TREATMENT OF CERTAIN SPANISH SHIPS OF WAR.

SIR,—I transmit to you, for your information and guidance, a copy of a letter (24th July 1873) which has been addressed by the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, embodying the views of Her Majesty's Government in regard to the treatment in certain cases of the Spanish Ships of War denounced as pirates by a decree of the Government of Madrid.

SIR,—With reference to my letter of yesterday respecting the Spanish Ships of War denounced as pirates by a decree of the Government of Madrid, I am directed by Earl Granville to request that you will acquaint the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty that Her Majesty's Government consider that, if such vessels commit any acts of piracy affecting British subjects or British interests, they should be treated as pirates, the decree of the Spanish Government having deprived them of the protection of their flag; but if they do no such acts, they should not be interfered with.

I am to add that Lord Granville presumes that there is a sufficient British Naval Force on the coast of Spain for the protection of British interests in the present circumstances.

the Regulations following:-

1. The council of the shire within the boundaries of which
any common heretofore proclaimed or hereafter to be pro-
claimed under the provisions of *The Land Act* 1869 is wholly
included, shall be the Managers of such common.

2. The members for the time being of the road board of the
road district within the boundaries of which any common
heretofore proclaimed or hereafter to be proclaimed under the
provisions of *The Land Act* 1869 is wholly included, shall be
the Managers of such common.

3. In all cases in which a common proclaimed as hereinbefore
provided shall be situate partly within any shire or road dis-
trict, or partly within two (2) or more shires or road districts,
the council of the shire or the road board of the road district
within the boundaries of which the largest extent of such
common shall be included, shall be the Managers of such
common.

Mount Emu and Carnghan, and the road from Carnghan by Trawalla bridge leading north-westerly by the land of Frederick Williams, held under the 42nd section of *The Land Act 1865*, to the northern boundary of the district, together with all reserves on such roads, shall be excluded from and shall form no part of the Ballarat Clean District.
