## CHOLERA.

**T**HE accompanying copy of a Despatch from the Secretary of State with reference to the steps to be taken in cases of cholera on board ship is published for general information.

**MY LORD,**—I transmit to you for your information and guidance a copy of a letter, 8th August 1871, which has been received from the Board of Trade, enclosing a copy of a Circular with Order in Council appended, which has been issued to the British Consuls and to the Officers in the British Possessions abroad relative to the steps to be taken in cases of cholera on board ship.

**SIR,**—I am directed by the Board of Trade to transmit to you the enclosed copy of a printed Circular with Order in Council appended, which has just been issued from this department to the Superintendents of all Mercantile Marine Offices in the United Kingdom, to the British Consuls, and to the Officers in the British Possessions abroad.

The urgency of the subject, as will be perceived on reference to these documents, precluded this Board from following their otherwise invariable practice of previously consulting the Secretary of State; but the Board hope that if further instructions are thought by his lordship to be necessary in the matter, he will not find it too late now to have them sent out.

**APPENDED** hereto is the copy of an Order in Council directing that ships on board of which any person has been attacked by cholera during the voyage shall not enter any port or place in the United Kingdom until the clothes and bedding of such person shall have been destroyed.

Care should be taken that shipmasters understand this obligation, and the further obligation of disinfecting the berths  
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of cholera patients and all things besides clothes and bedding likely to carry infection.

All cases of cholera should be entered in the official log, and a list of all articles destroyed.

In the case of seamen dying of cholera at a foreign port, the Consul will give directions for the destruction of the clothing, &c., of the deceased, which should never be sent to the United Kingdom.

**WHEREAS** pursuant to an Act passed in the sixth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, chapter seventy-eight, and of *The Sanitary Act* 1860, and of *The Public Health (Scotland) Act* 1867, and of every other power in them vested, the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council did, on the twenty-ninth day of July now last past, and on the third of this instant August, make and publish certain Orders: And whereas it has seemed expedient to their lordships, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Acts or otherwise in them vested, to make a further Order touching the disease in the said recited Orders mentioned:

Now therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council do, by virtue of the aforesaid powers, order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. No master of any ship in which, during the voyage and before the arrival thereof at any port of the United Kingdom, any person has been attacked with or died of cholera shall bring his ship into any such port until he has destroyed the clothing and bedding of all persons who shall so have died or had an attack of cholera on board such vessel during such voyage.

2. In this Order the term "ship" includes vessel or boat:

The term "master" includes the officer or person for the time being in charge or command of a ship:

The term "cholera" includes choleraic diarrhoea.

3. The terms "clothing and bedding" mean and include all clothing and bedding in actual use and worn or used by the person attacked as aforesaid at the time of and during such attack.

4. Every person offending against this order shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

5. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Statute* 1865, it is amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the Court of General Sessions of the Peace in and for the Sale General Sessions District to be holden at WALHALLA in addition to the places appointed by former Proclamations.

# PLEASANT CREEK HOSPITAL.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor-General and Legislative Council of the Colony of New South Wales, passed in the eleventh year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled "*An Act to enable certain public hospitals to sue and be sued in the name of their treasurer, and to provide for the taking and holding of real property belonging to such hospitals respectively*," it was amongst other things enacted that, whenever the Governor should deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to any hospital thereafter to be established in any town in the said colony not mentioned in the said Act, it should and might be lawful for the said Governor to declare the same by Proclamation, to be published in the *Government Gazette*; and from and after the publication thereof the said Act should be deemed and taken to apply to the hospital or hospitals to be specified in such Proclamation to all intents and purposes as fully and effectually as if the said hospital or hospitals were specially named therein: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation declare that, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said Act, I have extended the provisions of the said Act to the hospital called and known as the "Pleasant Creek Hospital," situated at Stawell, in Victoria aforesaid.

\*(1.) If a General Register Office certificate cannot be obtained, the instructions printed below will show what evidence should be supplied. If evidence is already in the hands of the Commissioners, strike out "A certificate of my birth," and insert "Evidence is already in the possession of the Commissioners."

†(2.) The terms indicated by the marks of quotation must appear in the certificate, which must be given after personal examination, and bear date not earlier than 1st January 1872.

‡(3.) Two testimonials must be sent bearing date not earlier than 1st January 1872. One of them should be given by an intimate acquaintance (not a relative) of not less than three or four years' standing; the other, if the candidate has recently left school, should be given by his late school-master, or if he has had employment of any kind, by his late employer. If the candidate has been at any university, he should send a certificate of good conduct from his college tutor.

§(4.) If mathematics be named, state whether pure or mixed, or both are intended; if natural science be mentioned, state which branches.

## EVIDENCE OF AGE TO BE REQUIRED FROM CANDIDATES FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

I.—Every candidate born in England or Wales should produce a certificate from the Registrar-General of Births, Marriages, and Deaths, or from one of his provincial officers. This certificate may be obtained at Somerset House, or from the Superintendent Registrar of the district in which the birth took place.

II.—A candidate who is a native of India must have his age certified by the Government of India, or of the presidency or province in which he may have resided.

III.—Every other candidate not producing the certificate mentioned in clause I, must prove his age by statutory declaration, and should also, if possible, produce a record of birth or baptism from some official register; under which term may be included the parochial registers of baptisms, the non-parochial registers of baptisms and births deposited at Somerset House under Acts of Parliament, the register kept at the India Office of persons born in India, &c., &c. This regulation applies—

1. To all candidates not born in England or Wales.
2. To candidates, who, though born in England or Wales, cannot produce the Registrar-General's certificate.

The Civil Service Commissioners reserve to themselves the right of deciding in each case upon the sufficiency of the evidence produced, but they subjoin the following general rules for the guidance of candidates:—

- (a.) The declaration should specify precisely the date and place of birth, and should, if possible, be made by the father or mother of the candidate. If made by any other person, it should state the circumstances which enable the declarant to speak to the fact. If an entry in a Bible or other family record be referred to, the Bible or other record must be produced at the time of making the declaration, and must be mentioned in the declaration as having been so produced.
- (b.) If the candidate was born in England or Wales, the declaration must contain a statement that after due inquiry no entry has been found in the books of the Registrar-General; or a separate declaration must be made to that effect.
- (c.) If no extract from any register is produced, the declaration must contain a statement that, after due inquiry, no such record is believed to exist; or a separate declaration must be made to that effect.
- (d.) Statutory declarations must be exactly in the form prescribed by the Act of 5 and 6 William IV., c. 62. A printed form, if required, will be supplied on application to the Civil Service Commissioners.

N.B.—Clergymen, as such, are not qualified to take declarations.

# REGULATIONS UNDER "THE VOLUNTEER STATUTE 1865."

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the following alterations in the Regulations under the Volunteer Statute of 1865 (28 Victoria 226), viz.:—Clauses 26 to 40 are hereby cancelled, and the following clauses substituted; to take effect from 14th October instant.

## DEFINITION OF EFFECTIVES.

### Cavalry.

26. At the commencement of any year the following volunteers, and no others, will be classed as effectives in the cavalry branch of the force:—

- (a.) Any volunteer who was enrolled before the 1st of October of the year next preceding, and who has during that year—
  - (1.) Attended twelve mounted parades, one of which shall be an official inspection.
  - (2.) Attended twelve other, either mounted or dismounted parades, or both.
- (b.) Any volunteer who was enrolled between the 1st October and 31st December of the year next preceding, and has during that year—
  - (1.) Attended nine mounted parades, one of which shall be an official inspection.
  - (2.) Attended nine other, either mounted or dismounted parades, or both.
- (c.) Any volunteer who was enrolled between the 1st January and 31st March of the year next preceding, and who has during that year—
  - (1.) Attended six mounted parades, one of which shall be an official inspection.
  - (2.) Attended six other, either mounted or dismounted parades, or both.

27. No person shall be enrolled in any troop until he has gone through six recruit drills, either mounted or dismounted, or both.

28. No mounted parades will count towards classification at which less than fifteen members shall have been present, and no other parades or drills will count at which less than ten members shall have been present.

29. Every troop shall parade for inspection three times in each year, on such days and at such hours as shall be appointed by the officer in command of the force.

30. No troop will be allowed to return more than thirty effectives, unless when a troop has horsed a gun at its own expense, when twelve extra effectives will be allowed. Any members in excess of this number are to be considered as supernumerary.

31. At the commencement of each year the commanding officer of each troop will be credited with the sum of £3 for each effective member of his troop.

32. No claim shall be admitted at the commencement of any year if the number of effectives of a corps be below twenty, and the services of such corps shall be dispensed with.

## ARTILLERY AND RIFLE VOLUNTEERS.

33. At the commencement of any year the following volunteers, and no others, will be classed as effective in the above-named branches of the force:—

### Artillery (Field Batteries).

- (a.) Any volunteer who was enrolled before the 1st October of the year next preceding, and who has gone through a course of musketry instruction for that year, and has also during that year—
  - (1.) Attended two full battery parades of not less than six (6) guns fully manned.
  - (2.) Attended and passed two parades for official inspection with guns.
  - (3.) Attended thirteen other parades.
  - (4.) Attended seven other, either parades or drills.
- (b.) Any volunteer who was enrolled between the 1st October and 31st December of the year next preceding, and has during that year—
  - (1.) Attended two full battery parades of not less than six (6) guns fully manned.
  - (2.) Attended and passed two parades for official inspection with guns.
  - (3.) Attended nine other parades.
  - (4.) Attended five other, either parades or drills.
- (c.) Any volunteer who was enrolled between the 1st January and 31st March of the year next preceding, and who has during that year—

- (b.) Any volunteer who was enrolled between the 1st October and 31st December of the year next preceding, and has during that year—
  - (1.) Attended two battalion parades, or two full battery parades of not less than six (6) guns fully manned.

  - (3.) Attended nine other parades.

- (c.) Any volunteer who was enrolled between the 1st January and 31st March of the year next preceding, and who has during that year—
  - (1.) Attended one battalion parade.
  - (2.) Attended and passed at one parade for official inspection.
  - (3.) Attended seven other parades.
  - (4.) Attended three other, either parades or drills.

### Parades.

34. In the definition of an effective, a parade shall mean an assembly of a corps under arms in the open air, whereat not less than 40 members are present for three quarters of an hour at least. Should the corps, having assembled in sufficient numbers, be dismissed from inclement weather, before the three-quarters of an hour be passed, the officer commanding the force may allow the parade to be returned.

35. A drill shall mean any assembly of a corps for drill whereat not less than twenty members are present. Officers commanding corps may not return in any month more than four parades and four drills ordered by themselves.

36. For the purposes of battalion drill or inspection, the officer commanding the force may order other parades of corps in addition to the four specified in the preceding regulation, which may be returned by officers commanding corps.

37. A battalion parade shall mean an assemblage of two or more corps under the conditions of the regulations defining a parade.

## ENGINEER VOLUNTEERS.

38. At the commencement of any year the following volunteers, and no others, will be classed as effective in the above-named branch of the force:—

- (a.) Any volunteer who was enrolled before the 1st October of the year next preceding, and who has during that year—
  - (1.) Attended two battalion parades.
  - (2.) Attended nine parades of the corps.
  - (3.) Attended and passed an official inspection.
  - (4.) Passed an official inspection in some branch of military engineering.
  - (5.) Attended eighteen musters of the corps for exercise and instruction, of which ten at least were for engineering instruction.
  - (6.) Gone through a course of musketry instruction.
- (b.) Any volunteer who was enrolled between the 1st October and 31st December of the year next preceding, and who has during that year—
  - (1.) Attended two battalion parades.
  - (2.) Attended and passed an official inspection.
  - (3.) Passed an official inspection in some branch of military engineering.
  - (4.) Attended six parades of the corps.
  - (5.) Attended twelve musters of the corps for exercise and instruction, of which seven at least were for engineering instruction.

(c.) Any volunteer who was enrolled between the 1st January and 31st March of the year next preceding, and who has during that year—

- (1.) Attended one battalion parade.
- (2.) Attended and passed one parade for official inspection.
- (3.) Attended five parades of the corps.
- (4.) Attended nine musters of the corps for exercise and instruction, of which five at least were for engineering instruction.

#### SPECIAL REGULATIONS FOR VOLUNTEER ENGINEERS.

##### Enrolment.

39. No person shall be enrolled as a member of the Engineers unless he shall have been educated as an architect, surveyor, civil, mechanical, or mining engineer, or as an assistant to one or other of them, or be a skilled mechanic, or shall have served in the corps of Royal Engineers.

##### Parades.

40. A parade shall mean an assembly of the corps under arms in the open air, for instruction in the field exercises and evolutions of infantry, at which twenty at least are present.

#### SPECIAL REGULATIONS FOR THE TORPEDO AND TELEGRAPH CORPS.

Professional men serving in this corps on the 30th June in each year, approved by the commandant, may classify as effectives on the 1st July, provided the number of effectives does not exceed 30.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 13) it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time not less than thirty days before or after an annual election, or general election, or first appointment of councillors, whether under the Act No. CLXXVI. hereby repealed or this Act, for any shire, the Governor may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll in such shire, and if he shall think fit so to do, divide the shire into two or into three ridings, by such names and with such boundaries respectively as shall by Order in Council be assigned to the same, and may from time to time, subject to the like conditions, alter, vary, or rescind such Order: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll of the Shire of Glenelg, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act, and no counter-petition has since been presented to the Governor, praying him not to grant the prayer of the petition above mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the said Shire of Glenelg into three ridings, to be designated by the names and to be comprised within the boundaries which are hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:—

**THE NORTH RIDING.**—Commencing at a point in the centre of the road from Green Hills to Harrow on the intersection of the southern boundary of the parish of Brit-brit; thence west by the said parish boundary to the eastern boundary of the parish of Beerik; thence southerly by the parish boundary of Beerik to the south-east angle of that parish; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of the parishes of Beerik and Bruk-bruk to the south-west angle of the last said parish; thence northerly by the parish boundary to the north-west angle of the said parish of Bruk-bruk; thence westerly by the southern boundary of the parish of Brimbola to the Steep-bank rivulet; thence southerly by the Steep-bank rivulet to the River Glenelg; thence by the River Glenelg to the north-west angle of the parish of Nangeela; thence by a line due west to the eastern boundary of South Australia; thence north by the said eastern boundary to the Moquito Creek; thence easterly to and by the southern boundary of the electoral district and the River Glenelg to the junction of the Pigeon Ponds with the said river; thence south-easterly by the Pigeon Ponds and the most northern branch of the same to a point in the centre of the road from Green Hills to Harrow, where it crosses the said Pigeon Ponds; thence southerly by the centre of the said road to the commencing point.

**THE SOUTH RIDING.**—Commencing at the junction of the Stokes River with the River Glenelg; thence by the course of the River Glenelg to the junction of the River Wannon; thence by the River Wannon to the northern boundary of the parish of Sandford; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of the said parish of Sandford and the parishes of Merino and Coleraine to the south-east angle of the parish of Muntham; thence northerly by the eastern boundaries of the parishes of Muntham and Beerik to the south-west angle of the parish of Brit-brit; thence easterly by the southern boundary of the said parish of Brit-brit to a point in the centre of the road from Green Hills to Harrow; thence southerly by the centre of the said road to a point opposite the eastern angle of section XVII. in the parish of Tehara, in the county of Normanby; thence

by a line to the said eastern angle; thence by a line south to the north-east angle of section IV., in the parish of Grassdale; thence south by the eastern boundary of the said section to the south-east angle of allotment 4 of the said section; thence by a line south-west to the River Stokes; thence south-westerly by the said river to the commencing point.

No. 387, § 2) it is amongst other things enacted that if at any time in any road district, whether single or united, and whether the area be one hundred square miles or less, the total net annual value of the rateable property as appearing by the general rate then last made shall have amounted to or exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district a shire within the meaning of *The Shires Statute*, by such name as in and by the Order in Council may be assigned to the same; and the subdivisions, if any, of the district subsisting at the time of such constitution shall be and be called ridings of the shire: And whereas the total net annual value of the rateable property in the road district hereinafter mentioned, as appearing by the general rate now last made in such district, has exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, and it seems fit to constitute the same to be a shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order constitute the Road District hereinafter mentioned to be a Shire within the meaning of *The Shires Statute* by the name hereby assigned to the same, that is to say:—

#### STATE AID TO RELIGION ABOLITION ACT.

(ACT 391, SECOND SCHEDULE.)

#### MINING ON THE RAILWAY RESERVE, SANDHURST DISTRICT.

THE Governor in Council has authorized Samuel Davis, hereinafter styled Samuel Davis and party, subject to the conditions, restrictions, and regulations hereby imposed and made by the Governor in Council, and subject to conditions, restrictions, and regulations imposed and made by the Board of Land and Works in an instrument of even date herewith, to occupy for mining purposes the piece of land described in the schedule hereto, which forms a part of the lands reserved or set apart or used for railway purposes.

1. The said Samuel Davis and party shall not nor will sink shafts upon or otherwise break the surface of the said land, or use or occupy the surface thereof in any way, unless and until they shall have obtained the permission in writing of the Commissioner of Railways and Roads.

2. The said Samuel Davis and party shall not nor will mine, or make any drive, gallery, or work under the said land at a depth less than one hundred feet from the natural surface thereof.

3. It shall be lawful at any time for any officer authorized by the Commissioner of Railways and Roads or by the Minister of Mines, together with such person or persons as such officer may require for assistance, to visit and examine the shafts, galleries, drives, airways, and waterways on, under, or in connection with any workings within the said land, and to use any machinery therewith connected, whether the shafts, galleries, drives, airways, and waterways be within the said land or not; so that they be connected with any workings on or within the said land; and all persons employed in connection with such workings shall afford all necessary facilities to such officer and his assistants as may be required for the purposes of and with a view to such inspection.

4. The Engineer-in-Chief of Railways, or other officer authorized as aforesaid, may order that the galleries, drives, ways, passages, &c., be stowed, if necessary, or may order that such masonry or other works of art be made and erected at the cost of the said Samuel Davis and party as in his opinion may be required for the support of the surface or as a precaution against any contingent damage to the railway; and thereupon the said Samuel Davis and party shall cause the work so ordered to be well and truly done with all reasonable speed.

5. Previous to occupying any portion of the said land the said Samuel Davis and party shall deposit in the hands of the Receiver and Paymaster at Sandhurst the sum of Fifty pounds sterling, as a guarantee that they will observe and fulfil these conditions, such deposit to be retained until the said persons shall relinquish the land described in the schedule and discontinue mining operations; and if the said conditions, restrictions, and regulations shall then have been observed and fulfilled, the said deposit shall be returned to the depositors, but if any of them shall not then have been observed or fulfilled, then the whole, or such part of the sum so deposited as aforesaid as the Governor in Council shall think fit, shall by an Order of the Governor in Council be declared forfeited, and shall thereupon become public money, and be applied accordingly.

6. In case any person or persons employed in the mining operations hereby authorized shall in any way violate any of the above conditions, it shall not be lawful for him or them any longer to mine under, upon, or within the said land, or to continue in any way to occupy the same; and the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge whether or not any condition has been violated.

7. The Commissioner of Railways and Roads, or any person authorized by him in writing, shall have at any time power to order the immediate discontinuance of any mining operations within or under any part of the said land, whether the above conditions shall have been observed or not, and the mining operations shall thereupon be immediately discontinued; and an order in writing served on any one of the miners, or a written order posted on any part of the land described in the schedule, shall be sufficient notice.

8. The Governor in Council may at any time revoke this Order.

The deaths in September exceeded those in August by 5. They also exceeded the average of September during the previous ten years by 47. If, however, an allowance be made for the increase of population they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 2 only.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 73.8° on the 17th, and the lowest was 37.7° on the 6th. The mean temperature of the month (53.3°) was 4° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (35.3°) took place on the 6th, viz.:—from a maximum of 73° to a minimum of 37.7°. The least range (6.4°) was on the 22nd, viz.:—from a maximum of 58.1° to a minimum of 51.7°. The mean daily range was 18°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.938 inches) was slightly above the average.

Fifty-six per cent. of the deaths were of males, and 44 per cent. were of females; 37 per cent. were of children who had not attained their fifth year, against 32 per cent. in September 1870, 33 per cent. in September 1869, 37 per cent. in September 1868, 40 per cent. in September 1867, 41 per cent. in September 1866, 51 per cent. in September 1865, 38 per cent. in September 1864, 33 per cent. in September 1863, 43 per cent. in September 1862, and 40 per cent. in September 1861.

Ten persons of 75 years of age and upwards died during the month, viz.:—A male aged 75 of bronchitis, a male aged 79 of cancer, a male aged 79 of paralysis, a female aged 75 of injuries caused by being run over by a cab, a female aged 77 of heart disease, two males aged respectively 80 and 90, and three females aged respectively 75, 76, and 81, of old age.

Sixteen violent deaths occurred during the month, of which the following are the particulars:—A male infant aged 1 year was killed by being accidentally thrown from a cart, a stage carpenter aged 27 died of injuries caused by an iron pillar falling on him, a laborer aged 31 died of a fractured spine, the result of an injury received in connection with an hydraulic lift, a squatter aged 34 died of fracture of the skull caused by a fall from a horse, a laborer aged 36 fractured his neck by a fall over a precipice, a carpenter aged 48 died of fracture of the ribs and injury to the lung resulting from a fall, three persons were killed by vehicles, namely, a teacher of music aged 50, a carter aged 50, and a female aged 75; a commission agent aged 49 was accidentally poisoned by belladonna, a boy aged 4 and a male aged 45 were accidentally drowned, a fisherman's son aged 16 and a female cook aged 42 were found drowned, a female child aged 1 year was accidentally suffocated with a piece of lead, a carpenter aged 42 committed suicide by drowning.

Seventy-two deaths, or 25 per cent. of the whole, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—37 in the Melbourne Hospital, 5 in the Alfred Hospital, 5 in the Lying-in Hospital, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, and 5 in the Industrial Schools.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 104, of which 51, or 49 per cent., were of males, and 53, or 51 per cent., were of females; 70 were under one year of age, 16 were between one and two years, 8 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 176, of which 106, or 60 per cent., were males, and 70, or 40 per cent., were females; 6 were between five and ten, 4 were between ten and fifteen, 7 were between fifteen and twenty, 12 were between twenty and twenty-five, 18 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty-five, 23 were between thirty-five and forty, 14 were between forty and forty-five, 19 were between forty-five and fifty, 15 were between fifty and fifty-five, 11 were between fifty-five and sixty, 6 were between sixty and sixty-five, 7 were between sixty-five and seventy, 6 were between seventy and seventy-five, 7 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 3 were eighty and upwards.

The largest number of deaths resulted from Local diseases; the most fatal complaints being those of the nervous and respiratory systems. Fifty-five deaths were occasioned by Zymotic diseases, as against 51 in August. Of these, 29 were caused by whooping-cough in September and 23 in August. An equal number of deaths occurred from constitutional diseases in August and September. The numbers resulting from phthisis fell from 49 in the former month to 42 in the latter.
