FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford, in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he may think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," now stand prorogued until Tuesday the Thirteenth day of February instant, and it is expedient to prorogue the same further: Now therefore, I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Tuesday the Thirteenth day of February instant until Wednesday the Twentieth day of March now next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this second day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and in the thirty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.

PORTARLINGTON JETTY LIGHT.

MARINERS are hereby informed that, on and after the 1st March next, a *green light* will be exhibited between sunset and sunrise from a lamp erected on the *Portarlington Jetty*.

The light is twenty-five (25) feet above low-water level, and is visible in clear weather a distance of five (5) miles, between the bearings W. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. and S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., and is cut so as to guide vessels a cable's length clear of the north edge of the Prince George bank and the buoy off Point Richards.

EXTENSION OF DRAWBACKS REGULATIONS TO PORTS ON RIVER MURRAY.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the Drawbacks Regulations dated 3rd January 1872, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the same date, being extended to goods exported from Victorian Ports on the River Murray; of the clause attached, to be called Clause 5 B being added thereto; and of the accompanying Form of Bond being used in the case of such goods in lieu of that contained in Schedule 1 to the said Regulations.

CLAUSE 5 B.

At each port on the River Murray the coastwailer in charge will attend at his office on such day and at such hour as may be directed by public notice from the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, to pass such goods for drawback in respect to which he may have received notice on the previous day, in which case no charge will be made for the officer's attendance. Claims for drawback under this order must be made to the Collector of Customs, at Melbourne, who will pay them at the Custom House, or remit the money to claimant, less the cost of remittance.

BOND TO BE GIVEN ON ENTRY OF GOODS ENTITLED TO DRAWBACK ON EXPORTATION ACROSS THE RIVER MURRAY.

KNOW ALL MEN by these presents, that We are jointly and severally held and firmly bound unto our Sovereign Lady Victoria, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, in the sum of pounds to our said Lady the Queen, her heirs or successors, for which payment well and truly to be made we bind ourselves, and each of us jointly and severally, our and each of our heirs, executors, and administrators, and every of them, firmly by these presents.

Now the condition of the above written obligation is such, that if the above bounden comply with all the regulations approved by virtue of Act No. 35 Vict. No. 413, and pay any penalty which may be imposed in default of such compliance, and if the said goods and every part thereof shall be duly shipped and exported to and landed at _____ aforesaid, or otherwise accounted for to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, and shall not be re-introduced into Victoria except on payment of the full duties chargeable thereon, then this obligation to be void, otherwise to be and remain in full force and virtue.

REGULATIONS FOR THE TRANSMISSION OF GOODS UNDER BOND FROM MELBOURNE OR GEELONG TO WAREHOUSING PORTS ON THE RIVER MURRAY, AND VICE VERSA.

GOODS may be "exported" under bond from the ports of Melbourne or Geelong to warehousing ports belonging to New South Wales, situated on the Murray, by rail *via* Echuca, and from thence by steamer or other approved means of conveyance to the port of destination.

2. Goods in bond at the port of Melbourne may, in the same manner, be "removed" under bond to Echuca, or to other warehousing ports belonging to Victoria on the River Murray.

3. Similar goods may be removed to or exported under bond from one warehousing port to another on the River Murray, under the usual regulations.

4. Drawback will be allowed on such duty-paid goods entered outwards for ports belonging to New South Wales on the River Murray, according to the regulations under the Drawbacks Act of 1871.

5. In the event of steamers or other approved means of conveyance not being in waiting at Echuca to receive goods entered out for other Murray ports, on their arrival by rail at that station, the owners or agents of such goods will be required to place the same in bond (*in transitu*) at that port until a vessel or other approved means of conveyance is ready to convey them to their destination, when they are to be placed in such vessel or other means of conveyance, by and at the expense of the owner or agent thereof, under the supervision of the officers of this department.

6. No goods forwarded under bond for Murray ports shall be allowed to remain, during *transitu*, at the railway station, Echuca, for more than 24 hours after arrival; goods not shipped from thence to their destination, or placed by the agents or owners thereof in the bonding warehouse at that port, within the time specified, will be removed to bond by the officers of this department, at the expense of the parties interested, and shall remain in such bond at their risk until all expenses attending such removal and warehousing have been paid.

7. The bond to be entered into at the port of removal or

export must cover goods to their port of final destination; it will be unnecessary, therefore, for owners or agents of goods detained at Echuca, under the circumstances referred to in preceding paragraph, to enter into a further bond at that port.

8. The bonds entered into for the removal or export of goods to Murray ports shall contain a covenant binding the exporters of such goods and their sureties to produce, within a reasonable time to be stated therein, to the collector of the port of export, a certificate from the proper officer of Customs at the port of destination of such goods acknowledging the receipt thereof.

9. On an entry being passed for removal or export of goods from the warehouse, Melbourne or Geelong, for Murray ports, *via* Echuca, such goods shall be forwarded by and at the expense of the owner, under the usual regulations, to the searcher of this department at the railway station, Melbourne, who will duly record the receipt and transmission of such goods, and properly secure the carriages conveying the same.

10. A transire, in duplicate, containing particulars of goods forwarded under bond by rail, signed by the searcher of Customs at the railway station and countersigned by the railway officer, shall be transmitted by the train conveying the goods under cover to the principal officer of Customs, Echuca, along with shipping bill; and the duplicate of the former will be returned by the searcher to the collector, Melbourne or Geelong, as the case may be, together with the Customs entry of goods, duly certified to by such searcher that the goods have been exported or removed.

11. On the arrival of goods under bond by rail at Echuca, the declaration on the transire accompanying the same is to be signed by the guard or other railway officer in presence of the principal officer of Customs; and should the goods be intended for that port, such transire is to be treated as a coast-wise report, and entries are to be passed accordingly.

12. If the goods are entered out and intended for ports in New South Wales, or for other Victorian ports on the Murray, the transire is to be retained by the principal officer of Customs, Echuca, who will intimate to the collector, Melbourne or Geelong, as the case may be, the arrival at his station of the goods *in transitu*.

13. In a like manner, the officer of this department at the port of destination, when the goods are intended for Victorian ports, shall acquaint the collector with the arrival at his station.

14. The principal officer of Customs at Echuca is particularly directed to take care that all bonded goods forwarded to that port *in transitu* for other ports on the Murray, shall be entered and borne on the vessel's manifest conveying the same to their final port of destination.

15. Dutiable goods, the produce of or exported from New South Wales, may be entered and bonded at Victorian ports on the Murray, to be either cleared for home consumption or removed under bond by rail *via* Echuca to the ports of Melbourne or Geelong, under similar regulations as bonded goods removed or exported therefrom for Murray ports, or from Albury.

16. The master of every vessel trading to and conveying bonded goods from Victorian ports on the Murray shall be required to enter into bond by himself and two sufficient sureties to conform to the Customs laws and regulations of this colony, and shall in every case where goods are removed by him from one warehousing port to another be a party to the removal or export bond entered into by the owner or agent of such goods. He shall also keep a cargo book, in which shall be entered all goods, together with their port or place of shipment and landing. No goods shall be landed at other than a duly proclaimed port, except under a written permit from the officer of the port at which the duties shall have been paid on such goods.

17. Goods may be exported from the warehouse under bond or for drawback from Melbourne to Albury, or between the ports on the River Murray, upon execution of the usual bond by the exporter; the proprietor of any such waggon also entering into a bond on each occasion for the due delivery of goods entrusted to him, and for compliance with these regulations, in double the amount of duty payable on such goods, with two approved sureties; no goods other than bonded goods or for drawback being in any such waggon.

18. The letters H. M. C. shall be kept distinctly painted in letters not less than fourteen inches in length and two inches in thickness, on each side of the cover of such waggon; such waggon and its contents may be examined by any officer of Customs (or other person authorized in writing by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs), to whom every facility and information required shall be given by the driver of such waggon.

19. Before the driver of any such waggon shall proceed on his journey he shall furnish to the Customs a "way-bill," in duplicate, specifying in detail, marks, Nos., and description of goods laden by him, their quantities or value, according as duty is chargeable thereon; such "way-bill," in duplicate, if found correct, shall be signed by the driver and countersigned by the searcher of Customs, one copy thereof being handed to the driver and the other posted without delay to the principal officer of Customs at the port of arrival.

20. It will be the duty of any carrier entrusted with bonded goods at once on his arrival to report himself at the Custom House, and present his "way-bill," and there conform to any instructions which may be given to him by the proper officer of Customs for the due security of the goods. The duplicate "way-bill" aforesaid, upon being compared with the goods, shall be endorsed by the examining officer with the result of the examination, and returned to the principal officer of Customs at the port of export.

PUBLIC STREETS IN BOROUGHES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Boroughs Statute* (23 Vict. No. 359) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time upon the request of the Council by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public street within the meaning of this Act, and such land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public and reserved for public use as a public street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; provided that no such proclamation shall be deemed to be a proclamation as a main road as hereinbefore provided; and provided further that every and any such proclamation may be any time revoked, if necessary, by the Governor: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, acting upon the request of the respective Councils of the Boroughs of Ballarat East, Eaglehawk, and Emerald Hill, do by this notice proclaim to be public streets within the meaning of the said Act the lands reserved or used for the streets, highways, or thoroughfares which are hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Street in the Borough of Ballarat East.

Name of street, Eureka street (part of); width, 53 feet; limits, from Main street bearing N. 62° 16' E. two and a half chains to Alexander street.—(71.D.8838.)

Streets in the Borough of Eaglehawk.

Name of street, none; width, 66 feet; limits, from Napier street at the south-east angle of allotment 1 of section 14a bearing westerly to Market street.

Name of street, Pascoe street; width, 66 feet; limits, from the south-western boundary of the borough to the western boundary of the city of Sandhurst.

Name of street, Walker street; width, 66 feet; limits, from Pascoe street southerly to the south-western boundary of the borough.—(71.A.26010.)

Streets in the Borough of Emerald Hill.

Name of street, none; width, 99 feet; limits, from the junction of Dorcas street and the Eastern road bearing

northerly to the junction of the Sandridge and St. Kilda roads.

Name of street, none; width, 66 feet; limits, from Moray street north to Whiteman street.

Name of street, Clarke street (extension); width, 66 feet; limits, from the Sandridge road to Whiteman street.

Name of street, Whiteman street; width, 66 feet; limits, from the intersection of the Sandridge road by the St. Kilda railway line bearing northerly along the railway line to Moray street north.—(71.D.24185.)

Trustees' receipts to be sufficient discharges to lessees, vendees, or mortgagees, who are not to be bound to see to the application of moneys paid by them; and neither lessees, vendees, mortgagees, or exchangers to be entitled to demand evidence of consent by, nor are their titles to be affected by any want of consent on the part of any of the persons before mentioned to the exercise of any power by the trustees.

Subject to the exercise of the above powers, the incumbent or officiating minister for the time being of the ecclesiastical parish of St. James to be entitled to minister in church and to have use and control of buildings.

PURPOSES TO WHICH PROCEEDS OF DISPOSITION ARE TO BE APPLIED.

Three-fifths of net rents of land leased to be paid to the minister for the time being of the ecclesiastical parish of St. James, Melbourne, so that the amount so paid do not in any one year exceed One thousand pounds. Land taken in exchange to be dealt with by the bishop or the person duly authorized to administer the affairs of the diocese during the vacancy of the see, acting under advice as aforesaid, in manner deemed most beneficial for the denomination above-mentioned.
