TREATMEN'T OF CERTAIN SPANISH SHIPS OF WAR. THE Governor has directed the subjoined Letters to be published for general information.

Sir,—I transmit to you, for your information and guidance, a copy of a letter (24th July 1873) which has been addressed by the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, embodying the views of Her Majesty's Government in regard to the treatment in certain cases of the Spanish Ships of War denounced as pirates by a decree of the Government of Madrid.

Sir,—With reference to my letter of yesterday respecting the Spanish Ships of War denounced as pirates by a decree of the Government of Madrid, I am directed by Earl Granville to request that you will acquaint the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty that Her Majesty's Government consider that, if such vessels commit any acts of piracy affecting British subjects or British interests, they should be treated as pirates, the decree of the Spanish Government having deprived them of the protection of their flag; but if they do no such acts, they should not be interfered with.

I am to add that Lord Granville presumes that there is a sufficient British Naval Force on the coast of Spain for the protection of British interests in the present circumstances.
