FISHERIES ACT EXTENDED TO THE RIVER AVOCA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled *An Act to consolidate the Laws for the protection of Fisheries and Game*, it is amongst other things enacted, that if any person shall set, lay down, use, or fish with any kind of net in the Yarra Yarra, Plenty, Werribee, or Saltwater rivers, in the colony of Victoria, or in any other river, lake, creek, stream, or pond to which the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall, by Proclamation duly published in the *Government Gazette*, extend the provisions of the eleventh clause, he shall forfeit such net, and also such sum not exceeding Ten pounds as the convicting justice shall think fit: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby extend the above recited provisions of the said Act, being the eleventh clause thereof, to the River Avoca.

PORTS AND HARBORS OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor, and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Passengers Harbors and Navigation Statute 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of the shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations, and from time to time in like manner may alter, amend, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules and regulations, and substitute others in their stead: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the thirteenth day of May in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by the above recited Statute, did define the limits and boundaries of ports in the said colony, and did proclaim and declare that certain rules and regulations therein specified for the governance and preservation of the said ports, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, should be substituted for other rules and

regulations formerly in force: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the seventh day of August in the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one certain rules were substituted for others: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby repeal rule 29 of those referred to in the said last-mentioned Proclamation and do hereby frame the following rule, which shall be substituted for and be in place of the rule hereby repealed:—

In lieu of the said rule 29 the following shall be substituted:—

29. *Watch on board.*—All vessels in port shall always have at least one seaman as watch on deck, with the following exceptions:—(1.) Vessels laid up, coal hulks, ballast or other lighters lying within such limits as the harbor master authorized them to occupy; such vessel or vessels shall always have one person on board. (2.) Vessels (not being vessels moored to or lying at any pier or jetty) and boats lying within the limits marked A are not required to keep a person constantly on board. All persons aforesaid and all persons in charge of boats shall answer the challenge of the water police or other public officer.

DISTRICTS WHERE CERTIFICATES MAY BE GRANTED FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES CHARGEABLE WITH FEE OF £10.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits-Sale Statute 1864 Amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, upon the application in writing of the respective councils of shires and road board mentioned in the first column of the annexed Schedule, do hereby proclaim the shires and road district, or parts thereof specified in the second column of such schedule, with the exemptions specially therein named, to be districts within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—

SCHEDULE.

Name of Shire or Road District.	Particulars of District Proclaimed.
Alexandra, Shire of ...	The whole of the shire, excepting the township of Alexandra and an area comprised within a radius of one mile from the Council Chambers in that township.
Donnybrook and Wallan-wallan Road District	The whole of the Donnybrook and Wallan-wallan Road District.
Newstead, Shire of ...	The whole of the Shire of Newstead.
Portland, Shire of ...	The whole of the townships of Brauxholme, Digby, Greenhills, Heywood, Hotspar, and Tahara, and except that portion of the shire which is within half a mile of the Main roads from Heywood to Hamilton, Greenhills to Tahara, and Portland to Digby.

INCORPORATION OF CLUNES DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-third day of October 1871.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor
Mr. Gavan Duffy | Mr. Berry
Mr. Walsh | Mr. McLellan
Mr. Grant | Mr. Spensley.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled *An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions*, it is amongst other things enacted, that any institution established for the cure of disease, or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons, and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom shall have paid not less than One pound per annum, or Twenty pounds in one donation, may be incorporated as thereafter mentioned, and all persons who shall have paid as aforesaid shall be deemed contributors within the meaning of the said Act; and it is also enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five of the said persons praying that such institution may be incorporated, to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of such persons, shall have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication) the Governor in Council may declare the contributors for the time being to such institution to be, and they shall thereupon become and continue, a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the Order in Council, and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty-five contributors to the institution known as the Clunes District Hospital, praying that the said institution may be incorporated: And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petition has been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order declare the contributors to the said institution to be a body politic and corporate in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, in manner following, that is to say:—

The contributors for the time being to the institution called and known as the Clunes District Hospital, situate at Clunes in the Colony of Victoria, are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Clunes District Hospital."

And the Honorable Charles Gavan Duffy, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SANDHURST MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAW No. 9.—[3th September 1871.]

AT a meeting of the mining board of the Mining District of Sandhurst, begun and holden at Sandhurst, in the said district, on the eighth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and seventy one, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

Registration of residence areas.—Every holder of a residence area held under a miner's right may, at any time after marking off and taking possession of the same, cause such area to be registered in a book kept by the mining registrar for that purpose; and that twenty-eight (28) days be allowed from the time of marking off for the erection of a residence.

Machinery sites.—Any person or persons may take possession of and occupy a site upon which to erect machinery for the purpose of crushing or extracting gold or other metals from quartz, cement, pyrites, or any similar substance connected with mining, any extent of unoccupied Crown lands not exceeding three (3) acres, the length thereof in no case to exceed twice the breadth, provided such site be not on any known reef, or within 50 yards of any known reef, and does not interfere with residence sites or any existing rights to the said land in that locality.

Application for machinery sites.—The applicant for a machinery site shall (as far as practicable) in the first place erect posts at each angle of the ground for the purpose of defining (as nearly as possible) the boundaries of such site, such posts to be six inches square and standing three feet above the ground, each post to have a metal plate on it with the words "Applied for machinery site," with the name of the applicant painted thereon, such notices to be maintained, as far as practicable, until the date of registration of such site; and the applicant shall within forty-eight hours after marking out such site leave with the mining registrar a notice in the form of the schedule hereunto annexed numbered 12, and publish a copy of such notice in any newspaper published or circulating in the division in which the site is situated, giving as far as practicable the exact position of the ground applied for.

Survey and registration of machinery sites.—The applicant shall then cause the site to be surveyed by the mining surveyor appointed to make surveys under the bye-laws for the division in which such machinery site is situated, and shall, upon the expiration of twenty-one days of the first marking out of the site, lodge a plan of it with the mining registrar, and register such site and the owners thereof in the same way that claims and shares therein are registered, and the mining registrar shall issue certificates of the same in the form of No. 3 hereunto attached.

Exemption.—The applicants or registered owners of any machinery site shall be allowed six months for the erection of their machinery; after which, if having worked their machinery for any period not less than six months for any of the purposes named in this bye-law, they may, on application to the registrar, obtain exemption for the same for a period of six months from the date of ceasing to work, and the registrar shall issue an exemption certificate in the form of No. 2 hereunto annexed.

Forfeiture.—Two months after ceasing to work the machinery for which any machinery site has been obtained, without having

the same exempted, or seven days after period of exemption has expired, without work being resumed, such site may, by the warden, be declared abandoned; or if the owners or applicants of any machinery site should fail to erect the machinery for which the site was obtained within six months after the first marking out such site, on the application of any miner, may, by the warden, be declared abandoned, and on such declaration being made the first applicant may be put in possession of the same without having to pay compensation to former owners: Provided that the former owners shall be allowed two months from the date of such declaration to remove any machinery they might have previously erected on the said site. But no machinery site shall be declared abandoned if the machinery be in perfect working order, and cannot be worked through want of water, or such material to crush for which the site was granted, or from other and sufficient cause proved before a warden.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT
1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act* 1870, the Governor in Council has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined, shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:-

BARTON RUN.—Commencing at the point where the Lexington run crosses the summit of the Mount William Range; thence by that range and a line, being the eastern boundary of the Mount Burchet run, bearing southerly and south-westerly to the Wannan run; thence by that run bearing south-easterly to the Yarran-yarran run; thence by that run bearing south-easterly to the Mount William run; thence by that run bearing north-easterly and easterly to the Mount William Plains run; thence by that run and by the Burrumbidgee run, bearing north-easterly to the Lexington run aforesaid; and thence by that run westerly to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

HAMILTON QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 7 of section 2, parish of Greenhills, being a point on the eastern side of the road from Portland to Hamilton; thence east to Lake Condah Swamp; thence southerly by the eastern margin of that swamp to the creek which forms part of the eastern boundary of the Lake Condah pre-emptive section; thence by that creek to Lake Condah; thence by the western shore of that lake southerly to Darlott's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Fitzroy River; thence by that river upwards to the aforesaid road from Portland to Hamilton; and thence by that road north-easterly to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. I am sorry to report that I found one scabby sheep in the ram paddock of the latter station on the 15th ultimo; consequently I have prosecuted the manager under the 46th section of the Act, but the bench having withheld its decision until Monday the 2nd proximo, I am unable now to give a report of it. I am in good hopes, however, that the disease is eradicated, as the whole of the sheep depasturing on that station have been shorn and dipped in August; more especially if a clean muster had been effected, which is a difficult thing to accomplish when the paddocks are both rough and large, and only a few hands to work them. I am not aware of the existence of scab in any other portion of this district. The regulations of the 16th June appear to work admirably.

I HAVE the honor to hand you my report on the Melbourne scab district for the quarter ending 30th September 1871.

There have been no fresh cases of scab in the district. I have inspected all the flocks that were under license, and found them, with the exception of a flock of 1100 depasturing near Wallanwallan, to all appearance free from scab. I had one case of prosecution before the the Mornington bench, for the removal of sheep from the Melbourne quarantine district without a permit, when defendant was fined £50 and £3 ss. costs.

A petition was made by the butchers of Dromana and the Sanatory Station, praying that the open road through the Melbourne clean district should be extended to those townships, to enable them to be supplied with butcher's meat; the petition has been granted by the Government.

During the past quarter about 700 sheep have arrived at this port from the adjacent colonies and the United Kingdom.

About 289,716 sheep have passed through the Flemington yards, all of which appeared to be free from scab.

I HAVE the honor to report that during this quarter West Burnewang has, at the recommendation of my board of advice, been released from quarantine.

The runs now in quarantine are Powlett Plains, Brenanah, and Cooyora Springs; also the farms of Peddie, Dunn, and Hope, parish of Clunes, and of Clancey and Mechin, parish of Powlett Plains.

I believe, however, that the sheep on these places are all clean, only that a sufficient time has not yet elapsed to enable me to be sure.

I HAVE the honor to forward my report for the quarter ending 30th September 1871.

During this quarter I have issued one license, on the 12th August, to Mrs. M. A. Heagney, for 230 sheep; these are the only sheep under license in my district.

I have had one prosecution, against Mr. Esau Shelton, of Avenel, who was fined £25 ls. for having 501 sheep infected with scab without a license.

My board of advice held its first meeting (since its reconstruction) on the 27th July, and has held monthly meetings since.

Eight stations in this district have been formed into a clean district, and ten have been recommended by the board to be added to the Seymour quarantine district, the said ten stations being considered by me to be very doubtful. The board held their meetings at Violettown on the last Monday of each month, at twelve o'clock noon.

I am able to report the issue of a clean certificate for the sheep on Narraport, and also that the order constituting Narraport a quarantine district has been revoked.

I have not been able to find any appearance of scab in the quarantine district of Burton run.

No offences against the Act in this district have come to my knowledge.

The regulations of 8th June appear to work well, very little delay or inconvenience having taken place in obtaining authorities to travel under them; and that might be altogether avoided if those buying and selling sheep would only take the trouble to look a little ahead and remember that the inspectors are at their offices the first seven days in each month.

I have granted authority for the driving of 1563 rams for stud purposes into this clean district during the quarter, some of them very valuable animals.
