## HOLIDAYS IN COMMON SCHOOLS.

THE Commissioners of the Board of Education having observed that the number of holidays (30) allowed by regulation No. 132, to be taken in one year, has been exceeded in a very large number of schools, hereby give notice to local committees and teachers that in future the penalty provided in regulation No. 135, for any excess of holidays, will be strictly enforced, unless the reasons for such excess be considered fully satisfactory.

The Board will only sanction an excess of holidays in cases where it shall be made clear that it has been impossible to keep the schools open without injury to the teachers or the children.

It is pointed out that the thirty holidays allowed, being exclusive of Saturdays and Sundays, amount to six weeks in the year, which are amply sufficient for all purposes of recreation and rest.

The deaths in December exceeded those in November by 100. They also exceeded the average of the month in the previous ten years by 2. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of November by 74.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 106° on the 22nd, and the lowest was 44° on the 26th. The mean temperature of the month (66°2') was 3°2' above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (46°) took place on the 3rd, viz. :—from a maximum of 97° to a minimum of 51°. The least range (9°2') was on the 12th, viz. :—from a maximum of 59° to a minimum of 49°8'. The mean daily range was 23°2'. The mean atmospheric pressure (29·842 inches) was slightly above the average.

Males contributed 53 per cent., and females 42 per cent. to the total mortality; children under five years of age contributed 53 per cent. to that mortality. In December 1870, the proportion of children under five years of age to the total mortality, was 52 per cent.; in December 1869, it was 53 per cent.; in December 1868, it was 55 per cent.; in December 1867, 64 per cent.; in December 1866, it was 69 per cent.; in December 1865, it was 65½ per cent.; in December 1864, it was 63 per cent.; in December 1863, it was 47 per cent.; in December 1862, it was 66 per cent.; in December 1861, it was 50 per cent., and in December 1860, it was 73 per cent.

The deaths of 7 persons over 75 years of age, all males, occurred during the month, viz. :—One aged 76 of cephalitis; two aged respectively 77 and 81 of bronchitis; two aged respectively 84 and 87 of old age; one aged 84 of paralysis; and one aged 85 of extravasation of urine.

Twenty violent deaths took place during the month, of which thirteen were referred to accident, one to homicide, five to suicide, and one to execution. The following are the particulars.—A boy aged 6 was killed by a fall from a horse, a boy aged 8 died of rupture of the peritoneum resulting from a fall; a boy aged 8 died of injuries resulting from a cart-wheel passing over him; a hatter aged 42 died of the effects of a fall; a female infant aged 9 months died of a scald; a boy aged 5 died of sunstroke; a boy aged 8, a boy aged 14, and a youth aged 19, were accidentally drowned in the Yarra; a female aged 50 was accidentally drowned at Hotham; a male aged from 35 to 40 was found drowned at St. Kilda; a male about 40 years of age, name and occupation unknown, was found drowned, and a baker aged 40 was found dead, in the Yarra; a chemist aged 31, and a fruiterer aged 42, committed suicide by cutting their throats; a confectioner aged 40 and a female aged 47, poisoned themselves with strychnine; a clerk aged 20 drowned himself (verdict in last three cases temporary insanity); a female aged 43 was murdered by persons unknown; a laborer aged 45 was judicially hanged in the Melbourne Gaol.

Sixty-nine deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole mortality, occurred in public institutions, viz. :—31 in the Melbourne Hospital, 6 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Lying-in Hospital, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Industrial Schools, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 2 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 204, of which 105, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 99, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 161 were under one year of age, 34 were between one and two years, 6 were between two and three, 2 were between three and four, and 1 was between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 180, of which 119, or 66 per cent., were of males, and 61, or 34 per cent., were of females; 17 were between five and ten, 4 were between ten and fifteen, 3 were between fifteen and twenty, 10 between twenty and twenty-five, 11 were between twenty-five and thirty, 12 were between thirty and thirty-five, 24 were between thirty-five and forty, 24 were between forty and forty-five, 15 were between forty-five and fifty, 14 were between fifty and fifty-five, 10 were between fifty-five and sixty, 11 were between sixty and sixty-five, 7 were between sixty-five and seventy, 11 were between seventy and seventy-five, 2 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 5 were upwards of eighty.

The deaths from zymotic and local diseases were about equal in the month under review. The most fatal zymotic diseases were diarrhoea and dysentery, which together caused 64 deaths against 20 in November. Under the head "Constitutional Diseases," phthisis, combined with hæmoptysis, caused 33 deaths in November, and the same number in December.

The number of deaths in the quarter ending 31st December 1871, was 945, which is more by 62 than the average of the quarter during the previous ten years, but less than that average by 108, if allowance be made for the increase of population during the period. The mean temperature of the quarter under review (60°2') corresponds closely with an average based upon the experience of the last quarters of the previous ten years.
