THE SHIRE OF GLENLYON DIVIDED ANEW.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixth day of October 1871.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 25) it is amongst other things enacted, that where any portion of Victoria shall have been annexed to any shire divided into ridings, or any part of any such shire has been severed from such shire, it shall be lawful for the Governor either to abolish all previous ridings of such shire or to divide anew such shire into such separate ridings as may seem fit by such names and with such boundaries as shall in and by the Order in Council be assigned to the same and at any time to vary or annul such order; and the number of such ridings shall be the same as that of the ridings theretofore subsisting, or in the case of annexation may be one more, or in the case of severance may be one less, than such number, if the Governor shall see fit, and such new ridings shall be in lieu of the last-mentioned ridings, and upon any such abolition as afore-said the shire shall be deemed to be a single shire to all intents and purposes: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and seal of the colony bearing date the fourth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, the shire of Glenlyon was constituted; and by another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, the boundaries of the said shire were enlarged: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the thirteenth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, the said shire was divided into three ridings: And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor to abolish all previous ridings of the said shire and to divide it anew: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order abolish all previous ridings of the shire of Glenlyon, and doth divide the said shire anew into four several ridings, to be designated by the names and to be comprised within the boundaries which are hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:—

THE SOUTH RIDING.—Commencing at the junction of the Kangaroo Creek with the River Coliban; thence southerly by the centre of Kangaroo Creek to the north-east angle of W. King's 42nd section block, parish of Coliban; thence south by the east boundary of W. King's block and the west boundary of Mr. Mitchell's 42nd section block to the south-west angle of the last-named block; thence south-westerly to the north-west angle of Roskelly's 42nd section block; thence south by its west boundary to its south-west angle; thence south-westerly by a direct line to the north-west angle of G. Bowie's 42nd section block; thence southwardly and westwardly by the western boundary of G. Bowie's and W. Sowerby's 42nd section blocks to the south-west angle of W. Sowerby's block; thence by a direct line south to the shire boundary; thence by the shire boundary northwardly to the commencing point.

THE NORTH RIDING.—Commencing at the junction of the Kangaroo Creek with the River Coliban; thence southerly by the centre of the Kangaroo Creek to the intersection of the creek with the Woodend road; thence by the centre of that road westerly to the eastern boundary of the main road from Glenlyon to Malmesbury; thence north-easterly by the eastern boundary of the said road to a point east of the south-east angle of the parish of Holcombe; thence west by a direct line to the said south-east angle; thence north by the east boundary of Holcombe parish to the shire boundary; thence by the shire boundary easterly, northwardly, and southerly to the commencing point.

THE EAST RIDING.—Commencing on the western boundary of the shire where it is intersected by the Main Daylesford to Malmesbury road; thence north-easterly by the said road to the junction of the Daylesford to Woodend road; thence by the last-named road to its intersection with Kangaroo Creek; thence southerly by the centre of Kangaroo Creek to the north-east angle of W. King's 42nd section block, parish of Coliban; thence south by the east boundary of W. King's block and the west boundary of Mitchell's block to the south-west angle of the last-named block; thence south-westerly to the north-west angle of Roskelly's 42nd section block; thence south by its west boundary to the south-west angle of the block last named; thence south-westerly by a direct line to the north-west angle of G. Bowie's 42nd section block; thence southwardly and westwardly by the western boundary of G. Bowie's and W. Sowerby's 42nd section blocks to the south-west angle of W. Sowerby's block; thence south to the shire boundary; thence by the shire boundary westerly, northerly, and easterly to the commencing point.

THE WEST RIDING.—Commencing at the intersection of the Main Daylesford to Malmesbury road with the west boundary of the shire; thence northwardly and eastwardly by the shire boundary to the north-east angle of the parish of Holcombe; thence south by the east boundary of the said parish to its south-east angle; thence east to the east side of the Daylesford to Malmesbury main road; thence south-westerly by the east side of the said main road to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Francis Longmore, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

MINING ON THE RAILWAY RESERVE, SANDHURST DISTRICT, AUTHORIZED.

THE Governor in Council has authorized W. H. Burrowes and party, and others, hereinunder styled W. H. Burrowes and party, subject to the conditions, restrictions, and regulations hereby imposed and made by the Governor in Council, and subject to conditions, restrictions, and regulations imposed and made by the Board of Land and Works in an instrument of even date herewith, to occupy for mining purposes the piece of land described in the schedule hereto, which forms a part of the lands reserved or set apart or used for railway purposes.

1. The said W. H. Burrowes and party shall not sink shafts upon or otherwise break the surface of the said land, or use or occupy the surface thereof in any way, unless and until they shall have obtained the permission in writing of the Commissioner of Railways and Roads.

2. The said W. H. Burrowes and party shall not nor will mine, or make any drive, gallery, or work under the said land at a depth less than one hundred feet from the natural surface thereof.

3. It shall be lawful at any time for any officer authorized by the Commissioner of Railways and Roads or by the Minister of Mines, together with such person or persons as such officer may require for assistance, to visit and examine the shafts, galleries, drives, airways, and waterways on, under, or in connection with any workings within the said land, and to use any machinery therewith connected, whether the shafts, galleries, drives, airways, and waterways be within the said land or not, so that they be connected with any workings on or within the said land; and all persons employed in connection with such workings shall afford all necessary facilities to such officer and his assistants as may be required for the purposes of and with a view to such inspection.

4. The Engineer-in-Chief of Railways, or other officer authorized as aforesaid, may order that the galleries, drives, ways, passages, &c., be stowed, if necessary, or may order that such masonry or other works of art be made and erected at the cost of the said W. H. Burrowes and party as in his opinion may be required for the support of the surface or as a precaution against any contingent damage to the railway; and thereupon the said W. H. Burrowes and party shall cause the work so ordered to be well and truly done with all reasonable speed.

5. Previous to occupying any portion of the said land the said W. H. Ryan and party, subject to the conditions, restrictions, and regulations hereby imposed and made by the Governor in Council, and subject to conditions, restrictions, and regulations imposed and made by the Board of Land and Works in an instrument of even date herewith, to occupy for mining purposes the piece of land described in the schedule hereto, which forms a part

of the lands reserved or set apart or used for a public water reservoir at Malmsbury.

1. The persons hereby authorized to occupy for mining purposes the portion of land described in the schedule at the foot hereof shall not nor will sink any shaft, or make any excavation, deposit any earth, stone, or other substance upon, or in any other way occupy the surface of any portion of the land actually reserved or set apart or used for reservoir purposes, without having first obtained the permission in writing of the Minister of Mines.

2. The mining operations shall be conducted in such a manner as not to pollute the water in the reservoir, or to cause to flow into it any water pumped from any mine, or any sludge or tailings, or to interfere in any way with the purpose for which the said land was so reserved or set apart or used.

3. The said persons hereby authorized as aforesaid shall, on the requisition in writing of the Minister of Mines, cause to be prepared complete and accurate plans and sections of all drives, levels, adits, and ways constructed by the said persons, and shall cause the same to be laid before such officer, and at such time as the said Minister shall in writing direct, and shall, if and when the said Minister shall so direct, require the surveyor who shall have made the same to make a statutory declaration as to the truth and accuracy thereof.

Previous to occupying any portion of the said land under the authority of this Order, the persons named in this Order shall deposit in the hands of the Receiver and Paymaster at Castlemaine the sum of Fifty pounds sterling, as a guarantee that they will observe and fulfil these conditions, such deposit to be retained until the said persons shall relinquish the land described in the schedule and discontinue mining operations; and if the said conditions, restrictions, and regulations shall then have been observed and fulfilled, the said deposit shall be returned to the depositors, but if any of them shall not then have been observed or fulfilled, then the whole, or such part of the sum so deposited as aforesaid as the Governor in Council shall think fit, shall by an Order of the Governor in Council be declared forfeited, and shall thereupon become public money, and be applied accordingly.

6. In case any person or persons employed in the mining operations hereby authorized shall in any way violate any of the above conditions, it shall not be lawful for him or them any longer to mine under, upon, or within the said land, or to continue in any way to occupy the same; and the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge whether or not any condition has been violated.

7. 11.
