## PART I. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such proclamation; and upon any such proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend all of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to the town hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

## THE TOWN OF MANSFIELD.

## STACKS MALICIOUSLY BURNT AT MAFFRA.

## EIGHTY POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS about midnight of Monday the 2nd of February last two stacks of Barley, two stacks of Wheat, and one stack of Oats, the property of three different individuals, were destroyed by fire at Upper Maffra. The deaths in January exceeded those in December by 32. They also exceeded the average of the month in the previous ten years by 118. If allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of January by 15.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 99.9° on the 2nd, and the lowest 49.8° on the 22nd. The mean temperature of the month (65.7°) was 2 of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer (47.1°) in any one day took place on the 2nd, viz., from a maximum of 99.9° to a minimum of 52.8°. The least range (19.8°) was on the 12th, viz., from a maximum of 75.0° to a minimum of 64.2°. The mean daily range was 21.6°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.942 inches) was slightly above the average.

Males contributed 52.5 per cent., and females 47.5 per cent. to the total mortality; children under five years of age contributed 57.5 per cent. to that mortality. In January 1873 the proportion of children under five to the total was 49 per cent.; in January 1872 it was 56 per cent.; in January 1871 it was 57 per cent.; in January 1870 it was 58 per cent.; in January 1869 it was 58 per cent.; in January 1868 it was 62 per cent.; in January 1867 it was 75 per cent.; in January 1866 it was 65½ per cent.; in January 1865, it was 65 per cent.; in January-1864 it was 64 per cent., and in January 1863 it was 64 per cent.

Twelve deaths of persons of 75 years of age and upwards occurred during the month, viz., those of a coachman aged 76 of old age; of a civil engineer aged 78 of chronic diarrhoea; of a contractor, aged 80, of enlargement of the prostate gland; of an office-keeper aged 66 of colitis; of a laborer aged 80 of fever and debility; of a laborer aged 80 of old age; and of six females, one aged 75 of cancer in the stomach, one aged 77 of pleurisy, one aged 78 of dysentery, one aged 80 and one aged 85 of old age, and one aged 84 of gangrena senilis.

The number of violent deaths which took place during the month was 22; of these, 20 were set down to accident or negligence and 2 to suicide. The particulars of the accidental deaths were, as follow:—A boy aged 13 died of injuries received by running against a telegraph post; a lad aged 16 died of fracture of the pelvis; a laborer aged 41 died of fracture of the skull, caused by a tree falling on him; a carpenter aged 63 died of fracture of the leg, resulting from a fall from a loft; a male child aged 2½ died of burns caused by playing with matches; a male child aged 13 months died of a scald from hot coffee. Five persons died of sunstroke or the effects of heat, viz., a miner aged 40, a clerk aged 72, a girl aged 12, a boy aged 2, and a male infant aged 3 days; a bootmaker aged 63 died of opium poisoning. Eight persons died of drowning, namely, a female child aged 15 months, a boy aged 2, two boys each aged 9, a boy aged 11, a miner aged 30 whilst endeavoring to save a woman who was in the water, a man aged 42, and a female aged 16. The suicidal deaths were thus reported:—A telegraphic operator aged 32 poisoned himself with prussic acid, and a female aged 33 strangled herself whilst of unsound mind.

Eighty-five deaths, or 16 per cent. of the total number, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Melbourne Hospital, 47; Alfred Hospital, 5; Lying-in Hospital, 4; Benevolent Asylum, 3; Immigrants' Home, 9; Yarra Bend Asylum, 2; Metropolitan Asylum, 8; Industrial Schools, 5; Pentridge Stockade, 2.

The deaths of children under 5 years of age numbered 307, of which 138, or 45 per cent., were of males; 168, or 55 per cent., were of females; and 1 was of sex unspecified. Of those who died, 212 were under one year of age, 32 were between one and two, 11 were between two and three, 13 were between three and four, 8 were between four and five, and 1 was of age unknown.

The persons dying above the age of five years numbered 227, of which 142, or 63 per cent., were males; 85, or 37 per cent., were females. Twenty were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 6 were between fifteen and twenty, 11 were between twenty and twenty-five, 17 were between twenty-five and thirty, 14 were between thirty and thirty-five, 19 were between thirty-five and forty, 27 were between forty and forty-five, 30 were between forty-five and fifty, 19 were between fifty and fifty-five, 13 were between fifty-five and sixty, 11 were between sixty and sixty-five, 15 were between sixty-five and seventy, 12 were between seventy and seventy-five, 6 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 6 were eighty years old and upwards.
