MINT CHARGES.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the following charges for the receipt and coinage of gold at the Melbourne branch of the Royal Mint, in lieu of those fixed by the Order in Council of 12th June 1872.

These charges to take effect from and after the 31st December 1873:—

1. On parcels containing less than one thousand ounces standard at the rate of Five pence per ounce (standard).
2. On undivided parcels containing not less than one thousand ounces standard (to be melted and assayed in one lot), at the rate of Three pence per ounce (standard).

All fine silver over and above two per cent. (instead of only that in excess of four per cent. as fixed by Order in Council of 12th June 1872) contained in refinable gold will be paid for at the rate of Five shillings per ounce.

The charge for issue of gold bullion (regulation 4 of 12th June 1872) will remain unaltered.

ADDITIONAL LOCAL SIGNALS FOR THE PORT OF WANGANUI.

A SHIFTING beacon has been erected on the North Head, seaward of signal mast; this beacon bears a red flag by day, and a red light at night, when the tide serves and the bar is safe.

Masters of vessels crossing the bar by day should keep the beacon and signal mast in one, and also pay particular attention to the semaphore arm, on account of the curves taken by the channel inside the bar.

Masters of vessels crossing the bar at night should keep the red light on the beacon in one with the bright light on the signal mast, and pay particular attention to the green light, which will be used like the semaphore arm for guiding vessels through the channel inside the bar. This green light travels on a yard under the red light, and vessels must be steered in the direction in which the green light is moved.

Masters of vessels should, on arriving off the bar at night, burn flash or blue lights, to make their positions known to the look-out at the Pilot Station, who will answer this signal with a torch or flare-up light.

Sailing vessels should not attempt to cross the Bar at night, as the wind generally dies away or draws off the land.

These signals will be used on and after the 1st January 1874.

WASTE OF YAN YEAN WATER.

THE Board of Land and Works begs to direct attention to the urgent necessity that exists for checking Waste of Yan Yeau Water.

The loss of pressure occasioned by this waste during the summer months is greater than the main pipe is able to afford, and, unless stringent means are used to restrict it, citizens generally will suffer serious inconvenience from the great reduction in the supply, while those residing in the higher parts of the city and suburbs will be entirely deprived of water, as the constant discharge by unnecessary waste renders supply at high levels practically impossible.

Under these circumstances, the Board has no alternative but strictly to enforce the operation of the 11th bye-law, which provides a penalty of Five pounds in cases where water is allowed to run to waste.

The provisions of the Public Works Statute will also be rigidly carried out; every person using the water for irrigation without permission, and without affixing a meter, will be prosecuted. The service pipe will likewise be cut off, without notice, in all instances where water is wasted, misused, or unduly consumed.

The Board earnestly trusts that the public generally will assist the police and the officers of the department in abating an evil which causes such serious inconvenience to so large a number of citizens.

DISTRICTS WHERE CERTIFICATES MAY BE GRANTED FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES CHARGEABLE WITH FEE OF £10.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district, to proclaim any part of such shire or road district, to be defined by such council, and not being in or within one mile of any city or town, a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid, for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may, if he shall think fit, proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the respective districts hereinafter mentioned to be districts within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—

The whole of the Indigo United Road District (save and excepting those portions of the said district which are situated within a radius of one mile from the Post and Telegraph Office at Chiltern, and from the Bridge over the Indigo Creek at Barnawatha, respectively) shall be a district within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds.

The West Riding of the Shire of Minhamite shall be a district within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds.

The deaths in November exceeded those in October by 24. They also exceeded the average of November during the previous ten years by 100, but if allowance be made for the increase of population during the decenniad, they will be found to have been less than the average of November by 35.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 84° on the 4th, and the lowest was 42° on the 12th. The mean temperature of the month (57.7°) was about 3 degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (37.2°) was on the 4th, viz., from a maximum of 84° to a minimum of 46°. The least range (7.5°) was on the 5th, viz., from a maximum of 62.8° to a minimum of 55°. The mean daily range was 18.9°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.919 inches) was slightly above the average.

Fifty-seven per cent. of the deaths were of males and 43 per cent. were of females. Forty-two per cent. were of children under five years of age, as against 48 per cent. in November 1872, 42 per cent. in November 1871, 48 per cent. in November 1870, 47 per cent. in November 1869, 49 per cent. in November 1868, 45 per cent. in November 1867, 60 per cent. in November 1866, 60 per cent. in November 1865, 43 per cent. in November 1864, and 47 per cent. in November 1863.

Fifteen persons of 75 years of age and upwards died during the month, viz.:—A female aged 84 of diarrhoea, a female aged 88 of old age and diarrhoea, a female of 75 and a sawyer aged 91 of apoplexy, a laborer aged 76 of heart disease, a male aged 80 of cerebral congestion and paralysis, a male aged 78 of enteritis, a male aged 85, a female housekeeper aged 85, two females aged respectively 80 and 78, a male teacher aged 78, a stock-rider aged 88, and a laborer aged 80 of old age and debility, a female aged 85 of fracture of the femur.

Twenty-one violent deaths occurred during the month, of which 15 were set down to accident or negligence and 6 to suicide. The particulars of them are as follow:—A lad aged 10, died of fracture of the spine, caused by falling from a tree; a carter aged 26, of tetanus, caused by injury to the head occasioned by the wheel of a lorry; a male aged 43, was killed by a dray wheel passing over him; a contractor aged 44, by the wheel of a railway carriage passing over him; a female aged 85, died of intracapsular fracture of the femur; an able seaman aged 26, was poisoned with laudanum taken in mistake for rum; a male aged 40, was poisoned by taking a dose of liniment in mistake; a boy aged 5, a cowherd aged 16, a domestic servant aged 17, and a coal-trimmer aged 23, were drowned; and a female infant 13 weeks old was suffocated in bed. The suicides were those of a female aged 64, who drowned herself, and a clerk aged 45, who poisoned himself; also, of a male aged 42, and a dealer

Seventy-nine deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole number, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Melbourne Hospital, 46; Alfred Hospital, 7; Benevolent Asylum, 7; Lying-in Hospital, 3; Immigrants' Home, 3; Gaol, 1; Yarra Bend Asylum, 9; Metropolitan Asylum, 3.

The deaths of children under 5 years of age numbered 157, of which 91, or 58 per cent., were of males, and 66, or 42 per cent., of females. Of those who died, 113 were under one year of age, 23 were between one and two years, 10 were between two and three years, 4 were between three and four years, and 7 were between four and five years.

The persons dying at a more advanced age numbered 221, of whom 123, or 56 per cent., were males, and 98, or 44 per cent., were females; 12 were between five and ten, 13 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 11 were between twenty and twenty-five, 19 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty-five, 14 were between thirty-five and forty, 32 were between forty and forty-five, 15 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 11 were between fifty-five and sixty, 11 were between sixty and sixty-five, 7 were between sixty-five and seventy, 9 were between seventy and seventy-five, 5 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 10 were eighty years old and upwards.

VICTORIAN WATER SUPPLY.

BYE-LAWS.

SANDHURST DISTRICT.

THE Board of Land and Works has made the following Bye-laws with respect to service-pipes to be used in connection with the water works in the above district belonging to the Board:—

1. Any owner or occupier of any premises within the above-mentioned district who shall wish to have water from the waterworks brought into his premises, and who shall have paid or tendered to the board the portion of water-rate in respect of such premises which the board may require to be paid in advance, may open the street, road, and ground between the pipes of the board and his premises, having first obtained the consent of the Council of the Borough, or Shire, or Road Board, as the case may be, to whom the management or care of such street or road belongs, or in whom the fee-simple thereof is vested, and of the owners and occupiers of such ground, and lay any leaden or iron pipe from such premises to communicate with the pipes of the board. Every pipe so to be laid shall be subject to the approval of some officer of the board.

2. Before any pipe is made to communicate with the pipes of the board, the person intending to lay such pipe shall give two days' notice to the board of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the board, and every such pipe shall be so made to communicate under the superintendence and according to the directions of the surveyor or other officer appointed for that purpose by the board.

3. Wrought-iron piping of approved quality, and lead piping of the following weights only, will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:—

No service for domestic supply of a larger bore than half-inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the board.

4. Every person who shall have agreed with the board for a supply of water by measure shall at his own expense provide a meter and keep and maintain the same in good working condition, to the satisfaction of such officer as may be appointed by the board; and in the event of any repairs being required, notice (in writing) shall be immediately given by such person to the board, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such repairs are effected.

5. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering (1,000,000) one million gallons.

6. Every person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give six days' notice in writing to that effect to the board, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.

7. If any person refuse or delay to have such meter properly repaired and put in correct working order after having been required by any officer of the board so to do, or if any person shall neglect to pay the water rates after due notice, the board may shut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the service pipe or otherwise until such meter shall have been properly repaired and certified by some officer of the board as being in proper working order, or until such rates are paid.

8. No plumber or other person shall fix or refix any meter upon any premises supplied with water by the board without having first obtained a certificate from the board that the said meter has been examined and found in correct working condition.

9. The officers of the board may enter any house, buildings, or lands to or into which water is supplied by the board by measure, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed.

The foregoing bye-laws were made and passed by the Board of Land and Works, and the Seal of the said Board of Land and Works was hereunto affixed the twenty-ninth day of December 1873, in the presence of

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Seab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:

Pursuant to Order of 28 April 1873.

BRENNAN QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—(including Brennan and Cooyma Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

BYE-LAW No. 1.—RELATING TO THE MODE OF CONDUCTING THE BUSINESS AT MEETINGS OF THIS COUNCIL.

Bye-law of the Council of the Shire of Eltham, made under Part 12 of the Shires Statute.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part 12 of *The Shires Statute*, the Council of the Shire of Eltham ordain as follows, that is to say:—

1st. The order of business at ordinary meetings shall be as follows:—

- (1.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of preceding meeting.
- (2.) Reading of correspondence—including copies of letters sent—and ordering thereon.
- (3.) Reading and consideration of reports.
- (4.) Presentation of petitions and memorials.
- (5.) Reception of deputations.
- (6.) Opening tenders and deciding thereon.
- (7.) Payments.

(8.) Ordinary business—including any postponed from previous meeting.

(9.) Consideration of motions of which notice has been given.

(10.) Notices of motion.

(11.) Postponed business.

(12.) Other business not requiring notice of motion.

2nd. No discussion shall take place upon any minutes except as to their accuracy, and upon such minutes being declared correct they shall at once be signed.

3rd. Upon the application of one or more councillors, the consideration of any document shall be postponed until after the disposal of "Notices of Motion."

4th. Any memorial or petition addressed to the council shall be presented by a councillor, who shall attach his name to the document and be responsible for its being respectfully worded, and no debate shall take place thereon, except as to its being received, until notice has been given as herein provided.

5th. No deputation shall be received unless introduced by a councillor, nor unless three days' notice at least of their intention, together with a statement of the object of the desired interview, has been given to the secretary.

6th. No motion shall be discussed or decided on at any meeting unless notice thereof shall have been given at a previous meeting.

7. No motion having for its object the execution of any public work the estimated cost of which exceeds £10 shall be considered until a report has been furnished by the surveyor as to the necessity for, and the probable cost of, such work.

8th. A motion may be superseded by an amendment being carried that the council proceed to the next business.

9th. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote unless it be seconded.

10th. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled, as the mover of a resolution, to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood, but any councillor may speak once also upon each amendment.

11th. One amendment only shall be discussed at a time, and when carried shall be considered a substantive motion, upon which a further amendment may be proposed, but the rejection of an amendment shall not preclude another from being made.

12th. Every councillor shall stand whilst addressing the council.

13th. Should two or more councillors rise at the same time, the president shall decide the order in which they shall be heard.

14th. The councillors shall, at meetings, designate each other by their official title.

15th. Points of order shall be settled by the president, whose decision shall be final.

16th. The amendment shall be put first and then the original motion.

17th. Any councillor using any expression or being guilty of any conduct capable of being applied offensively to any other member, shall, on being required to do so, make a satisfactory apology to the council, and for neglecting to do so before the rising of the council shall be considered guilty of an offence; and every person, not being a councillor, who shall at any meeting of the council, be guilty of interrupting the proceedings, or of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who on being directed, on account of his misbehaviour, to leave the room, shall decline to comply with such order, shall likewise be deemed guilty of an offence.

18th. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and such protest shall be given in, in writing, to the secretary, at least one week previous to the next meeting of the council, and shall specify the reasons for protesting, and the same shall be entered on the minute-book.

19th. The secretary shall have the custody of the common seal of the council, and shall verify each impression thereof with his signature.

20th. Any one or more of the preceding standing orders may, in case of emergency, be suspended for a special purpose, provided that there be no more than one dissentient.

21st. If any person be guilty of any offence specified in this bye-law, he shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5.
