GRANT FOR PURCHASE OF BOOKS FOR MECHANICS' INSTITUTES OR PUBLIC LIBRARIES, 1871-2.

THE Committees for the Management of Mechanics' Institutes or Public Libraries in country districts claiming to participate in the grant of £3000 for the purchase of Books are hereby requested to send in their applications before the 8th of March next.

The conditions attached to the item in the Appropriation Act are as follow:—

1. That grants be made in proportion to sum collected by private subscription or local rates during 1871.
2. That no grant exceeding £200 be paid to any one library.
3. That no grant be made to any institution in Melbourne, or more than one-sixth of the entire sum be divided amongst institutions within ten miles of it.

AID TO BUILDING FUND OF FREE LIBRARIES, 1871-2.

APPLICATION for a share in the sum of £2000 granted by the Legislature in Aid of the Building Fund of Free Libraries in the up-country districts will be received at this office until the 8th of March next.

No grant to any library is to exceed £500.

N.B.—To entitle any institution to share in this Grant, such institution must be *bona fide a free library*, that is, a library open to the public daily free of charge, as is the case with the Melbourne Public Library.

The following particulars must be furnished, viz.:—

1. The name of the institution, which should clearly indicate that it is a *FREE LIBRARY*.
2. The amount expended in the erection or purchase of the building, and the materials of which it is constructed.
3. The amount already contributed by the Government.
4. The amount locally subscribed, distinguishing between the sums subscribed before and since the last return.
5. Whether the land is the property of the institution, and whether granted by the Crown or purchased.
6. The number of books.
7. The number of visitors during 1871.

AN examination of Candidates for Certificates of Competency as Engineers and Surveyors of land and of works, will be held at a place to be notified in the *Argus*, at Ten o'clock on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, the 3rd, 4th, and 5th days of April next.

1. Field-work and Topography. Use and adjustment of instruments.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Act; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

No. 387, § 2) it is amongst other things enacted that if at any time in any road district, whether single or united, and whether the area be one hundred square miles or less, the total net annual value of the rateable property as appearing by the general rate then last made shall have amounted to or exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district a shire within the meaning of *The Shires Statute*, by such name as in and by the Order in Council may be assigned to the same; and the subdivisions, if any, of the district subsisting at the time of such constitution shall be and be called ridings of the shire: And whereas the total net annual value of the rateable property in the road district hereinafter mentioned, as appearing by the general rate now last made in such district, has exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, and it seems fit to constitute the same to be a shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order constitute the Road District hereinafter mentioned to be a Shire within the meaning of *The Shires Statute* by the name hereby assigned to the same; that is to say:—

THE UPPER YARRA ROAD DISTRICT, which was created by a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of September 1856, and was altered by subsequent Proclamation bearing date nineteenth day of August 1861, and was divided into electoral subdivisions by an Order of the 26th of November 1866, shall be and is hereby constituted and shall be named the

SHIRE OF LILLYDALE.

And the Honorable Francis Longmore, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

INSTRUCTIONS TO OFFICERS IN BRITISH POSSESSIONS ABROAD.
REGULATIONS FOR PREVENTING COLLISIONS.

Ship's Side Lights.

The following is the substance of an opinion recently given by the Attorney-General, the Solicitor-General, and the Queen's Advocate, viz:—

- (1.) That side lights and lanterns, otherwise unexceptionable, fixed in such a position that they may be obscured by the lower corners of the ship's square foresail, cannot be considered to be fixed as required by Article 3 of the Regulations.
- (2.) In the event of such side lights and lanterns being so fixed that the lower corners of the square foresail can obscure either or both such lights, the surveyors or inspectors may require the master or owner of the ship either to move the lanterns further forward, and to fix them where the lights cannot be obscured, or to cut off so much of the lower corners of her square foresail as causes, or is likely to cause, such obscuration.
- (3.) In the event of such master or owner neglecting or refusing to alter the position of the lanterns, or cut away such portion of her lower courses as the surveyor or inspector may direct, such surveyor or inspector may report the fact to the Collector of Customs, for the purpose of stopping the ship, and such Collector may refuse to grant the vessel a clearance under section 30 of *The Merchant Shipping Act amendment Act 1862*, until he receives a report from the surveyor or inspector to the effect that his requirements have been complied with.
- (4.) If after a vessel has been passed by such surveyor or inspector as carrying properly constructed and fixed lanterns and lights, the master fixes them in such a position that they may be or are obscured by the vessel's square foresail, and are not under such circumstances visible for a distance of two miles from right ahead to two points abaft the beam, on the respective sides, as required by Article 3, read in connection with Article 20 of the Regulations, such master will be guilty of a misdemeanor under section 27 of *The Merchant Shipping Act amendment Act 1862*.

AUCKLAND HARBOR.

Light on Bean Rocks, and Beacon on Bastion Reefs.

NOTICE is hereby given that, since the 1st December last, a fixed red, white, and green light, of the 5th order dioptric, has been exhibited between sunset and sunrise from a Lighthouse erected on the Bean Rocks.

The lighthouse is an open-framed structure, surmounted by keeper's dwelling and lantern, painted white, and elevated 50 feet above high water level. The light will be seen in clear weather a distance of ten nautical miles, allowing ten feet for the height of the observer's eye, and will show red, white, and green respectively, between the following bearings, all of which are given towards the light, viz. —

Red—Between the bearings of W.½S. and S.W. by W.½W.; that is red in the Tehmaki Strait, and on the south side of Korocho Channel, covering the reef north of Korocho Island.

White—Between the bearings of S.W. by W.½W. and S.W.½W., i.e., white in the fairway of Korocho Channel and the south-eastern side of the Hieh Channel.

Green—Between the bearings of S.W.½W. and S.S.E.½E., i.e., green on the north-western side of the Korocho and Hieh Channels, and on the eastern side of Rangitoto Channel, covering Rangitoto Reef.

White—Between the bearings of S.S.E.½E. and S.E.½S., i.e., white in the fairway of Rangitoto Channel.

Red—Between the bearings of S.E.½S. and E. by N.½N., i.e., red on the western shore of Rangitoto Channel covering the Rough Rock, and on the northern shore of the Harbor covering the Sandspit Buoy and Depot Point.

White—Between the bearings of E. by N.½N. and N.E.½E., i.e., white in the fairway of the Harbor, and over its southern shore above Oraki or Hobson's Bay.

There will be no light visible south of the Lighthouse, between the bearings of N.E.½E. and W.½S., i.e., southward of a line drawn from Resolution Point to the Lighthouse, and thence to East Tehmaki Head.

Vessels entering Auckland Harbor by the North or Rangitoto Channel should make the white or fairway light, steering in on this line of light until the summit of the North Head bears S.W., then keep away south across the red into the white (harbor) fairway light, bringing the three white lights (in a triangle) on Queen street wharf to bear S.W. by W.½W. which will lead up the harbor to the usual anchorage ground below the wharf.

Vessels having to work in should not enter on the green light when near Rangitoto Reef, i.e., when the peak of Rangitoto bears E.½N., nor on the red when the flagstaff on the summit of Mount Victoria bears S.W.½W., as they will on this latter bearing be in vicinity of the Rough Rock; they must also keep well in the white light when passing the Sandspit Buoy and Depot Point.

Vessels entering by the Tehmaki Strait will see the red light over the low southern part of Korocho Island, and, taking care not to approach within one mile of the Island, pass through the red into the white fairway light of Korocho Channel; then steer so as to pass about two cables' length N.W. of the lighthouse, crossing the colored lights of the Rangitoto Channel into the white harbor fairway light, and for the anchorage as before described.

Vessels entering by the Hieh Channel will keep on the line (S.W.½W.) intersecting the green and white lights, edging away into the white in passing the N.W. extreme of Hieh Island, and thence up the Korocho Channel and into the Harbor as before described.

Beacon on Bastion Reefs.

Notice is hereby given that the Beacon hitherto marking the position of the Bean Rocks, is now erected on the north-eastern extreme of the Bastion Reefs, and from it the lighthouse bears N.W., distant three cables.

Note.—All bearings are magnetic, and are given towards the light.
