reefs extending in S.S.E. direction from North Tiger Island towards Kalao Toea.

North Tiger Island is the most north-easterly of a group of coral islands lying east from the south end of Pulo Saleyer (Celebes) and called "Tiger Islands."

Many of them are covered with trees and brushwood, while some are merely patches, dry at low water.

They are all surrounded by large reefs forming a large chain of patches and shoals to the S. and S.S.E.

The commander of the Government steamer *Hertog Bernard* found, by many observations, the position of North Tiger Island to be in lat. $6^{\circ} 21'$ S. and long. $121^{\circ} 8'$ E. from Greenwich.

The master of the *Xantho* reports a safe passage to the N.N.W. between "Kalao Toea" and "Postpaard Island," for ships coming from the south.

North Tiger Island is visible from a vessel's deck at a distance of 8 miles.

No anchorage was found.

TELEGRAPH CABLE, JAVA.

NOTICE is hereby given that the submarine telegraph-cable across the Straits of Sunda is laid down from Anjer along the west coast of Java to Java's fourth point, and thence in the direction north 54° west.

The direction of the cable from Anjer to the "4th Point" is indicated by three white buoys, on which is painted in black the word "Kabel." They have on the top a small flag with the Dutch colors and the word "Telegraaf" in the white.

A similar buoy is placed at Telok-Betong, near the landing-place of the cable, in 5 fathoms; and the direction of the shore end is indicated by two white beacons.

It is therefore not allowed to anchor:—

1°. On the west coast of Java:

a. Between the line of the three white buoys and the coast.

b. Between the bearings—

Lighthouse on "4th Point," S. 40° E. and S. 70° E.

(During the night this part of the horizon will be illuminated by a fixed bright dioptrical light, with a range of visibility from a vessel's deck of eight nautical miles. It is placed in the stone tower from which the second order light of "Java's fourth point" is shown). And

c. As long as two lights, one under the other, are seen on "Java's 4th Point."

2°. At Telok-Betong:—

a. Eastward of the line marked by two white beacons.

b. Inside of the white buoy.

Any ship having been compelled to drop the anchor where this is not allowed by this notice, must weigh it carefully, and not set sail till it is certain that the cable has not been lifted up at the same time.

When this might be the case, the cable must be taken from the anchor and slipped with the greatest care, so that it can in no way be damaged.

**TIMBER RESERVE IN THE PARISHES OF BALLARAT,
CRESWICK, AND BUNGAREE.**

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and Baron BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and may from time to time, after one month's notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works may issue Licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee as shall from time to time be approved of by the Governor, and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as a Reserve made for the preservation and growth of timber, in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the 53rd section of the above-recited Act, the land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the Common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

YACKANDANDAH GOLDFIELD COMMON.—The Yackandandah Goldfield Common, described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 28th day of January 1861, and the 23rd day of November 1868, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries described as follow, viz.: Commencing at the north angle of allotment 4 of section L, parish of Yackandandah; thence by the road which forms the south-eastern boundary of
