APPLICATION for a share in the sum of £2000 granted by the Legislature in Aid of the Building Fund of Free Libraries will be received at this office until the 14th September next.

No grant to any library is to exceed £500, nor is any grant to be made to any institution in Melbourne.

N.B.—To entitle any institution to share in this Grant, such institution must be *bond fide* a free library, that is, a library open to the public daily free of charge, as is the case with the Melbourne Public Library.

The following particulars must be furnished, viz:—

1. The name of the institution, which should clearly indicate that it is a Free Library.
2. The amount expended in the erection or purchase of the building, and the materials of which it is constructed, with particulars of any further proposed expenditure thereon.
3. The amount already contributed by the Government, specifying the years.
4. The amount locally subscribed, distinguishing between the sums subscribed before and since the last return.
5. Whether the land is the property of the institution, and whether granted by the Crown or purchased.
6. The number of books.
7. The number of visitors during 1872 to 31st July.

## COMMONS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim or increase (as the case may be) the Commons hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:-

**BALLOONG COMMON.**—The unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be and constitute a Common to be designated the Balloong Common, viz.: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 18 A of section 2, parish of Balloong; thence by a road bearing S. 85° 35' E. one hundred and fifty-six chains, more or less, to the Ninety-mile Beach; thence by that beach bearing south-westerly six miles; thence by a line bearing north-westerly twenty-eight chains to Shallow Inlet; thence north-easterly by that inlet and Mangrove Flats to the south boundary of allotment 17 A; thence by the south and east boundaries of that allotment; thence by a line crossing a road to the south-west angle of allotment 20 B; thence by the south and east boundaries of that allotment, by the south and east boundaries of allotment 20 A, by the east boundaries of allotments 19 A, 19 A, and 18 A, by the north boundary of the last-named allotment, and by a road bearing N. 42° 25' E. thirty chains to the point of commencement. Area available for commonage, about 1700 acres.—(72.E.5337.)

**BELVOIR COMMON.**—The unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be and constitute a common to be designated the Belvoir Common, viz.: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 5 of

section 15, parish of Belvoir; thence by the west boundary of that allotment and a line (being the west boundary of the Belvoir Town Common) bearing north one hundred and seventy-six chains, more or less, to the River Murray; thence down that river to a point bearing east from the easternmost angle of the land in the parish of Belvoir West, licensed to John Pickering; thence to the said angle of that land; thence by the south-east boundary thereof; thence by a line bearing south three chains fifty links, more or less, to the north boundary of allotment 3 of section 4; thence by that allotment and allotment 4 to the Melbourne and Sydney road; thence by that road south-easterly and easterly to the south-west angle of allotment 2 of section 15, parish of Belvoir; thence by that allotment and a line crossing a road bearing north twenty-six chains eight links to the south-east angle of the land licensed to James Shelly; and thence by a road bearing east forty-three chains fifty links, more or less, to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area available for commonage, about 1500 acres.—(71.C.24371.)

### REMOVAL OF CUT TIMBER, ETC., FROM THE WATERSHED OF THE PLENTY RIVER AND ITS TRIBUTARIES.

WHEREAS by the 108th section of the *Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Board of Land and Works shall have power from time to time to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves: Now, therefore, the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the rule and regulation following, that is to say:—

The issue of licenses to enter upon and fall timber on unoccupied Crown lands forming the watershed of the Plenty River and its tributaries, having been prohibited:

Notice is hereby given, that all rails, palings, shingles, and fallen timber must be removed from such Crown lands before the thirty-first day of August instant, from which date dray traffic thereon will be permanently closed; and any person trespassing on such lands for the purpose of cutting or removing timber, or otherwise causing injury to the watershed, will be proceeded against in accordance with the before-mentioned clause of the said Act, whereby it is provided that every person offending against any such rule and regulation shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such rule and regulation, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
