Captain Lockyea of the barque King Oscar having reported that he passed a ship's lower mast floating 15 feet above the water, on Thursday last, 25th instant, about 15 miles south-east of Cape Howe, to which (from the sea breaking 100 feet from the mast) there appeared to be some wreckage attached, masters of vessels are warned of this fact, and cautioned to keep a good look out when in the vicinity.

Should this be the same mast reported by Captain Paddle as passed on the 17th instant, 45 miles S.W. of Cape Howe, its drift has been to the north-eastward at the rate of six and a half miles a day.

HEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called The Police Offences Statute 1865, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the Government Gazette extend all or any of the provisions contained in Tart I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend all the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to the Shire hereinafter mentioned, that is

WHEREAS by 'The Shires Statute amendment Act 1870 (34 Vict. No. 387, § 2) it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any road district, whether single or united, and whether the area be one hundred square miles or less, the total net annual value of the rateable property as appearing by the general rate then last made shall have amounted to or exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district a shire within the meaning of The Shires Statute, by such name as in and by the Order in Council may be assigned to the same; and the subdivisions, if any, of the district subsisting; at the time of such constitution shall be and be called ridings of the shire: And whereas the total net annual value of the rateable property in the road district hereinafter mentioned, as uppearing by the general rate now last made in such district, has exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, and it seems fit to constitute the same to be a shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order constitute the Road District hereinafter mentioned to be a Shire within the meaning of The Shires Statute by the name hereby assigned to the same, that is to say:
