or only so to a less amount than £50.
- (VI.) Where a debtor files the above-mentioned affidavit, the chief clerk shall fix the time and place at which the application for the dismissal of the summons will be heard by the court, and give notice thereof to the creditor and debtor three days before the day so fixed.
- (VII.) Where proceedings on a debtor's summons have been stayed for the trial of the question of the validity of the debt claimed therein, and such question has been decided against the validity of the debt, the debtor shall be entitled to have the debtor's summons dismissed with or without costs; but the order for such costs shall not be enforced for seven days, or where the creditor has lodged a notice showing that he has taken the necessary steps to set aside the judgment, until after the final decision thereon.
- (VIII.) Where the proceedings on a debtor's summons have been stayed for the trial of the question of the validity of the debt claimed therein, and such question has been decided in favor of the validity of the debt, the creditor shall be entitled to an order of the court refusing the application of the debtor to dismiss the summons with or without costs.
- (IX.) When proceedings on a debtor's summons have been stayed upon security being given, the creditor shall take or continue proceedings for the payment of the debt within twenty-one days from the date on which the security was completed, or if no such security was ordered or given then within twenty-one days from the date of the order staying proceedings on the summons, and if he fail to do so the debtor shall be entitled to have the summons dismissed with or without costs.
- (X.) Where proceedings on a debtor's summons have been stayed upon security being given, if the debtor do not within the specified time enter into the bond to the creditor or other security required by the court, the creditor shall be entitled to an order of the court refusing the application of the debtor to dismiss the summons with or without costs.

That the following shall be the rule instead of rule 16:—

2. When proceedings on a debtor's summons have been stayed pending the trial of the question of the validity of the creditor's debt, the creditor or debtor may, after the proceedings in the trial of such question have terminated, set down the summons for further order of the court on a day to be fixed by the chief clerk.

That the following shall be the rule, instead of rule 19:—

3. All applications to the court relating to any claim to the recovery of possession of property or to damages shall be by notice of motion, which shall contain the name of the person against whom such application is made, and all grounds of equitable or legal claim intended to be relied on, and all necessary particulars of the object of the motion and of the property sought to be recovered or affected, or the amount of the damages claimed.

That the following shall be the rule instead of rule 21:—

4. If any such notice of motion or summons be opposed, notice thereof shall be served upon the applicant at the address given in the notice of motion or summons seven clear days at least before the time fixed for the hearing. Every such notice of defence shall contain all grounds of legal or equitable defence intended to be relied on and the address of the defendant or his solicitor, and service at such address shall be deemed sufficient.

That the following shall be the rule instead of rule 37:—

5. Every affidavit to be used in obtaining, supporting, or opposing any motion or order for showing cause for or against any order or rule of court shall be filed with the chief clerk.

And that the following shall be the rule instead of rule 99:—

6. If an insolvent cannot truly state that his estate has paid or will pay seven shillings in the pound, he shall, instead of filing the affidavit required generally by rule 99, file an affidavit setting out the true circumstances of his case, and that his estate has not and will not be able to pay seven shillings in the pound, and he must serve notice upon the trustee that he intends to apply to the court upon the day appointed for the hearing of the application for a certificate of discharge to dispense with the condition mentioned in section 136 of the Statute, and the trustee or any creditor may be heard in opposition to such application to dispense with such condition. The trustee shall give notice of any such application to any creditor who has lodged a caveat.

And the following shall be rules in addition to the rules now in force:—

7. If the court shall in any case be of opinion that it would be desirable that a person should be appointed to take down, in shorthand or otherwise, the evidence of the insolvent, or of any witness examined at any public sitting of the court under this Act, it shall be competent for the court to make such an appointment, and every person so appointed shall be paid a sum not exceeding one guinea per day, and when the court appoints a shorthand writer, a sum not exceeding one shilling per folio of ninety words of any transcript of the evidence that may be required, and such sums shall be paid by any party at whose instance the appointment was made, or out of the estate as may be directed by the court.

8. Whenever an order of a judge is appealed against, the appellant or the solicitor for the appellant shall forthwith obtain, make, and prepare, at his own cost and charges, a fair copy of the judge's notes of the evidence taken before him in the matter of such order, and shall, as soon as may be, send or deliver the same to the judge, to be by him forwarded to the Supreme Court together with a statement of his reasons for making such order.

## PARTICULARS TO AID DETECTION.

The man above referred to is described as aged 20, five feet seven inches high, of medium build, with features rather thin, brown and sunburnt, little or no hair on the face, hair on the head short and of a color not known, small dark-brown eyes, lower arms sunburnt as if from exposure. He wore old yellow moleskin trousers, and had his head and face covered with a black silk handkerchief, which slipped off during the commission of the offence.

The following property was found close to the scene of the outrage, and may perhaps be traced to the owner:—A nearly square piece of old yellow moleskin; which had evidently formed a patch on some recently washed garment worn by a person mining or working with clay; two small pieces of old twilled calico wall lining, with pieces of wall paper adhering (with these the offender tied the complainant); the black silk head covering referred to above; a long strip of Scotch twill, torn from a man's shirt; a large piece of very old calico lining, and some old hay bands.
