## CASTLEMAINE DISTRICT WATER SUPPLY.

## RULES, REGULATIONS, AND ORDERS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of October 1872.

HIS Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Waterworks Act 1865*, makes the Rules, Regulations, and Orders following respecting the Castlemaine District Water Supply, being a work constructed under the authority of the said Act:—

1. The district which shall be rated for the Castlemaine District Water Supply shall be the whole of the Borough of Chewton, the whole of the Borough of Castlemaine, and the whole of the United Shire of Mount Alexander.

2. The water supplied from the works may be received for domestic purposes only (in which case no meter need be used), or by measure.

3. The following rates and charges in respect of all the lands and tenements within the said district (excepting hospitals, benevolent institutions, buildings used exclusively for public charitable purposes, churches, chapels, and other buildings used exclusively for public worship, the dwellings of ministers of religious denominations, and buildings used as schools and receiving aid from the Government or otherwise of a public character) are those which the owners and occupiers of such lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the board otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

I. On every house or tenement of £10 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.

II. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10 and not exceeding £100, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

III. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £100 and not exceeding £300, a rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

IV. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £300 and not exceeding £500, a rate of Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

V. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £500, a rate of Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

VI. Warehouses and stores not being domiciles shall be subject to a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

In addition to the above there shall be charged—

For stables and coach-houses—for one horse, 10s. per annum; for each additional horse, 7s. 6d. per annum; for one carriage, 20s. per annum; for each additional carriage, 10s. per annum.

For irrigation purposes the rate shall be £5 per acre per annum; the least rate to be charged shall be 5s. per annum.

Water-troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each.

The rates to be charged for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Two pence per 100 gallons.

The rate to be charged for water supplied by the board by measure shall be One shilling per 1000 gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity of which the charge at 1s. per 1000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure; and,

(2) If for other than domestic purposes only, 25,000 gallons per quarter.

4. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carrier's stable or a supply for any manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation, (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labor), or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps, for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants, or washing the house walls or a carriage, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter.

5. Any owner or occupier of any premises within the above-mentioned district who shall wish to have water from the waterworks brought into his premises, and who shall have paid or tendered to the board the portion of water-rate in respect of such premises by these regulations directed to be paid in advance, may open the street, road, and ground between the pipes of the board and his premises, having first obtained the consent of the Council of the Borough, or Shire, or Road Board, as the case may be, to whom the management or care of such street or road belongs, or in whom the fee-simple thereof is vested, and of the owners and occupiers of such ground, and lay any leaden or iron pipe from such premises to communicate with the pipes of the board. Every pipe so to be laid shall be subject to the approval of some officer of the board.

6. Before any pipe is made, to communicate with the pipes of the board, the person intending to lay such pipe shall give two days' notice to the board of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the board, and every such pipe shall be so made to communicate under the superintendence and according to the directions of the surveyor or other officer appointed for that purpose by the board.

7. Wrought-iron piping of approved quality, and lead piping of the following weights only, will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:—

No service for domestic supply of a larger bore than half-inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the board.

8. No person receiving a supply of water for domestic purposes shall use for other than domestic purposes any water so received.

9. No person receiving a supply of water for any other than domestic purposes shall use for any purpose other than those for which he is entitled to use the same any water so received.

10. Every person who shall have agreed with the board for a supply of water by measure shall at his own expense provide a meter and keep and maintain the same in good working condition, to the satisfaction of such officer as may be appointed by the board; and in the event of any repairs being required, notice (in writing) shall be immediately given by such person to the board, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such repairs are effected.

11. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering (1,000,000) one million gallons.

12. Every person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give six days' notice in writing to that effect to the board, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.

13. If any person refuse or delay to have such meter properly repaired and put in correct working order after having been required by any officer of the board so to do, or if any person shall neglect to pay the water rates after due notice, the board may shut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the service pipe or otherwise until such meter shall have been properly repaired and certified by some officer of the board as being in proper working order, or until such rates are paid.

14. No plumber or other person shall fix or re-fix any meter upon any premises supplied with water by the board without having first obtained a certificate from the board that the said meter has been examined and found in correct working condition.

15. The officers of the board may enter any house, buildings, or lands to or into which water is supplied by the board, by measure, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed.

16. No person receiving water from the board shall take and carry away such water from his premises, to any person not having agreed to be supplied by the board with water, or shall allow such person to take and carry away the same.

17. No person receiving water from the board shall sell the same to any other person.

18. Where several houses or parts of houses in the separate occupation of several persons are supplied by one common pipe, or where water is supplied to courts, alleys, and rights-of-way by stand-pipes, each owner or occupier of every such house or part of a house in every such court, alley, or right-of-way receiving water from the board, shall be liable to the payment of the same rates for the supply of water as he would have been liable to if the house or the part of a house owned or occupied by him had been supplied with water from the works of the board by a separate pipe.

19. The rates for water shall be paid in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year, and the first payment shall be made at the time when the owner or occupier of the premises shall require, receive, or use the supply of water, and if such time shall not be one of the half-yearly days aforesaid, then the first payment shall be a proportionate part of the rate for the fraction of the current half-year up to the first of such half-yearly days.

20. If any person supplied with water by the board does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, the Board may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

21. The streets shall not be watered from hydrants, or fire-pipes by means of a hose, but the water is to be applied to the streets by carts, or by manual labor.

22. The water supplied in the above district shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and

being under and in accordance with the same regulations, and not otherwise.

23. In the construction of these rules and regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, and the word "board" shall mean the Board of Land and Works.

And the Honorable Angus Mackay, Her Majesty's Minister of Mines for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions*, it is amongst other things enacted, that any institution established for the cure of disease, or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons, and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom shall have paid not less than One pound per annum or Twenty pounds in one donation, may be incorporated as thereinafter mentioned, and all persons who shall have paid as aforesaid shall be deemed contributors within the meaning of the said Act; and it is also enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five of the said persons praying that such institution may be incorporated, to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of such persons, shall have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication) the Governor in Council may declare the contributors for the time being to such institution to be, and they shall thereupon become and continue, a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the Order in Council, and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty-five contributors to the institution known as the Warrnambool Hospital, praying that the said institution may be incorporated: And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petition has been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order declare the contributors to the said institution to be a body politic and corporate in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, in manner following, that is to say:—

The contributors for the time being to the institution established in Warrnambool, in the county of Villiers, under the style of the Villiers and Heytesbury Hospital and Benevolent Asylum, but generally known as and called the Warrnambool Hospital, are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Warrnambool Hospital and Benevolent Asylum."

And the Honorable James Goodall Francis, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such

borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in compliance with the application in writing of the council mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto annexed, do hereby proclaim the portion of the shire mentioned in the last column of such Schedule to be a district within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and may from time to time, after one month's notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works may issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee as shall from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as a Reserve made for the preservation and growth of timber, in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the 53rd section of the above-recited Act, the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described (excepting the portions thereof which may have been applied for under the 19th or 49th section of the said Act, prior to the date of this Proclamation, and for occupation of which portions licenses may hereafter be granted), that is to say:—

YANGARDOOK STATE FOREST.—One thousand two hundred acres, more or less, county of Bourke, parish of Yangarook: Commencing at the point on Djerriwarrh Creek determined by producing the south boundary of Isaac Smith's licensed land; thence by a line bearing east eighty-five chains, more or less, to that land; thence by that land and a line bearing north about one hundred and four chains; thence by a road bearing N. 52° 54' E. about eighteen chains to the south angle of allotment B; thence by that allotment and allotment A bearing N. 25° 51' W. fourteen chains, N. 5° 32' E. nine chains sixty-three links, N. 22° 48' E. fourteen chains thirty-nine links, and N. 73° 20' W. twenty-eight chains fifty-eight links; thence by a road bearing N. 89° 50' W. about twenty-four chains to the aforesaid creek; and thence by that creek downwards to the commencing point; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(72.H.1770.)

I have had clause 47 of Scab Act enforced in regard to the sheep kept on the Eglinton station.

I have had no prosecutions during the quarter. I regret being unable to report any great improvement in the state of the district during the past quarter. The scab

has, during the winter months, again shown on the same runs infected twelve months ago. On these runs the paddocks are excessively large, the country rugged and scrubby, and some of the ranges inaccessible; on this account it is very difficult to eradicate the disease. The sheepowners are not certain of having made a clean muster, the sheep at same time being weak from effects of fluke.

During the approaching shearing season I hope to see great exertions made to effect clean musters on the runs now infected, have the sheep properly dipped, and I hope cured.

I have issued no licenses this quarter. I have examined, at the Flemington yards and elsewhere, 157,970 sheep, all of which, with the exception of 200, appeared to be free from scab.

I have destroyed 200 sheep that were scabby at the Yarra Flats.

1193 sheep have arrived from England and the neighboring colonies during the quarter, and have all been dressed for scab previous to their leaving Melbourne.

The first month in the quarter I was engaged with the foot and mouth disease.

I HAVE the honor, in compliance with clause 12 of Scab Act, to report that, during the quarter now ended, there has been no fresh outbreak of scab in my district.

Coutts Bros. have shorn and dipped their sheep (which broke out) in tobacco and sulphur, having found that lime and sulphur used immediately after shearing causes the cuts from the shears to turn to bad sores. They (Coutts Bros.) are subdividing their paddock, to facilitate mustering, and are to use strenuous measures to cure their sheep.

Mr. Russell's sheep are all clean with the exception of the one flock reported in June last, in which I found one infected sheep.

There has been only one meeting of my Board of Advice during this quarter. The next meeting will be on the 11th proximo.

I have issued no licenses and inflicted no fines during the quarter.

SEYMOUR DISTRICT.

I HAVE the honor to report as to the state of scab in the Seymour District for the quarter ending 30th September 1872.

I have issued a scab license to Mr. Isaac Younghusband for 115 rams on his Killeen station.

I had five prosecutions against Mr. Younghusband, and obtained convictions in three, viz.:-

1st. Dipping sheep without authority on the Euroa station. I prosecuted for 2000, but there were said to be 14,000 in the Between-the-Creeks paddock, where I found the dipped sheep. Fined £100, and £8 ss. costs.

2nd. Not giving notice of being aware the 115 rams on Killeen were scabby. Fined £10 and £3 ss. costs.

3rd. Not giving written notice to neighboring sheepowners of scab being on his Killeen run. Fined £5, and £3 ss. costs.

The other cases, for not giving notice of scab in his sheep in the upper paddock, Waunganbehan, and for not affixing notices of scab at Killeen, were dismissed.

I have recommended the release from quarantine of the Mogolemby run, belonging to Mr. Thos. Beggs.

I consider the country lying to the west of the Sydney road as in a great measure clean, but on the east side, where it is very rugged and thick with wattle scrub, as being in a doubtful state.

No renewed licenses have been applied for, but as the season has been unusually wet, and the ground so soft as to prevent sheep being mustered, I do not attach much importance to that fact. As the shearing is just commencing, when all the sheep must necessarily be collected, I will soon be in a position to form a decided opinion on the subject.

I have had considerable difficulty in the cases re Younghusband, who denied having dipped any of his sheep since shearing last, as did the servants in his employ who were subpoenaed on behalf of the Crown. I was fortunately able to find other witnesses, who proved the dipping had been going on for a whole week, and so got a conviction.

## REGULATIONS UNDER THE WATERWORKS ACT 1865.

THE Governor in Council, in pursuance of the provisions contained in the 7th section of the Act No. 288, called *The Waterworks Act 1865*, and in exercise of the powers thereby conferred, has made the following regulations:—

1. From and after the 21st October 1872 applications for the supply of water from the Spring Gully Reservoir at Sandhurst are to be made to the keeper of the reservoir, who, on receiving from the applicant the proper price for the water required, will take steps to supply the same as soon as possible.

2. The reservoir keeper shall lodge to the credit of the Secretary for Mines daily, into such bank as may be directed by the Secretary for Mines, all moneys which on or before such day shall have come into his possession in the carrying out of these regulations, and shall obtain from the teller, cashier, or other proper officer of the bank, a receipt for the money so lodged.

3. The reservoir keeper shall give to each purchaser a receipt for the money paid upon a printed form, as hereinafter provided, and shall upon the block of such receipt enter full and accurate particulars thereof.

4. Printed forms of receipts shall be issued to the reservoir keeper from the head office, from time to time, in such quantities as may be required, and each receipt shall bear a distinctive number and be marked with the initials of the Secretary for Mines, or of such officer as may be appointed by him for that purpose. The reservoir keeper shall under no pretence whatever receive money for the sale of water without giving a receipt therefor on one of the printed forms so supplied.

5. The reservoir keeper shall, on the first day in every month (such day not being a Sunday or a public holiday duly gazetted as such, in which case the following day shall be substituted), forward to the Secretary for Mines a statement showing the moneys received by him during the preceding month; such statement shall show the name of each purchaser, the quantity of water purchased, the amount of purchase-money, and the date when such purchase-money was received. He shall at the same time furnish a list of the sums of money paid by him into the bank during the preceding month in manner aforesaid.

6. The reservoir keeper shall, whenever required by the Secretary for Mines, forward to the head office, or produce to any officer duly authorized for that purpose by the Secretary for Mines, the blocks of the receipts issued by him, together with any unissued receipts which may be in his possession.

7. If from any cause whatever a printed form of receipt shall be rendered unfit for issue it shall not be destroyed, but shall be retained by the reservoir keeper, for production to the Secretary for Mines or officer duly authorized by him in manner aforesaid.

8. The rate to be charged for the water shall be Fourpence (4d.) per thousand gallons.

9. The regulations affecting the supply of water from the Huntly aqueduct, made by Orders in Council dated respectively the 12th July 1869 and the 13th October 1869, are hereby revoked.

The Engineer-in-Chief of Railways, or other officer authorized as aforesaid, may order that the galleries, drives, ways, passages, &c., be stowed if necessary, or may order that such masonry or other works of art be made and erected at the cost of the said William Quillinan and party as in his opinion may be required for the support of the surface or as a precaution against any contingent damage to the railway; and thereupon the said William Quillinan and party shall cause the work so ordered to be well and truly done with all reasonable speed.

5. Previous to occupying any portion of the said land the said William Quillinan and party shall deposit in the hands of the Receiver and Paymaster at Castlemaine the sum of Fifty pounds sterling, as a guarantee that they will observe and fulfil these conditions, such deposit to be retained until the said persons shall relinquish the land described in the schedule and discontinue mining operations; and if the said conditions, restrictions, and regulations shall then have been observed and fulfilled, the said deposit shall be returned to the depositors, but if any of them shall not then have been fulfilled or observed, then the whole, or such part of the sum so deposited as aforesaid as the Governor in Council shall think fit, shall by an Order of the Governor in Council be declared forfeited, and shall thereupon become public money, and be applied accordingly.
