NOTICE TO DEPOSITORS.

IT is hereby notified that the following Amended Regulation has been approved by the Governor in Council:—
6. Interest, calculated yearly at the rate of Three pounds per cent. per annum, shall be allowed on every complete sum of Ten shillings, or some multiple thereof, deposited; and shall be computed from the first day of the calendar month next following the day on which the sum of Ten shillings shall have been deposited, or on which deposits of a less amount shall have made up the sum of Ten shillings, up to the first day of the calendar month in which moneys are withdrawn.

The interest will be calculated to the 31st December in every year, and will then be added to and become part of the principal money.

This regulation to take effect on and after the 1st day of February 1873.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicestershire, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the one hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the Common hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:-

St. Andrew's GOLDFIELD COMMON.—The St. Andrew's Goldfield Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 28th day of January 1861, and increased by a Proclamation bearing date the 7th day of November 1864, is hereby further increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries described as follow, viz.: Commencing at the north-west angle of the land in the parish of Greensborough licensed to William Watkins, being a point on Diamond Creek; thence by that land and the Kangaroo Ground Farmers' Common bearing east to the western boundary of the existing common, being the range which divides the waters of the aforesaid creek from the waters of Watson's Creek; thence by that range north-easterly to the south boundary of the town of Queenstown; thence by the south and west boundaries of that town to Diamond Creek aforesaid; and thence down that creek to the point of commencement. Area available for commonage, about 2400 acres.—(72.E.19505.)

NORTHERN VOLUNTEER RIFLE CORPS.

1. The commanding officer may at any time convene a special meeting of the corps, and must do so on the written requisition of twelve (12) members. No such special meeting shall be held to be duly convened unless notice of it shall have been given at a parade of the corps, and it shall have been called by advertisement inserted, or circular issued to every member, four days previous to the day of meeting.
2. Any member appearing on parade or company drill with uniform, arms, or accoutrements dirty or unserviceable from neglect may be fined by the officer in command the sum of 1s.
3. Any member changing his permanent address must give notice of the same to the officer commanding, in writing, within thirty (30) days, and if he fail to do so shall be fined the sum of Half-a-crown (2s. 6d.).
4. Any member guilty of talking or other irregularities on parade will be liable to a fine of One shilling (1s.).
5. All excuses for absence from parade-muster must be in writing, and must be at the orderly room or other place appointed before the end of the month in which the absence occurred.
6. A list of all fines imposed in any month shall be signed by the officer commanding, and be posted in the orderly room or other place appointed on the first of the following month.
7. All fines must be paid to the sergeants in charge of squads within the month on the first of which they are posted.
8. An account of all fines as incurred and received shall be kept in a book, which shall be open to inspection in the orderly room.
9. Members failing to make themselves effective as per Volunteer Regulations shall be liable to a fine of Forty shillings, but the commanding officer may remit the whole or any part of such fine.
10. If a member at any time desire to quit the corps under the provisions of the Act, he shall be fined the amount if more than Ten shillings (10s.) whereby his debit exceeds his credit: provided that no such fine shall exceed £2, and that the whole or the half may, at the discretion of the officer commanding, be remitted.
11. Every member joining the corps to be supplied with a copy of these Rules and Regulations.

The deaths in December exceeded those in November by 77. They also were less than the average of the month in the previous ten years by 5. If allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of December by 80.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 90.1° on the 6th, and the lowest was 46.5° on the 31st. The mean temperature of the month (62.7°) was about half a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer (39.1°) in any one day took place on the 28th, viz. from a maximum of 89.6° to a minimum of 50.5°. The least range (11°) was on the 2nd, viz. from a maximum of 64° to a minimum of 53°. The mean daily range was 22.5°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.784 inches) was slightly below the average.

Males contributed 53 per cent., and females 47 per cent. to the total mortality; children under five years of age contributed 55 per cent. to that mortality. In December 1871 the proportion of children under five years of age to the total mortality was 53 per cent.; in December 1870 it was 52 per cent.; in December 1869 it was 53 per cent.; in December 1868 it was 55 per cent.; in December 1867, 54 per cent.; in December 1866, 69 per cent.; in December 1865, 65½ per cent.; in December 1864, 63 per cent.; in December 1863, 47 per cent.; and in December 1862, 66 per cent.

The deaths of three persons over 75 years of age occurred during the month, viz.:—A female aged 82 years of chronic rheumatism; a waiter 77 years old of old age, and a gentleman aged 84 years of cancerum oris.

Twenty-six violent deaths took place during the month, of which 22 were set down to accident and 4 to suicide. Of the former, the following are the particulars:—A boy aged 4 was killed by a kick from a horse; a clerk and a seaman aged 21 and 32 respectively died of injuries received in falls, resulting in each case in fracture of the spine; a lad aged 14 died of fracture of the skull, occasioned by a fall from a horse; a woodcarter aged 35 died from internal injuries caused by a dray passing over his chest; three girls aged respectively 14 weeks, 1 year, and 4 years, and a boy aged 3 years, died of burns and scalds; nine deaths were caused by drowning, viz. those of a girl aged 10, of three boys aged 3, 5, and 11 respectively, of a man aged 30, of a greengrocer aged 31, of a quarryman aged 37, of a seaman aged 40, and of a tinsmith aged 24; a male and a female infant aged 12 and 21 days respectively were accidentally suffocated; a laborer aged 31 died of gangrene of the arm resulting from accidental injury; a female infant died of neglect at birth. The four suicidal deaths were those of a woman aged 24, who poisoned herself, of a laborer aged 53, who drowned himself, of a laborer aged 40 and of a male aged 37, who hanged themselves.

Sixty-four deaths, or 17 per cent. of the whole mortality, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—30 in the Melbourne Hospital; 8 in the Alfred Hospital; 2 in the Lying-in Hospital; 3 in the Benevolent Asylum; 3 in the Immigrants' Home; 10 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 1 in the Industrial Schools; 1 in the Melbourne Gaol; and 6 in the Nursery Industrial Schools.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 212, of which 114, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 98, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 149 were under one year of age, 35 were between one and two years, 10 were between two and three, 10 were between three and four, and 8 between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 171, of whom 88, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 83, or 49 per cent., were of females; 7 were between five and ten, 12 were between ten and fifteen, 6 were between fifteen and twenty, 12 were between twenty and twenty-five, 8 were between twenty-five and thirty, 17 were between thirty and thirty-five, 22 were between thirty-five and forty, 19 were between forty and forty-five, 10 were between forty-five and fifty, 14 were between fifty and fifty-five, 14 were between fifty-five and sixty, 16 were between sixty and sixty-five, 5 were between sixty-five and seventy, 6 were between seventy and seventy-five, 1 was between seventy-five and eighty, and 2 were upwards of eighty.

SHIRE OF RUTHERGLEN.

BYE-LAW No. 2.

A BYE-LAW for regulating the conduct of officers and servants of the Shire of Rutherglen, and providing for the due management of the affairs and proceedings of the Council of the said shire, made under section 187 of the Shires Statute.

The Council of the Shire of Rutherglen, by virtue of the powers conferred on them under part 12 of the Shires Statute, doth hereby ordain that bye-law No. 1 heretofore existing be, and the same is, hereby repealed.

The council of the said shire doth further ordain that bye-law No. 2 be in lieu thereof.

That is to say, viz.:

1. The ordinary meeting of the council shall be held at the office of the shire, Rutherglen, on the first Saturday of every month, at Eleven o'clock a.m.

2. At every ordinary meeting the first business shall be the reading and confirmation of the minutes of any preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be allowed thereon except as to accuracy as a record of the proceedings of the meeting. The minutes, when confirmed, shall be signed by the president or chairman of the meeting.

3. Conduct of business shall be first reading correspondence, reports, and petitions, and dealing with the same. The ordinary business of the council shall then be disposed of, and finally notices of motion shall be given for next meeting.

4. Every notice of motion must be in writing and signed by the mover.

5. Every communication to the council shall be in proper form, addressed to the president and councillors, and every councillor presenting a petition or memorial shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.

6. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind a motion already passed, shall be entertained unless notice of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given by the secretary to each of the councillors seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration shall be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the councillors present at such subsequent meeting. If the number of councillors present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority, if the number of councillors present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

7. No motion shall be considered unless notice has been given at a previous meeting, or when a special meeting has been called for the purpose.

8. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor, if any calling so to order, shall be heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

9. The mover of every motion appointing a committee shall be a member of that committee.

10. Every councillor, including the president, shall stand when addressing the council, and no councillor shall be interrupted except by a call to order.

11. No councillor shall speak twice on any motion or amendment except the mover, by way of reply or personal explanation, and the ruling of the president shall be final on all points of order or practice.

12. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be considered unless the councillor who has given such notice, or some other councillor authorized by him in writing, be present when the business is called on, and notices not so proceeded with shall be struck off the notice paper.

13. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time; but if lost another may be moved before the original motion is put

to the vote, but upon any amendment being carried the original motion shall be deemed rejected, and the amendment so carried shall take the place of the original motion, and on it only one amendment can be moved.

14. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, nor impute improper motives, and all personal reflections shall be deemed highly disorderly, and any councillor making use of any such expression capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor shall at once, if required to do so by the president or any other councillor acting as chairman, withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology to the council.

15. The president shall call to order any councillor out of order, and if the councillor deemed out of order shall not obey, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

16. On any motion being put from the chair, the secretary may be required by any councillor to enter in the minute-book the names of the councillors who voted thereon, and specify whether such councillor voted for or against the motion so put from the chair.

17. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under discussion, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained, but if the motion for adjournment be carried the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the council.

18. No election to any office under the control of the council shall be made until fourteen clear days' notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more of the local papers calling for tenders from competent persons.

19. At the first ordinary meeting of the council after the annual election a finance committee and a public works committee shall be appointed, each committee to consist of three councillors.

20. The duties of the finance committee shall be generally to supervise the financial affairs of the council, and, amongst other matters, submit to the council, on or before the 31st of January in every year, an estimate of the working expenses of the council for the current year.

21. The public works committee shall, on or before the 31st of January in every year, submit to the council an annual report and estimate of such works as may be deemed desirable to undertake during the year.

22. When the public works report shall have been brought up, the council shall, at the following meeting, take such report into consideration, and finally determine what works shall be proceeded with immediately during the year: Provided that the estimated cost of such works shall in no case exceed four-fifths of the funds available for public works during the year.

23. Plans and specifications of all such works determined on shall be prepared forthwith by the engineer, and tenders called for the execution of the works.

24. Contracts, shall be made by tender, and shall be advertised in one or more of the local papers at least fourteen days previous to tenders being accepted.

25. Tenders shall be deposited in the tender-box at the office of the council one hour previous to the meeting, and opened by the president or chairman at the meeting appointed for that purpose. Every tender shall be accompanied by a cash deposit of five per cent. on the amount of tender; cheques will on no account be received. Contracts will be prepared by the council.

26. The shire engineer shall attend at the office of the council one hour previous to the meeting, to examine and certify to accounts in his department.

27. All accounts for payment shall be submitted to the secretary one hour at least previous to the meeting of the council.

28. The collector shall pay into the Bank of Victoria, Wahgunyah, all moneys received by him within three days of the time of receiving such moneys, and shall furnish the council with a detail statement of the same in writing.

29. At the ordinary meeting of the council in August the secretary shall lay on the table a statement showing the attendance of councillors at the council meetings during the past year, and the same, after having been certified to by the president, shall be published in one or more of the local papers.

30. Any part of this bye-law may be suspended *pro tem.* in case of emergency, with the consent of not less than five councillors present at any meeting, the same being entered in the minutes at such meeting.
