VESSELS.

Report of Wreckage in the Track of Vessels trading between Melbourne and Sydney or Newcastle.

CAPTAIN LOCKYER of the barque *King Oscar* having reported that he passed a ship's lower mast floating 15 feet above the water, on Thursday last, 26th instant, about 15 miles south-east of Cape Howe, to which (from the sea breaking 100 feet from the mast) there appeared to be some wreckage attached, masters of vessels are warned of this fact, and cautioned to keep a good look out when in the vicinity.

Should this be the same mast reported by Captain Paddle as passed on the 17th instant, 45 miles S.W. of Cape Howe, its drift has been to the north-eastward at the rate of six and a half miles a day.

DETERMINATION OF LONGITUDE OF ADELAIDE.

PART I. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE
1865" EXTENDED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend all the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to the Shire hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF TULLAROO.

DISTRICTS WHERE CERTIFICATES MAY BE GRANTED FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES CHARGEABLE WITH FEE OF £10.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honourable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in compliance with the application in writing of the respective councils mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto annexed, do hereby proclaim the shire and parts of shires mentioned in the last column of such Schedule to be districts respectively within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—

PART OF THE SHIRE OF MINHAMITE ATTACHED TO THE SHIRE OF DUNDAS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-second day of April 1872:

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor
 Mr. Gavan Duffy Mr. Longmore
 Mr. Grant Mr. McLellan
 Mr. Vale Mr. W. A. C. a'Beckett.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 22) it is amongst other things enacted, that if the whole or a majority of the ratepayers of any part of a shire or road district in which an annual or general election or first appointment of members has taken place, shall, by petition under their hands, describing such part by metes and bounds, pray the Governor that such part be severed from such shire or road district, or if any part of any shire or road district shall not have been alienated from the Crown and be unoccupied, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to order that such part or so much thereof as the Governor shall think proper, be severed from such shire or road district respectively, and by the same or any other order to direct that the portion so severed from such shire or road district respectively shall be attached to any other shire, borough, road district, riding, or subdivision to be named in such order, and the same shall take effect upon the publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the twenty-second day of December One thousand eight hundred and seventy, the Shire of Minhamite was constituted: And whereas by another Order of the Governor in Council made on the twenty-third day of November in the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one the Shire of Minhamite was divided into three separate ridings, the respective boundaries of which were therein described; And whereas by another

Order in Council made on the twenty-sixth day of February One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two the Shire of Dundas was constituted: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Shire of Minhamite therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council; by this present Order, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth sever a part of the Shire of Minhamite, described in such petition, from such shire, and doth hereby direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the Shire of Dundas: And the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby set forth the altered boundaries of the West Riding of the said Shire of Minhamite and of the said Shire of Dundas in manner following, that is to say:—

THE WEST RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF MINHAMITE.—Commencing at the intersection of the main road from Belfast to Hamilton with the southern boundary of the shire (as gazetted 13th day of January 1871); thence westerly, southerly, westerly, northerly, westerly, and northerly by the shire boundaries to the centre line of the north-east arm of the Condah Swamp; thence easterly by the centre line of that arm of the Condah Swamp and of the main Louth Swamp and the Weerangourt Creek to the intersection of a right line joining the south-west angle of the Lyne pre-emptive section and the north-west angle of the Weerangourt pre-emptive section; thence south-easterly by the Dundas shire boundaries to the north-west angle of section 2 of the parish of Banangal; thence southerly by the western boundary of the said section to the road bounding the said section on the south; thence westerly by the said road to the junction of the road bounding section 5 of the said parish on the west; thence southerly by that road to its junction with the main road from Belfast to Hamilton; thence south-easterly by the said main road to the commencing point.

THE SHIRE OF DUNDAS.—Commencing at the junction of the eastern boundary of the parish of Pendyk-pendyk and the county boundary of Dundas; thence south to the north-east angle of the parish of Wookurkook; thence westerly by the northern boundary of said parish to the north-west angle thereof; thence south by the road on the western margin of said parish and of the parish of Gatung-gatum to the north-east angle of allotment 5 A of section 1 of the last said parish; thence westerly by the northern boundary of said allotment and the road on the northern margin of the parish of Gatung-gatum to the north-west angle of said parish; thence southerly by the western boundary of said parish to the south-west angle thereof; thence south by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 2 n of section of the parish of Urangara; thence further south by the west boundary of said parish to the south-west angle thereof; thence east by the southern boundary of said parish to the intersection of the road running between sections 2 and 3 of the parish of Joolang; thence southerly by the said road and the western boundary of allotment 4 of section 17 of the said parish to the northern boundary of the parish of Redruth; thence westerly by the northern boundary of the parish of Redruth to the north-west angle thereof; thence southerly by the western boundary of the said parish of Redruth to the River Wannon; thence westerly by the course of that river to the north-west angle of the parish of Murrudal in the county of Normanby; thence south by the western boundary of that parish to the intersection of the road running between sections 3 and 4 in the said parish; thence westerly by that road to the north-west angle of allotment 17 of section D in the parish of Tahara; thence south by the western boundaries of said allotment 17 and of allotments 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, and 23 of said section D to the road from Green Hills to Coleraine; thence south-easterly by that road to the south-west angle of section 19 in the parish of Murrudal; thence easterly by the road on the north of the parish boundary of Branxholme, and by said parish boundary to the north-east angle of section 6 in the said parish; thence south by the parish boundary to the main road from Branxholme to Hamilton; thence north-easterly by that road to the intersection of a right line joining the south-west angle of section 4 in the parish of Yulecart and the north-west angle of the Lyne pre-emptive section in the parish of Byambynee; thence southerly by that line to the north-west angle of the Lyne pre-emptive section; thence by the south-eastern boundary of the shire of Portland to the centre of the north-east angle of the Condah Swamp; thence easterly by the centre line of the said swamp, and of the main Louth Swamp and the Weerangourt Creek to the intersection of a right line joining the south-west angle of the Lyne pre-emptive section and the north-west angle of the Weerangourt pre-emptive section; thence south-easterly by that line to the north-west angle of the Weerangourt pre-emptive section; thence by the western boundary of said section to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a right line south-easterly to the north-west angle of section 4 of the parish of Macarthur; thence southerly by the western boundary of section 4 and the south-western boundary of section 2 of the said parish to the north-west angle of the township reserve of Macarthur; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of the said township reserve to the western boundary of the county of Villiers; thence northerly by the western boundary of the said county to the eastern boundary of the county of Dundas; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of the county of Dundas to the commencing point, excepting the borough of Hamilton.

CONSTITUTING A ROAD DISTRICT TO BE A SHIRE.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute amendment-Act 1870* (34 Vict. No. 387, § 2) it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any road district, whether single or united, and whether the area be one hundred square miles or less, the total net annual value of the rateable property as appearing by the general rate then last made shall have amounted to or exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district a shire within the meaning of *The Shires Statute*, by such name as in and by the Order in Council may be assigned to the same; and the subdivisions, if any, of the district subsisting at the time of such constitution shall be and be called ridings of the shire: And whereas the total net annual value of the rateable property in the road district hereinafter mentioned, as appearing by the general rate now last made in such district, has exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, and it seems fit to constitute the same to be a shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order constitute the Road District hereinafter mentioned to be a Shire within the meaning of *The Shires Statute* by the name hereby assigned to the same, that is to say:—

THE NUNAWADING ROAD DISTRICT, which was created by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-seventh day of July 1857, and was altered by a subsequent Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of February 1858, and was divided into electoral subdivisions by an Order of the 26th of February 1866, shall be and is hereby constituted and shall be named the

SHIRE OF NUNAWADING.

And the Honorable Francis Longmore, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BOROUGH OF SANDRIDGE.

Bye-law No. 29 of the Council of the Borough of Sandridge, made under section 174 of the Boroughs Statute, No. 359, for the preservation of public decency.

IN pursuance of section 174 of the Boroughs Statute, the Council of the Borough of Sandridge ordain as follows, that is to say:—

(I.) That from and after the date of this bye-law coming into operation, no person shall appear in a state of nudity for the purpose of bathing near to or within view of any inhabited house, or of any public wharf, quay, bridge, street, road, or other place of public resort within the limits of the Borough of Sandridge, between the hours of Eight o'clock in the morning and Eight o'clock in the evening. Any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every such offence.

(II.) The following bye-law, heretofore existing, is repealed (that is to say), the bye-law numbered 28, and intitled a bye-law for the preservation of public decency.
