PROCLAMATION OF A STREET IN THE CITY OF SANDHURST REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute* (33 Vict. No. 359) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time upon the request of the council by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public street within the meaning of this Act, and such land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public and reserved for public use as a public street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; provided that no such proclamation shall be deemed to be a proclamation as a main road as thereinbefore provided; and provided further that every and any such proclamation may be at any time revoked, if necessary, by the Governor: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke a notice dated the seventh day of November 1871 proclaiming streets in the city of Sandhurst so far as it relates to the portion of Ophir street in the said city of Sandhurst lying north-westerly of Barnard street; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(73.L.7260.)

PUBLIC STREETS IN THE CITY OF SANDHURST.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute* (33 Vict. No. 359) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time upon the request of the council by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public street within the meaning of this Act, and such land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public and reserved for public use as a public street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; provided that no such proclamation shall be deemed to be a proclamation as a main road as thereinbefore provided; and provided further that every and any such proclamation may be at any time revoked, if necessary, by the Governor: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, acting upon the request of the Council of the City of Sandhurst, do by this notice proclaim to be public streets within the meaning of the said Act the lands reserved or used for the streets, highways, or thoroughfares hereinafter described, subject to existing rights, that is to say:—

Streets in the City of Sandhurst.

Booth street (extension); total width ninety-nine feet; limits, from the west angle of allotment 10 of section 61, north-westerly to Alley street.

Streets denoted by red color on plans attached to correspondence numbered 73.M.12397 and 73.L.13431, deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1869 it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to,

diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of this Act; and nothing herein contained shall prevent the sale by auction or the leasing or licensing under this Act of any land comprised in any common heretofore or hereinafter to be proclaimed; and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim or add to (as the case may be) the Commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

BRIGHT COMMON.—A Common is hereby proclaimed under the designation prefixed hereto, comprising the Bright Town Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 18th day of May 1863, and the Crown lands within the boundaries hereinafter described, namely:—Commencing at junction of Roberts Creek with the Ovens River; thence up that river to the Deep Creek; thence by the north boundary of the Bright Town Common bearing east three hundred and seventy-five chains to the north-east angle thereof; thence by a line bearing north about four miles to the range which divides the waters of the Ovens River from the waters of the Kiewa River; thence by that range bearing westerly to the source of Roberts Creek aforesaid; and thence down that creek to the point of commencement. Total area, about thirteen thousand acres.—(73.J.11599.)

BURNEWANG AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON.—The said Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 5th day of March 1866, and altered by Proclamations bearing date respectively the 2nd of July and 26th of August 1867, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing on the east boundary of allotment 68, in the parish of Burnewang, at a point bearing west from the south-west angle of allotment 211, parish of Corop; thence by allotments 68 and 70, in the parish of Burnewang, to a point bearing north from the north-east angle of allotment 88, parish of Runnymede; thence south to the south-east angle of allotment 111; thence west to the Mount Pleasant Creek; thence up that creek to the north-west angle of allotment 10, parish of Toolleen; thence east to the north-east angle of allotment 11; thence south to the north-east angle of allotment 32; thence east to the north-east angle thereof; thence south and south-easterly to the south-east angle of allotment 51; thence west to the south-west angle of allotment 49; thence north-westerly to the south-west angle of allotment 40; thence west, north-westerly, and north to the north-west angle of allotment 1; thence west by the south boundary of the parish of Campaspe to the north-east angle of allotment 3A of section 1, parish of Muskerry; thence south and west to the south-east angle of the Muskerry pre-emptive section; thence south to the north-east angle of allotment 22; thence south-easterly to the south-east angle of allotment 39A; thence easterly about seven miles and a half to the south-west angle of allotment 68, parish of Toolleen aforesaid; thence east to the south-east angle of allotment 75, being a point on the range which divides the waters of the Mount Pleasant Creek from the waters of the Cornella Creek; thence by that range northerly to the south boundary of the parish of Corop aforesaid; and thence by that boundary bearing west to the point of commencement.—(73.L.8809.)

SNAKE VALLEY GOLDFIELD COMMON.—The Common described amongst others in a Proclamation bearing date the 28th day of January 1861 under the designation of Snake Valley, and increased amongst others by a Proclamation bearing date the 27th day of December 1865, is hereby added to by including therein the land hereinafter described, viz.:—Eight thousand seven hundred acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries described as follow, namely: Commencing at the south-west angle of the existing common; thence by a line bearing south three miles; thence by a line bearing east to the Myrtle Creek; thence by a line bearing north-easterly about five miles and a half to an angle on the eastern side of the road from Stanley to Yackandandah *via* Hillsborough, the said angle being distant S. 3° 52' W. forty-four chains seventy-nine links from the south angle of section H, in the town of Hillsborough; thence crossing that road to its western side by a line bearing westerly; thence by that road bearing northerly to the southern boundary of the Yackandandah Goldfield Common; thence by that common bearing west about one mile; thence by a line bearing westerly to the junction of the Clear Creek with the Nine-mile Creek; thence by the last-named creek upwards to the north boundary of the existing common aforesaid; and thence by the north, east, and southern boundaries of that common to the point of commencement.—(72.G.15769.)

TIMBER RESERVE ADDED TO.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and may from time to time, after one month's notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works may issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee as shall from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as an addition to a Reserve made for the preservation and growth of timber, in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the 53rd section of the above-recited Act, the Crown lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described (excepting the portions thereof which may have been applied for under the 19th or 49th section of the said Act prior to the date of this Proclamation, and for occupation of which portions licenses may hereafter be granted), viz.:—

MOUNT COLE STATE FOREST.—Extension, 4200 acres, more or less, counties of Kara-kara and Ripon: Commencing at the west angle of allotment 1, parish of Amphitheatre; thence by that allotment and a line bearing S. 63° 7' E. eleven chains; thence by a line and William Fort's land bearing S. 26° 53' W. twenty-four chains sixty-one links; thence by lines bearing respectively south one hundred and thirteen chains and west about two hundred and ninety chains to the present state forest; thence by that forest bearing N. 24° W. about seventy chains and north-westerly about eighty chains to a point west of the commencing point; and thence by a direct line about three hundred and sixty chains to that point. As shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(73.L.4780.)

TIMBER RESERVES DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and may from time to time, after one month's notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works may issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee as shall from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and seal of the colony bearing date the twenty-sixth day of March 1872 a reserve for the preservation and growth of timber was proclaimed under the designation of the Ballarat and Creswick State Forest, and by another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of April 1873 the said reserve was diminished: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the nineteenth day of August 1867 a reserve for the preservation and growth of trees was proclaimed comprising Mount Warrenhip: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, in accordance with the provisions of the 53rd section of the above-recited Act, revoke the Proclamations hereinbefore referred to bearing date respectively the twenty-sixth day of March 1872 and the nineteenth day of August 1867 so far as they relate to the several portions of land hereinafter described, that is to say:—

BALLARAT AND CRESWICK STATE FOREST.—The Ballarat and Creswick State Forest, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 26th of March 1872, and diminished by another Proclamation bearing date the 28th of April 1873, and hereby further diminished by deducting therefrom the several portions of land hereinafter described, comprising in all ninety acres, viz.:—

Twenty acres, parish of Creswick (applied for by Mary Mitchell).

Twenty acres, parish of Creswick (applied for by Philip Mitchell).

Fifty acres, parish of Ballarat, north of allotment 1 of section F (applied for by John Amery).

As shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(72.L.9328.)

MOUNT WARRENHEIP TIMBER RESERVE.—The Mount Warrenheip Timber Reserve, described in a Proclamation under the 41st section of *The Amending Land Act 1865* bearing date the 19th August 1867, and hereby diminished by deducting therefrom the portions thereof included within the boundaries hereinafter described, and comprising in all an area of thirty-four acres one rood thirty-four perches, viz. :—

The following Harbor Regulation, framed by the Marine Board of New South Wales, under the provisions of *The Navigation Act of 1871*, is published for general information.

UNDER and by virtue of the powers conferred upon us by *The Navigation Act of 1871*, we, the Marine Board of New South Wales, hereby make the following regulation as to the warning signal to be made by all steamships and harbor and river steamers when navigating or being underway between sunset and sunrise, in any harbor, river, or other inland water within the jurisdiction, that is to say—

We hereby order and direct that the master or other person in charge of any steamship or harbor and river steamer shall, whilst navigating or being underway in any harbor, river, or other inland water within the jurisdiction, between sunset and sunrise, cause a steam whistle to be sounded audibly at intervals of not more than five minutes.

REGULATIONS FOR CASTLEMAINE DISTRICT WATER SUPPLY.

THE Governor in Council, in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authority conferred by *The Water-Works Act 1865*, has made the following alteration in the rules, regulations, and orders, made on the 14th day of October 1872, respecting the Castlemaine District Water Supply, namely:—

The rate to be charged for water supplied for sluicing shall hereafter be One penny halfpenny per thousand gallons, if at the time of such supply the water in the reservoir shall not be lower than two feet below the level of the bye-wash.

The minimum quantity of water which will be charged for under this regulation will be the quantity which would pass through the service pipe now used if constantly supplied during six working days of eight hours each.

Payment for water so supplied will have to be made in advance, and no payment will be accepted for a longer period than one week.
