REGULATIONS FOR THE PREVENTION OF THE INTRODUCTION OF CONTAGIOUS DISEASES INTO NETHERLANDS INDIA.

THE Governor has directed the Despatch and Proclamation hereto subjoined to be published for general information.

My Lord,—I transmit to you for your information a translation of a Proclamation (4th August 1871) issued by the Governor-General of Netherlands India, to prevent the introduction of certain contagious diseases into the Dutch Indian Possessions, and for the enforcement of quarantine in certain cases.

[Translation.]

The attention of those concerned is directed to the following Ordinance, promulgated by the Governor-General of Netherlands India in the official paper (*Staatsblad*) of Netherlands India, 1871, No. 109, under date of 4th August 1871:—

In the King's name!

The Governor-General of Netherlands India, having heard the Council of Netherlands India, sends greeting, and notifies to all who shall see these presents or hear them read—

That he, considering it desirable that measures be adopted for the prevention, as far as possible, of the introduction into Netherlands India of contagious diseases imperilling the general health;

In observance of articles 20, 29, 31, and 33 of the Regulations for Conducting the Government of Netherlands India;

Having read the Colonial Minister's communication of 19th May 1871, let. AAZ, No. 2609;

Has thought proper and has resolved,

By virtue of the King's authorization, to establish the following general regulations for the prevention of the introduction into Netherlands India of contagious diseases imperilling the general health:—

Article 1. Ships and vessels wherein contagious diseases dangerous to the general health, such as cholera, yellow fever, asiatic plague, small pox, and others of a similar character prevail, or have prevailed during the voyage just completed, or if such ships and vessels come from places where contagious diseases prevailed at the time of their departure, must, on their arrival in a roadstead of Netherlands India bear a yellow flag at the foretop.

Article 2. All intercourse of any ship or vessel arriving and bearing the yellow flag with the shore and with other ships and vessels in the roadstead, or in the vicinity of the roadstead, without distinction, is, saving what is directed in Article 3, forbidden.

No. 22.—APRIL 19, 1872.—1.

For each transgression of this prohibition committed by any one belonging to the ship or vessel, or who has made the voyage therewith, the commander will be punished by a fine of 100 to 1000 florins.

Any one, without being authorized to do so by virtue of these regulations, shall go on board such ship or vessel will be punished, according to his nationality, by imprisonment or by labor on the public works, for a period of eight days to a month.

The Commander of the Guardship, or where no such vessel is present, the Harbor Master is to attend to the maintenance of the prohibition, in accordance with the directions given thereupon.

Article 3. If it should afterwards appear that, although the ship or vessel is in the condition described in Article 1, the yellow flag was not hoisted upon it on its arrival, the commander incurs a fine of 500 to 5000 florins.

The Commander of the Guardship, or where no such vessel is present, the Harbor Master, then orders that the yellow flag be immediately hoisted.

Article 4. When any ship or vessel bearing a yellow flag comes to a roadstead, or when the yellow flag is hoisted after arrival in the roadstead, according to the provision in Article 3, an officer of health from the guardship, or, in places where there is no guardship, a civil or military medical man, to be appointed by the Chief of the Local Administration, shall go as speedily as possible, observing the prescribed measures of precaution, on board the newly-arrived ship, for the purpose of instituting a diligent inquiry as to the nature of the disease.

All officers and others charged with any civil or military medical service are bound to perform that service with the greatest speed.

A report of the result of the inquiry is to be immediately made, both to the Chief of the Local Administration and the Commander of the Guardship, or, in places where there is no guardship, to the Harbor Master, so that the necessary measures may be taken in accordance with the existing regulations in this respect, to isolate the newly-arrived ship, to render assistance to the commander, and to attend to the sick.

If, however, it should be found that there is no danger of contagion, then permission is immediately to be given to haul down the yellow flag; and this serves as a sign that the prohibition against the opening of communication with the shore or with other vessels is revoked.

The same is done so soon as the Chief of the Local Administration has declared, on the advice of the medical man, that all danger of contagion is at an end.

Article 5. The Chief of the Local Administration is to give immediate information, by telegraph if possible, of the measures referred to in the third paragraph of Article 4, as well as of the declaration mentioned in the last paragraph of that Article, to the Commander of the Naval Force, the Chief of the Department of Marine, and to the Director of Instruction, Worship, and Industry, and, if he is not himself the Acting Chief of the District, also to the Chief of the District Administration.

Article 6. In ships or vessels whereon the yellow flag has been hoisted it must not be hauled down without the express order of the Commander of the Guardship, or, in places where there is no Guardship, of the Harbor Master.

After sunset two lighted lanterns must be placed, one under the other, on the foretop.

For every transgression of these regulations the commander will incur a fine of 500 to 5,000 florins.

Article 7. The commander of any ship or vessel whereon the yellow flag is hoisted, is bound to execute, immediately and strictly, the measures prescribed to him by the authorities authorized thereto, in accordance with this ordinance.

If necessary the aid of the armed force will be called in to enforce the execution of those measures.

Article 8. Ship and cargo are liable and seizable for the payment of the fines laid upon the commander by virtue of Articles 2, 3, and 6.

The sentence of condemnation shall always contain the declaration that the officer charged with the execution is authorized to continue the embargo on the ship or vessel, and to prevent the departure thereof until the fines are paid, if the sale in execution should be considered inadvisable by the Chief of the Local Administration in the interest of general health.

Transitory Provision.—Article 1 and the first paragraph of Article 3 first come into operation with the seventh month after the promulgation of this ordinance.

The second paragraph of Article 3 and the rest of the provisions of this ordinance are, nevertheless, applicable to the ships and vessels referred to in the first paragraph of Article 3, which arrive in a roadstead of Netherlands India, within seven months after the promulgation.

And in order that no one shall plead ignorance hereof, it shall be inserted in the official paper (*Staatsblad*) of Netherlands India, and, so far as necessary, be posted up in the Native and Chinese languages.

It is, moreover, ordered and commanded that all superior and inferior communities and public persons, officers, and justiciaries, each for so far as concerns him, shall maintain the strict observance hereof, without connivance or respect of person.

ORDERS AND REGULATIONS RELATIVE TO LICENSES FOR WATER EASEMENTS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fifteenth day of April 1872.

WHEREAS by section 55 of *The Land Act 1869* it is enacted that the Board of Land and Works may grant licenses to deepen, widen, clean, repair, or otherwise improve any race, drain, dam, or reservoir, or to take any water therefrom, upon and through any land described in such license in the same manner as if the same were situated on Crown lands, and the licensee may by the authority thereof and for the purposes therein expressed enter upon the land so conveyed; but such licensee shall make compensation to the owner of such land for any damage occasioned by such entry, to be determined by arbitration in such manner as shall be determined by regulations to be made by the Governor. And whereas by section 110 of the said Act the Governor acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, has power to make rules, regulations, and orders for providing for all proceedings, forms of grants, leases, licenses, and other instruments: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by these presents make, for the purpose of determining the form of the said license and the mode by which such compensation shall be ascertained, the regulations following, that is to say:—

1. If any licensee under any license granted by the Board of Land and Works under the powers conferred by the 55th section of *The Land Act 1869*, and the owner of any land affected thereby, or his agent cannot agree as to the amount of compensation occasioned by the entry of such licensee upon the land of such owner, then, unless both shall concur in the appointment of a single arbitrator, each party, on the request of the other party, shall nominate and appoint an arbitrator to whom such dispute shall be referred; and such appointment shall be made under the hand of such party, or, if such party be a corporation aggregate, under the common seal of such corporation, and such appointment shall be delivered to the arbitrator and shall be deemed a submission to arbitration on the part of the party by whom the same shall be made; and after any such appointment shall have been made neither party shall have power to revoke such appointment without the consent of the other party, nor shall the death of either party operate as a revocation: And if for the space of fourteen days after any such dispute shall have arisen, and after a request in writing, in which shall be stated the matter so required to be referred to arbitration, shall have been served by the one party upon the other party to appoint an arbitrator, such last-mentioned party fail to appoint such arbitrator, then upon such failure the party making the request, and having himself appointed an arbitrator, may appoint such arbitrator to act on behalf of both parties, and such arbitrator may proceed to hear and determine the matters which shall be in dispute, and in such case the award or determination of such single arbitrator shall be final.

2. If before the matter so referred shall be determined any arbitrator appointed by either party die or become incapable, the party by whom such arbitrator was appointed may nominate and appoint, in writing, some other person to act in his place, and if for the space of seven days after notice in writing from the other party for that purpose he fail to do so, the remaining or other arbitrator may proceed *ex parte*; and every arbitrator so to be substituted shall have the same powers as were vested in the former arbitrator at the time of his death or disability as aforesaid.

3. Where more than one arbitrator shall have been appointed such arbitrators shall, before they enter upon the matters so referred to them, nominate and appoint, by writing under their

hands, an umpire to decide upon any such matters on which they shall differ; and if such umpire shall die, or refuse, or become incapable to act, they shall forthwith, after such death, refusal, or incapacity, appoint another umpire in his place, and the decision of such umpire upon the matters so referred to him shall be final.

4. If when any such single arbitrator shall have been appointed, and such arbitrator shall die, or refuse to act, or become incapable before he shall have made his award, the matters referred to him shall be determined by arbitration as if such arbitrator had not been appointed.

5. If, where more than one arbitrator shall have been appointed, either of the arbitrators refuse, or for seven days neglect to act, the other arbitrator may proceed *ex parte*, and the decision of such other arbitrator shall be as effectual as if he had been the single arbitrator appointed by both parties.

6. If where more than one arbitrator shall have been appointed, and where neither of the arbitrators shall refuse or become incapable, or neglect to act as aforesaid, such arbitrators shall fail to make their award within thirty days after the day on which the last of such arbitrators shall have been appointed, the matters referred to them shall be determined by the umpire to be appointed as aforesaid.

7. The said arbitrators or their umpire may call for the production of any documents in the possession or power of either party which he or they may think necessary for determining the matters in dispute.

8. The submission to any such arbitration may be made a rule of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria on the application of either of the parties.

9. Every such award shall be in the following form or the like effect:—

Award by Arbitration for damages occasioned by entry under License granted by the Board of Land and Works under powers contained in the 55th section of The Land Act 1869.

We, (or I) _____ have ascertained the compensation for the damage occasioned by the entry of [name of licensee] under license from the Board of Land and Works, dated [date of license], granted in pursuance of the powers contained in the 55th section of the *Land Act 1869*, to deepen, widen, clean, repair, or otherwise improve, or take water from the race, drain, dam, or reservoir, upon, through, or from the land [here describe the land as in the license] of which said land _____ is the owner; and we (or I) hereby award that the sum of £ _____ is the compensation to be paid by [insert name of licensee] to [insert name of owner], as and being such owner; and we (or I) hereby direct the said [name of licensee] to pay the said sum of £ _____ to the said [name of owner], as and being such owner as aforesaid, in full satisfaction and discharge of all damage occasioned by such entry.

10. And with respect to the form of license to be issued by the Board of Land and Works the following shall and hereby is declared to be and be issued as the said license:—

Form of License for Water Easements upon Lands other than Crown Lands.

Whereas by the fifty-fifth section of *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things provided that the Board of Land and Works may grant licenses to deepen, widen, clean, repair, or otherwise improve any race, dam, or reservoir, or take water therefrom, upon and through any land described in such license in the same manner as if the same were situated on Crown lands; and that such license may, by the authority thereof, and for the purposes therein expressed, enter upon the land so conveyed: Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works doth by these presents, in pursuance of the said recited powers, grant unto [name of licensee] license to [deepen, widen, clean, repair, or to otherwise improve, or to take water] from the [race, drain, dam, or reservoir] through and upon the land situate in the parish of _____, in the county of _____, and which [race, drain, dam, or reservoir], together with the lands through and upon which the same is cut or constructed, is more particularly described and shown on the plan here indorsed, the said [race, drain, dam, or reservoir], being thereon colored red; together with full license for the purposes herein expressed to enter upon the said land so situated as hereinafter mentioned, to hold the said [race, dam, or reservoir] and all rights thereto appertaining unto the said _____ from the _____ day of _____ A.D. 18 _____ for the term of _____; subject nevertheless to the terms and conditions following, that is to say:—

1. That the said Board do not guarantee possession of the said licensed premises.
2. That this license shall expire, and all the powers hereinbefore conferred shall cease and determine at the expiry of the time above stated: Provided always that the Board of Land Works may grant from time to time any renewal thereof, upon payment of such fee as to the said Board may seem just.

RIDINGS OF THE SHIRE OF DAREBIN.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eighth day of April 1872.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 13) it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time not less than thirty days before or after an annual election, or general election, or first appointment of councillors, whether under the Act No. CLXXVI hereby repeated or this Act, for any shire, the Governor may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll in such shire, and if he shall think fit so to do, divide the shire into two or into three ridings, by such names and with such boundaries respectively as shall by Order in Council be assigned to the same, and may from time to time, subject to the like conditions, alter, vary, or rescind such Order: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll of the Shire of Darebin, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the said Shire of Darebin into three ridings, to be designated by the names and to be comprised within the boundaries which are hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:—

The Woodstock Riding.—Commencing at centre of the road north of the north-west angle of section 28 in the parish of Merriang; thence east by the centre of that road to opposite the north-east angle of section 31 of the same parish; thence south to the north-east angle of section 18 of the same parish; thence east to the north-east angle of allotment 2 of section 9 in the parish of Toorourrong; thence south to the south-west angle of section 2 in the parish of Yan Yean; thence west to the south-west angle of section 4 in the parish of Kalkalla; thence north to the north-west angle of section 9 in the last-named parish; thence west to the south-west angle of section 15 in the same parish; thence north to the Merri-merri Creek; thence by the centre of the said creek to the south boundary of section 9 in the parish of Merriang; thence west to the south-west angle of the said section 9; and thence north to the point of commencement.

The Morang Riding.—Commencing at the centre of the road opposite the north-west angle of section 10 in the parish of Yan Yean; thence east to the centre of the River Plenty; thence south by the centre of that river to the south-west angle of section 5 in the parish of Yan Yean; thence east by the southern boundary of section 5 and a line due east to Arthur's Creek; thence south by Arthur's Creek to a point in the creek about four miles twenty-five chains due east of the north-west angle of section 13 in the parish of Morang; thence by a line due west and by the northern boundary of section 13 to the centre of the River Plenty; thence south by the centre of the River Plenty to opposite the north boundary of section 18; thence by the northern boundary of section 18 and a line due west to the centre of the Upper Plenty road; thence south-west and south by the centre of the Upper Plenty road to its intersection with the north boundary of section 15 in the parish of Keelbundora; thence east to the Darebin Creek; thence by the centre of the said creek northerly to the north-west angle of section 27 in the last-named parish; thence east to the south-east angle of section 1 in the parish of Morang; thence north to the commencing point.

The Epping Riding.—Commencing at the south-east angle of section 1 in the parish of Yan Yean; thence west to the centre of the Merri-merri Creek opposite the north-west angle of section 16 in the parish of Woollert; thence southerly by the centre of that creek to the north-west angle of section 13 in the parish of Keelbundora; thence east by the northern boundaries of sections 13 and 14 to the Darebin Creek; thence by the centre of the said creek northerly to opposite the north-west angle of section 27 in the parish of Keelbundora; thence east to the south-east angle of section 1 in the parish of Morang; thence north to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Francis Longmore, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

NAME OF DUCK PONDS ALTERED TO HOVELL'S CREEK.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1869 it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included

in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognised as a county, parish, or town by the name so given as aforesaid. The Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: Provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to diminish or extend the area of any county or to alter the boundaries or name of any county, and to add the territory taken away from one county to any other adjacent county, and to divide any county into two or more counties and to give to each a distinguishing name: And whereas it is expedient that the name of "Duck Ponds," which has been hitherto applied to the chain of water-holes taking their rise near Station Peak and falling into Corio Bay, should be altered to "Hovell's Creek," in commemoration of the camping at "the round water-hole" in 1824 of Captain Hovell's exploration party: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, in exercise of the power vested in me by the said Act, alter the name of "Duck Ponds" hitherto applied to the chain of water-holes hereinbefore mentioned and do direct that the said chain of water-holes shall henceforth be designated

HOVELL'S CREEK.

DISSOLUTION OF A UNION UNDER THE "WEIGHTS AND MEASURES STATUTE 1864."

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, called *The Weights and Measures Statute* 1864, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, at any time, if he think fit, and shall, at the request of not less than half the councils or boards constituting any union proclaimed under the said Act, dissolve the same by proclamation: And whereas the Borough of Creswick and the Shire of Creswick were proclaimed a union on the first day of December One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Creswick and the Council of the Shire of Creswick have requested that the said union may be dissolved: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation dissolve the union of the Borough of Creswick and the Shire of Creswick for the purposes of the said Act.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute* 1865, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend

all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend all the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to the respective towns in the shire of St. Arnaud hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE TOWN OF DONALD,
THE TOWN OF NAVARRE,
THE TOWN OF STUARTMILL.

Bye-law amending Bye-law No. 1, gazetted 13th October 1871, declaring and enacting what Bye-laws and what clauses of Bye-law No. 1 shall be repealed, and for determining the size of prospecting claims and extended claims for sinking ahead.

At a Meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ararat, begun and holden at the Mining Board-room, Ararat, in the said District, on the eighth day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, it is ordained by the said Board as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Size of Claims.*—Prospectors shall be entitled to an extent of claim as specified in the following table:—

WET SINKING.

For discovering a new lead not exceeding two (2) miles from any gold workings, one hundred (100) feet along the course of the lead by a width of four hundred (400) feet for each man.

Exceeding two (2) miles, one hundred and forty (140) feet along the course of the lead by a width of four hundred (400) feet for each man.

No claim shall exceed in extent the area allowed for twelve (12) men.

For discovering a lost lead, eighty (80) feet along the course of the lead by a width of four hundred (400) feet for each man. No claim shall exceed in extent the area allowed for twelve (12) men.

DRY SINKING.

For discovering a new lead, not exceeding one (1) mile distant from any gold workings, the extent of claim shall be two hundred (200) feet by two hundred (200) feet.

Exceeding one (1) mile and not exceeding three (3) miles, three hundred (300) feet by three hundred (300) feet.

Exceeding three (3) miles, five hundred (500) feet by five hundred (500) feet.

For discovering a lost lead, one hundred and fifty (150) feet by one hundred and fifty (150) feet.

No prospecting claim shall be marked out within five hundred (500) yards of the nearest boundary line in wet sinking, and two hundred and fifty (250) yards of the nearest boundary line in dry sinking of any other claim.

3. *Repeal Clause.*—From and after the date at which this bye-law shall have the force of law, all the undermentioned bye-laws now in force in the Ararat Mining District, viz.:—Bye-law No. 2, gazetted 22nd February 1867; Bye-law amending bye-law No. 2, gazetted 7th May 1867; Bye-law No. 3, gazetted 31st January 1868; Bye-law supplementary to bye-law No. 2, gazetted 22nd September 1868; Bye-law No. 1, regulating quartz mining, gazetted 28th October 1870; and clauses five (5) and one hundred and forty-two (142) of bye-law No. 1, gazetted 18th October 1871, shall be and the same are hereby repealed, always saving and excepting the obligations, liabilities, and rights of all persons obtained previous to and held at the time of this bye-law coming into operation: Provided that any bye-law repealed by any of the bye-laws hereby repealed, or by any other bye-law which is itself repealed shall remain, and be deemed to have been, repealed from the time of its repeal.

NEW SOUTH WALES.

Harbor Light, Nelson Head, Port Stephens.

On and after the night of Monday the 1st of April, a Harbor-light will be exhibited on Nelson Head, Port Stephens, visible at a distance of from eight to ten miles in clear weather.

This light will show bright to seaward—be eclipsed over the entrance shoal—and make out red after the shoal is passed and Nelson Head can be steered for. When Nelson Head is passed the light will again make out bright and be a guide for picking up an anchorage or proceeding further into Port Stephens.

Vessels seeking shelter in Nelson Bay can therefore run for the harbor-light (bright), so long as the Port Stephens

revolving light is kept in sight. When the revolving light closes with Toomee Head, it will be necessary to haul to the N.N.W. till the harbor-light is lost sight of and again made out red; a course can then be shaped direct for it, and when Nelson Head is passed the white light will re-appear and be a guide for coming to in Nelson Bay.

NOTE.—It will be necessary to keep a good look out to avoid the islands off the entrance, when running for Port Stephens in bad weather.

SHIRE OF RIPON.

BYE-LAW No. 2.

A Bye-law for regulating the conduct of the officers and servants of the Shire of Ripon, and for providing for the due management of the affairs and proceedings of the Council of the said shire.

THE Council of the Shire of Ripon, by virtue of the powers conferred on them by the twelfth part of the Shires Statute, doth hereby ordain that bye-law No. 1 heretofore existing be and the same is hereby repealed.

The Council of the said shire doth further ordain bye-law No. 2 to be in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

1. The meetings of the council shall be held at the office of the council, in Lawrence street, Beaufort, at the hour of 10 a.m. on the first Thursday in every month.

2. The secretary shall attend daily at the office of the council, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m., except on general holidays or when he has obtained leave of absence.

3. The officers of the council must attend all ordinary meetings of the council, except permission be given to them by the president or the council to be absent.

4. The council shall commence business so soon after the time notified as there is a sufficient number of councillors in attendance to constitute a quorum directed by law; but if at the expiry of the time specified there is not a quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the council at the meeting, and the names of all councillors present shall be recorded in the minute book by the secretary.

5. The minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed, shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the council, in order to their confirmation; and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

6. The reading and ordering on reports of special committees and of officers, the receiving of deputations, and the reading of memorials, shall follow the correspondence.

7. Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be in proper form, and be presented by a member of the council, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.

8. On the presentation of a petition or memorial, no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given as herein-after provided, and the only questions that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be, that the petition be received, and, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

9. No report of a committee, except that of finance, shall be considered or adopted on its presentation, nor until due notice shall be given. All such reports shall be read and received *pro forma*, and, if ordered by the council, printed for distribution among the councillors, to be considered at any subsequent meeting, or taken into consideration after the orders of the day upon which it is presented.

10. If in any report there are distinct recommendations contained in such report, such report shall not be adopted until the sense of the council has been taken separately on each.

11. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any business which the president may think fit to bring under consideration. Any councillor may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable, in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given in writing to the secretary previous to the meeting at which the same is to be taken into consideration; and all such notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they are given.

12. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the councillor who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him in writing, be present when the business is called on. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

13. The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee shall for the time being be a member of such committee.

14. Before any motion is put from the chair, in case the mover is not prepared with his motion in writing, the secretary shall take down the same in writing, and may obtain the signatures of the mover and seconder.

15. It shall be competent for any councillor, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of any subject, at the next or any subsequent meeting; and upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof shall be given by the secretary to each councillor, by post, of the day for which the order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is set down for consideration.

16. On any motion being put from the chair, the secretary may be required by any member to enter in the minute book

the names of the councillors who voted thereon, and specify whether such councillors voted for or against the motion so put from the chair.

17. All reports sent in to the council by any councillor or councillors thereof, or by any officer of the council, shall be written on sheets of large foolscap paper, on one side only, a broad margin being left so that they can be properly bound together.

18. Any councillor moving or seconding any motion or amendment, shall be held to have spoken on that motion or amendment.

19. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the president shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

20. No councillor shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last proposed; and the president shall, without waiting for the interposition of the council, call to order any councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment. After the reply, the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

21. The president, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule of precedent applicable to the case, without argument or comment; and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final for the time being in each case.

22. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, nor impute improper motives, and all personal reflections shall be considered disorderly; and any councillor making use of any expression offensive to any other councillor shall, if required by the president, withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology to such councillor.

23. Any councillor who shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order by the president, or refuse to withdraw any offensive expression when required to do so by the president, he shall for each such offence forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

24. The councillors, in meeting of council, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of president, chairman, or councillors.

25. Every councillor, including the president, shall stand up when addressing the council in discussion of any question.

26. Any councillor may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a councillor immediately upon the same being used.

27. Any councillor may, of right, require the production of any of the documents of the council relating to the question or matter in discussion.

28. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote.

29. Upon the adoption of any amendment by the council, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

30. The president shall, on taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the first question in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which party has the majority; and the council shall vote in all cases by show of hands.

31. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the council.

32. Any councillor may enter his protest against any resolution of the council, provided such protest is not inconsistent with truth, or disrespectful to the council. Notice of intention to protest must, however, in every case be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest, signed by the councillor or councillors protesting, and specifying the reason for protesting, must be entered before the next regular meeting of the council, by the protesting councillor, in a book kept for that purpose in the secretary's office, and duly referred to in the minutes of the council; the same to be considered also as a part of such minutes.

33. A notice of motion may dispensed with in cases of emergency, where the council considers it necessary to do so, there being not more than one councillor absent at such meeting.

34. No election to any vacant office at the disposal of the council shall take place until six clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more of the local newspapers, inviting applications from candidates properly qualified.

5. Drawing or trailing any sledge, timber, or other heavy material on any road or footway, to the injury of such road or footway.

6. Placing any placard or other document, writing or printing, upon or otherwise defacing or damaging any fence, bridge, lamp-post, gate, or other erection the property of the Shire Council.

7. Allowing any tree, hedge, or fence to encroach on the footway, so as to contract the width thereof.

8. Leaving any hole, excavation, or dangerous formation on any road or footway without keeping a light burning thereat from sunset to sunrise, whether such hole, excavation, or dangerous formation be made in execution of works for the Shire Council or otherwise.

9. Turning loose or allowing to wander any cattle or other animal upon any public road or thoroughfare.

10. Making any bridge or other contrivance to cross the water table of any road without the permission of the Shire Council.

11. Opening any drain or sewer upon or removing the surface of any road or footway without the permission of the Shire Council.

12. Removing any sand from any water-channel or drain on any road or under the charge of the Shire Council without the permission of the Shire Council.
