RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

IT is hereby notified that the subjoined Rules, made by the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and dated the twenty-third day of June A.D. 1873, have been duly laid before Parliament.

REGULÆ GENERALES.

The twenty-third day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

In pursuance of the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of Victoria, the 15th Victoria No. 10, section 32, and of another Act of the same Legislature, No. 427, section 17, we, the Judges of the Supreme Court, hereby order as follows:—

1. That the 8th chapter of the General Rules of this Court dated the 29th day of November 1853, and the schedule thereto, and also the Rules of this Court dated the 30th day of May 1868, save as to the 5th section thereof, be repealed as to all proceedings to be hereafter commenced, but that all proceedings heretofore commenced by newspaper advertisement, and all rights duties and liabilities of all persons under such proceedings, shall remain unchanged.

2. That every application to the Court for probate of will or for letters of administration shall be made by motion on Thursday, or any other day appointed for hearing the same.

3. That no probate of any will or administration of the estate of any deceased person shall be granted to any person, except after the expiration of fourteen days from the publication of an advertisement by him or some Proctor on his behalf in one of the Melbourne newspapers of his intention to apply for the same.

4. That every application for probate of a will or for administration with the will annexed shall be supported by an affidavit or affidavits setting forth—

- The death of the testator;
- The time of his decease;
- That he has left a will;
- The date thereof;
- The name and residence of each executor and of each of the subscribing witnesses thereto;
- An identification or statement of the contents thereof;
- A statement of the value of the property, distinguishing real and personal;
- A search in the Registrar-General's office for any other will deposited;
- The publication of advertisements;
- That no caveat has been lodged up to the morning of the application;

and if such will be executed by the testator by his affixing his mark thereto, then an affidavit of the due execution thereof and of the cause of it being by mark shall also, if possible, be made by one or more of the subscribing witnesses thereto; and every such affidavit shall be filed before the motion for probate of the will or administration shall be granted.

5. That every application for letters of administration to any deceased person by a person applying not as a creditor shall be supported by an affidavit or affidavits setting forth--

The death of the deceased ;
 The time of his decease ;
 That he died intestate, leaving property in Victoria, specifying its value, distinguishing real and personal ;
 What relatives or next of kin he left surviving him, so far as the same may be known and material by law to the right to administer or share in his property ;
 The character in which the person making the application claims to be entitled, and the truth thereof ;
 That the applicant has carefully enquired if there be a will ;
 A search made in the Registrar-General's office for a will deposited ;
 The publication of advertisements ;
 That no caveat has been lodged up to the morning of the application.

6. That in all cases where a creditor or one of joint creditors shall intend to apply for letters of administration, he shall, previous to such application, go before the Master-in-Equity and prove his debt ; and the said Master is hereby directed to enquire into and admit or reject proof of such debt, and certify to a Judge whether the same be due ; and if the Master shall certify that such debt is due, a Judge may order that a summons do issue, calling on the widow and next of kin of the deceased person to appear before the Court, fourteen days after the first publication thereof, to show cause why administration of the estate of the deceased should not be granted to such creditor, and such summons shall be made returnable not less than fourteen days from the first publication thereof, and shall be published once in each of two consecutive weeks in two newspapers to be named in the order directing the issue of such summons ; and no administration shall be granted to such creditor unless upon an affidavit or affidavits setting forth--

The death of the person ;
 The time of his decease ;
 That he left property in Victoria, specifying its value, distinguishing real and personal ;
 Whether he died intestate or left any and what will ;
 That the applicant has carefully enquired if there be a will ;
 A search made in the Registrar-General's office for a will deposited ;
 What relatives or next of kin the deceased left surviving him, so far as the same may be known and material in law to the right to administer or share in his estate ;
 That the applicant is a creditor, and to what amount ;
 That he has proved his debt ;
 The publication of advertisements ;
 That no caveat has been lodged up to the morning of the application.

7. That in all cases of probate and administration there shall be filed, with the above, affidavits on oath of the proposed executors and administrators in the form in the Schedule to these Rules annexed set forth, promising the due performance of their duties.

8. That the bond of an administrator and his sureties shall be in the form in the Schedule hereto.

9. That generally before any letters of administration shall issue to a person procuring the security of individuals, he shall attend with each of his sureties before the Master-in-Equity, and they shall each respectively justify as to the amount of value of his property.

10. That sureties to administration bonds may also justify by affidavits made in Victoria out of Melbourne, before, and such bonds may be executed by all or any of the parties thereto in the presence of and attested by, any Commissioner of the Court for taking Affidavits in Victoria, not being the Proctor or Clerk of the Proctor of the person applying for such administration : Provided always that every such affidavit shall specify the particulars of the property of the person making the same, and the value of such particulars over and above his just debts and liabilities respectively ; and such affidavits shall be filed in the office of and be laid before the Master-in-Equity, who, if not fully satisfied therewith, may require further information or assurance as to the sufficiency of the security, either by further affidavit made as hereinbefore provided, or by the personal attendance and examination upon oath of the proposed surety.

11. That where the bond of an incorporated company or guarantee society, approved of by the Governor in Council under the Act 427, section 27, is received as security instead of the security of individuals, such bond and condition shall be in the same form, substituting the name of such company or society for those of the individuals, and the Master, before the issue of the letters of administration, shall satisfy himself of the due execution of such bond.

12. That no administrator shall be allowed the price he may pay for procuring the security either of individuals or of such company or society as an expense of administration.

13. That if the person obtaining an order for probate or administration shall not take out such probate or procure such administration to be issued within three months of the making of such order, any other person having claim thereto may proceed to obtain administration *cum testamento annexo* or other administration, as the case may be, notwithstanding such order ; and if such last-mentioned person, after the expiration of the said three months, lodge a caveat against the issuing of such probate or administration respectively with the Master-in-Equity, such Master shall not issue the same to the person who has obtained such order without the special direction of the Court.

14. That where an order is made fixing a time for showing cause against an order nisi, under the 30th section of the Act 427, both parties may subpoena their witnesses for that time or any adjourned time for the hearing in the same manner as in a suit in Equity, and such subpoena shall be issued by the Master-in-Equity.

15. That either party shall, four clear days before the day appointed for hearing, file in the office of the Master-in-Equity any affidavits he may propose to use at the said hearing, under Act 427, section 32, and serve notice of the filing thereof upon the opposite party ; and the opposite party, desiring to cross-examine a deponent, shall, two clear days before the said day appointed for hearing, serve a notice requiring the production of such deponent for cross-examination ; but the Court may, at its discretion, specially order variations from this Rule.

16. That all executors and administrators do and shall make or cause to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the property, lands, and hereditaments, goods, chattels, and credits of the deceased which shall have come to the hands possession or knowledge of them respectively, or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for them respectively, and the same so made sign with their proper handwriting (or mark if illiterate), and do and shall exhibit and deposit, or cause to be exhibited and deposited, the same inventory in the office of the Master-in-Equity within three calendar months next ensuing the order granting probate or letters of administration respectively; and further do and shall respectively make or cause to be made a true and just account of the administration of the estate which they have undertaken as to their receipts and disbursements, and as to what portion is retained by them and what portion remains uncollected, and the same so made do and shall sign with their proper handwriting (or mark if illiterate), and do and shall respectively exhibit and deposit, or cause to be exhibited and deposited, the same account in the said office of the Master-in-Equity within fifteen calendar months next ensuing the order granting probate or letters of administration respectively. Provided that this Court may, under special circumstances, by order dispense with the performance of this Rule, or excuse the omission to have performed it so far as relates to allowing administration bonds to be put in suit under the Act 427, section 28.

17. That these Rules shall be read in connection with the unrepealed Rules of this Court, dated the 29th day of November 1853, and as if incorporated therewith.

18. That application for probate and administration under peculiar circumstances, not expressly referred to herein, shall be made upon such grounds and materials as to real and personal property as have been heretofore acted upon by this Court in its Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, or as near thereto as circumstances permit, and the forms of affidavits, orders, and documents heretofore in use shall be followed in all matters not expressly hereby provided, and not inconsistent herewith or with the Act 427.

19. That this Court may depart from the strict language of these Rules in all cases in which special circumstances or justice may require.

That if I obtain probate [or administration] I will well and truly collect and administer according to law, to the best of my knowledge and ability, the property, lands, and hereditaments, goods, chattels, and credits of the said deceased at the time of his death, which at any time after shall come to the power or control, hands, or possession of me as his executor [or administrator], or of any other person or persons for me; that I will make or cause to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the property, lands, and hereditaments, goods, chattels, and credits of the said deceased which shall have come to the hands, possession, or knowledge of me, or to the hands or possession of any other person or persons for me, and the same so made will sign with my proper handwriting [or mark], and will exhibit and deposit, or cause to be exhibited and deposited, the same inventory in the office of the Master-in-Equity within three calendar months next ensuing the order granting probate [or administration]; and further, that I will make or cause to be made a true and just account of the administration of the estate which I have undertaken as to my receipts and disbursements, and as to what portion is retained by me, and what portion remains uncollected, and the same so made will sign with my proper handwriting [or mark], and will exhibit and deposit, or cause to be exhibited and deposited, the same account in the said office of the Master-in-Equity within fifteen calendar months next ensuing the order granting probate [or administration].

PUBLIC STREET IN THE CITY OF SANDHURST.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute* (33 Vict. No. 359) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time upon the request of the council by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public street within the meaning of this Act, and such land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public and reserved for public use as a public street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; provided that no such proclamation shall be deemed to be a proclamation as a main road as therebefore provided; and provided further that every and any such proclamation may be at any time revoked, if necessary, by the Governor: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, acting upon the request of the Council of the City of Sandhurst, do by this notice proclaim to be a public street within the meaning of the said Act the lands reserved or used for the street, highway, or thoroughfare hereinafter described, but subject to existing rights, that is to say:—

City of Sandhurst.

Extension of Wattle lane; 33 feet wide; from Langston street, at the south angle of allotment 173 of section K, N. 42° W. six chains.—(73.J.11566.)

TOWN PROCLAIMED UNDER "THE LAND ACT 1869."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish, or town by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby define the boundaries of the Town hereinafter mentioned, and do distinguish such Town by the name prefixed to the description thereof, that is to say:—

TOWN OF KEWELL.—County of Borung, parish of Kewell East, comprising allotments 9 and 10: Commencing at a point on the Yarrambiack Creek west of the north-west angle of allotment 9; thence up that creek to a dam; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries thereof, and again up the said creek to the south boundary of allotment 10; thence by a road bearing east to the south-east angle of that allotment; thence by a line bearing north fifty-nine chains ninety links; and thence by allotment 8, by a line, again by that allotment and a line bearing west to the commencing point. The bearings are from the true meridian.—(73.L.12487.)

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to enable certain Public Hospitals to sue and be sued in the name of their Treasurer, and to provide for the taking and holding of Real Property belonging to such Hospitals respectively*, it is amongst other things enacted, that whenever the Governor shall deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to any hospital thereafter to be established in any town in the said colony not mentioned in the said Act, it shall and may be lawful for the said Governor to declare the same by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after the publication thereof the said Act shall be deemed and taken to apply to the hospital or hospitals to be specified in such proclamation to all intents and purposes as fully and effectually as if the said hospital or hospitals were specially named therein: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do hereby declare that the provisions of the said Act shall extend, and are hereby extended, to the Gippsland Hospital established at Sale.

Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend all of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to

The deaths in June were fewer by 81 than those in May. They, however, exceeded the average of June in the previous ten years by 60; and, if allowance be made for the increase of population, they will also be found to have exceeded the average of June by 4.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 65° on the 1st, and the lowest was 37° on the 16th. The mean temperature of the month (52.2°) was 2.2° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (25.2°) took place on the 27th, viz. from a maximum of 63.2° to a minimum of 38°. The least range (5°) was on the 13th, viz. from a maximum of 54.7° to a minimum of 49.7°. The mean daily range was 14.3°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.015 inches) was slightly above the average.

Fifty-three per cent. of the deaths were of males and 47 per cent. were of females. Thirty-three per cent. were of children who had not attained their fifth year of age, as against 42 per cent. in June 1872, 37 per cent. in June 1871, 37 per cent. in June 1870, 40 per cent. in June 1869, 45 per cent. in June 1868, 51 per cent. in June 1867, 41 per cent. in June 1866, 48 per cent. in June 1865, 45 per cent. in June 1864, and 31 per cent. in June 1863.

Nine persons of 75 years of age and upwards died during the month, viz.:—A male aged 75 of apoplexy, a male aged 78 of dysentery, a male aged 78 of brain disease, a female aged 77 and a male aged 83 of bronchitis, a male aged 81 of heart disease, and two males aged respectively 77 and 87 and a female aged 88 of old age.

Twelve violent deaths occurred during the month, of which the following are the particulars:—A boy aged 2 years died of rupture of the aorta resulting from a fall, a boy aged 3 died of fracture of the skull caused by a kick from a horse, a boy aged 10 was killed by an omnibus wheel passing over him, a boy aged 14 died of accidental injury to the back, a farmer aged 21 died of concussion of the brain, the result of an injury caused by a horse, a female aged 23 died from the effects of being run over by a cab, a groom aged 37 was crushed by a horse, a stonemason aged 45 was drowned by falling into a tank whilst suffering from brain disease, a female infant aged 2 days was suffocated by bed-clothes, a laborer aged 35 died of accidental suffocation caused by a piece of meat, a patient in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum aged 31 was killed by a blow given by another patient, and a blacksmith aged 31 died of hæmorrhage from a self-inflicted wound in the throat.

One hundred and three deaths, or 29 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—42 in the Melbourne Hospital; 8 in the Alfred Hospital; 11 in the Lying-in Hospital; 13 in the Benevolent Asylum; 15 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 2 in the Metropolitan Asylum; 2 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum; 5 in the Immigrants' Home; 3 in the Industrial Nursery School; 1 in the Industrial Schools, and 2 in Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 116, of whom 56, or 48 per cent., were of males, and 60, or 52 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 66 were under one year of age, 18 were between one and two years, 15 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five years of age.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 235, of whom 130, or 55 per cent., were males; and 105, or 45 per cent., were females; 21 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 7 were between fifteen and twenty, 18 were between twenty and twenty-five, 20 were between twenty-five and thirty, 15 were between thirty and thirty-five, 27 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 17 were between forty-five and fifty, 13 were between fifty and fifty-five, 12 were between fifty-five and sixty, 23 were between sixty and sixty-five, 10 were between sixty-five and seventy, 14 were between seventy and seventy-five, 5 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 4 were eighty years of age and upwards.

The number of deaths from zymotic diseases was equal in May and June (82). Fatal cases of scarlatina increased from 8 to 14, and of whooping-cough from 4 to 10. At the same time deaths from diphtheria fell from 13 to 5, and those from dysentery and diarrhoea fell from 22 to 10. Deaths from phthisis declined from 38 in May to 31 in June.

NEW ZEALAND.

[Notice No. 8.]

THE following information concerning Port Lyttleton and various Ports in New Zealand has been received from Captain F. E. Gibson, Chief Harbor-master of the Province of Canterbury, 1872.*

* See Admiralty Charts:—New Zealand, general sheet, No. 1212; New Zealand Coast, sheets II., V., VIII., and IX., Nos. 2543, 2034, 3529, and 2532; Port Lyttleton, No. 1999; Akaroa Harbor, No. 1573; also New Zealand Pilot, pages 75, 121, and 185 to 194.

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation 16° easterly in 1872.]

PORT LYTTLETON, OR VICTORIA.

The harbor of Lyttleton is situated in the north-west angle of Banks Peninsula, having a common entrance with Port Levy. The entrance is about two miles wide between Godley Head on the north-west and Baleine Point on the south-east. Toloa or Adderley Head, between the harbors, lies back from the other two.

Godley Head is a perpendicular volcanic cliff of a dark-red color, on which stands a lighthouse painted white, in lat. 43° 35' 32" S., long. 172° 49' 30" E. It is a fixed white dioptric light, second order, 440 feet above the sea-level, illuminating an arc of 200 degrees, visible from seaward in clear weather 30 miles.

At the foot of the western side of Adderley Head, in Little Port Cooper Bay, stands the Pilot Station. A look-out is kept day and night, and vessels requiring a Pilot after dark should, when between the heads, burn a blue light, or show a flare-up, and the signal will be promptly answered by the Pilot, unless engaged with another vessel, in which case a vessel may with safety proceed up the fairway of the harbor and anchor below the shipping in five fathoms, and the Harbor Pilot will shift her at daylight to a proper anchorage.

The course up Port Lyttleton is S.W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. The width between Adderley and Godley Head is about a mile, with deep water close to on either hand till within view of the town on the north shore, when vessels should anchor in 3 to 3½ fathoms.

There is good anchorage outside in calms or southerly weather, soundings 7 to 10 fathoms extending 4 or 5 miles from the shore.

In approaching the harbor from the northward, Mount Herbert, the highest peak of the peninsula, is a prominent mark, Port Lyttleton lying to the westward of it. On a nearer approach, Mount Pleasant, the highest peak on the north side of the harbor, is easily distinguished, being bluff towards the port and sloping off gradually to the low land of the plain. Cooper's Knobs, at the head of the harbor, are remarkable round, wooded, overhanging peaks, and form a leading mark for steering up the harbor, with the house on Quail Island under them bearing S.W. by W.

Vessels coming from the southward after rounding the peninsula should keep along the land, about one mile and a half off, until they open out the two harbors of Lyttleton and Port Levy.

There are no dangers to avoid in Port Lyttleton except the reefs close to the different points, and Parson Rock, a small detached pinnacle, with 8 feet on it at low water, which lies N.N.W. from Ripu Islet (near the south side 2½ miles within the heads) 14 cables from the shore. A small red buoy has been placed on an outlying detached rock with 14 feet on it, and about 30 yards outside the above-mentioned rock.

With strong northerly winds a considerable swell rolls into the harbor; north-east and south-west are the prevailing winds.

The bottom for the most part is composed of soft mud, and experience has proved that it is safer for vessels to lie at single anchor with a long scope of chain (60 to 75 fathoms), with the second anchor kept ready at a moment's notice, than moored.

Tides.—It is high water, full and change, at 4 h. 20 m.; average rise at springs 7½ feet, and 4 feet during neaps. The tides are irregular during both periods, and cannot be depended on, being greatly affected by the winds.

The depth of water at the existing jetties is uniform, gradually increasing from the Screw Pile towards Wood's and Cunningham's Wharf, and vessels under 15 feet draught of water can moor alongside and discharge direct into the railway trucks.

Sumner.—The first bay to the north-west of Godley Head is known as Taylor's Mistake, from its being sometimes mistaken for Sumner, which is the next bay to the west. The entrance to the Heathcote or Avon River, Opawaha, lies 2½ miles to the north-west of Godley Head, one-eighth of a mile to the northward of Cave Rock off the southern entrance point of the river. Sumner Bar, at the entrance of the river, is 400 feet wide, composed of fine sand, having a depth in the channel of not less than 5 feet at low-water springs, shoaling gradually on either side.

On Cave Rock stands a signal staff on which are exhibited the New Zealand General Tidal and Bar Signals, and vessels are piloted in by means of semaphore arms. The entrance to

the river lies at first in a southerly direction, and then bends suddenly to the westward. The narrowest part of the channel, which is at the elbow, is 150 feet wide. Vessels of 40 tons can enter safely at the proper time of tide, and then ascend the Heathcote River to the Ferry, and smaller craft to the quay within 2 miles of Christchurch. Highest water on the bar, 12 feet at springs.

WAIMAKARIRI RIVER, KAIAPOI.

The entrance to the Waimakariri River bears from Godley Head N.W. by N., distant 12 miles. There is a bar which is constantly shifting and varying in depth. A signal staff with semaphore arms, similar to that at Sumner, stands on the highest sand-hill immediately to the southward of the entrance, and two movable beacons are placed on the South Spit and kept in one as nearly as possible with the deepest water over the bar, which has generally about 3 feet upon it at low-water springs. Vessels of 40 tons can ascend about 8 miles to Kaiapoi; the navigation of the river inside is easy, and the channel well staked.

AKAROA HARBOR.

Vessels rounding Banks Peninsula are cautioned that a rock has been reported, from which Long Look-out Point bears about south-west, distant nearly three-quarters of a mile; they must therefore be careful not to approach the land in the vicinity of this point within one mile. There is a constant current setting to the northward off the peninsula, varying in strength according to the wind.

The excellent harbor of Akaroa is situated at the south-east end of Banks Peninsula. The heads are high and bold, the Western head being the higher of the two, rising to a height of between 1500 and 2000 feet, with a reef running off a short distance.* Off the Eastern head is a large flat rock called the Longboat. The breadth of the entrance is about three-quarters of a mile. The course is N.W. by N. at first, and then the harbor trends nearly N. by W. Great caution must be observed in entering with a south-west wind, as it blows in baffling and heavy squalls over the land above the western head. The usual anchorage is on the east shore about 5 miles up, in 5 to 8 fathoms. Give a good berth to Green Point before entering the bay where the town stands, as a reef extends about one-eighth of a mile off it, marked by a small red buoy.

A bank of soundings, with anchorage in 10 fathoms on it, is reported as lying about eight or ten miles to the south-eastward of Akaroa Head.

TIMARU.

Vessels bound for Timaru after rounding Banks Peninsula should steer S.W. by W. southerly, unless the wind be strong from E.S.E. (which causes an inset), when it is necessary to keep three-quarters of a point more southerly.

The coast line from Banks Peninsula to Timaru is a low shingle beach, and cannot be seen in thick weather or by night until close in with the breakers, while to the southward of the town at Timaru the cliffs are from thirty to fifty feet high; this is a sure guide to Timaru low shingle beach to the north; moderately high cliff to the south. A vessel can safely stand off and on this part of the coast by keeping outside a depth of 7 fathoms.

If the weather is clear the high mountain range will be seen behind Timaru long before the coast line has risen; and Burke's Pass, a remarkable gorge almost directly behind Timaru, is a good landmark, showing a distinct gap; there is a small town a short distance to the north and in sight of Timaru, but the cliffs before mentioned will prevent any mistake.

The reef off Pateti Point, just to the southward of Timaru, runs out a mile from the shore, and should be given a wide berth. There is a red light shown at the Harbor-master's Office on the cliff above the Government landing shed, visible from three to four miles; if made by night bring it to bear W.S.W., and run in on that bearing, anchoring in not less than 4½ fathoms.

Signals.—In addition to the general signals for the colony published in the "New Zealand Harbor Regulations," the following local signals are used as required:—

A ball at one yard arm and one on mast
half the length of the yard below the
yard } Wait till the tide
ebbs.

A ball at each yard arm } Vessel may stand
in safety.

Two balls at each yard arm, one below the
other } Vessel may stand
in safety; a boat
will put off.

Two balls at one yard arm (one below the

When vessels at anchor are meant to put to sea, the general
signal "Put to sea" will be shown.

No. 2 Marryatt's Code over second distinguishing pennant
at mast head: The vessel is running into danger.

Night Signals.—The night signals are as published in the
New Zealand Harbor Regulations; but when it is intended
that vessels at anchor should put to sea, two guns will be fired
in addition to showing the proper lights.

Caution.—Never use the ship's boats to land with. The
amount of surf on the beach cannot be judged from seaward.
In bad weather a look-out is kept on shore. By night,
should a vessel part or be in danger of dragging on shore, (as
a last resource) slip and run her on the beach as near Le Crens
Gully (to the north of the town) as possible: let the hands
remain by the wreck, and assistance will be given by means
of a rocket fired over the vessel.

* Information has been received of the existence of a rock, lying about
half a mile S.W. from the rocks off the South Head of Akaroa Harbor,
Banks Peninsula. The rock (*Wright's rock*) is pinnacle-shaped, having, it is
reported, about 11 feet water on it at low water, and only breaks in a heavy
sea. No kelp marks the locality.

OPUNAKE BAY, COOK STRAIT.

This anchorage, only fitting for steamers or small sailing vessels in fine weather, is five miles north-west of Otumutua Point, and one mile south-east of Te Nama Pah. (This pah no longer exists.) Opunake Bay is of horseshoe shape and about one-third of a mile deep, with high cliffs round the shore. The north-west head extends 600 feet seaward of the south-east head.

The accommodation for landing and shipping at present consists of one cargo boat capable of carrying six tons in moderate weather, and is in charge of the Signalmen, who picks up a crew of natives when required. The boat is worked the same as at New Plymouth, with a rope attached to the warping buoy.

A reef extends from the north-west head half a mile in a southerly and south-westerly direction; also off the south-east head in a south-westerly and westerly direction about one-third of a mile. These reefs shelter the bay at low water in bad weather, as much of the sea is broken before reaching the beach.

The channel into Opunake Bay is one-third of a mile wide between the before-described reefs, with a depth of water of 8, 7, 6, 5, to 4 fathoms at low water. The distance at low water from head to head is about one-third of a mile.

There is a sandy beach in the centre of the bay, about 250 yards long. Detached rocks lie under water about half a cable from low-water mark, and nearly 1 1/2 cables from the north-west shore. As little as 4 feet is found on these rocks at low water; they are well out of the way of the anchorage. Small vessels can beach in fine settled weather; then the beach is remarkably smooth. The bay is sheltered from winds between S.E. round by E. to N.W., and exposed to all other winds.

Two black beacons are erected on the north-west side of the bay to mark the best anchorage; the upper beacon is 20 feet and the lower 10 feet high; they are 380 feet apart and bear from each other N.W. 1/4 W. and S.E. 1/4 E. When the beacons are in line, a vessel is sufficiently close in to have a swinging berth.

A red beacon, 10 feet high, is placed 96 feet S.S.W. 3/4 W. from the flag-staff (situated at the head of the bay), and is intended as a leading mark into the bay. This beacon kept in line with the flag-staff leads a vessel between the reefs in deep water, carrying in at low water from 8, 7, 6, 5, to 4 fathoms.

A vessel bound for Opunake should keep about 2 miles off shore until the flag-staff bears N.N.E. 1/4 E., then steer in on that bearing until the red beacon in front of the flag-staff is seen; keep this beacon and flag-staff in line, bearing N.N.E. 1/4 E., until the two black beacons on the port hand are in line, bearing N.W. 1/4 W.; then let go the anchor in 4 fathoms, stony bottom; but should the wind be strong from south-east or north-west, keep a little to windward, where will be found the smoothest water, with good 90 fathoms swinging room.

Sailing vessels of fifty tons or upwards should anchor about three-quarters of a mile off the heads in 10 fathoms, rocky bottom, on the following bearings:—Otumutua Point S.E. by E. 1/4 E., and the flag-staff N.N.E. 1/4 E.; and be prepared on the first appearance of strong in-shore winds to proceed to sea.

Tides.—It is high water, full and change, at 9 h. 45 m.; range of tide, 7 to 10 feet.

Signals.—The following signals are used at Opunake:—
Four balls horizontal on yard, two on each side of mast ... The vessel may stand in with safety.

Three balls horizontal on yard, two on one side of mast and one on the other ... Anchorage in the bay unsafe, but vessel can anchor outside and a boat will be sent off.

Two balls horizontal on yard, one on either side of mast ... Bay dangerous, keep to sea.

Night Signals:—
White light over red—Wait till daylight, anchorage safe.
Red light over white—Bay dangerous, keep off.

NORTH ISLAND, MERCURY ISLANDS.
A dangerous sunken rock, measuring about 150 feet in diameter, with only 4 feet water on it at low-water spring tides, has been discovered in the fairway entering Mercury Island Harbor. The following magnetic bearings of this rock were taken by Mr. W. Simpson, late master of revenue cutter *Ringleader*:—

Extreme south-west point of island, S. by E. 1/4 E. The inner of the two rocks at entrance of bay, W.S.W. These rocks in one lead nearly over the danger.

Wool consigned for shipment, and requiring to be dumped, will be deliverable at the dumping sheds, where a receipt must be given on behalf of the ship.

All bales of wool carried on the above lines weighing over 4 cwt. each will be charged at rate and a half.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

Twenty-four hours will be allowed for the removal of wool after arrival of the trucks. From that time storage will be charged, and strictly enforced, at the rate of One penny per bale per diem until the wool is removed by the consignee, or sent to store by the department at the consignee's cost and risk. All wool is carried at owner's risk as to condition, and will be signed for accordingly. If detailed weight lists are furnished by the department for the use of consignees, the charge for weighing will be Fourpence per bale. All previous wool rates are now cancelled.

FURTHER BYE-LAW OF THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS
RELATIVE TO VEHICLES, ETC.

BYE-LAW XI.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby repeal bye-law numbered xx. of the railway bye-laws made on the 29th day of April 1864, and in lieu thereof doth make the following bye-law:—

No carman, hackney coachman, drayman, porter, carter, or other person, unless licensed by the Board of Land and Works in that behalf, will be allowed to come into or upon the stations, lands, piers, or premises of the Board for the purpose of plying for hire, or touting or soliciting custom or hire, or removing passengers or luggage, either with or without a cab, car, dray, handcart, or truck, unless by permission of the station-master or pier-master in charge of such stations, lands, pier, or premises, and any carman, hackney coachman, drayman, carter, porter, or other person evading or attempting to evade, or being guilty of a breach of this bye-law, or refusing or neglecting to quit the premises of the Board when thereto required by a station-master, pier-master, or other servant of the said Board, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

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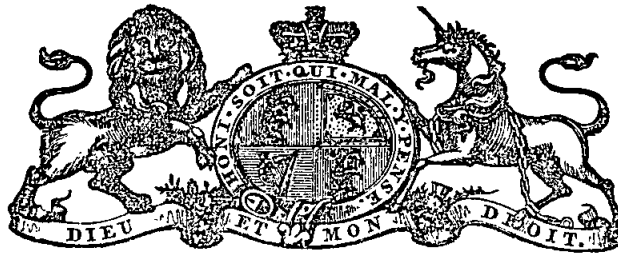
