NOTICE TO DEPOSITORS.

IT is hereby notified that the following Amended Regulation has been approved by the Governor in Council.—

2. Deposits of One sixpence or of any number of sixpences, or of pounds, shillings, and sixpences, will be received from any depositor at the Post Office Savings Banks, provided the deposits made by such depositor do not exceed £100 within any period of fourteen days, without special permission in writing having first been obtained by such depositor from the Postmaster-General.

When the principal and interest together standing to the credit of any one depositor amount to the sum of £250, all interest will cease so long as the same funds continue to amount to the said sum of £250.

All deposits must be made in cash or in notes issued by Victorian banks.

This regulation to take effect on and after the 1st day of August 1872.

BUNBURY LIGHTHOUSE.

The true bearing of Bunbury lighthouse from Cape Naturaliste is 64° 28' east of north. The height of the light above ordinary high water mark is 117 feet, and, supposing the eye to be 15 feet above sea level, it may be visible for about fifteen and a half nautical miles.

SURRENDER, RENEWAL, ETC., OF MINING LEASES.

THE attention of persons holding leases for mining purposes is directed to the provisions of section 29 of *The Mining Statute 1865* (copy subjoined*), pursuant to which the lawful holder of any mining lease can at any time during the currency of such lease offer a surrender of the same in order to obtain a new lease of the whole or any part of the land thereby demised.

The lawful holder of any such lease desirous of taking advantage of the said provisions should forward to the office of the Minister of Mines the lease proposed to be surrendered and all documents establishing the title thereto, together with an offer of surrender under his hand and seal conditionally on a new lease being issued in lieu thereof for the whole or any portion of the ground demised by such lease, and a certificate from the local mining surveyor that the posts defining the boundaries of the land to be included in the new lease are in their proper positions, and that the angles of the block are clearly defined by trenches. If a portion only of the said land be required, a plan or tracing setting forth the area and dimensions of such portion should also be forwarded, accompanied with the surveyor's certificate above referred to.

Every such offer of surrender should be lodged in this office at least one month before the date of the expiration of the lease or leases to be surrendered.

*SECTION 29 OF MINING STATUTE 1865, 29 VICT. NO. 291.

“Any person holding a lease under the provisions herein before contained or under the provisions of any Act authorizing the granting of leases for mining purposes, and the executors, administrators or assigns of any such person, shall be entitled at any time, with the consent of the Governor in Council, to surrender the same; and it shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on the behalf aforesaid, to grant to such person a lease for any term not exceeding, in the case of a gold mining lease fifteen years, and in the case of a mineral lease thirty years, of the whole or any part of the land demised by such surrendered lease; and any such new lease may, with the like consent, be renewed from time to time for any period not exceeding fifteen or thirty years (as the case may be) at each renewal. Provided that such new lease shall be at the rent which shall then be chargeable by law in respect of a gold mining or mineral lease, according as such new lease shall be the one or the other, and shall be subject to the covenants and conditions prescribed by the regulations which shall at the time of the granting thereof be in force and applicable to the particular lease required, or such other covenants and conditions as to the Governor in Council shall seem fit: Provided further that before any such new lease shall be granted the person intended to be the lessee shall pay such fine not exceeding Ten pounds as the Governor in Council shall direct.”

NOTE.—The Melbourne Hospital is in Gipps Ward; the Alfred Hospital and Immigrants' Home are in Albert Ward; the Lying-in Hospital is in Smith Ward; the Industrial Schools are in Emerald Hill Borough; the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum and the Pentridge Stockade are in "Remainder of District"; the Benevolent Asylum is tabulated in Hotham Borough.

The deaths in June exceeded the deaths in May by 18. They also exceeded the average of June in the previous ten years by 18; but, if allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of June by 37.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 63° on the 2nd, and the lowest was 35° on the 13th. The mean temperature of the month (51.6°) was nearly 2° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (21.5°) took place on the 1st, viz., from a maximum of 65° to a minimum of 43.5°. The least range (4.8°) was on the 22nd, viz., from a maximum of 58.8° to a minimum of 54°. The mean daily range was 13.3°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.808 inches) was nearly a quarter of an inch below the average.

Males contributed 58 per cent. and females 42 per cent. to the total mortality. Children under five years of age contributed nearly 42 per cent., against 37 per cent. in June 1871, 37 per cent. in June 1870, 40 per cent. in June 1869, 45 per cent. in June 1868, 51 per cent. in June 1867, 41 per cent. in June 1866, 48 per cent. in June 1865, 45 per cent. in June 1864, 31 per cent. in June 1863, and 43 per cent. in June 1862.

Nine persons of 75 years of age and upwards died during the month, viz.:—A female aged 80 of tracheitis, a male aged 81 of paralysis, a male aged 76 of brain disease, a male aged 75 of heart disease, two males aged respectively 85 and 95, and three females aged respectively 76, 84, and 87, of old age.

Eleven violent deaths occurred during the month. The following are the particulars:—A boy aged 14 died of fracture of the pelvis, a car-driver aged 34 died of concussion of the brain caused by his horse falling, a laborer aged 31 was killed by a fall of earth, a farmer aged 32 died of accidental injuries to the head, a male aged 52 died from injuries caused by an accidental explosion whilst blasting, a carter aged 62 was killed by a cart-wheel passing over him, a boy aged 4½ died of scalds, a male infant was overlain in bed, a male aged 45 was found drowned, a cabinet-maker aged 20 poisoned himself, and a female aged 36 drowned herself whilst of unsound mind.

Seventy-nine deaths, or 26 per cent. of the total number, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—34 in the Melbourne Hospital, 7 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Lying-in Hospital, 11 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 10 in the Industrial Schools, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 126, of which 68, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 58 or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 90 were under one year of age, 17 were between one and two years, 10 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 177, of which 107, or 60 per cent., were males, and 70, or 40 per cent., were females; 13 were between five and ten, 4 were between ten and fifteen, 6 were between fifteen and twenty, 10 were between twenty and twenty-five, 11 were between twenty-five and thirty, 16 were between thirty and thirty-five, 13 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 17 were between forty-five and fifty, 13 were between fifty and fifty-five, 15 were between fifty-five and sixty, 7 were between sixty and sixty-five, 6 were between sixty-five and seventy, 9 were between seventy and seventy-five, 3 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 6 were eighty and upwards.

RULES OF THE ARARAT DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

THE Hospital will afford gratuitously surgical and medical aid to any poor person requiring them, irrespective of creed, country, or color; but any person who shall be admitted either as an in-door or out-door patient, and shall be found able to pay, will be required to do so. Paying patients will be admitted under certain conditions, and in accordance with the bye-laws of the hospital. All property found on patients who may die in the hospital will be appropriated to defraying the expense of their maintenance and burial: the residue, if any, to be handed over to their legal representatives.

2. The hospital shall be managed by a committee of sixteen members, which shall include a president, vice-president, treasurer, and not more than four honorary surgeons.

3. No person, being a paid servant in the employ of the hospital, nor any person who shall be interested in the execution of any contract entered into for the hospital, shall be a member of the committee.

4. The committee shall appoint two auditors (not members of the committee) to examine the accounts for the past year, who shall, if satisfied, certify to the accuracy thereof prior to the general meeting.

5. The committee shall meet for general business once, at least, in each month, at such time and place as it may from time to time appoint; and for special business, on the requisition of five members. In the absence of the president or vice-president, one of the members present shall be elected to act as chairman.

6. That every contributor of £50 in one sum shall be a life governor, with the privilege of voting at all general or special meetings of subscribers, and of nominating six in-door and four out-door patients every year. And every contributor of £20 in one sum shall also be a life governor, with the privilege

of voting at general and special meetings of subscribers, and of nominating four in-door and three out-door patients every year. And every contributor of £5 in one sum shall be entitled to the privilege of voting at general and special meetings, and of nominating four in-door and two out-door patients during the year of such contribution. And every contributor of £1 per annum shall have the privilege of voting at all general and special meetings of subscribers, and of nominating one in-door and three out-door patients, provided the funds and accommodation of the hospital will admit of the reception of such patient.

7. That no person (except life governors) shall have any right to vote at any meeting, unless they have within a year, and not less than fourteen days previous to such meeting, contributed £1 at least to the funds of the hospital.

8. That accidents, and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency by the medical officer in attendance, be received at any time; and that in ordinary cases patients shall be admitted only on Mondays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, at Twelve o'clock, on the recommendation of a subscriber of at least £1 for the then current year, and also of one of the committee of management, who shall certify that the said patient is not capable of providing for medical attendance.

9. That no female for the purpose of confinement, child under five years of age, insane person, person affected with syphilis or any infectious disease, or any person who in the opinion of the medical officer in attendance is unfit to be an in-door patient, shall be received under any circumstances, except with the express permission of the visiting committee.

TREASURER.

10. The treasurer shall receive all money on behalf of the hospital, and invest the same in such bank or banks as the committee of management shall direct, to the credit of the hospital. He shall pay all accounts after the same have been signed by the chairman of the meeting as approved by the committee, by drafts on the bank or banks, which shall be countersigned by the president, or vice-president, and secretary. He shall also keep an account of all money received and paid by him, and report the same at least once a month to a meeting of the committee.

HONORARY SURGEONS.

11. The honorary medical officers shall consist of four legally qualified medical practitioners, who shall be elected in the same way as other members of committee. They shall have access to the hospital at all times; they shall perform all capital surgical operations, assisted by the resident surgeon, but no such operation shall be performed without a previous consultation of as many of the medical staff as can be obtained, except in cases of emergency, and they shall regularly consult in all cases of importance or protracted continuance in the hospital.

VISITING COMMITTEE.

12. The visiting committee, consisting of three members of the managing committee, shall have access to the hospital at all times; and shall at noon, on Mondays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, visit the hospital for the purpose of inspecting the arrangements thereof, and of enquiring of the patients if they are properly attended to; also for the admission of patients. If necessary, they shall report in writing to the next meeting of the committee any alterations or suggestions they may think proper.

RESIDENT SURGEON.

13. The resident surgeon shall be a legally qualified medical practitioner, who shall reside on the premises, and who shall not be absent therefrom for any lengthened period, without the permission of the managing committee. He shall not be allowed to engage in private practice, under any circumstances, except by express authority of the committee. He shall hold office under the direction of the committee, and one month's notice, on either side, shall terminate the period of his engagement.

14. He shall receive the certificates from applicants for admission, examine the nature of their cases, decide on their fitness for admission, either as in-door or out-door patients, and report the same to the visiting committee; and shall also discharge all patients as soon as he considers them fit to be discharged.

15. He shall have charge of all patients in the hospital, and their treatment; but in cases of difficulty or danger, or long continuance in the hospital, he is to consult the honorary surgeons, and report to the committee.

16. He shall be invested with paramount power within the institution, he being directly responsible to the general committee for the doing or not doing of each particular act; and also that the hiring and dismissing of all inferior officers be vested in him.

17. He shall keep such accounts respecting the patients as the committee may direct, in books to be kept for that purpose, and furnish a monthly report to the managing committee.

18. He shall have charge of all surgical instruments, drugs, and chemicals, and shall carefully examine them, both as to quality and quantity, and report any defects, in either respect, to the managing committee, and shall make an inventory of the same in a book to be kept for the purpose, and keep an account of the receipt and expenditure or loss and breakage of such instruments, drugs and chemicals. There not being a dispenser, he must perform such duties as would devolve on that officer.

19. He shall enter regularly, in books to be kept for that purpose, the names of the patients, as they are admitted or discharged, and note the nature and history of their diseases while under treatment; and shall receive all money and other property belonging to patients, and shall account for the same to the committee.

20. He shall accompany the honorary surgeons through the wards, and report to them the state of the patients. He shall

also visit each patient every morning and evening, and enquire if the treatment prescribed has been attended to; and if any cause of complaint exists he shall immediately remove the same, or report it to the committee at its next meeting.

21. He shall perform all minor operations of surgery, and the *post mortem* examinations, and shall keep the key of the dead-house. He shall also give due notice to the honorary medical officers when a consultation is to be held, or an operation is to be performed; but in all cases of emergency he shall act to the best of his judgment.

SECRETARY AND COLLECTOR.

22. The secretary and collector shall keep the minutes, accounts and records of the hospital, compile all reports, conduct the correspondence, attend all meetings, and bring all business before the same, carry out all resolutions agreed to, and perform all clerical duties that may be ordered by the committee.

23. He shall convene the annual general meeting in the month of January in each year, at such time and place as may be fixed by the committee, by advertisement in the local papers, at least seven days previous to the meeting.

24. He shall convene special meetings of contributors in the same manner, when directed by the committee, or on the written application of ten contributors of at least £1 each; the object of such special meeting to be stated in the advertisement, and he shall also give special notice to each member of the committee of such meetings.

25. He shall collect subscriptions and all moneys due to the hospital, give receipts for the same, furnish admission orders, according to amount of subscription, pay to the treasurer, at least once in every month, all moneys he may have received, and render an account of the same.

26. He shall be in attendance at the hospital at the meetings of the visiting committee, and for the convenience of any other person who may wish to see him, every Monday, Thursday, and Saturday, from twelve to one p.m., except when required to be out of town collecting.

SERVANTS.

27. The servants shall live in the hospital, and shall not leave it without the permission of the resident surgeon. They shall obey the orders of the said officer, be regular in their attendance, behave with tenderness to all patients, and with civility and respect to strangers.

28. They shall pay great attention to cleanliness personally, and to all things entrusted to their charge; particularly to the bedding of the patients, and have it changed as often as may be necessary, taking care that it is thoroughly dried and aired.

29. They shall administer to the patients the medicines and diet at the times and in the manner directed by the resident surgeon, and they shall not permit the patients to take anything which is not prescribed, and shall be careful to explain to the patients the instructions of the said officer; they shall watch attentively the state and symptoms of the patients, and report the same to the resident surgeon.

30. They shall not permit patients to receive from visitors medicines, victuals, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor allow any portion of the medicines, diet, or any other things to be removed from the wards by the patients or visitors without an order from the resident surgeon.

31. They shall be careful to collect and carry to the dispensary all empty phials, gallipots, &c., and shall attend at the dispensary at the time appointed to receive medicines and instructions.

32. They shall not admit any stranger without permission of the resident surgeon, except during the hours appointed for that purpose.

33. They shall be obedient to the regulations of the hospital and shall report immediately to the resident surgeon any impropriety of conduct, or infringement of the rules, by any patient, visitor, or other person.

PATIENTS.

34. The patients shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner, and shall strictly observe all the directions of the resident surgeon and servants, take their medicines and diet at the time directed, and shall not take any other than those prescribed; neither shall they conceal or put away any portion thereof.

35. They shall not leave their ward and go into another ward, nor leave the house, nor remain out for a longer time than may be granted, nor introduce visitors, nor receive medicines, victuals, liquors, tobacco, or any other thing, nor shall they smoke, without the express leave of the resident surgeon.

36. They shall not gamble, spit on the floor, deface or injure any part of the ward, furniture, bedding, clothing, books, or periodicals; nor sing, blaspheme, or use rude or indecent language.

37. Any patient having any cause of complaint shall make the same known to the resident surgeon or visiting committee, whose duty it shall be to remedy the same, or report it to the committee at its next meeting.

38. Patients judged by the resident surgeon as able to assist in the work of the hospital shall, at his request, so employ themselves.

39. Patients shall not sit up after eight o'clock in the winter or nine o'clock in the summer; and all patients considered by the resident surgeon able to do so, shall rise at seven o'clock in the summer and eight o'clock in the winter.

40. Out-door patients must attend at the hospital on Mondays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, at twelve o'clock, and must observe the rules relating to in-door patients as far as the same may be applicable.

PATIENTS AND VISITORS.

41. Patients and visitors are requested not to give any fee, reward, or gratuity to any servant or other person connected with the hospital.

42. Visitors are admitted only on Wednesdays and Sundays, between the hours of two and five o'clock in the afternoon, except by a special order from a member of the managing committee or resident surgeon; and no visitor is allowed to remain more than one hour, except officiating ministers of religion, who may visit patients at any time; but all visitors must retire when requested to do so.

43. Visitors shall not give or leave with any patient, medicine, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor any other thing, without the permission of the resident surgeon; nor interfere with the servants, or disturb the patients by loud talking or unnecessary noise.

44. Any visitor or patient violating any of the rules of the hospital, or behaving with impropriety, will be compelled to retire or be dismissed, and will not be re-admitted at any time without special leave from the visiting committee.

45. Any servant or other person in any way connected with the hospital (except in so far as is provided for in the sixteenth rule) who shall receive directly or indirectly any fee, reward, or gratuity, shall be immediately disqualified and dismissed, and shall not be permitted to hold any office or appointment in future.

MEETINGS.

46. All meetings in connection with the hospital shall be open to subscribers, and to the representatives of the Press, provided that no person present at committee meetings, who is not a member of committee, shall interfere or take any part in the proceedings.
