WHEREAS by The Land Act 1869 it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein-before contained the Governor may by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut any timber on the Crown lands in the parish of Warrandyte which are hereinafter described, that is to say:—

WARRANDYTE.—One thousand one hundred and thirty-four acres, more or less, county of Evelyn, parish of Warrandyte, being section 16 and part of section 3: Commencing at the south-east angle of section 16; thence north one hundred and sixty chains; thence west twelve chains to the River Yarra Yarra; thence down that river to J. Thomson's section; thence by that section south twenty-two chains, east thirty-two chains fifty links, south forty-five chains fifty links, south forty-five chains fifty links, south forty-five chains fifty links, thence again down the Yarra River to the west boundary of section 3; thence south one hundred and forty-two chains; and thence cast eighty chains to the commencing point.—(73.K.24376.)

### QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of The Scab Act 1870, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Qarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Tenderers are to state the price at per ton of 50 cubic feet. No wood will be measured until it shall have been stacked fourteen days, so as to have settled down, and must then stand 5 feet high by 2 feet wide.

Security will be required to the amount of Ten per cent. on the total amount of the contract, either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect. Tenders must be accompanied by bank notes, or a bank draft in favor of the Secretary of the Tender Board, for Ten per cent. of the amount of security required, which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited.

The firewood is to be delivered at each place mentioned herein, and is to be delivered at the rate of at least 100 tons per week, at each place mentioned, commencing not later than the 1st day of January 1874.

For each and every week's delay in the delivery beyond the times specified in this contract the Government shall be entitled to deduct, as and for liquidated damages, the sum of Ten pounds sterling.

The Railway Storekeeper shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the specification, notice of which will be given to the contractor

specification, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason.

In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supply as to the quality or kind of timber, the same is to be decided by the General Overseer of Locomotives, whose decision shall be final.

Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

Irregularity in quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding I wenty-five pounds for each case, as the Government may direct.
