## TRATY FOR THE MUTUAL SURRENDER OF BRITISH AND ITALIAN FUGITIVE CRIMINALS.

SIR,—With reference to my Circular Despatch of the 10th of April, enclosing copy of a Treaty between Her Majesty and the King of Italy for the mutual surrender of fugitive Criminals, I have the honor to transmit to you, for your information, a copy of a Declaration, signed at Rome by Sir Augustus Paget and M. Visconti Venosta on the 7th of this month, correcting an error in the date of a Maltese Ordinance mentioned at the end of the 18th Article of that Treaty.

## DECLARATION rectifying an Error in Article XVIII of the Treaty between Her Majesty and the King of Italy of the 5th February 1873, for the Mutual Surrender of Fugitive Criminals.

Signed at Rome, May 7, 1873.

THE Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of Her Majesty the Queen of Great Britain and Ireland to His Majesty the King of Italy, and His Italian Majesty's Minister for Foreign Affairs, having concurrently recognized a material error in the date of the Ordinance of the Maltese Government of the 21st of February 1863, as it is mentioned at the end of the XVIIIth Article of the Extradition Treaty of the 5th of February 1873, between Great Britain and Italy, have, by common consent, declared that the words:—

“Finally, it is agreed that this stipulation does not apply to the Island of Malta, the Ordinance of the Maltese Government of May 3, 1863 (No. 1230), remaining in full force,” shall be read:—

“Finally, it is agreed that this stipulation does not apply to the Island of Malta, the Ordinance of the Maltese Government of the 21st of February 1863 remaining in full force.”

The present Declaration is signed in duplicate at Rome, this 7th day of May 1873.

## TONNAGE OF FRENCH VESSELS.

THE accompanying copy of an Order of the Queen in Council, which has been received from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, extending to French vessels the advantages held out by *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862* to ships of foreign countries adopting the rules for the measurement of tonnage which obtain in the United Kingdom, is published for general information.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862* it is enacted, that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships for the time being in force under the principal Act have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country, and are in force in that country, it shall be

lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers, and thereupon it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be remeasured in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions, but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the “Certificates of Registry of British Ships is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships.” And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships now in force under *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854* have been adopted by the President of the French Republic, and are in force in the French dominions:

Her Majesty is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct that the ships of France, the certificates of French nationality and registry of which are dated on or after the first day of June, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in the said certificates of French nationality and registry.

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE INEBRIATES ACT  
1872."

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of

WHEREAS by *The Inebriates Act 1872*, the Governor in Council is empowered, subject to any provisions or conditions he thinks fit, to grant to any person, or two or more persons jointly, a license for twelve months to keep a house for the treatment and cure of habitual inebriates, thereafter called a "retreat," and from time to time to revoke or renew such license, and from time to time to make and alter regulations for the good government of retreats, and for the fees payable by residents therein, and for better carrying out the purposes of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said recited Act, doth make the Regulations following:—

1. No license shall be granted to any person or persons to keep any house as a retreat within the meaning of the said recited Act unless he or they hold the same for a year or for some greater estate, and the licensee or one of the licensees shall reside constantly at such retreat, and shall keep a sufficient staff of officers and servants for the maintenance and management thereof.

2. Any person or persons desiring to obtain a license to keep a retreat may make application for such license in writing addressed to the Chief Secretary; and every such application shall describe the house in respect of which the same is made, and state on what tenure the person or persons so applying hold the same; and whether a license is desired for the detention of male or female persons, or of persons of both sexes, and the maximum number of persons or persons of each sex for the detention of whom there is accommodation in such house, and what staff of officers and servants will be employed.

3. When any application has been made for any such license and before such license is granted the Chief Medical Officer shall inspect the house in respect of which such application is made, and shall report to the Chief Secretary on the accommodation and general suitability thereof for the purpose of a retreat, and on the number of persons of the sex mentioned in the application or of each sex that may properly be detained therein, and on the staff of officers and servants that will be required therefor.

4. Every license shall be in the form or to the effect in the schedule hereto.

5. The Governor in Council may from time to time appoint so many persons as may be necessary to be visitors of retreats under the said Act, and every such person may remove.

6. Every licensee of a retreat shall at all times permit such retreat to be visited and inspected by any visitor or visitors appointed as aforesaid, and shall, at the request of any such visitor, show to him any part or the whole of such retreat and any or every person in it, and produce any order, warrant, or other authority under which any or every person in such retreat is detained, and all books ordered by these regulations to be kept.

7. Every visitor shall from time to time, as he shall see occasion, and once at least in every twelve months, report to the Chief Secretary on every retreat visited by him, and in particular on the observance therein of the said Act, and of all regulations of the Governor in Council for the time being in force thereunder, and of all rules framed as hereinafter appearing by the licensee or licensees for the management thereof; and if any such visitor shall see anything in connection with such retreat or the management thereof which, in his opinion, ought to be amended, he shall call the attention of the licensee or licensees thereto before reporting thereon.

8. The licensee or licensees of every retreat shall cause a book to be kept in which shall be entered the name and sex of every person admitted into any retreat and the date of such person being so admitted, and such particulars shall be entered within three hours after such person is so admitted; and on any such person lying, being discharged, or otherwise quitting the retreat, such death or discharge, or the manner in which such person shall have quitted the retreat, and the date thereof, shall be entered in such book.

9. The licensee or licensees of every retreat shall, within one month after the issue of the license, frame and forward to the Chief Secretary rules for the management of such retreat; and if from time to time such licensee or licensees frame any new rules, whether in addition to or in substitution for any such rules, such licensee or licensees shall forthwith forward the same to the Chief Secretary.

10. The curative treatment of persons detained in retreats shall consist in enforcing abstinence from intoxicating liquors except under medical direction, in restoring such persons to health by suitable diet, medicine, exercise, and cheerful occupation, and in moral persuasion and kindness on the part of the superintendent.

11. There shall be resident in every retreat some person who shall be a legally qualified medical practitioner, hereinafter called the medical superintendent, who shall have charge over the curative treatment of all persons detained therein. And on every appointment and removal of a medical superintendent

the same shall be forthwith notified, in writing, by the licensee or licensees of the retreat, to the Chief Secretary; and such medical superintendent shall, except in cases when he shall appoint a substitute as hereinafter mentioned, be constantly at the retreat.

12. The medical superintendent of any retreat may, in case of his temporary absence from the retreat, or incapacity to act from illness, appoint some person to be his substitute during such temporary absence or incapacity, and the day and hour of every such appointment, the name of the person appointed, and the reasons of the appointment, shall be forthwith entered in a book to be kept for the purpose; and on the medical superintendent resuming his duties, the day and hour of his so resuming the same shall be forthwith entered in such book. Every substitute so appointed shall have all the powers of the medical superintendent.

13. The medical superintendent of every retreat shall at the request of any person detained in such retreat, and on payment by such person of the cost thereof, hold a consultation with any legally qualified medical practitioner whom such person may name on the case of such person.

14. There shall be kept in every retreat a book to be called the "Medical Case Book" in which the medical superintendent shall from time to time make entries as to the health of each person detained in such retreat, together with a correct description of the medicine and other remedies prescribed for the treatment of his disorder, and in case of death a correct account of the autopsy (if any) of such person; and the medical superintendent shall forthwith, if the Chief Secretary shall so require, transmit to the Chief Secretary a copy of the entry or entries in such book relating to any such person.

15. The licensee or licensees of every retreat shall cause all letters written by any person in such retreat to be posted, and shall cause all letters addressed, as hereinafter provided, to any person detained in such retreat to be delivered to such person.

16. Letters intended for any person detained in any retreat may be closed up in an envelope, addressed to such person; and such envelope may be enclosed in another envelope, addressed to the superintendent or any licensee of such retreat; and such superintendent or licensee may refuse to receive any letter addressed to such retreat bearing on the outside thereof the name of any person detained in such retreat notwithstanding the detention of such person; and any enclosure addressed to any person detained in any retreat contained in any letter so addressed to the superintendent or any licensee thereof, shall be delivered to such person unopened.

17. All enclosures contained in letters so addressed to any superintendent or licensee of a retreat addressed to persons not detained in such retreat may be opened by such superintendent or licensee, and either destroyed or returned to the sender, as he shall think fit.

18. Any person whom any person detained in any retreat shall desire to see shall be admitted to see such last-mentioned person at all reasonable times. But the licensee or licensees of any retreat shall not be bound to answer any enquiries made after any person supposed to be detained in any retreat, or to state whether such person is or is not detained, unless the Chief Secretary shall so order.

19. Nothing in the last preceding rule shall compel the licensee or licensees of any retreat to admit any person into such retreat without the special order of the Chief Secretary who shall on any previous occasion have introduced or attempted to introduce any intoxicating liquor into such retreat.

20. The fees following shall be payable to the licensee or licensees of every retreat by every person committed to and detained in such retreat, i.e., such sum as the licensee may determine not exceeding £13 per calendar month for any such person for board, medical and ordinary attendance; and such fees shall be payable every three calendar months in advance, the first payment being due on the day of the admission of such person into the retreat.

SCHEDULE.

License to keep a Retreat under "The Inebriates Act 1872."  
Know all men, in pursuance of "The Inebriates Act 1872," I have hereby granted to A.B., of [residence and occupation] a license, to be in force for twelve months from the date hereof, to keep, under the provisions of the said Act, for the treatment and cure of habitual inebriates, the house, the particulars whereof are set forth in the schedule hereunder written: Provided that this license is subject to the conditions following, that is to say:—

[Persons of the male sex only (or of the female sex only) shall be detained in such house, and not more than persons shall be detained in such house at one time, (or not more than persons of the male and persons of the female sex shall be detained in such house at one time) (or not more than persons shall be detained in such house at one time)] and that the said A.B. observe and cause to be observed all the provisions of the said Act, and all Regulations of the Governor in Council for the time being in force thereunder, and is subject to be revoked at any time by the Governor in Council as he shall see occasion.

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such proclamation; and upon any such proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend all of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to

**PORT DARWIN.**

The following information relating to Port Darwin, with instructions for anchoring clear of the Ocean Telegraphic Cable laid between it and Java, are from Lieutenant B. Douglas, R.N.R., the Government Resident, March 1872.\*

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation 2° easterly in 1872.]

Port Darwin is a free port; neither customs duties nor harbor dues are imposed. A shipping-master is appointed for the shipping and discharge of seamen under the Marine Board Act of South Australia. The commanders of Australian ships are, however, required to report and clear their ships in the usual way before the custom-house officer, and a correct account in the form of entry must be given of all goods landed, although no import duties exist. A magistrate's court exists, and a body of mounted police are stationed in the territory.

The flagstaff at Port Darwin stands on Fort Hill on the northern shore, and is in lat. 12° 28' 28" S., long. 150° 52' E. The commercial code of signals is in use at this station.

*Pilot.*—When a vessel heaves in sight, the harbor-master and pilot will board, and bring her into the anchorage.

*Anchorage.*—The best anchorage is off the south side, of the little valley between the table-land of Point Emery and Fort Hill, not coming under 7 fathoms at low water in a large vessel, or under 6 fathoms in a small craft.

Ships remaining more than for two or three days should moor with open hawse to the north-west.

*Caution.*—Great caution should be observed in taking up an anchorage near the line of the cable during the strength of the tides, as the soundings are deep, and ships sometimes drag before bringing up. This caution should be specially observed during the north-west monsoon.

The tides in the vicinity and in the harbor of Port Darwin are rapid and somewhat irregular. It is high water at Port Darwin, full and change, at 5 h. 25 m. Springs range from 16 to 24 feet; neaps 2 to 12 feet. The ebb stream makes 40 minutes before high water. Outside the harbor the flood runs from the north-westward and the ebb from the E.S.E.

*Landing Place and Direction of Telegraph Cable.*

The shore end is landed on the mud flat below the Residence, on the east extreme of the table-land on which the town stands.

At about a cable's length from the edge of the flat, the Telegraph Cable runs W. by N.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N. for about 2 miles, when the north extreme of Point Emery bears N. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N., and the base of Fort Hill, on which the flagstaff stands, bears E. by S.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S.

From that position the cable lies in a N. by W. direction, running parallel to the Point Emery Shoal for 8 miles, when

the extreme of the cliff of Point Emery bears S.S.E., and East Point N.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E.

The cable then takes a W.N.W. direction for  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles, when the south extreme of East Point bears E. by S.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S., and Talc Head S. by E.

From the above position the cable is laid about N.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W. for 11 miles, when its course is changed to W. by N.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N. into the offing, and in soundings beyond the depth of 14 fathoms.

With the foregoing particulars masters of vessels can lay down the direction of the cable on their chart of the harbor.

*Directions.*—When off the coast line between Fort Point and Point Emery, and in the vicinity of the ordinary anchorage off the town, to keep outside and clear of the cable, keep the extreme of the land of the west point at high-water mark N.W. by W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W., and the summit of Talc Head from W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. to S.W. by W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W.

Off the coast line between Point Emery and East Point, keeping to the westward of the cable, keep the summit of King's Table S.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E. until East Point bears N.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E.

In the offing clear of the harbor, to keep south-west of the line of cable in about 12 fathoms, keep the south extreme of Point Emery S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E. until the west extreme of the land about Point Charles bears S. by W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W.

It is not recommended to navigate inside the line of cable between Emery Point and East Point, as that portion of the coast is much encumbered with shoals.

In the offing the navigation is safe on both sides of the cable. The shore end of the cable, which is carried out to the north of Point Charles, is very heavy, and could not be lifted by any small craft, though it might be injured, and commanders and owners of ships are subject to heavy damages if the cable is negligently fouled.

## TOWN OF EMERALD HILL.

## BYE-LAW No. 50.

A Bye-law to regulate by means of Standing Orders the proceedings of the Town Council of Emerald Hill, made under the provisions of the 17th section of the Boroughs Statute.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the one hundred and seventy-fourth section of the Boroughs Statute the councils of any city, town, or borough established under the said Statute may from time to time as shall to them seem fit, make bye-laws for any of the purposes for which the several subdivisions of the twelfth schedule to the said Statute are intended to provide, one of which is for the regulation of council proceedings; And whereas it is expedient to make better provision for the regulation by means of Standing Orders of the proceedings of the Town Council of Emerald Hill, the Council of the Town of Emerald Hill ordain as follows, that it is to say:—

1. Bye-law No. 1 of the said council, intituled "A Bye-law to regulate by means of Standing Orders the proceedings of the Council for the Municipal District of Emerald Hill," shall be, and the same is hereby repealed.

2. The proceedings of the said council shall be conducted according to the following regulations only, which shall be and be called the Standing Orders of the said council, that is to say:—

3. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

4. At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required.

5. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- i. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- ii. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- iii. Presentation of reports of committees, including payments recommended by committees.
- iv. Ordinary business.
- v. Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- vi. Extraordinary business.
- vii. Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in notice thereof.

6. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

7. All notices of motion shall be dated and given by the intending mover to the town clerk at the close of the meeting of council, or seven clear days prior to next ordinary meeting of council; and the town clerk shall enter the same in the minute book, in the order in which they may be received.

8. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

9. No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.

10. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the town clerk in the notice paper, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

11. No motion entered in the notice paper shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect, or by leave of the council.

12. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment or taking part in discussion thereon shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment, must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

14. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

15. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may however require the enforcement of any standing order

of the council by directing the mayor's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of mayor, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

18. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the mayor or chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. The mayor or chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation.

21. The mayor or chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the mayor or chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

24. A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

25. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologise for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. Any person, not being a councillor, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the mayor or chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

28. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

29. The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. The mayor or chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. At every meeting of the council all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

33. If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question; whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but, if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, one other amendment, but not more, may be moved.

35. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council, but if on the question being put the motion being negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed; or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. Any member of the council may enter his protest against any resolution of the council, providing that such protest is not inconsistent with the truth or disrespectful to the council. Notice of intention to protest must, however, in every case be given in writing on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest, signed by the member or members protesting and specifying the reason for protesting, must be entered forthwith by the protesting member in a book to be kept for that purpose in the clerk's office, and duly referred to in the minutes of council, the same to be considered also a part of such minutes.

38. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate shall, in the next meeting of the council, be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

39. No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day, unless the council shall otherwise order.

40. It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision hereof.

41. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

42. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

43. No election to any office at the disposal of the council shall take place until six clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more of the local newspapers, inviting applications from candidates properly qualified.

44. No member of the council, nor any auditor, nor any officer holding office under the council, shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the council, or for any work to be done for the council, and in all cases in which security for the due and faithful performance of any duty or contract is required, the expenses of preparing such security shall be borne by the party giving the same.

45. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained herein may be suspended for a special purpose upon a vote of the majority of the council.

46. If any person shall be guilty of any offence or misfeasance or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in herein, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.
