WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission shall have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any general roll or supplementary roll or ordinary electoral roll or roll of rate-paying electors, the Governor in Council may take all such measures as may be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or may declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission; and every such Order in Council shall state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and shall be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the preparation of the Rolls of Rate-paying Electors for the several Divisions of the Electoral Provinces and Districts named in the third column of the schedule hereto annexed has been unavoidably impeded by reason of the non-receipt by the Electoral Registrars for such divisions of the Lists of Ratepayers within the time fixed by the Acts Nos. 279 and 334 from the several officers named in the first

OUTLYING TERRITORY ATTACHED TO THE SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 19) it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may, if he shall be thereunto requested by the council of the shire, and if he shall see fit so to do, and upon such terms and

conditions as shall appear to him to be reasonable and just, annex to any shire or to any riding, or in separate parts to any two or more ridings of any shire if divided into ridings, any portion of Victoria adjoining to such shire and forming therewith one continuous area, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or the town of Geelong; and every such portion shall thereupon become and be part of such shire, and so much thereof as shall have been added to any riding of such shire shall be part of the riding to which it shall have been so added, and such shire and riding after such annexation shall, save where herein otherwise provided, be deemed to be the same shire and riding respectively after such annexation as before; provided that notice of the time when it shall please the Governor to order that any such intended annexation be taken into consideration by his Executive Council shall be published by the Minister in the *Government Gazette*, and in at least one newspaper generally circulating in the portion to be annexed, at least one month before any such annexation shall be made: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the twenty-fourth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, the Cranbourne Road District was constituted the Shire of Cranbourne: And whereas, in compliance with a request from the council of the said shire, it has seemed fit to the Governor to add to the said shire the portion of Victoria described in a notice published in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, bearing date the fourth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, adjoining to the said shire and not lying within the limits of the above-mentioned city and town or any municipal or road district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby add to the Yallock Riding of the Shire of Cranbourne a portion of the colony adjoining to such riding and forming therewith one continuous area (such portion not lying within the city or town above mentioned or any municipal or road district), in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and doth re-define the Yallock Riding of the said shire, added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:-

THE YALLOCK RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.—Starting at the north-east angle of the parish of Tyabb; thence around and including the parishes of Lang Warrin and Sherwood; east and south by the shire boundary to the east angle of section 19, parish of Yallock; along the eastward side of allotments 24 and 1 and the southward sides of 1, 2, and 3; south and west to and around allotments 20, 28, and 26, all in the same parish, to the south-east angle of Meikle's pre-emptive right; west to Westernport Bay; and by the shore of the bay northward and westward to the starting point.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

RIDINGS OF THE SHIRE OF PORTLAND.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-ninth day of September 1873.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 18) it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time not less than thirty days before or after an annual election, or general election, or first appointment of councillors, whether under the Act No. CLXXVI. hereby repealed or the said Act, for any shire, the Governor may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll in such shire, and if he shall think fit so to do, divide the shire into two or into three ridings, by such names and with such boundaries respectively as shall by Order in Council be assigned to the same, and may from time to time, subject to the like conditions, alter, vary, or rescind such Order: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll of the Shire of Portland, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the said Shire of Portland into three ridings, to be designated by the names and to be comprised within the boundaries which are hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:-

THE SOUTH RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF PORTLAND.—Commencing at the sea coast at the south-east corner of South Australia; thence north by the south-east boundary line of South Australia to its intersection with the road from Dartmoor to Mount Gambier; thence by that road to its junction in the township of Dartmoor with the south-west boundary of the three-chain road from Heywood to Dartmoor; thence south-easterly by the south-west boundary of the said three-chain road to the north boundary of the parish of Drumburg; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the parish of Drumburg to the western side of the main road from Heywood to Hamilton; thence south-westerly by the western boundary of the said main road to a point immediately north of the north-west angle of allotment 4A, section 21, parish of Myamyn; thence southerly to the said north-west angle of the said allotment 4A, section

21, parish of Myamyn; and further southerly by the western boundary of the said allotment 4A, section 21, parish of Myamyn, to the north-west angle of the parish of Homerton; thence east by the northern boundary of the parish of Homerton to the west bank of Darlot's Creek; thence further east to the eastern bank of the said creek; thence further east by the northern boundary of the parish of Dunmore to the south-east angle of the parish of Condah; thence by a right line south to a point on the northern boundary of allotment 22, parish of Dunmore; thence south-easterly by the northern boundaries of allotments 22 and 23, parish of Dunmore; thence south-westerly, south-easterly, and southerly by the eastern boundary of the shire of Portland, being the western boundaries of the Ellengowan and Castlemaddie runs, passing through allotments 23, 21, 16, 11, 10, 17, 18, and 19, parish of Dunmore, and allotments 9, 21, 38, 53, 84, 81, 83, and 82, parish of Bessiebell, and allotments 16, 15, 34, 35, 48, and 67, parish of Tyrendarra, to the sea coast; thence westerly by the sea coast to the south-east corner of South Australia at the commencing point, exclusive of the township of Portland.

THE WEST RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF PORTLAND.—Commencing at the intersection of the eastern boundary line of South Australia with the southern boundary of the road from Dartmoor to Mount Gambier; thence easterly by the southern boundary of that road to its junction in the township of Dartmoor with the south-west boundary of the three-chain road from Heywood to Dartmoor; thence south-easterly by the south-western boundary of the said three-chain road to the northern boundary of the parish of Drumburg; thence easterly by the said northern boundary of the parish of Drumburg to the south-west angle of allotment 4B, section 17, parish of Myamyn; thence northerly by the western boundaries of the parishes of Myamyn and Bramburra to the north-west angle of the parish of Bramburra; thence north one chain; thence westerly by the northern boundary of the parish of Winayung to a one-chain road on the west of allotment 19 of section 9, parish of Grassdale; thence northerly by that road to its junction with a one-chain road on the north of allotment 11 of section 9, parish of Grassdale; thence westerly by that one-chain road to its junction with the one-chain road on the western boundary of the parish of Grassdale; thence northerly by that road to the River Stokes; thence south-westerly by the said River Stokes to its junction with the Glenelg river; thence northerly by the River Glenelg to the northern boundary of the shire of Portland, being a point on that river due east from the southern boundary of the township of Lindsay; thence west by that line to the south-west angle of the township of Lindsay, on the western boundary of South Australia; thence south by that boundary line to its intersection with the southern boundary of the road from Dartmoor to Mount Gambier at its commencing point.

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, such Common to be designated by the name prefixed to the description thereof, that is to say:—

LUCKNOW COMMON.—Four thousand acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the three several portions, the respective boundaries whereof are as follow, viz.:—

REGULATION No. 6 OF THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF PRAHRAN RESCINDED.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Boroughs Statute*, 33 Vict. No. 359, sec. 178, has rescinded the Regulation which was passed by the Council of the town of Prahran under Part V. of the 12th Schedule of the said Statute on 22nd July 1872, and confirmed on 19th August 1872, and is described in the *Government Gazette* of the 20th September 1872 as follows, viz. :-

"In pursuance of Part V. of the Twelfth Schedule of the Boroughs Statute, adopted by Bye-law No. 77 of the Council of the town of Prahran, the said Council make the following regulation, that is to say :-

"For regulating the classes, rates, and thickness of external walls of buildings; for regulating the erection of attached, detached, and isolated buildings; for regulating the material and construction of walls, party walls, and party arches; for regulating buildings over public ways, porticos, and external projections, chimneys, roofs, and drains; for regulating the construction of dwelling-houses, yards, cellars, ground and upper floors; and for regulating the appointment and fees of the surveyor."

SHIRE OF HUNTLY.

BYE-LAW No. 2.

A Bye-law for regulating the conduct of the officers and servants of the Shire of Huntly, and for providing for the due management of the affairs and proceedings of the Council of the said Shire, and for carrying into effect all the provisions of The Shires Statute according to the true intent and meaning thereof, for the good government of the Shire, made under part 12 of The Shires Statute.

THE Council of the Shire of Huntly, by virtue of the powers conferred on them by The Shires Statute, and of the 187th section of part 12, do hereby ordain that Bye-law No. 1 be and the same is hereby repealed.

The Council of the said Shire do hereby ordain that—

1. The councillors in all meetings of the council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of president, chairman, or councillor.

2. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the president or chairman for the time being shall decide as to priority.

3. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion, or any amendment, must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

4. Every councillor proposing a motion or amendment, or speaking on any matter, must rise and address the president or chairman for the time being, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, whereupon he shall sit down until the question of order shall have been decided, when he may resume his address.

5. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, nor impute motives, and all personal reflection shall be considered disorderly, and any councillor making use of any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor shall at once, if required by the president or the chairman for the time being, withdraw such expression and make an apology satisfactory to the council.

6. Any councillor may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by another councillor immediately upon the same being uttered.

7. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

8. The ordinary meetings of the council shall be held at the Council Chambers, Huntly, on the first and third Wednesday in each month, at two o'clock in the afternoon, and the business of any meeting shall be commenced as soon after the time fixed as there shall be a sufficient number of councillors in attendance to constitute a quorum; but if at the expiry of one hour from the time specified there be not a quorum present no business shall be transacted by the council at the meeting, and the names of all councillors present shall be recorded in the minute book by the secretary.

9. The order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, unless altered by resolution at any particular meeting:—Reading and

confirming the minutes of any previous meeting not already confirmed, without discussion, except as to the accuracy thereof; reading copies of letters sent; reading letters received and ordering thereon; opening and dealing with tenders; reception of and reading petitions and memorials; reading and ordering on reports of committees, deputations, and officers; orders of the day; motions of which previous notice has been given; accounts.

10. The orders of the day shall include all matters incomplete at any previous meeting, all matters of which due notice has been given, and any business which the president or any councillor or any officer may introduce, and in the ordering of which verbal instructions to an officer may be deemed sufficient.

11. Every notice of motion shall be given in writing to the secretary, and shall be read aloud by that officer at the meeting previous to that at which the same is to be taken into consideration, and every such notice shall be considered in the order in which it is given.

12. Any motion or amendment not seconded shall not be further debated, but shall lapse.

13. No motion entered on the notice-paper shall be considered unless the councillor who has given such notice, or some other councillor authorised by him in writing, be present to proceed with the same when called on.

14. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the seconder.

15. The councillor who moves any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken thereon.

16. No councillor shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion of which he has been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last proposed after the reply, and the amendment, or the original motion, as the case may be, shall immediately be put to the vote.

17. No motion shall be made on any report of a committee or officer, except that of receiving the same, unless under urgent circumstances and with the unanimous consent of the councillors present, when, by a separate motion, the whole or part of such report may be adopted.

18. No discussion shall be allowed upon any motion for the adjournment of the council, but such motion shall, immediately upon being seconded, be put from the chair, and, in the event of its being negatived, the consideration of the subject then under discussion shall be resumed, or the next on the notice-paper proceeded with, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business undisposed of shall have precedence when the council resume.

19. One amendment shall be discussed at one time, but if lost other amendments may be separately moved before the original question is put to the vote.

20. Upon the adoption of any amendment it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other amendment, and the original motion shall be deemed to be lost.

21. No motion involving the expenditure of a sum exceeding £10 shall be entertained unless notice thereof shall have been given at a previous meeting.

22. On any motion being put from the chair the secretary may be required by any member to enter in the minute book the names of the councillors voting thereon, and how each councillor voted, and the secretary shall forthwith make the entry required.

23. The ruling of the president or chairman for the time being shall be final.

24. If in the report of a committee or officer there be distinct recommendations, it shall not be adopted until the sense of the council shall have been taken separately on each.

25. The mover of any motion appointing a committee shall be a member of such committee.

26. Whenever a division shall be taken the councillors voting in the affirmative shall say "Aye," and those voting in the negative shall say "No," and the result shall be declared by the president or chairman for the time being, and the motion or amendment may be put as often as may be necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion.

27. Any councillor refusing to vote upon any matter before the council, on being called upon so to do by the president or the chairman for the time being, except where pecuniarily interested, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty shillings or such part thereof as any justice before whom the said penalty may be sought to be enforced may think fit.

28. Any councillor who shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order, or use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, and who when required by the president or chairman for the time being shall not forthwith withdraw such expression and make such apology to the council as shall be deemed satisfactory by the council, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds or such part thereof as any justice before whom the said penalty may be sought to be enforced may think fit.

29. The secretary of the shire shall have the custody and shall be responsible for the safety of all documents belonging to the council, and shall also have the custody of the common seal of the corporation, and affix the same when required by a quorum of the councillors present at any meeting of the council.

30. Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be in proper form, and must be presented by a councillor, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded; and no debate shall take place thereon except as to its being received and made an order of the day or an order at any future meeting, or it may be referred to a committee, or to any officer, to report thereon.

This Bye-law may be suspended *pro tem.* in case of emergency and with the unanimous consent of the councillors present at any meeting.

The foregoing Bye-law was made by special order the seventh day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.
