WASTE OF YAN YEAN WATER.

THE Board of Land and Works begs to direct attention to the urgent necessity that exists for checking Waste of Yan Yeau Water.

The loss of pressure occasioned by this waste during the summer months is greater than the main pipe is able to afford, and, unless stringent means are used to restrict it, citizens generally will suffer serious inconvenience from the great reduction in the supply, while those residing in the higher parts of the city and suburbs will be entirely deprived of water, as the constant discharge by unnecessary waste renders supply at high levels practically impossible.

Under these circumstances, the Board has no alternative but strictly to enforce the operation of the 11th bye-law, which provides a penalty of Five pounds in cases where water is allowed to run to waste.

The provisions of the Public Works Statute will also be rigidly carried out; every person using the water for irrigation without permission, and without affixing a meter, will be prosecuted. The service pipe will likewise be cut off, without notice, in all instances where water is wasted, misused, or unduly consumed.

The Board earnestly trusts that the public generally will assist the police and the officers of the department in abating an evil which causes such serious inconvenience to so large a number of citizens.

WATERSHED OF THE PLENTY RIVER AND ITS TRIBUTARIES.

WHEREAS by the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted that the Board of Land and Works shall have power from time to time to make and alter, or rescind, rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves: Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the rule and regulation following, that is to say:—

The issue of licenses to enter upon and fall timber on unoccupied Crown lands forming the watershed of the Plenty river and its tributaries, and also for a distance of two miles northward from the crest of the Dividing Range, having been prohibited, notice is hereby given that all rails, palings, shingles, and fallen timber must be removed from such Crown lands before the thirty-first day of December next, from which date dray traffic thereon will be permanently closed; and any person trespassing on such lands for the purpose of cutting or removing timber, or otherwise causing injury to the watershed, will be proceeded against in accordance with the before-mentioned clause of the said Act, whereby it is provided that every person offending against any such rule and regulation shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such rule and regulation, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by any such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATION RELATING TO THE WATERSHED OF THE PLENTY RIVER, ETC., RESCINDED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by An Act passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony, by any Orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within and the times at which Circuit Courts shall be holden in the said colony, and the said limits and times to alter and vary as he shall, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary: And whereas an Order, bearing even date herewith, has been by me made with the advice of the Executive Council, defining the places and times as hereinafter set forth at which Circuit Courts shall be holden in Victoria during the year 1874: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the said Order defining and appointing the places and times at which the several Circuit Courts of Victoria shall be holden during the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four to be as follow, that is to say:—

The deaths in October were less than the deaths in September by 57. They exceeded the average of October in the previous ten years by 102. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of October by 43.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 89.3° on the 16th, and the lowest was 35.6° on the 5th. The mean temperature (59.3°) of the month was 2.7° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer (37.9°) in any one day took place on the 24th, viz., from a maximum of 80.9° to a minimum of 43.0°. The least range (5.4°) was on the 17th, viz., from a maximum of 65.2° to a minimum of 59.8°. The mean daily range was 21.2°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.887 inches) was slightly above the average.

Males contributed 58 per cent. of the deaths and females 42 per cent. Thirty-seven per cent. were of children under five years of age, against 37 per cent. in October 1872, 41 per cent. in October 1871, 32 per cent. in October 1870, 40 per cent. in October 1869, 45 per cent. in October 1868, 40 per cent. in October 1867, 51 per cent. in October 1866, 52 per cent. in October 1865, 41 per cent. in October 1864, and 37 per cent. in October 1863.

Five persons of 75 years and upwards died during the month, viz.:—A female aged 80, of bronchitis, a female of 89 of rheumatism, a laborer aged 75 of pneumonia, a gardener aged 75 of paralysis, and a female of 75 of apoplexy.

Seventeen violent deaths occurred during the month, viz., that of a female aged 45, of injury to the head caused by a fall; a seaman aged 32, by timber falling upon him; a plumber aged 35, from the results of injuries received by a fall some time ago; a butcher aged 30, accidentally drowned; a female child of 24 days, accidentally suffocated; a waiter aged 32, from suicidal poisoning; a grocer aged 20, from fracture of ribs; a lamplighter aged 25, who was run over by a waggonette, causing fracture of skull; a seaman aged 18 and a female aged 29, accidentally drowned together; a newly born male child, who was wilfully murdered by suffocation; a laborer aged 66, who was killed by a fall off a ladder; a carpenter aged 44, who committed suicide by hanging; a seaman aged 29, who fell a distance of 150 feet; a male child of 5 years of age, killed by the kick of a horse; a carter aged 38, who died from the effects of severe burns; and a farm laborer aged 65, accidentally thrown from a dray.

Eighty deaths, or 23 per cent. of the total number, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Melbourne Hospital, 44; Alfred Hospital, 11; Benevolent Asylum, 3; Lying-in Hospital, 3; Immigrants' Home, 7; Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2; Yarra Bend Asylum, 8; Industrial Schools, 1; Children's Hospital, 1.

The deaths of children under 5 years of age numbered 131, of which 77, or 59 per cent., were of males, and 54, or 41 per cent., of females. Of those who died, 81 were under one year of age, 26 were between one and two years, 11 were between two and three years, 9 were between three and four years, and 4 were between four and five years.

The persons who died at a more advanced age numbered 223, of whom 129, or 58 per cent., were males, and 94, or 42 per cent., were females; 24 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 12 were between twenty and twenty-five, 23 were between twenty-five and thirty, 19 were between thirty and thirty-five, 21 were between thirty-five and forty, 26 were between forty and forty-five, 17 were between forty-five and fifty, 13 were between fifty and fifty-five, 13 were between fifty-five and sixty, 15 were between sixty and sixty-five, 10 were between sixty-five and seventy, 7 were between seventy and seventy-five, 3 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 2 were eighty years old and upwards.

Zymotic diseases caused 61 deaths in October against 77 in September. There was also a large decrease in the number of deaths from local diseases, which caused 222 deaths in September and only 177 in October. The number of deaths during the month under review from bronchitis and pneumonia, which were so fatal in September, was 22 and 26 respectively. Deaths from phthisis reached as high as 50 in number.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts herein-after mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:

Pursuant to Order of 28 April 1873.

BRENNANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Brennanah and Coyocora Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

BYE-LAW No. 35.

A Bye-law made under the provisions of part 12 of the Shires Statute, No. 358, for preventing obstructions and incumbrances in and upon the public roads and streets in the Shire of Colac.

IN pursuance of the provisions of part 12 of the Shires Statute, No. 358, the Council of the Shire of Colac ordain as follows, that is to say:—That from and after the date of this bye-law coming into operation—

1. Any person who shall erect or cause to be erected any awning, verandah, or other structure over, upon, along, or across the footway of any street, lane, highway, passage, or other public place in the Shire of Colac, without having previously obtained in writing the consent thereto of the shire surveyor of the said shire, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Ten pounds; and shall further, within the space of forty-eight hours, from and after the date of conviction, remove or cause to be removed such awning, verandah post, or other structure, and in case of failure or neglect of such removal shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

2. Every such awning or verandah, when such consent to the erection thereof shall have been obtained, shall be constructed in strict accordance with the plan and specification previously approved of by the council.

3. No such consent as aforesaid nor anything herein contained shall be held to confer upon the recipient of such consent, or any other person, any right to maintain any verandah post or other structure, whether erected prior or subsequent to the date of this bye-law coming into operation, over, upon, along, or across any footway within the said shire; and if at any time it shall be desirable that any awning, verandah post, or other structure (whether the same shall have been erected in accordance with such permission and directions as aforesaid or otherwise, or prior or subsequent to the date of this bye-law coming into operation) should be removed, and the council shall order the removal of the same, the owner or occupier of the premises attached to, or in front of, or in connection with such awning, verandah post, or other structure shall cause the removal of such awning, verandah post, or other structure within forty-eight hours from the time of the service of a notice of such order under the hand of the shire surveyor at such premises as aforesaid, or personally upon or at the last known residence or place of business of such owner or occupier; and in case of failure or neglect to comply with such notice, every owner or occupier so offending shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

4. Any person being the occupier of any shop or premises having an awning, verandah post, or other structure extending over any public footway or roadway, who being required by a notice in writing under the hand of the shire surveyor of the said shire to remove from such awning, verandah post, or other structure any signboard, screen, or other appendage, or any goods, wares, merchandise, or other matters, or things whatsoever, shall after forty-eight hours from the time of the service of such notice at such shop or premises, fail or neglect to comply with the requirements of such notice as aforesaid, shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
