## TREATY FOR THE MUTUAL SURRENDER OF BRITISH AND ITALIAN FUGITIVE CRIMINALS.

HIS Excellency the Administrator of the Government has directed the subjoined Despatch and Order of Her Majesty in Council to be published for general information.

## EXTRADITION.

Order in Council, dated March 24, 1873, for carrying into effect a Treaty between Her Majesty and the King of Italy for the Mutual Surrender of Fugitive Criminals, signed at Rome, February 5, 1873.

At the Court at Windsor, the 24th day of March 1873.

Whereas by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, initialed "An Act for amending the Law relating to the Extradition of Criminals," it was amongst other things enacted, that where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals. Her Majesty may, by other in Council, direct that the said Act shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be decomed exception. deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the fifth day of February last between Her Majesty and the King of Italy for the Mutual Extradition of Fugitive Criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and His Majesty the King of Italy, having judged it expedient, with a view to the better administration of justice, and to the prevention of crime within their respective territories, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from justice, should, under certain circumstances, be reciprocally delivered up: Their said Majesties have named as their Plempotentiaries to conclude a Treaty for this purpose, that is to say.

Say:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Sir Augustus Berkeley Paget, Her Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to His Majesty the King of Italy;
And His Majesty the King of Italy, the Noble Emilio Visconti Venosta, Deputy in the Parliament, and Minister Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

#### ARTICLE I.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other reciprocally any persons who, being accused or convicted of any of the crimes specified in the Article following, committed within the territory of either of the said Parties, shall No. 52.-July 11, 1873.-1.

I quali, dopo essersi communicati i loro respettivi pieni poterii trovati in buona e debita forma, hanno convenuto e conchiuso gli Articoli seguenti:—

#### ARTICOLO I.

Le Alte Parti Contraenti si obbligano di consegnarsi reci-procamente coloro i quali essendo imputati o condannati per uno dei reati indicati nel saguente Articolo, commesso nel territorio di una di esse Parti, saranno trovati nel territorio

be found within the territory of the other, in the manner and under the conditions determined in the present Treaty.

#### ARTICLE II.

The crimes for which the extradition is agreed to are the

following:—

1. Murder, or attempt or conspiracy to murder, comprising the crimes designated by the Italian Penal Code as the association of criminals for the commission of such offences.

2. Manslaughter, comprising the crimes designated by the Italian Penal Code as wounds and blows wilfully inflicted which cause death.

3. Counterfeiting or altering money, and uttering or bring-

3. Counterfeiting or antering money, and untering on highing into irrelation counterfeit or altered money.

4. Forgery, counterfeiting or altering, or uttering of the thing or document that is forged or counterfeited or altered.

5. Larceny, or unlawful abstraction or appropriation.

6. Obtaining money or goods by false pretences (cheating or fearly).

- 6. Obtaining money or goods by laise preferences (cheating or fraud).
  7. Fraudulent bankruptcy.
  8. Fraud, abstraction, or unlawful appropriation, by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, or member, or officer of any public or private company or house of com-
- omerce.

  9. Rape.

  10. Abduction.

  11. Child stealing.

  12. Burglarry and housebreaking, comprising the crines designated by the Italian Penal Code as entry by night, or even by day, with fracture or escalade, or by means of false key or other instrument, into the dwelling of another person with intent to commit a crime.

13. Arson.
14. Robbery with violence.
15. Threats by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or anything else.
16. Piracy, according to international law, when the pirate, a subject of neither of the High Contracting Parties, has committed depredations on the coasts, or on the bigh seas, to the injury of citizens of the requiring party, or when being a citizen of the requiring party, and having committed acts of piracy to the injury of a third State, he may be within the territory of the other party, without being subjected to trial.
17. Sinking or destroying, or attempting to sink or destroy, a vessel at sea.

18. Assaults on board a ship on the high seas with intent to kill or to do grievous bodily harm.

19. Revolt or conspiracy by two or more persons on board a ship on the high seas, against the authority of the muster.

Accomplices before the factinany of these crimes shall, moreover, also be delivered up, provided their complicity be punishable by the laws of both the Contracting Parties.

#### ARTICLE III.

The Italian Government shall not deliver up any Italian to the United Kingdom; and no subject of the United Kingdom shall be delivered up by it to the Italian Government.

## ARTICLE IV.

In any case where an individual convicted or accused shall have obtained maturalization in either of the two Contracting States after the commission of the crime, such naturalization shall not prevent the search for, arrest, and delivery of the individual. The extradition may, however, be refused if five years have elapsed from the concession of naturalization, and the individual has been demiciled, from the concession thereof, in the State to which the application is made.

#### ARTICLE V.

No accused or convicted person shall be given up if the offence for which he is claimed is political; or if he proves that the demand for his surrender has been made with the intention of trying and punishing him for a political offence.

#### ARTICLE VI.

The extradition shall not be granted if, since the commission of the crime, the commencement of proceedings, or the conviction, such a length of time has clapsed as to bur the penal prosecution or the punishment, according to the laws of the State to which application is made.

#### ARTICLE VIL

The accused or convicted person who has been given up shall not, until he has been liberated, or had an opportunity of returning to the country in which he was living, be imprisoned or subjected to trial in the State to which he has been given up, for any crime or on any charge other than that on account of which the extradition took place.

This does not apply to offences committed after the extradition.

#### ARTICLE VIII.

If the individual claimed is under prosecution or in custody for a crime committed in the country where he has taken refuge, his surrender may be deferred until the law has taken its

course.

In case he should be proceeded against or detained in such country on account of obligations contracted with private individuals, or any other civil claim, his surrender shall nevertheless take place, the injured party retaining his right to prosecute his claims against him before the competent authority.

### ARTICLE IX.

The requisitions for extradition shall be made, respectively, by means of the Diplomatic  $\Lambda$ gents of the High Contracting Parties.

#### ARTICOLO IV.

Può intravia essere ricusata la estradizione, ove siano trascorsi cinque anni dalla concessa naturalità, e l'individuo abbia, datla concessione di questa, tenuto il suo domicilio nello Stato richiesto.

#### ARTICOLO V.

Non sarà consegnato un imputato o condannato, se il reato pel quale egli è domandato sia politico; ovvero se egli prova che la domando della sua consegna sa stata, fatta con l'intendimento di giudicarlo e punirlo per un reato politico.

#### ARTICOLO VI.

Non sarà accordata la estradizione, se dal commesso reato, dall'iniziato procedimento, o dalla condanna, sia decorso tanto tempo che l'azione penale o la pena secondo la legge dello Stato richiesto sia estinta.

#### ARTICOLO VII.

L'imputato o condannato consegnato, finchè non sia stato liberato, o non abbia avuto l'opportunità di tornare nel paesi dove dimorava, non potrì essere careerato, o sottoposto a giudizio nello Stato, a cui fu consegnato, per reato o per altra imputazione diversa da quella per la quale avenne la estra-

#### ARTICOLO VIII.

Se l'individuo domandato è sotto processo o carcerato per un reato commesso nel paese dove si è refugiato, la sua estra-dizione può essere differita finchè la legge abbia avuto il suo

In caso si debba procedere contro di lui o sia egli detenuto nello stesso paoso per obbligazioni contratte con privati o per ogni altra azione civile. la sua consegna, ciò non ostante, avverrà, salvo alla parte di fin valere i suoi diritti contro di lui innanzi all'autorità competente.

## ARTICOLO IX.

Le domande di estradizione saranno fatte rispettivamente per mezzo degli Agenti Diplomatici delle Alte Parti Con-traenti.

The demand for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State applying for the extradition, and by such proof as, according to the law of the place where the fugitive is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there. committed there

committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation of the competent Court of the State applying for the extradition.

The demnand for extradition must not be founded upon a sentence in contumacia.

#### ARTICLE X.

If the demand for extradition be made according to the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State to which the requisition is made shall proceed to arrest the function

which the requisition is made shall proceed the fugitive.

The prisoner shall be taken before the competent magistrate, who shall examine him, and make the preliminary investigations of the affair, in the same manner as if the arrest had taken place for a crime committed in the same country.

#### ARTICLE XI.

ARTICLE XI.

In the examinations to be made in conformity with the preceding stipulations, the authorities of the State to which the demand is addressed shall admit; as entirely valid evidence, the documents and depositions taken on oath in the other State, or copies of them, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued there; provided that such documents are signed or certified by a Judge, Magistrate, or Officer of such State, and are authenticated by the oath of some witness, or stamped with the official seal of the Department of Justice or some other Department of State.

#### ARTICLE XII.

If, within two months from the arrest of the accused, sufficient evidence be not produced for his extradition, he shall be liberated.

#### ARTICLE XIII.

The extradition shall not take place until the expiration of fifteen days after the arrest, and then only if the evidence has been found sufficient, according to the laws of the State to which the demand is addressed, to justify the committed of the prisoner for trial in case the crime had been committed in the territory of that State; or to show that the prisoner is the identical person condemned by the Tribunals of the State which demands him.

#### . ARTICLE XIV.

If the prisoner be not given up and taken away within two months from his apprehension or from the decision of the Court upon the demand for a writ of habeas corpus in the United Kingdom, he shall be set at liberty, unless sufficient cause be shown for the delay.

#### ARTICLE XV.

ARTICLE XV.

If the individual claimed by one of the two Contracting Parties, in conformity with the present Treaty, should be also claimed by another or by other States on account of crimes committed in their torritories, his surrender shall, in preference, be granted according to priority of demand, unless an agreement be made between the Governments which make the requisition, either on account of the gravity of the crimes committed, or for any other reason.

#### ARTICLE XVI.

ARTICLE XVI.

Every article found in the possession of the prisoner at the time of his arrest shall be seized, in order to be delivered up with him. Such delivery shall not be limited to the property or articles obtained by the robbery or fraudulent bankruptey, but shall include everything that may serve as evidence of the crime; and it shall take place even when the extradition, after having been ordered, cannot take effect, either on account of the escape or the death of the delinquent.

## ARTICLE XVII.

The High Contracting Parties renounce all claim for repayment of the expenses incurred for the arrest and maintenance of the person to be given up, and for his conveyance on board a ship; such expenses shall be borne by themselves respectively.

#### ARTICLE XVIII.

ARTICLE XVIII.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the Colonies and foreign possessions of the two High Contracting l'arties.

The requisition for the surrender of a person accused or condemned, who has taken refuge in any such Colony or possession of either party, shall be made to the Governor or chief authority of such Colony or possession by the Chief Consular officer of the other residing in such Colony or possession; or, if the accused or condemned person has escaped from a Colony or foreign possession of the party on whose behalf the requisition is made, the requisition shall be made by the Governor or chief authority of such Colony or possession.

Such requisitions may be disposed of, in accordance, as far as possible, with the stipulations of this Treaty, by the respective Governors or chief authorities, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the extradition or to refer the matter to their own Government.

Her Britannic Majesty shall nevertheless be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British Colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender to His Italian Majesty of criminals who may have taken refuge in such Colonies or possessions, always in conformity, so far as possible, with the provisions of the present Treaty.

#### ARTICOLO X.

#### ARTICOLO XI.

Le autorità dello Stato richiesto, negli esami che debbono fure, giusta le precedenti stipulazioni, ammetteranno, come prova intieramente velida, i documenti e le deposizioni testimoniali raccolte con giuramento nell' altro Stato, o copie di esse, e similmente i mandati è le sentenze ivi emanate, purchè tali documenti siano firmati o certificati da un giudice o Magistrato o Ufficiale dello Stato medesimo, e siano autenticati col giuramento di qualche testimone, o contrassegnati col sigillo uffiziale del Ministero di Giustizia, o di qualche altro Ministero di Stato.

#### ARTICOLO XII.

Se nel termine di, due mesi dalla data della cattura del imputato, non sarà esibita sufficiente prova per la estradizione, egli sarà liberato.

#### ARTICOLO XIII.

Su tali domande potrà essere provveduto in conformità, per quanto è possibile, dei patti di questo Trattato dai rispettivi Governatori o dalle autorità supreme, le quali tuttavia avranno la facoltà o di accordare la estradizione o di riferirne al proprio Governo.

Sua Maestà Britannica nondimeno potrà dare speciali provvedimenti nelle Colonie Britanniche e possedimenti stranieri, per la consegna dei delinquenti rifugnati in dette colonie o possedimenti, a Sua Maestà Italiana, sempre in conformità, per quanto sia possibile, alle disposizioni del presente Trattato.

Finally it is agreed that this stipulation does not apply to the Island of Malta, the Ordinance of the Maltese Government of May 3, 1863 (No. 1230), remaining in full force.

#### ARTICLE XIX.

The High Contracting Parties declare that the present stipulations apply as well to persons accused or convicted, whose crimes, on account of which the extradition is demanded, may have been committed previously, as to those whose crimes may be committed subsequently to the date of this Treaty

#### ARTICLE XX.

The present Treaty shall come into operation ten days after its publication according to the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties.

Either party may at any time put an end to this Treaty, which, however, shall remain in force for six months after the notice for its termination.

This Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Rome within six weeks, or sooner if possible.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed in duplicate, in English and Italian, the present Treaty, and have affixed thereto their respective scals.

Done at Rome, the 5th day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

#### ELECTRIC TELEGRAPH.

Amended Regulations and Conditions under which Telegraphic Messages are Authorized to be Trans-mitted in Victoria.

MITTED IN VICTORIA.

HIS Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council has approved of the following amended Regulations under which Telegraphic Messages may be transmitted in Victoria.

1. A full and correct address must be given to every message, which must also bear the signature of the sender. Messages must be written with ink. All amounts must be written in words at length, with figures in parentheses.

2. Messages must be transmitted in the order of their reception, and no precedence will be allowed, except for special despatches on the service of the Government, the arrest of criminals, and in cases of pressing emergency, sickness, or death.

3. Payment of charges in advance in advance in advance in advance in advance in advance in advance.

S. Payment of charges in advance is required, except for replies to interrogatory messages on which the sender may have written the words "Reply will be paid for;" but special arrangements may be made for the receipt of messages payable by the receiver, either by depositing security at the receiving office, or by furnishing written guarantee to the satisfaction of the manager, covering the cost of transmission.

4. Messages will be delivered free of charge within one mile of the office at which they are received by telegraph; over that distance cab or omnibus fare will be charged, when incurred; and for messages to be delivered on shipboard an extra charge to cover the disbursement for boat hire will be made.

extra charge to cover the disbursement for boat hire will be made.

5. Messages may be transmitted in cypher in Roman letters or figures, on payment of an additional charge of fifty per cent. A group of five cypher letters or five cypher figures will count as one word.

6. On special occasions, when the communication may be kept open during the night, the minimum charge will be 5s. for 58 words or under upon all messages received for transmission later than 8 p.m.

7. No pecuniary responsibility is assumed for any errors or delays in the transmission or non-transmission, delivery or non-delivery of any message, from whatever cause the same may arise. In order, however, to afford the fullest security for the correctness of a transmitted message, the sender may obtain a copy of the message as repeated back from the receiving office, upon payment of one-half the original charge upon such message.

8. In the event of serious delay occurring to prevent the transmission of a message within a reasonable time, or sufficient to destroy the value of the despatch, notice will be conveyed to the sender, should his address be known, and the message, together with the amount paid thereon, be returned, if desired.

9. All messages, whether written upon the usual printed forms or upon plain paper, will be considered as tendered for transmission to their destination under the several conditions and stipulations ab. " Actualed.

10. The offices will be kept open for the transmission of messages by the public generally between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 8 p.m. (Sundays excepted.)

11. In case of any dispute arising as to the number of words chargeable on any message, the same shall be decided in accordance with the rules adopted at the latest European Telegraph Convention.

#### TRANSMISSION OF TELEGRAPHIC MESSAGES BY POST.

Telegraphic messages forwarded by wire from any telegraph station in Victoria, upon which the full telegraph rates payable in this colony have been paid, may be sent by post as letters, for delivery in Victoria or in any of the Australian colonies or New Zealand, without any payment for postage, if enclosed in the usual telegraph envelope.

Letters containing messages for transmission by telegraph from any place within Victoria posted at any post office not a telegraph office, with the words "Telegraphic Message only" written thereon, above the address, and directed to the nearest telegraph office, may be forwarded free of postage; and the officer in charge of the telegraph office to which such letter may be addressed shall transmit the message contained therein to destination, if within the colony of Victoria, provided that at least the minimum telegraph fee of One shilling in postage-stamps be paid thereon, any deficiency being collected on delivery.

Any Olegraphic message received by post for transmission

Any Degraphic message received by post for transmission by wire, and upon which less than full rate (if for a place beyond Victoria), or less than One shilling (if for a place within the colony), has been paid, shall be returned at once by the officer receiving the same to the sender, together with a note of explanation, enclosing the money received with the message as above.

The anchorage marked on the chart, to the southward of Goat Island, is by no means good, the ground being coral and very uneven (4 fms. to 10 fms).

The town of Somu Somu is about two miles north of its charted position.

Wairiki, the town abreast the anchorage, is about three miles south of Goat Island.

A vessel intending to anchor off Somu Somu should pass west of Goat Island, taking care to avoid the patches which here extend from both sides of the strait, and haul in for the town when well north of the island.

Supplies, other than fruit and yams, are scarce here; fresh water cannot be obtained without considerable difficulty.

Loma Loma, Island of Vanua Balavu, Fiji.

The following directions may be of assistance to vessels proceeding thither, H.M.S. Dido having been navigated by them without a pilot:—

Having made the south extreme of the Sea Reef, steer close along it to the north for the entrance; this will be easily distinguished, and a detached shoal near the centre of the channel, which constantly breaks, will prevent its being mistaken. Having made the entrance, steer N.W. for the opening between Aria Island and Vanua Balavu to clear a line of sunken patches running to the northward, about \$\frac{1}{2}\$-mile from the west side of the entrance. These patches will under favorable circumstances be seen. Having cleared them, a N.W. by W. \frac{1}{2}\$W. course for the lowest part of Vanua Balavu will lead close past the north end of a line of patches to the north of Munia Island. These patches having but little water over them are easily seen if care be taken to have the sun behind. Having passed these reefs, a W. \frac{1}{2}\$S. course for the east extreme of Manuano Island (which shows as a small light-colored bluff), will lead between several reefs with very little water over them, and with but little deviation to avoid them right up to the island. The anchorage to the southward of the island in 9 fathoms is much the best, that to the north being foul and bad holding ground.

Supplies are scarce, and there is no water.

FROST REEF.

The following position of Frost Reef was ascertained when passing near it:—
The rock of which the bearings are given is always above water, and is in the north extreme of the reef. Its breadth appears to be about 2' E. and W.; N. extreme, Mango, N. 75° E.; W. extreme, Chinchin, S. 1° E. From a position, with W. extreme, Chinchin rock, on reef S. 1° E.; and N. extreme, Mango, N. 86° E.; the E. extreme of the reef bore S. 34° E.; W. extreme of the reef bore S. 29' W. All courses and bearings are magnetic.

From the mast head the shoal appeared to extend to the northward and north-westward, as far as the eye could reach, and in places to have very little water on it.

A LL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground is opened.

2. By the 19th section of The Cemeteries Statute 1864, any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person and his representatives for ever.

3. Applications for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees, when the secretary will give the required "permit" on payment of proper charges.

4. Orders for interment to be lodged at the office of the trustees, on the day before, between the hours of Eight o'clock a.m. and Five o'clock p.m.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug. Any person, however, wishing to construct a vault of any kind will only be permitted to do so under instructions and permission of the trustees.

6. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

7. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hour fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive; and from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. throughout the rest of the year.

8. All graves, gravestones, monuments, and vaults to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in,

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 18th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable menument, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used

11. No fencing of any kind allowed without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees.

12. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office for inspection; and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.

13. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy or otherwise injure any monument, vault, tombstone, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against, as directed by the Statute.

14. No vehicle, horse, or other animal to be allowed within the cemetery gates.

15. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations, from time to time, in these rules and regulations.
