By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1869, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may from time to time by a notice in the *Government Gazette* proclaim as a street or road or as a town or village any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such town or village shall be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road shall have been proclaimed shall be and be deemed to be, thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim as a village the portion of Crown lands hereinafter described, viz.:—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved or used for a road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public road within the meaning of this Act, and such land reserved or used for a road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way shall thereupon and thenceforward from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public and reserved for public use as a public road within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; provided that no such proclamation shall be deemed to be a proclamation as a main road as hereinbefore provided; and provided further that every and any such proclamation may at any time be revoked, if necessary, by the Governor: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim to be a public road within the meaning of the said Act the lands reserved or used for the road, highway, or thoroughfare at Blackwood, in the shire of Ballan, the width and limits of which are hereinafter described, viz.:—

Total width—48 feet 9 inches. Limits—From the south-east angle of allotment 1 to the north-east angle of allotment 3 of section C, at Red Hill, in the parish of Blackwood.—(72.F.20784.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1869 it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the one hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

YARCK COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the following boundaries shall be and constitute a Common, to be designated the Yarck Common: Commencing at the west angle of allotment 8, parish of Yarck, being a point on the south-eastern side of the road from Yea to Merton; thence by that road bearing north-easterly to the north angle of allotment 9; thence by a road bearing south-easterly to Spring Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the road which forms the west boundary of allotment 93, parish of Alexandra; thence by that road and the road forming the south-western boundary of Yarck bearing north and north-westerly to allotment 5 of Yarck; thence by that allotment and a line bearing north-easterly to the east angle of allotment 8 aforesaid; and thence by the southern and south-western boundaries of that allotment westerly and north-westerly to the commencing point, 4000 acres, more or less, as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(72.H.17851.)

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Justices of the Peace Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden: And whereas by Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony bearing date the seventh day of December 1868, the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which Courts of General Sessions shall have jurisdiction were defined: And whereas by other Proclamations bearing date the fourth day of January 1869, and the twenty-eighth day of December 1870, some of such districts were altered: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint that the Courts of General Sessions of the Peace having jurisdiction within the places or districts defined or altered as hereinbefore mentioned shall be holden during the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three at the respective places and times hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

BYE-LAWS.

MELBOURNE SEWERS AND WATER SUPPLY.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of, the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, make the Bye-laws following:—

1. All bye-laws heretofore made relating to the Melbourne Sewers and Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Board, that is to say:—

- i. On every house or tenement of £10 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.
- ii. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10 and not exceeding £100, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- iii. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £100 and not exceeding £300, a rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- iv. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £300 and not exceeding £500, a rate of Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- v. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £500, a rate of Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- vi. Warehouses and stores not being dwellings shall be subject to a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- vii. Water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each.
- viii. For water supplied by the Board by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Board, at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be (1), if for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity of which the charge at 1s. per 1000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure; and (2) if for other than domestic purposes only, 25,000 gallons per quarter.

4. Any person receiving water from the board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises to any person not having agreed to be supplied by the board with water, or who shall allow such person to take and carry away the same, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. Any person receiving water from the board who shall sell the same to any other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the board, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the board, he shall obtain from the board a license in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. Before any such license shall be granted by the board the person applying for same shall satisfy the board that he is a competent plumber.

9. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the board, without giving two days' notice to the board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the board, without the permission in writing of the board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

10. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the board without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board. Lead-piping of the following weights only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:—

No service of a larger bore than $\frac{1}{2}$ inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the board.

11. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the board may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as to the said board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

12. Any person supplied with water by the board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

13. No meter shall be allowed to be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering (1,000,000) one million gallons, except by special consent of the board.

14. If any meter should cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

15. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

16. In the construction of these bye-laws, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole.

The foregoing bye-laws were made and passed by the Board of Land and Works and the seal of the said Board of Land and Works was hereunto affixed the nineteenth day of December 1872, in the presence of

SIGNALS.

Pilotage and Distress.

The Board of Trade have for a long time been in communication with ship owners and with the public departments with a view to establishing certain signals to be used by ships in distress and by ships wanting pilots. The Board of Trade have, with great care, ascertained full particulars of the signals made at night by the ships of private companies (chiefly by a combination of rockets and blue-lights), and have framed a set of rules to establish signals which, whilst they interfere with no existing signals, are in themselves simple and unmistakable.

The Admiralty and the Trinity House, and all public bodies and companies with whom the Board have corresponded, agree as to the necessity for authorized signals of distress, and the question has been so far narrowed that there only remained one or two points to settle by conference.

This was done at a meeting at the Board of Trade, consisting of Captains Were and Weller, Elder Brethren of the Trinity House; Mr. J. Hart, of the Pilotage Department of the Trinity House; Captain Simpson, Superintendent of Pilotage at Liverpool, and Captain Wilson, of the Mersey Docks and Harbor Board; and Admiral Bedford and Mr. Gray, of the Board of Trade.

At this meeting it was unanimously agreed that it would be well if rules were made as given below. It was proposed that these rules should be printed in draft and circulated at an early convenient opportunity, with a view to careful consideration and subsequent embodiment in the Merchant Shipping Code Bill.

The draft rules agreed to were:—

1. Signals to be made by Ships wanting a Pilot.

That the signals be—

(a.) *In the daytime.*—To be hoisted at the fore, the Jack or other National Color usually worn by merchant ships, having round it a white border, one-fifth of the breadth of the flag.

(b.) *At night.*—

(1) A blue-light every 15 minutes; or

(2) A bright white light, flashed or shown at short or frequent intervals, just above the bulwarks, for about a minute at a time.

2. As regards Signals of Distress.

(a.) *In the daytime.*—The following signals, numbered 1, 2, and 3, when used or displayed together or separately, shall be deemed to be signals of distress in the daytime:—

1. A gun fired at intervals of about a minute.

2. The Commercial Code signal of distress indicated by N. C.

3. The distant signal, consisting of a square flag having either above or below it a ball, or anything resembling a ball.

(The Ensign Union down has been advisedly omitted, because many foreign flags are the same whether right side or wrong side up; and because it is hoped that the signals now suggested may become international.)

(b.) *At night.*—The following signals, numbered 1, 2, 3, and 4, when used or displayed together or separately, shall be deemed to be signals of distress at night:—

1. A gun fired at intervals of about a minute.

2. Flames on the ship (as from a burning tar barrel, oil barrel, &c.).

3. Rockets of any color or description, fired one at a time at intervals of about five (5) minutes.

4. Blue-lights, burned one at a time at intervals of about five (5) minutes.

SOUTHERN RIFLE CORPS.—

RULES PREPARED BY THE COMMITTEE FOR THE FUTURE GOVERNMENT OF THE CORPS.

Constitution of committee—Members, how elected—Vacancies in committee, how filled—Secretary, his duties—Commanding officer a member of committee ex officio.

1. The civil business of the corps shall be managed by a general committee, consisting of seven members, to be elected annually in the month of July, five to form a quorum. Should the number of candidates proposed exceed the number required a ballot shall be taken, and the seven having the greatest number of votes shall be declared elected. All vacancies occurring in committee to be filled by the corps, at a meeting specially convened for that purpose. Secretary to be elected by the company at the annual meeting, and shall be an *ex officio* member of committee. His duties shall be to keep clear and intelligible minutes of all proceedings at committee and corps meetings, to keep the accounts of the corps, to prepare half-yearly statements of receipts and expenditure, to post copy of same in the orderly room, and to conduct all correspondence relating to the corps under direction of the commanding officer, and to convene all meetings of committee when necessary, but no committee shall be deemed convened unless all the members are duly summoned. The commanding officer of the corps shall be, *ex officio*, a member of the committee.

Duties of committee—Money votes—When to meet.

2. The business of the committee shall be to consider and decide as to the eligibility of all candidates for admission to the corps, who shall be subject to the approval of the officer commanding; to consider, pass, and recommend to be paid, all expenditure of corps funds, exclusive of all monies received from the Government (no expenditure exceeding Five pounds sterling to be incurred at any one committee meeting without the sanction of the officer commanding); and to take into consideration any matters submitted to them by the officer commanding the corps. The committee to meet monthly and as often as occasion may require.

Special general meetings, how convened.

3. The officer commanding may at any time convene a special general meeting of the corps, and must do so on receiving a requisition stating the object of the meeting, signed by not

less than twenty members of the corps, provided always that the subject to be dealt with be not of a military nature.

Alteration or rescinding of rules—Fourteen days' notice required—Number of signatures required to request for alteration of rules—Who shall preside at meetings.

4. Every special general meeting shall be deemed duly convened by notice at parade at least seven days before such meeting, and by an advertisement in the daily papers the day before the meeting, but no rule or bye-law shall be made, altered, or rescinded, unless fourteen days' notice be given to the commanding officer, who shall, on receiving a requisition stating the proposed alteration, and duly signed by not less than twenty members, summon a special general meeting of the corps, and shall direct a copy of such proposed addition to, alteration, or repeal of the rules or bye-laws to be posted in the orderly room at least seven days before such meeting. At every meeting of the corps the senior officer present shall preside.

General meetings be held July and January each year.

5. A general meeting of the corps shall be held in the months of July and January of each year, to be convened by advertisement in the daily papers, and by notice given at parade at least seven days before the time appointed for such meeting.

Financial statement—Auditors and auditing of the accounts.

6. At each general meeting a statement of the financial position of the corps, duly audited, shall be submitted to the members. Two auditors shall be elected by the corps, the duties of such auditors shall be the examination of the books and accounts of the corps for the ensuing half-year, and to submit a statement of its then financial position at the next general meeting; in the event of one or both of the auditors being unable to perform their duties, the committee shall appoint one or two in their place.

Dissolving meetings.

7. No general committee or other meeting of the corps shall be dissolved without a motion to that effect having been carried.

Directions to applicants for joining the company—When candidate is under full age.

8. All persons desirous of joining the corps shall make written application to the officer commanding, who shall direct that the name, address, and occupation of every such person shall be posted in the orderly room for at least seven days before he can become a member of the corps, during which time any member objecting to the candidate must communicate the same in writing to the committee. Should the candidate for admission be under the age of twenty-one years, or in service as an apprentice, he must also produce the written consent of his parent, guardian, or employer to his entering the corps, and in addition thereto, such parent, guardian, or employer must sign the following undertaking to become responsible for all fines and penalties incurred by such candidate after his admission, and under these rules:—

Form of undertaking to be signed by parent, guardian, or employer, when candidate is under full age.

Memo.

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I, the undersigned of , of , a candidate for admission to the Southern Rifle Corps, he being under full age, do hereby give my consent to his candidature, and, in consideration of his being admitted a member, do hereby undertake to pay to the officer commanding the said corps, or to such other person as he shall appoint, the amount of all fines which may be incurred by the said under the rules of the corps, a copy of which I have seen and have made myself acquainted with the contents thereof.

Witness

Minimum age and height required of candidates.

9. No person shall be eligible for admission to the corps unless he be at least 5 feet 5 inches in height, and not under seventeen years of age.

Members changing residences.

10. All members changing their permanent address must, within Thirty days, give notice of the same in writing to the commanding officer, under a penalty of Two shilling and sixpence.

Members requiring to be absent for Thirty days or more.

11. Any member of the corps intending to be absent from his permanent address for a period of more than thirty days must give notice of such intention in writing to the commanding officer, who shall, at his discretion, direct the deposit of his arms, accoutrements, and uniform in a place, to be appointed by the said officer commanding; penalty for non-compliance with this rule Ten shillings.

Members responsible for damage to arms, accoutrements, and clothing.

12. Every member will be responsible for the good and serviceable order of his arms, accoutrements, and clothing (fair wear and tear excepted), and any damage done thereto shall be made good by him.

Appearing on parade with arms, clothing, &c., dirty or unserviceable.

13. Any member appearing at parade or company drill with uniform, arms, or accoutrements dirty or unserviceable from neglect, may be fined by the officer in command, or the captain commanding, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence.

Members must be properly clothed for parade.

14. No member, when in possession of arms and clothing, will be allowed on parade unless in uniform and accoutred.

Wearing uniform, or any portion, prohibited when off duty.

15. Any member, when off duty, wearing the uniform issued to him by the Government, or any portion thereof, without the permission of the officer commanding, shall be fined for the first offence Two shillings and sixpence, and for every subsequent offence Five shillings.

Members owing fines must pay them before competing in company's matches.

16. No member to compete in any of the corps rifle matches unless he has qualified as an effective and duly liquidated all claims recorded against him.

Arms, &c., to be sent to Orderly Room for inspection when ordered.

17. Should circumstances prevent any member from attending a parade called for an inspection of arms, he must forward his rifle, sword, and accoutrements to such place and at such time, as shall be appointed by the commanding officer. A fine of Two shillings and sixpence shall be inflicted for non-compliance with this rule.

Resignation of Members.

18. Any member of the corps resigning before he has earned his effective allowance, or failing to make himself effective in any year, shall be fined the sum of Two pounds ten shillings, or such less sum as the committee may determine.

Transfer of members to other companies, how arranged.

19. Any member wishing to transfer to another company shall be allowed to do so on condition the commanding officer of the corps, to which transfer is desired, will pay to the credit of this company the value of his uniform at the time of transfer, or, in default thereof, the member so desiring to be transferred shall, previous to transfer, be made to pay a proportionate amount for same, according to length of time such uniform shall have been worn; such amount to be decided by the committee.

Fines to be posted in Orderly Room.

20. All fines incurred during each month shall be posted in the Orderly Room by the 15th of the succeeding month.

Non-payment of fines, how enforced.

21. Any member who may be fined must pay the amount of such fine to the non-commissioned officer or others duly appointed by the commanding officer, to receive the same within fourteen days of the fine having been posted in Orderly Room, and in default of such payment will be proceeded against according to law.

Rules to be supplied to each member.

22. Every member joining the company to be supplied with a copy of these regulations.

DUTIES TO BE DONE TO BE RANKED AS EFFECTIVE.

Duties required to be performed in each year by each member to earn effective allowance are—

In the case of old members:

To attend 15 parades.

2 battalion parades.

2 parades for official inspection.

And, in addition thereto, as many other parades or company drills as will make 24 in all; also the course of musketry instruction as ordered.

New members must, after being dismissed drill, perform the following duties to render themselves effective (in addition to their musketry instruction, as ordered):

If joining between 1st October and 31st December,

To attend 9 parades.

2 battalion parades.

2 official inspections.

And 5 other company parades or drills; making 18 in all.

If joining between 1st January and 30th April,

To attend 7 parades.

1 battalion parade.

1 official inspection.

And 3 other company parades or drills; making 12 in all.
