PERRY'S GOLDEN RULE FOR AVOIDING COLLISIONS AT SEA.

(Discovered by Capt. Charles James Perry, and read before the Royal Society, Victoria, by Professor Halyford, 11th November 1867.)

"WHENEVER the Danger of Collision pervades the courses of two approaching ships, each vessel maintains unalterably one line of direction or 'bearing' from the other throughout the progress of the ships towards the point of contact."

So that if the light of an approaching ship in the night-time is seen, after a moderate interval of time, to continue on the same "bearing" as was first observed, it is a certain indication that the danger of collision is involved in the courses of the ships; but if the second observation shows the approaching ship to be upon a *smaller* angle with the course than that which was at first observed, it indicates that she will pass ahead; but if upon a *larger* angle, that she will pass astern. Any alteration, therefore, in the angle or "bearing" is a sign of safety; but a continuance of the same angle, whether it be large or small, is an infallible token of danger.

This rule assumes that no alteration is made in the courses or speed of the vessels during the short interval of sighting one another and crossing each other's track.

The same rule applies in the day-time.

Discoverer long resident on South Head, and a reliable authority. He considers rock to have about three fathoms over it at high water. Bearings are from general knowledge and not by compass."

MINING OPERATIONS ON RESERVED LAND AT SPRING HILL AUTHORIZED.

THE Governor in Council has authorized the holders generally of miners' rights to occupy under the same the land described in the schedule hereto, being a portion of an area reserved for Watering purposes by Order of 26th March 1866, and notified accordingly in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th April 1866, subject to the following conditions:—

1. The extent of ground to be occupied by any miner or party of miners shall not exceed the limit prescribed by the bye-laws of the Maryborough Mining Board for mining claims of a similar class.
2. The surface of the ground shall not be occupied for purposes of residence, nor shall any tents or huts be erected thereon.
3. The mining operations shall be conducted in such a manner as not to pollute the spring, or to cause to flow into the same any water from the claims, or any sludge or tailings, or to interfere in any way with the purpose for which the said land was so reserved, or set apart, or used.
4. The workings shall be open at all times to the inspection of any mining surveyor, or other authorized officer.
5. The Minister of Mines, or any person by him authorized in writing, shall have at any time power to order the immediate discontinuance of any mining operations within the reserve.
6. In case any person mining under the authority of this order shall in any way violate the above conditions, it shall not be lawful for him any longer to mine upon or within the limits of the said lands.

SCHEDULE.

All that piece or parcel of land in the colony of Victoria, county of Talbot, parish of Spring Hill, in the mining district of Maryborough, and containing by admeasurement eight acres two roods and thirty perches, be the same more or less: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 27, and bounded on the west by a road bearing north seven chains ninety links; on the north by a line bearing east eleven chains; on the east by a line bearing south seven chains ninety links; and on the south by a road bearing west eleven chains to the point of commencement.

MATLOCK PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES of the Matlock General Cemetery.

1. Application for a site for a grave or vault, and for permission to inter in the Matlock General Cemetery, must be made, in writing, at the office of the trustees, Matlock, and the prescribed fee or fees must then and there be paid to the officer appointed to receive the same. Such officer will then grant, in writing, the required permission, subject to the pro-

duction before interment of all particulars, in writing, required for the registration of deaths by Act 28 Victoria No. 246.

2. The trustees will not undertake to cause graves to be dug or re-opened, but all operations in the cemetery must be conducted by the permission, under the supervision, and subject to the control of the trustees or their officer appointed for such purpose.

3. All graves must be sunk to a depth of six feet for adults and five feet for children under 12 years of age.

4. Permission, in writing, will be granted by the trustees to erect a vault, monument, tomb, pedestal, stone, or fence on or around any site or grave which shall have been previously allotted or used on application, in writing, payment of prescribed fee or fees, and production of a plan, approved of by the trustees, of said erection.

5. Proposed epitaphs or inscriptions to be placed over graves must be submitted, in writing, to the trustees, who will at their discretion withhold or grant permission to use the same.

6. All erections on or around graves must be kept in good order and repair by their respective owners, otherwise the trustees will have them repaired at the risk and cost of said owners, or will have them removed altogether.

7. The hours appointed for interments are between Eight o'clock a.m. and Five o'clock p.m., but under extraordinary circumstances the trustees will grant special permission to inter at other hours.
