CUTTING OF TIMBER ON CERTAIN LANDS IN THE PARISH OF WARRANDYTE PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor may by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut any timber on the Crown lands in the parish of Warrandyte which are hereinafter described, that is to say:—

WARRANDYTE.—One thousand one hundred and thirty-four acres, more or less, county of Evelyn, parish of Warrandyte, being section 16 and part of section 3: Commencing at the south-east angle of section 16; thence north one hundred and sixty chains; thence west twelve chains to the River Yarra Yarra; thence down that river to J. Thomson's section; thence by that section south twenty-two chains, east thirty-two chains fifty links, south forty-five chains fifty links, west thirty-seven chains, and north twenty-six chains seventy links; thence again down the Yarra River to the west boundary of section 3; thence south one hundred and forty-two chains; and thence east eighty chains to the commencing point.—(73.K.24376.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid,

collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the Commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

BROADFORD FARMERS' COMMON.—The Broadford Farmers' Common, proclaimed on the 4th day of March 1861, and increased by a Proclamation bearing date the 6th day of September 1869, is hereby further increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land, comprising an area of four thousand acres, more or less, within the boundaries described as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 57, parish of Broadford, being a point on the southern side of the road from Broadford to Yes; thence by that road bearing south-easterly to the boundary between the Mount Piper and the Reedy Creek runs; thence by that boundary southerly to the northern boundary of the Running Creek run; thence by that boundary westerly to Sunday Creek; thence down that creek to a line formed by the prolongation of the south boundary of the land licensed to Christina McDonald; thence by that line, by the south and eastern boundaries of the said land, and by the south and east boundaries of the land licensed to D. C. Cameron to a point bearing west one chain from the south-west angle of the land licensed to Johanna Irvine; thence to the said angle of that land; thence by the south and east boundaries thereof; and thence by the south and east boundaries of allotment 57 aforesaid to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(73.M.24603.)

CALLAWADDA FARMERS' COMMON.—The Callawadda Farmers' Common, described in three several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 4th day of February 1867, the 12th day of March 1867, and the 11th day of November 1867, is hereby increased by adding thereto the allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, and comprising an area of three thousand three hundred and eighty-one acres eight perches, viz.:—Parish of Callawadda, allotments 162, 163, 166, 167, 168, 181, 182, 183, 184, 185, 186, 187, 196, 197, 198, 199, 200, and 201; parish of Kiachella, allotment 182 b.—(73.J.21967.)

KIRKELLA TEMPORARY COMMON.—The Kirkella Temporary Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 20th of November 1865, and diminished by a Proclamation bearing date the 16th of September 1867, is hereby increased by adding thereto allotments 165, 166, 168, and 169, in the parish of Kirkella, comprising an area of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two acres one rood eight perches.—(73.K.23213.)

THE UNITED SHIRE OF MALDON DIVIDED ANEW.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fifth day of November 1873.

PRESENT:
His Excellency the Governor
Mr. Kerferd Mr. Cohen.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 23) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by not less than one-third of the number of persons whose names appear on the voters' rolls of any one or more ridings of a united shire for all ridings of which a voter's roll shall be in force, to divide anew such united shire into such separate ridings as to him may seem fit by such names and with such boundaries as shall in and by such Order in Council be assigned to the same and equal in number to the whole number of councillors hereby or hereunder assigned to such united shire divided by three, and such new ridings shall be in lieu of the original ridings which shall have become such upon the union: And whereas by an Order in Council made on the fifth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the United Shire of Maldon was constituted: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition signed by not less than one-third of the number of persons whose names appear on the voters' rolls of the said united shire: And whereas notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same

Act, and no counter petition has since been presented to the Governor: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this present Order, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth divide anew the said United Shire of Maldon into three several ridings, and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby set forth the names and boundaries of such ridings in manner following, that is to say:—

THE MALDON RIDING.—Commencing at a point bearing west one chain and fifty links from the north-west angle of allotment 12, section 2, in the parish of Maldon; thence by a line bearing north one mile; thence by a line bearing east two miles and a quarter; thence by a line bearing south four miles; thence by a line bearing west two miles and a quarter; and thence by a line bearing north to the commencing point.

THE BARINGHUP RIDING.—Commencing on the north boundary of the Shire of Maldon, at a point in the centre of the road at the north-east angle of portion 1, section 7, in the parish of Bradford; thence southerly and easterly by that road to its junction with a road which passes through section 5, parish of Bradford; thence by that road southerly to its junction with the Castlemaine to Dunolly main road; thence easterly by that road to the west boundary of the municipality of Maldon; thence south and east by the west and south boundaries of the said municipality to the centre of the road from Maldon to Newstead; thence southerly by that road to the south boundary of Maldon Shire; thence westerly, northerly, and easterly by the southern, western, and northern boundaries of the shire to the commencing point.

THE WALMER RIDING.—Commencing on the north boundary of the Shire of Maldon at a point in the centre of the road at the north-east angle of portion 1, section 7, in the parish of Bradford; thence southerly and easterly by that road to its junction with a road which passes through section 5, parish of Bradford; thence by that road southerly to its junction with the Castlemaine to Dunolly main road; thence easterly by that road to the west boundary of the municipality of Maldon; thence north, east, south, and west, by the west, north, east, and south boundaries of the said municipality to the centre of the road from Maldon to Newstead; thence southerly by that road to the south boundary of Maldon Shire; thence easterly, northerly, and westerly by the southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of the shire to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

NOTICE TO INTENDING CANDIDATES FOR CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY UNDER "THE SHIRES STATUTE" AND "BOROUGHES STATUTE" 1869.

AN Examination of Candidates for certificates of competency as Engineers and Surveyors of Land and Works will be held, at a place to be notified in the *Argus*, at Ten o'clock on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, the 16th, 17th, and 18th days of December next.

Candidates are requested to be in the examination room punctually at the hour named each day.

All candidates must forward, before the 6th December next, to the Secretary to the Board of Examiners, at the Offices of Railways and Roads, Spencer street, notice in writing of intention to present themselves for examination, giving address and name in full, and at the same time enclosing the sum of (£2 2s.) Two guineas with articles of indenture and certificates (if any) that they may possess from properly constituted bodies of examiners.

If a candidate presents himself more than twice and is successful at the third or any subsequent examination, the last fee will be returned.

Candidates are requested to provide themselves with drawing instruments and scales.

No candidate will be admitted for examination unless the above conditions are complied with.

The fees will be paid by the secretary into the consolidated revenue.

The Board issues two classes of certificate, A and B, both of which qualify for an appointment; but a first-class certificate (A) is evidence that the grantee has passed with credit.

The following are the subjects in which candidates will be examined:—

1. Field-work and Topography.—Use and adjustment of instruments.
2. Construction and Maintenance of Roads, including principles and practice.
3. Substructures.—General principles and practice in relation to various materials.
4. Collection and Distribution of Water, including general principles and practice.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts herein-after mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:

Pursuant to Order of 28 April 1873.

BRENANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Brenanah and Coyora Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

GREENWALD QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the north-east corner of Greenwald run on the Crawford River; thence westerly by that river to its junction with the Glenelg River; thence southerly by that river and the Molaside Creek to the north-west corner of Kentbruck run; thence by the western boundary of that run bearing southerly to its south-westerly corner; thence by the southern boundary south-easterly; thence northerly and westerly by the top of Mount Kincaid to the north-west corner of Greenwich run; thence by the western boundaries of Greenwich and Lower Crawford runs to the Glenaulin Creek; thence by that creek south-easterly to the south-east corner of Greenwald run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run bearing northerly to the commencing point. The boundaries above described comprise the runs of Greenwald, Glenaulin, and Kentbruck.

HAPPY VALLEY QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the head of the Muddy Creek; thence westerly by the Main Dividing Range to the east boundary of the Glenvale run; thence northerly by the east boundary of that run to the Clorbinane run; thence northerly and north-easterly by the east and south-east boundaries thereof to the southern boundary of the Flowerdale run; thence by the said boundary easterly to the Glenburn run; thence south-easterly by that run to the Muddy Creek aforesaid; and thence to the commencing point.

POWLETT'S PLAINS QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Powlett's Plains run).—Commencing at a point on the River Loddon, being the north-east angle of allotment 62, parish of Kinypaniel; thence southerly along the said River Loddon to the northernmost angle of the Salisbury Plains run; thence westerly and southerly to the northernmost boundary of the Brenanah run; thence westerly along the said boundary to the eastern boundary of the Torpichen run; thence northerly along the said boundary to the southernmost boundary of the Edgar Plains run; and thence easterly to the point of commencement.

PROTECTORATE QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Protectorate run).—Commencing at the north-east angle of Waranga run; on the west by that run; on the south by Postlethwaite run on the east by the Goulburn River for about seven miles; thence by a line running north-west to the commencing point.

SANDHURST DISTRICT, FREEHOLD LANDS IN THE
Dunn's Farm, parish of Clunes, section C, allotments 20, 27, and 28,
Hope's Farm, parish of Clunes, section C, allotments 29, 30, 31, and 32.

SANDHURST DISTRICT, FREEHOLD PROPERTIES IN THE
Parish of Powlett—Clancy.—Comprising allotments 10 and 12, lying on the north side of the main road from Salisbury Plains pre-emptive right to Kinypaniel in the county of Gladstone.

Parish of Kinypaniel—Mackins.—Comprising allotment 95, on the River Loddon, in the county of Gladstone.

TULLAROOP QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the south-east angle of W. Teel's 42nd section block, being also the south-east angle of allotment 3A, section 7, parish of Eddington, being a point on the Tullaroop Creek; thence west to the south-west angle of the land granted to William Heer; thence southerly along the three-chain road to its junction with the one-chain road leading to Maryborough, and by that road in a south-westerly direction to its intersection with the western boundary of the parish of Eddington; thence south along the said parish boundary one mile and twenty-eight chains; thence east one mile and fourteen chains; thence southerly along the three-chain road fifteen chains; thence east one mile and five chains to the Tullaroop Creek; thence northerly by that creek to the point of commencement.

Pursuant to Order of 26 May 1873.

MANSFIELD QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the Muddy Creek with the Goulburn River; thence up that river to the "Balham Hill" run; thence by the eastern, southern, and western boundaries of that run to the Goulburn River aforesaid; thence down that river to the eastern boundary of Nainbabulla run; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of that run and the eastern boundaries of Dropmore and Tarcombe runs to Wanghambelian run; thence easterly by the southern boundary of that run and the southern boundaries of Seven Creeks, Bailey Hill, and Saintfield runs to Barjarg run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run to the western

On and after the fifteenth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, the charges for the carriage of all firewood, logs, deals, piles, and other kinds of sawn or split timber arriving at Melbourne, will be increased by the following rates in addition to those now in force, that is to say:—

- Firewood, One shilling and sixpence per truck.
- Sawn timber, Two shillings and sixpence per truck.
- Logs and piles, Four shillings per truck.
- Other kinds of timber, Four shillings per truck.

Trucks to be loaded as heretofore by the owners; the unloading to be done by the department.
