ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION:

THE Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Despatch bearing date the 22nd day of March 1872, intimated to the Governor that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise Her power of disallowance with respect to the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the 35th year of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates of which are hereto subjoined, viz.:

- No. 394. An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Three hundred and seventy thousand pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one and two. [Assented to 31st August 1871.]
- No. 395. An Act to sanction the issue and expenditure of certain sums from "The Public Works Loan Account" for a Salary and Contingencies for the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one. [Assented to 12th September 1871.]
- No. 396. An Act to amend an Act intitled "An Act to incorporate the Proprietors of a certain Banking Company called 'The Bank of New South Wales' and for other purposes therein mentioned." [Assented to 23rd November 1871.]

WHEREAS by the Constitution Statute it is amongst other things enacted that the provisions of the Act of the fourteenth year of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-nine, and of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy-six, For the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land, which relate to the giving and withholding of Her Majesty's assent to Bills, and the reservation of Bills for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, and the instructions to be conveyed to governors for their guidance in relation to the matters aforesaid, and the disallowance of Bills by Her Majesty, shall apply to Bills to be passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly constituted under the Constitution Act of Victoria and the now-reciting Statute, and by any other legislative body or bodies which may at any time hereafter be substituted for the present Legislative Council and Assembly: And whereas the Bill hereinafter mentioned which was passed by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon: And whereas by an Order of the Queen in Council, made on the twenty-first day of February, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, a copy whereof is hereto appended, Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the said Bill: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of the aforesaid Acts, do by this my Pro-

clamation signify that the said Bill intituled *An Act to amend the Discipline Act 1870*, reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon upon the twenty-third day of November, in the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

THE EAST LODDON RIDING.—Commencing at the junction of the Marraboor and Murray Rivers, at Castle Donnington; thence south-easterly by the River Murray to the junction of the Yaluk Creek; thence southerly by the centre of the Yaluk and Nannilla Creeks to the Kow Swamp; thence by the eastern side of the Kow Swamp to the centre of Mount Hope Creek; thence southerly by the centre of Mount Hope Creek to a point due east of the north-west angle of the parish of Jarlan; thence west to the said north-west angle on the River Loddon; thence by the River Loddon and the River Marraboor northerly and westerly to the commencing point.

BYE-LAWS OF THE VICTORIA RACING CLUB.

WE, James Blackwood (chairman), Richard Goldsbrough, Charles Brown Fisher, James Patterson, Charles Edward Bright, Winfield Attenborough, Robert Power, and John Goodman, constituting an absolute majority in number of the committee of the Victoria Racing Club, do hereby, in exercise of our powers under *The Victoria Racing Club Act 1871*, make the bye-laws following, that is to say:—

2. The weighing yard, and the passage thereto, the stewards' stand, and the judge's box.
3. The paddock called "the hill."
4. The paddock called "the training ground."
5. All the residue of the said land.

II. Subject to the provisions of the eleventh of these bye-laws, all members of the Victoria Racing Club shall, upon production of their tickets, be admitted at all race and other meetings to the first, third, and fifth of the divisions hereinbefore specified, and with their own horses and carriages (not being licensed horses or vehicles) to the members' paddock.

III. Subject to the provisions of the said eleventh bye-law, all persons who have duly paid for admission to the grand stand shall, upon production of their tickets, be admitted on the days for which their tickets are issued to the first, third, and fifth of the said divisions.

IV. Subject to the provisions of the said eleventh bye-law, all persons who have duly paid for admission to the third of the said divisions shall, upon production of their tickets, be admitted thereto on the days for which their tickets are issued; but shall not be permitted to remain therein for a longer period than half-an-hour after the last race of the day shall have been run.

V. Subject to the provisions of the said eleventh bye-law, all persons who shall have duly paid for admission to the fourth of the said divisions for the purpose of training or exercising horses shall, upon production of their tickets, be admitted thereto with their horses for the period for which such tickets are issued, subject, however, to such orders as the committee, or the stewards appointed by the committee may from time to time give as there may be occasion with reference to such division.

VI. All persons shall be admitted to all race meetings to the fifth of the said divisions free of charge.

VII. No person except the judge or any person he may call to his assistance shall enter the judge's box at the time the horses are prepared to start, or are running for any race.

VIII. No person shall enter the weighing stand, or the weighing yard, or the approaches thereto, except the officers of the club, the jockeys requiring to be weighed, and the owners and trainers of horses desirous to see their jockeys weighed.

IX. No person shall enter the stewards' stand except the officers of the club, and such persons as the committee or the stewards may invite to do so.

X. No person shall enter any of the first four of the said divisions of the said land without a ticket duly authorising him in that behalf.

XI. The following persons shall not be admitted into any of the first four of the said divisions:—

1. Any person proved to the satisfaction of the committee or stewards to have been at any time guilty of any malpractice or dishonorable conduct in connection with racing.

Any person proved to the satisfaction of the committee or stewards to be a defaulter.

XII. Each member of the club, and all persons paying for admission to any of the said first four divisions shall be supplied with a ticket of admission which he or she shall, upon demand, produce or (if required) surrender to all gate-keepers, and other persons having authority from the club to demand the production or surrender of the same.

XIII. Persons renting or hiring for any race meeting the grand stand or any portion thereof, or any booth upon the

said land, shall abide by any order given by the committee or stewards, in reference to the said land, and the buildings and other erections thereon.

XIV. No person shall take any dog on the said land, or in any building thereon.

XV. Any person committing on the said land, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be removed from such land; notwithstanding such person may be a member of the club, or may have purchased and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission—

1. Assaulting any other person.
2. Being drunk.
3. Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course or any part of it during a race meeting, or when the horses are prepared to start, or are running for any race.
4. Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
5. Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
6. Behaving improperly, or riotously.
7. Being found in any of the first four of the said divisions and not producing, upon demand, or (if required) not surrendering to any gate-keeper or other person having authority from the club to demand production of the same, a ticket duly authorising admission to such division, unless the person so found shall forthwith satisfy the stewards or one of them that the proper charge for admission has been paid by him, and that his ticket has been lost.
8. Obtaining admission to any of the first four of the said divisions when disentitled to such admission under these bye-laws.

SHIRE OF RIPON.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE LAKE GOLDSMITH RESERVE.

WHEREAS the Regulations made by the Governor under the provisions of *The Land Act 1869* authorises the managers of commons to make regulations for the management of commons under their control: And whereas, the Governor by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of 12th January 1872 placed under the control of the Shire-Council

of Ripon, as managers thereof, the Lake Goldsmith Reserve, the said managers do now, under the authority vested in them, make the following regulations respecting the said reserve:—

1. No person, except a ratepayer, holder of miner's right, business license, or carrier's license, residing within a distance of five miles of the said reserve shall be entitled to depasture any large cattle thereon.

2. No ratepayer, holder of miner's right, business license, or carrier's license, residing within a distance of five miles of the said reserve shall be permitted to depasture more than ten head of large cattle in addition to the number allowed by the 4th clause of the regulations made by the Governor dated 29th March 1870.

3. No person shall be permitted to depasture large cattle on said reserve without first paying to the person appointed by the council to receive such fees the following fees (to wit):—At the annual rate of four shillings per annum for every head of large cattle.

4. Small cattle only to be allowed to water at the Lake Goldsmith Reserve, and not to depasture thereon.

5. The term large cattle shall mean—Cows, heifers, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; and the term small cattle shall mean sheep and goats.

6. No person shall discharge other than ordinary fowling-guns within the said reserve, swivel or other larger sized guns strictly prohibited.

7. No person shall throw or convey, or cause or permit to be thrown or conveyed into the said reserve, lake, or channel therein, any dead animal, rubbish, dirt, weeds, filth, or any noisome thing, or shall wash or cleanse therein any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any article whatsoever.

8. All fees must be paid half-yearly in advance.

9. Any person committing a breach of any of the above regulations shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, recoverable before any justice of the peace in petty sessions.

The above regulations were made by the managers of the Lake Goldsmith Reserve on the seventh day of March 1872.
