FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he may think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," now stand prorogued until Tuesday the Eleventh day of March instant, and it is expedient to prorogue the same further: Now therefore, I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Tuesday the Eleventh day of March instant until Tuesday the Fifteenth day of April now next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this third day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, and in the thirty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.**

FLINDERS PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES and Regulations of the Flinders Public Cemetery.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. Any person or persons making a vault or private grave, or erecting a monument or tombstone in the cemetery, by and with the consent and formal permission of a quorum of the trustees under these rules, and upon payment of the proper charges, is or are entitled to have, maintain, and keep such vault, grave, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their sole representatives for ever, from the date of such permission being given.
3. Applications for burial, or for permission to make a vault or grave, or erect a monument or tombstone in the cemetery must be made to the agent of the trustees, and subject to rules hereinafter mentioned. A certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying, on payment of the proper charges (see Schedule B.)
4. The charges for common graves will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in the cemetery, on receipt of a certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of a quorum of the trustees that the relatives or friends of the deceased are unable to pay the charges.
5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, if required, at a uniform rate; parties causing private graves to be dug by their own assistants, or brick graves or vaults made ready, must dig or construct under the direction or with the approval of the trustees or the person appointed by them for that purpose.
6. Any person wishing to make an interment in any private grave or vault must obtain the consent in writing of the owner thereof, which document must be submitted to the trustees or their agent on making application for the interment.
7. The plans of all monuments, raised tombs and fences, are to be submitted to the trustees previous to the placing of the same in the cemetery, and the approval of the same obtained in writing.
8. Every monument, raised vault, grave, gravestone, and fence must be kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner or owners.
9. Orders for or notices of interment must be given to the agent of the trustees at least eight working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral, otherwise an extra charge will be made. (See Schedule A.)
10. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for interments will be from Eight o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. from the first of September to the thirtieth day of April inclusive, and from Eight o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. in the other months.
11. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept, and may be inspected on application to the agent of the trustees.
12. The name, age, denomination, late place of residence and probable cause of death, together with other information as required per Schedule A, must be stated at the time of giving the order for interment.
13. The trustees reserve to themselves the right to make any alterations from time to time in the charges and regulations.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service of the Victorian Railways, or by the exercise of the right to purchase reserved in the specification or the special conditions to any of the schedules, or by the purchase of articles manufactured in the penal or other Government establishments, or the manufacture of articles by the department.

4. IRON CASTINGS.

TENDERS will be received until Ten a.m. on Tuesday the 25th March 1873 from persons willing to furnish Iron Castings, in such quantities as may be required for the Government Railways, from 1st July 1873 until the 30th of June 1874.

The castings are required for locomotive engine work, carriage work, &c.

Whenever specially ordered the castings shall be run from the very best "cold-blast iron," and of such particular brand, quality, and mixture as may be described in the order; or of such other substituted mixture as may be approved or directed by the General Overseer of Locomotives, so as to produce a hard, close, soft, or other description of metal.

The castings are to be clean, sharp, free from surface scale, shell, cold shuts, blow holes, honeycomb, cinder, or any other imperfection, and are to be sound in every respect and thoroughly close in grain. When specially ordered the castings are to be run with heads or runners of such weight as may be requested, and no extra charge shall be made or allowed for same, and the contractor will be required to remove the head or runner from the casting where possible, and charge the casting at the net weight only, trimmed and cleaned. In cases where it is necessary to cut off the head in a lathe or machine, such head will be cut off by the Government, and returned to the Melbourne Station, there to be delivered to the contractor free of cost or carriage.

Whenever ordered, the castings are to be moulded in loam without a pattern, and loam price will be paid according to schedule, but no extra charge will be allowed for patterns, strickles, or loam boards. The orders will express the kind or description of casting according to the schedule distinction; and the rates there filled in opposite each item will be allowed accordingly.

9. The Railway Storekeeper will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior character, or not in accordance with the specification, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to him.

Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

10. Irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivery or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Railway Storekeeper, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds; and it will be in the power of the Government, upon repetition of such irregularities, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11.
