JETTY LIGHT.—PORT FAIRY.

On and after the fifteenth day of April instant, a *green* light will be exhibited, from sunset to sunrise, from the end of the Jetty at Port Fairy; the light will be cut, to clear the buoy off the foul ground to the northward of the lighthouse, and will be visible between the bearings of W.S.W. and South at a distance of about three (3) miles.

Vessels entering Port Fairy should steer in until the *green* light on the jetty is opened out when steer for it and anchor. The best anchorage is in about three (3) fathoms at about a cable's length to the N.W. of the black buoy off the foul ground with the light on Rabbit Island bearing S.S.E.

COMMON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described as a Common, in accordance with the above recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

Foxhow Common.—The unappropriated Crown lands within the town of Foxhow shall be and constitute a common. Area available for commonage, about 650 acres.—(71.C.18066.)

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and in the thirty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.

The Council of the Shire of Newstead shall, within twelve months from the 26th of March aforesaid, drain form, and metal sixty-three chains and fifty-five links of the Newstead to Mount Prospect Main Road.

to be (vice Edward Clark, whose term of office has expired) Manager of the Sandridge roads, *via* Prince's Bridge and *via* Falls Bridge, proclaimed Common-toll roads under Orders in Council of 28th December 1863, and 11th April and 30th May 1864; and that he shall, on the 27th day of each month, receive from the collectors and lessees of all tolls upon the roads so proclaimed, and upon the bridges thereon, all moneys collected by them as and for such tolls, or due by them as the rents thereof; and that he shall within four days after the receipt thereof distribute the amount so collected amongst the local bodies interested therein, in the proportions directed by Order in Council of 15th August 1864; such appointment to be in force from 1st January to 31st December 1872.

The deaths in February were fewer than those in January by 100, but they exceeded the average of the month in the previous ten years by 6. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of February by 64.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 95°9' on the 17th, and the lowest was 48°3' on the 8th. The mean temperature of the month (64°9') was nearly 1° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (35°9') took place on the 17th, viz.:—from a maximum of 95°9' to a minimum of 60°. The least range (7°) was on the 21st, viz.:—from a maximum of 65° to a minimum of 58°. The mean daily range was 19°8'. The mean atmospheric pressure (29'963 inches) was slightly above the average.

Males and females contributed 51 and 49 per cent. respectively to the total mortality. Children who had not attained their fifth year contributed 56 per cent. against 65 per cent. in February 1871; 55 per cent. in February 1870; 60 per cent. in February 1869; 57 per cent. in February 1868; 74 per cent. in February 1867; 53 per cent. in February 1866; 64 per cent. in February 1865; 62 per cent. in February 1864; 65 per cent. in February 1863, and 68 per cent. in February 1862.

Four persons of 75 years of age and upwards died during the month, viz.:—A male, aged 77, of disease of the valves of the heart; a female, aged 75, of enteritis; a female, aged 76, and a male, aged 85, of old age.

Fourteen violent deaths occurred during the month, all of which were attributed to accident. The following are the particulars:—A boy aged 2½ died of internal injuries, caused by a cart-wheel passing over his body; a laborer aged 23 was killed by a railway train, a carter aged 27 was killed by the wheel of a dray passing over his head, a carpenter aged 35 died of fracture of the skull, a fireman aged 43 died of injuries received from machinery on board the s.s. *You Yangs*, a seaman aged 45 was killed by a railway train, a cab-driver aged 50 was killed by his cab passing over him; three youths, aged respectively 13, 14, and 17, a draper's assistant aged 28, and a brass-fitter aged 65, were drowned; two male infants were suffocated, one in its mother's arms, and the other in bed.

Sixty-two deaths, or 17 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—21 in the Melbourne Hospital, 6 in the Alfred Hospital, 5 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 11 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Industrial Schools, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, and 1 in the hulk *Sacramento*.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 203, of which 101, or 49 per cent., were of males, and 107, or 51 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 152 were under one year of age, 43 were between one and two years, 5 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 163, of which 87, or 53 per cent., were males, and 76, or 47 per cent., were females; 8 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 13 were between fifteen and twenty, 13 were between twenty and twenty-five, 13 were between twenty-five and thirty, 5 were between thirty and thirty-five, 18 were between thirty-five and forty, 13 were between forty and forty-five, 17 were between forty-five and fifty, 11 were between fifty and fifty-five, 8 were between fifty-five and sixty, 11 were between sixty and sixty-five, 12 were between sixty-five and seventy, 6 were between seventy and seventy-five, 3 were between seventy-five and eighty, 1 was eighty and upwards, and 1 was of age unspecified.

BALLARAT DISTRICT.

I HAVE the honor to forward you the quarterly report, ending 31st March, on the state of the Ballarat District.

There is no scab in this district to my knowledge. I have issued no licenses, nor had any prosecutions this quarter.

Since coming into the Ballarat District, on the 15th January last, I have inspected 201,736 sheep in the Corporation Yards and through the district, and found no trace of disease.

BEECHWORTH DISTRICT.

I HAVE the honor to furnish you with a report of the state of the Beechworth District, as regards scab, in accordance with the 12th section of the *Scab Act*, and to state scab has again broken out on Barwidgee station in 3000 sheep; also in 371 sheep the property of Mr. David Patton, farmer, at Bowman's Forest. These sheep were purchased from Mrs. Box, of Barwidgee station, in January last. I am pleased to report there has been no outbreak of scab in the district beyond the above-mentioned cases; all the other sheep in the district, as far as I know, are free from scab. I have further the honor to state, Messrs. Dale and Issett, butchers, at Wangaratta, have each been fined £50 for driving sheep from the Benalla clean

district into the Beechworth clean district without an inspector's authority. Mr. Timothy O'Rourke, butcher, at Bright, has also been fined £50 for crossing sheep from New South Wales into the Beechworth clean district without an inspector's authority. Mrs. Box, of Barwidgee, has been fined £100 for neglecting to license her scabby sheep. Mr. Patton also fined £18 11s. for owning 371 unlicensed scabby sheep, and further fined £5 for neglecting to register his sheep brand.

BENALLA DISTRICT.

I HAVE the honor, in accordance with section 12 of the *Scab Act*, to transmit you the following report of the state of this district relative to scab during the quarter ending 31st March. I am sorry to state that scab has broken out on the Killawarra run during this quarter. At a special meeting of my board it was recommended to place the said run in quarantine. On finding that the disease had reappeared, I, without delay, examined the adjoining paddocks of other runs, and found them in a satisfactory condition, which enables me to believe that the disease is, to all appearance, confined to Killawarra, and more especially as it made no headway there. I am glad to inform you that prompt measures have been taken by the present owners to eradicate the disease. I may here mention that, during the delivery of Killawarra in December last, not one woolly sheep had gone through the yards. I mustered and yarded the same sheep in November, and I only found one, which was perfectly clean, and which had been killed; but, at the mustering for dipping last week, no less than nine woolly sheep had been picked up, some of which were very scabby, and which no doubt has been the cause of the recent breaking out. I have inspected the most of the other stations which were last year in quarantine, and I am glad to say that they are, to all appearance, clean.

GEELONG DISTRICT.

I HAVE the honor to hand this my report of district for the first quarter of the present year, in accordance with section 12 of the Scab Act.

I am sorry to state that the Messrs. Staughton Brothers, of Exford, sheep were found by them, the end of January, to again show scab, and as they could not renew the license (it having expired) and their time was up with the property, they determined to kill the flock off, which was done under my supervision, and no penalties were inflicted.

I have to report that I found scab in a lot of 149 sheep, the property of Mr. William Kent, of Oaklands, Saltwater Creek, in the market yards on Monday the 11th ultimo, and on going to his place found the rest of his flock infected, as well as that of his neighbours, Messrs. Dalgetty, Ibbotson, and Blackwood, at Forest station, in charge of Mr. John L. Dow. Both of these stations have been licensed and placed in quarantine.

I have further to report that on Monday the 18th I received notice from Mr. D. H. Dow, manager for Messrs. Dalgetty, Ibbotson, and Blackwood, at Marathon, Sutherland's Creek, that he had found scab in two flocks under his charge, and on my going there to inspect the sheep I found three other flocks out of five infected, and some of the sheep with large patches on them, showing great neglect in allowing them to get so bad.

All the sheep on the station have been licensed, as the flocks were all mixed throughout, and the property placed in quarantine, and all traffic stopped by direction of the Board of Advice.

Mr. John Rout Hopkins, of Wormbete, was fined at the Winchelsea Police Court on the 15th February, under section 33 in the sum of £100, under section 32 £20, and under section 35 £20, with costs, £5 5s. I also summoned Mr. W. Kent under section 52 for travelling his infected sheep, but the case was dismissed, as the bench did not consider there was sufficient evidence of travelling; but the case has gone to the Attorney-General for his opinion on the matter.

These outbreaks of scab have thrown the district back, and the Board of Advice have given up the idea for the present of having any part of it proclaimed a clean district.

I attended, as instructed, the sale of the stock of the late Thos. Austin at Barvon Park, on the 4th and 5th ultimo, and forwarded the necessary documents to the different inspectors acting in the following districts, viz.:—Ballarat, Benalla, Gippsland, Hamilton, Hexham, Seymour, and Wimmera, besides a large number that went into the Melbourne and those remaining in this district purchased by residents. They realised most extraordinary high prices, the sheep being by no means in good condition.

I am unable as yet to report fully as to the state of the district, as I only arrived here from Hamilton at the end of January. In February I was detained in office for ten (10) days (beyond the office days), pending cases re Lloyd Jones, and have been engaged for ten (10) days in the present month travelling with you on your tour of inspection through the district.

I found scab in one of the flocks on Warrenbayne station, and have issued a license to Mr. Ross for 1500 sheep; also on Mr. Lloyd Jones' station, Avenel, and he has applied for a license for 8000 sheep.

Mr. Lloyd Jones has been fined Two hundred and seventy-five pounds (£275), in three cases, under clause 33 of the Scab Act.

Applications have been made to have most of the stations in this district released from quarantine.

WIMMERA DISTRICT.

In compliance with the provisions of *The Scab Act 1870*, I have the honor to furnish the following report for the quarter ending 31st March.

The sheep in the Wimmera district continue free from scab. I have granted authority for 25,970 sheep to enter the Wimmera clean district during the quarter, 6000 of which were from South Australia.

Angus Smith, of Mazeppa, was fined £55 for driving sheep into the Wimmera clean district without authority. Two persons were fined 20s. each for neglecting to give the notice required of their intention to drive sheep over land on which other sheep are kept; also five sheepowners, in the sum of £5 each, for neglecting to register the brands of sheep owned by them. I would take this opportunity of impressing on sheepowners the necessity of making themselves acquainted with the provisions of the Scab Act, and that it applies to all sheep in Victoria without distinction.

Tenders will be opened in the presence of tenderers, and such tenderers as can conveniently attend are requested to do so. Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond of one-third of the estimated amount of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved securities are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound and sweet, and properly trussed; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses be required to be stationed in any of the districts tendered for, the supplies required may be drawn from the contractor. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his contract.

4. 5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

7. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

8.
