CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT OF THE GRAMPIAN STATE FOREST.

THE GRAMPIAN STATE FOREST BOARD.

WHEREAS by the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: The Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulation relative to the control of the Grampian State Forest:—

REGULATION.

The undermentioned representatives of local public bodies in the Shire of Stawell, together with the District Surveyor at Ararat, shall constitute a Board of Management, to be called "The Grampian State Forest Board," to exercise control over the Grampian State Forest.

They may propose rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of such State Forest, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and, after approval and confirmation of such rules and regulations by the Board of Land and Works, shall give effect to and carry out the same as such board of management.

MOUTH OF THE YARRA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fisheries Act 1873* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, define the limits of and what waters shall be deemed to be, and what shall be deemed the mouth or other boundary of any river, creek, stream, bay, estuary, or lake; and may fix a distance from the mouth of any or every river, creek, or stream within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare and define the following to be THE MOUTH OF THE RIVER YARRA within which nets and fixed engines may not be used, that is to say, within a line drawn from the end of the Railway Pier, Williams-town, N.W.* to the Red Beacon Light at the entrance of the River Yarra; and from thence N.W.* to a post on the North or Sandridge Shore.

COMMON ABOLISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or

more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the one hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish the Common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

YUPPERIAR AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON, described in five several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 24th day of September 1865, the 2nd day of September 1867, the 22nd day of June 1868, and the 9th day of March, and the 31st day of May 1869.

NOTE.—During the quarter the gain to the population by excess of births over deaths was 4,330, viz., 2,340 males and 2,000 females; the gain by excess of arrivals over departures was 507, viz., 638 males and 129 females; the net increase was therefore 4,837, viz., 2,978 males and 2,619 females, as indicated in the table.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:

Pursuant to Order of 28 April 1873.

BRENAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Brennah and Cooora Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

GREENWALD QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the north-east corner of Greenwald run on the Crawford River; thence westerly by that river to its junction with the Glenelg River; thence southerly by that river and the Moleside Creek to the north-west corner of Kentbruck run; thence by the western boundary of that run bearing southerly to its south-westerly corner; thence by the southern boundary south-easterly; thence northerly and westerly by the top of Mount Kincaid to the south-west corner of Greenwich run; thence by the western boundaries of Greenwich and Lower Crawford runs to the Glenaulin Creek; thence by that creek south-easterly to the south-east corner of Greenwald run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run bearing northerly to the commencing point. WASTE OF YAN YEAN WATER.

THE Board of Land and Works begs to direct attention to the urgent necessity that exists for checking Waste of Yan Yeau Water.

The loss of pressure occasioned by this waste during the summer months is greater than the main pipe is able to afford, and, unless stringent means are used to restrict it, citizens generally will suffer serious inconvenience from the great reduction in the supply, while those residing in the higher parts of the city and suburbs will be entirely deprived of water, as the constant discharge by unnecessary waste renders supply at high levels practically impossible.

Under these circumstances, the Board has no alternative but strictly to enforce the operation of the 11th bye-law, which provides a penalty of Five pounds in cases where water is allowed to run to waste.

The provisions of the Public Works Statute will also be rigidly carried out; every person using the water for irrigation without permission, and without affixing a meter, will be prosecuted. The service pipe will likewise be cut off, without notice, in all instances where water is wasted, misused, or unduly consumed.

The Board earnestly trusts that the public generally will assist the police and the officers of the department in abating an evil which causes such serious inconvenience to so large a number of citizens.

BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

BYE-LAWS.

GEOLONG WATER SUPPLY.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of, the powers and authorities conferred on such board by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, make the Bye-laws following:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the board, that is to say:—

- i. On every house or tenement of £10 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.
- ii. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10 and not exceeding £100, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- iii. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £100 and not exceeding £300, a rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- iv. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £300 and not exceeding £500, a rate of Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- v. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £500, a rate of Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- vi. Warehouses and stores not being domiciles shall be subject to a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- vii. Water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each.
- viii. For water supplied by the board by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the board, at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons.
- ix. The rates to be charged for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Two pence per hundred gallons.
- x. Horses will be charged for at the rate of seven shillings and sixpence each, per annum.
- xi. Water for steam boilers will be charged for at the rate of fifteen shillings per horse-power per annum.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be (1), if for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity of which the charge at 1s. per 1000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure; and (2) if for other than domestic purposes only, 25,000 gallons per quarter. Syphon-pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

3. Any person receiving water from the board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the board, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the board, he shall obtain from the board a license in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

6. Before any such license shall be granted by the board the person applying for same shall satisfy the board that he is a competent plumber.

7. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the board, without giving two days'

notice to the board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the board, without the permission in writing of the board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

8. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the board without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board. Wrought-iron piping of approved quality and lead-piping of the following weights only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:—

No service of a larger bore than $\frac{1}{2}$ inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the board.

9. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the board may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

10. Any person supplied with water by the board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

11. If any meter should cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

12. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

13. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering (1,000,000) one million gallons.

14. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

15. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

16. If any person supplied with water by the board does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the board may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

17. The streets shall not be watered from hydrants or fire-plugs by means of a hose, but the water is to be applied to the streets by carts, or by manual labor, or by special stand-pipes of approved size and form.

18. The water supplied in the above district shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the same regulations, and not otherwise.

19. In the construction of these bye-laws the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "board" shall mean the Board of Land and Works.

The foregoing bye-laws were made and passed by the Board of Land and Works, and the Seal of the said Board of Land and Works was hereunto affixed the eleventh day of December 1873, in the presence of

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PENSHURST PUBLIC PARK.

WHEREAS by section 108 of the *The Land Act 1869*, it is among other things enacted that the Board of Land and Works shall have power from time to time to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves: Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the Rules and Regulations following to be observed and enforced in respect of the Penhurst Public Park:—

No. 1. The management of the park shall be under the local supervision of the Council of the Shire of Mount Rouse.

No. 2. The park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

No. 3. No person shall be permitted to enter or remain in the park who offends against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.

No. 4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the park; nor shall any one be permitted to light fires in the park, or smoke when walking off the paths therein.

No. 5. No person shall be allowed to climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, seats, or trees, or to roll or throw stones in the park.

No. 6. No person shall be allowed to put in the park any goats or pigs, or to bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord.

No. 7. No person shall be allowed to erect any dwelling in the park nor any booth or other erection for the purpose of offering for sale any article.

No. 8. No person except the gardeners or other servants employed in the park shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the park for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

No. 9. No cattle of any description shall be allowed to graze in the park, except such sheep for which the agistment in the park has been let by the council by public tender only, subject to the condition that such agistment shall not interfere with the right of the public to the free use of the park.

The rent derived from such agistment shall be spent solely on the improvement of the park.

Offenders against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1863*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

- 1st. All charges must be paid to the treasurer when orders are given, or before the grave or vault is opened.
- 2nd. Orders for interment must be given to the secretary of the cemetery between the hours of Ten a.m. and five p.m. of the day previous to the interment.
- 3rd. The certificate of the registration of death must be produced at the time of applying for the order of burial.
- 4th. The procession must arrive at the cemetery punctually, at the hour appointed.
- 5th. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive; and from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. throughout the rest of the year.
- 6th. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person, on evidence being produced before two of the trustees that the relations or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges.
- 7th. Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying, on payment of the proper charges.
- 8th. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
- 9th. Every coffin in a brick grave or vault to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
- 10th. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument, epitaph, or inscription must be submitted to the trustees for their approval; in the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
- 11th. Wooden fences allowed; but, if not kept in proper repair, may be removed by order of the trustees, after notice to the owner.
- 12th. A plan of the cemetery, and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected.
- 13th. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of, the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
- 14th. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanour; and, being convicted, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the Cemeteries Statute.
- 15th. No dogs will be allowed in the cemetery.
- 16th. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations or charges.
- 17th. No grave to be of less depth than six feet.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE CEMETERY ON 10TH OCTOBER 1873.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. By the Cemetery's Statute, any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives for ever.
3. Applications for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.
4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on a certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
5. Orders for interment to be given to the secretary, at the office of the trustees; such notice to be given between the hours of Ten a.m. and Four p.m. the previous day.
6. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of a surveyor appointed by the trustees, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
7. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
8. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
9. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive; and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months.
10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones, to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
12. A plan or drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, monument or tablet proposed to be erected, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 8th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
13. No catacombs or any wooden fencing allowed without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees.
14. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
15. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.
16. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected, and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.
17. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against as directed by the Statute.
18. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these rules, regulations, and charges.
