YAN YEAN WATER.

THE Central Board of Health, in view of the lately expressed doubts of the unwholesomeness of the Yan Yeau water, deem it desirable to bring prominently before the public the result of certain analyses thereof lately made by the Government analytical chemist.

These analyses show that the Yan Yeau water, though somewhat milky in appearance, "is in every respect a good, wholesome water," and that the green deposit which is collected by filtering the water through flannel, and the presence of which has mainly given rise to the recent apprehensions of its unwholesomeness, is owing to minute healthy plants, which are to be found in a greater or less degree in all wholesome drinking waters.

The analyses which have been made show, however, that the milky appearance of the Yan Yeau water is owing mainly to the presence of certain clayey impurities, and although these are not present to an extent to render the water unwholesome, they nevertheless give it an uninviting appearance. The Board of Health, therefore, in correcting the late unfounded apprehensions as to the unwholesomeness of the water, desire to take the opportunity of informing consumers that the clayey ingredients, and with them a good deal of the organic matters may be precipitated, and the water rendered perfectly clear, without any detriment to its quality, by the following very simple method, viz.:-

Three (3) grains of common alum, powdered, should be dissolved at night in each gallon of water required for the following day's consumption for drinking or culinary purposes, and the water put aside for the night. Next morning all impurities will have subsided, and the clear water should then be poured off for use, the sediment being thrown away. A pound of alum, the cost of which is only three pence, will by this means purify 2333 gallons of water.

REPLY TO A MEMORIAL FROM THE MELBOURNE VINE GROWERS' ASSOCIATION.

My Lord,—I referred to the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, for their consideration, a copy of your despatch No. 73 of 15th June, forwarding a Memorial from the members of the Melbourne Vine Growers' Association, in which they pray that they may be placed on an equal footing with the wine growers of Europe, as respects the admission of their wines into England at a lower rate of duty.

I transmit to you, for your information, a copy of the answer which has been received from their lordships' department, stating that they are unable, as at present advised, to entertain the memorial favorably.

Sir,—I am commanded by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury to inform you, with reference to the letters from the Colonial Office, dated 13th December 1870, and 15th June 1871, that my Lords have given their attentive consideration to the memorial referred to therein from certain vineyard proprietors and others interested in the growth of the vine in South Australia, representing that consequent on the dry heat of the climate of South Australia, the natural alcoholic strength of these wines very generally exceeds the standard at which wine is admitted into Great Britain, at the "one shilling duty" that during the transit from South Australia to Great Britain through the tropics the watery evaporation from wine in casks is considerable, and constitutes a further unavoidable cause of increasing their alcoholic strength, and requesting that the standard of 26 per cent. of spirit for natural wines chargeable with the duty of 1s. per gallon on importation into this country may be extended to 30 per cent. of proof spirit, with a view to the admission of wines, the produce of South Australia, at the duty of 1s. per gallon, when not exceeding 30 degrees of strength.

My Lords have likewise had before them the memorial from the members of the Melbourne Vine Growers' Association, which accompanied your letter of the 23rd ultimo.

My Lords direct me to request that you will state to the Earl of Kimberley, that although they are ready to admit that some hardship attaches to the wine growers of South Australia and Victoria in respect to the duty leviable in this country on the wines which they produce, they regret that they do not feel themselves warranted, as at present advised, in entertaining favourably the memorials from these parties.

Notice is hereby given that on and after the 15th of January 1872, a bright light will be exhibited from the Cape Jaffa Light-house, from sunset to sunrise.

The lighthouse is situated on a reef off Cape Jaffa (Cape Bernoulli on the Admiralty charts) in

Latitude 36° 57' 20" south

Longitude 139° 40' 20" east.

The light is bright, of the first order, on the holophotal revolving dioptric system, having eclipses every twenty seconds, and will be visible all round the horizon to a distance of twenty miles. The height of the focal plane is 100 feet.

Vessels approaching or passing this light should not come under sixteen (16) fathoms.

DISTRICT WHERE CERTIFICATES MAY BE GRANTED FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES CHARGEABLE WITH FEE OF £10.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the whole of the shire of Waranga to be a district within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties,

parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish, or town by the name so given as aforesaid. The Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria; and it is also enacted, that the Governor may from time to time by a notice in the *Government Gazette* proclaim as a street or road or as a town or village any portion or portions of Crown lands; and the lands in such town or village shall be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road shall have been proclaimed shall be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby notify and proclaim as a town the portion of Crown lands hereinafter described, to be designated by the name prefixed to the description, viz.:-

TOWN OF BLACKWOOD: Commencing on the right bank of the Lerderderg River, at a point bearing N. 5° 30' W. from the north-west angle of allotment 18 of section A; thence to the said angle of that allotment by a line bearing S. 5° 30' E. four chains, more or less; thence by the western boundary thereof, bearing S. 7° 58' E. one chain fifty links; thence by a line bearing south-easterly, crossing the Red Hill road to the north-west angle of allotment 6 of the said section; thence by the western boundary of that allotment bearing S. 7° 53' E. one chain fifty links to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a line bearing S. 5° 30' E. twenty-seven chains; thence by a line bearing N. 84° 30' E. forty-two chains, more or less, to a point bearing S. 5° 30' E. from the west angle of allotment 2 of section G; thence to the said angle thereof by a line bearing N. 5° 30' W. twenty chains, more or less; thence by the north-western boundary of that allotment bearing N. 25° E. one chain fifty-seven links to the north angle thereof; thence by a line bearing N. 5° 30' W. to the said bank of the Lerderderg River; and thence by that river upwards to the commencing point: as shown on the plans deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(71.D.19828.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend to the line of Road commencing at the boundary of the Borough of Wood's Point and terminating at Fisher's Creek, a distance of about sixty-four miles, subsection XVII. of section V. of the said Statute, the terms of which are as follow, viz.:-"Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public place."

No part of the district has as yet been proclaimed a clean district; but there is to be a meeting of the Board of Advice on the 18th instant, and it is then proposed to take the subject into consideration.

I have not had any prosecutions during the quarter.

I have granted permission to several persons under section 30, to dip their flocks on account of ticks, which, this year, are very troublesome.

I have granted thirty-three permits for sheep entering into and passing through my clean district, all of which have been subsequently approved of by my board.

I have issued no licenses, and inflicted only one penalty of £40 on F. Everingham.

I found scab, during the quarter, on the following runs, viz., Mr. Beggs' Mogelemby station, and at once required him to shepherd his sheep; on Mr. Rosse's station, Warrambayne, those sheep are also now shepherded; and on Mr. Lloyd Jones' Mangalore and Avenel runs—on several occasions those sheep were required by me to be shepherded, but Mr. Jones has not complied with the order.

I have had three prosecutions this quarter, viz., against Mr. Thomas Beggs, Mogelemby run, under section 33 of the Scab Act, who was fined £15; Mr. Archibald Ross, Warrambayne run, also under section 33, who was fined £60; and Mr. David Ogely, Baddaginie farm, under clause 65, for travelling sheep into a quarantine district without a permit, who was fined £50 and £4 4s. costs.

My Board of Advice met three times during last quarter, and ten stations were added to the Seymour Quarantine District during the same period.
