The deaths in March were more than those in February by 63. They were also more than the average of March in the previous ten years by 47. If allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of March by 23.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded during the month at the Melbourne Observatory was 95.2° on the 5th, and the lowest was 43.4° on the 24th. The mean temperature (62°) of the month was a degree and a half below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer (32.7°) in any one day occurred on the 5th, viz., from a maximum of 95.2° to a minimum of 62.5°, and the least range (9.8°) took place on the 27th, viz., from a maximum of 63° to a minimum of 53.2°. The mean daily range was 19.1°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.983 inches) was about the average.

Males contributed 55 per cent. and females 45 per cent. to the total mortality of the month; children who had not attained their fifth year of age contributed 49 per cent. to that mortality against 55 per cent. in March 1872, 53 per cent. in March 1871, 47 per cent. in March 1870, 48 per cent. in March 1869, 61 per cent. in March 1868, 63 per cent. in March 1867, 57 per cent. in March 1866, 59 per cent. in March 1865, 58 per cent. in March 1864, and 57 per cent. in March 1863.

The number of deaths of persons of the age of 75 years and upwards was 15, viz.:—Those of a master mariner aged 75, and a storekeeper aged 93 of old age; of a stonemason aged 93 of cancer; of a gentleman aged 75 of diarrhoea; of a gentleman aged 84 of bronchitis and exhaustion; of a hawker aged 75 of ascites; a dealer aged 78 of apoplexy; of a farmer aged 77 of hydropneumothorax; of a clerk aged 76 of pericarditis; of a male aged 75 of colonial fever; of five females aged respectively 70, 79, 82, 88, and 94 of old age.

The violent deaths which occurred during the month numbered twenty, of which seventeen were set down as accidental, one as homicidal, and two suicidal. The accidental deaths were those of:—A storeman aged 40 whose skull was fractured by a fall from a loft; of a storekeeper aged 36 who died of the effects of a gunshot wound in the arm; of a female infant aged 44 weeks who died of a scald; of a female child aged 1½, of two boys aged respectively 9 and 10, of a fisherman aged 47, of a share-dealer aged 55, and of a male aged 60, who were drowned; of three infants aged respectively 2, 3, and 4 months who were suffocated in bed; of an infant age unknown who was suffocated in night soil; of a female child aged 2 who died of lock-jaw caused by laceration of the hand; of a male child aged 2 who was killed by a dray wheel passing over him; of a lad aged 9 who died from the effects of a fall from a bridge; and of a laborer aged 32 who died from an undescribed injury to the leg. The homicidal death was that of a male aged 40 who was wilfully murdered. The suicidal deaths were those of:—A butcher aged 38 who poisoned himself with strychnine; and of a male aged 67 who shot himself with a pistol.

Sixty-three deaths, or 15 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—23 in the Melbourne Hospital; 8 in the Alfred Hospital; 4 in the Lying-in Hospital; 12 in the Benevolent Asylum; 1 in the Immigrants' Home; 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 3 in the Kew Lunatic Asylum; 1 in the Melbourne Gaol; 2 in the Pentridge Stockade; and 1 in the Police Depot.

The number of deaths of children under five years of age was 201, of which 103, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 98, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 137 were under one year of age, 44 were between one and two years, 14 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 1 between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 209, of whom 124, or 59 per cent., were males, and 85, or 41 per cent., were females; 20 were between five and ten, 4 were between ten and fifteen, 8 were between fifteen and twenty, 14 were between twenty and twenty-five, 13 were between twenty-five and thirty, 16 were between thirty and thirty-five, 19 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 13 were between forty-five and fifty, 13 were between fifty and fifty-five, 16 were between fifty-five and sixty, 13 were between sixty and sixty-five, 10 were between sixty-five and seventy, 12 were between seventy and seventy-five, 9 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 6 were over eighty years of age.

Under the head zymotic diseases, the most fatal complaints in the month under review were diarrhoea and dysentery, which caused 61 deaths as against 50 deaths in February and 53 in January. The total deaths from zymotic diseases were exceeded by those from local diseases, the most fatal complaints under the latter being those of the nervous and digestive systems.

SEYMOUR QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing on the Goulburn River at a point where the eastern boundary of the Worrough run abuts thereon; thence up that river to the south-west corner of the Nainabulla run; thence by the western boundary of that run to Dropmore run; thence by the southern, western, and northern boundaries of that run to Gobur run; thence by the western and northern boundaries of that run to Borodomanin South run; thence by the northern boundaries of that run to Borodomanin North and Junction runs to the Barjarg run; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of that run to the Lima run; thence, westerly and northerly by the southern and western boundaries of that run to the Warren-bayne run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to Honeysuckle North run; thence by the eastern, southern, and western portion of the northern boundaries of that run to Stony Creek run; thence by the western boundary of that run to the Gowangardie run; thence by that run north-westerly to the eastern boundary of the Caniambu run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the south-eastern boundary of Arcadia run; thence by the eastern, southern, and western boundaries of the Molka run to the south-eastern boundary of Noorilim run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; thence up that river to the Merringo run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to Worrough run; and thence, by the northern and eastern boundaries of that run to the point of commencement: Provided that all runs intersected by the boundaries above described shall be held to be within the Seymour Quarantine District: Provided, further, that such part of the Sydney road and all public roads, as well as the commons intersected by and along these roads, as are included in the boundaries above-described shall form no part of the Seymour Quarantine District. Provided further that the Moxelembly run shall form no part of the Seymour Quarantine District.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Order of 28 April 1873:

BRENANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Brenanah and Coyocora Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Benlith run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the northern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

CHRISTMAS HILL QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the south-east angle of the Glenard run, being a point on the west boundary of the Burgoyne and Tarrawarra Farmers' Common; thence by that common bearing south to the road from Stevenson's Bridge to Healsville; thence by that road easterly to the western boundary of allotment 3, parish of Sutton, being on a range; thence by that range southerly to the Yarra River; thence by a line to Mount Graham; thence by a line bearing about north 60 degrees west to Watson's Creek, being the south-eastern boundary of Diamond Creek run; thence by that run to the Glenard run aforesaid; and thence by that run to the commencing point. Provided that all alienated and selected lands at the date of this Order, as well as the main public road from Melbourne to Wood's Point and Yarra Flats, within the above boundaries, shall form no part of this Quarantine District.

GREENWALD QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the north-east corner of Greenwald run on the Crawford River; thence westerly by that river to its junction with the Glenelg River; thence southerly by that river and the Moleside Creek to the north-west corner of Kentbruck run; thence by the western boundary of that run bearing southerly to its south-westerly corner; thence by the southern boundary south-easterly; thence northerly and westerly by the top of Mount Kincaid to the south-west corner of Greenwich run; thence by the western boundaries of Greenwich and Lower Crawford runs to the Glenaulin Creek; thence by that creek south-easterly to the south-east corner of Greenwald run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run bearing northerly to the commencing point. The boundaries above described comprise the runs of Greenwald, Glenaulin, and Kentbruck.

HAMILTON QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at a point on the Glenelg River, being the north-east corner of East Strathdownie run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Kaladbro run; thence by the southern boundaries of that run to the western boundary of Ardn West run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run to the South Australian boundary; thence by that boundary to the Glenelg River; thence up that river to the starting point. KILLAWARRA QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the north corner of the Ovens Crossing-place Station; thence in a south-westerly direction by the Ovens Crossing-place, Tameric, Springs, and Mokoan runs; on the west and north by the Goorambat and Peechelba runs to the Ovens River; and on the east by that river to the point of commencement.

MANSFIELD QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the Muddy Creek with the Goulburn River; thence up that river to the "Balham Hill" run; thence by the eastern, southern, and western boundaries of that run to the Goulburn River aforesaid; thence down that river to the eastern boundary of Nainabulla run; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of that run and the eastern boundaries of Dropmore and Taroombe runs to Wanghambehan run; thence easterly by the southern boundary of that run and the southern boundaries of Seven Creeks, Bailey Hill, and Saintfield runs to Barjarg run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run to the western boundary of Maindample run; thence by the western boundary of that run to Ford's Creek; thence by Ford's Creek south-westerly to the Delatite River; thence down that river to the Goulburn River; thence up that river to the Howqua River; thence up that river to its source in the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range to the source of the Muddy Creek aforesaid; thence down that creek to the Island run; thence by the southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of that run to the Muddy Creek aforesaid; and thence down that creek to the point of commencement: Provided that all runs intersected by the boundaries above described shall be held to be within the Mansfield Quarantine District: Provided further, that all public roads, as well as the commons intersected by and along these roads, as are included in the boundaries above described shall form no part of the Mansfield Quarantine District: Provided that the farm occupied by James Tomkins, being lots 81, 82, 83, 84, 85, and 86 of the parish of Delatite, and lots 6, 7, 12, and 14 of the parish of Merrigg; also the farm occupied by John Hearne, being lots 69, 70, 71, 78, and 80, parish of Delatite, and lots 28, 29, 30, and 31, parish of Merrigg; also the farm occupied by Kenneth McKenzie, being lots 1, 4, 3, 7, 8, 11, and 38, parish of Merrigg; also farm occupied by Lewis Dundas, being lots 18, 19, 21, 132, 133, parish of Heolite, and lot 67, parish of Loyola; as also the roads leading from Changue station to Mansfield and from Mansfield to Jamieson, shall form no portion of the Mansfield Quarantine District: Provided further that the runs known as Upper Thornton and Goulburn Downs shall form no part of the said quarantine district.

POWLETT'S PLAINS QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Powlett's Plains run).—Commencing at a point on the River Loddon, being the north-east angle of allotment 62, parish of Kinypanial; thence southerly along the said River Loddon to the northernmost angle of the Salisbury Plains run; thence westerly and southerly to the northernmost boundary of the Brenanah run; thence westerly along the said boundary to the eastern boundary of the Torpichen run; thence northerly along the said boundary to the southernmost boundary of the Edgar Plains run; and thence easterly to the point of commencement.

PROTECTORATE QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Protectorate run).—Commencing at the north-east angle of Warapa run; on the west by that run; on the south by Postlethwaite run on the east by the Goulburn River for about seven miles; thence by a line running north-west to the commencing point.

REEDY CREEK QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at a point on the boundary of the Reedy Creek run where it is joined by the Tallarook and Kerrisdale runs; thence southerly by the western boundaries of Kerrisdale and Flowerdale runs to Clonbinane run; thence south-west by the boundary of that run to Running Creek run; thence north-westerly by the boundary of that run to Mount Piper run; thence north-westerly and north-easterly by that run to Tallarook run; and thence easterly by the southern boundary of that run to the commencing point.

Provided that the three-chain road from Hamilton (*via* Dunkeld and Wickliffe) to Skipton shall form no part of the Hexham Clean District.

KILMORE CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the north-east angle of the Wharparilla run, being a point on the Murray River; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of the said run to the Campaspe River; thence up that river to the Campaspe River run; thence by the northern, western, and a portion of the southern boundaries of that run to the Muskerry run; thence by the northern boundary of Muskerry and the northern and eastern boundaries of Mount Pleasant runs to Colbinabbin North run; thence by the western boundary of Colbinabbin North run to Gobareep run; thence by the western and northern boundaries of that run to Waranga run; thence by the northern boundaries of that run and Protectorate Station to the Goulburn River; thence down that river to the Murray River *aforsaid*; and thence down that river to the commencing point.
