## ROLL OF ELECTORS DECLARED VALID.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-first day of April 1874.

**W**HEREAS by *The Electoral Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission shall have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any general roll or supplementary roll or ordinary electoral roll or roll of rate-paying electors, the Governor in Council may take all such measures as may be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or may declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission; and every such Order in Council shall state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and shall be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas through an accident in transcribing the Roll of Rate-paying Electors for the St. Patrick's Division of the District of West Melbourne, the name of William Castles Lightbody was erroneously printed in the said Roll in lieu of the name of Alexander Lilley, and the Governor-in-Council has ordered the name William Castles Lightbody to be removed from the said Roll, and the name Alexander Lilley to be substituted therefor: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power in him vested by the 68th section of the Act No. 279, doth hereby declare valid the Roll of Electors for the St. Patrick's division of the Electoral District of West Melbourne rectified as aforesaid.

NOTICE TO INTENDING CANDIDATES FOR CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY UNDER "THE SHIRES STATUTE" AND "BOROUGH'S STATUTE" 1869.

An Examination of Candidates for certificates of competency as Engineers and Surveyors of Land and Works will be held, at a place to be notified in the *Argus*, at Ten o'clock on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th days of June next.

Candidates are requested to be in the examination room punctually at the hour named each day.

All candidates must forward, before the 22nd May next, to the Secretary to the Board of Examiners, at the offices of Railways and Roads, Spencer street, notice in writing of intention to present themselves for examination, giving address and name in full, and at the same time enclosing the sum of (£2 2s.) Two guineas with articles of indenture and certificates (if any) that they may possess from properly constituted bodies of examiners.

If a candidate presents himself more than twice and is successful at the third or any subsequent examination, the last fee will be returned.

Gentlemen holding the B certificate may present themselves at any examination for the purpose of obtaining the A certificate, without further payment, but notice of not less than two weeks will be necessary.

Candidates are requested to provide themselves with drawing instruments and scales.

No candidate will be admitted for examination unless the above conditions are complied with.

The fees will be paid by the secretary into the consolidated revenue.

The Board issues two classes of certificate, A and B, both of which qualify for an appointment; but a first-class certificate (A) is evidence that the grantee has passed with credit.

The following are the subjects in which candidates will be examined:—

1. Field-work and Topography.—Use and adjustment of instruments.
2. Construction and Maintenance of Roads, including principles and practice.
3. Substructures.—General principles and practice in relation to various materials.
4. Collection and Distribution of Water, including general principles and practice.
