### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 334), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, acting upon the complaint of the Council of the Shire of Gardiner, and pursuant to an Order in Council bearing even date herewith, do hereby proclaim the portion of the Boundary road, extending from its junction with the Gardiner's Creek road southwards to its intersection with the Malvern road; thence eastwards for a distance of five miles from the point of commencement, to be a Common-tolls road of the said Shire of Gardiner, the City of Melbourne, the Town of Prahran, and of the Boroughs of Saint Kilda and Brighton, and of the Shire of Caulfield.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add the Crown lands hereinafter described to a Common in accordance with the provisions of the above recited Act, that is to say:—

NORTH AND SOUTH WOORAGEE FARMERS' COMMON.—The North and South Wooragee Farmers' Common, proclaimed by Order of the 20th July 1863, and extended by Order of the

28th September 1873, is hereby further increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries described as follows, viz.:—Commencing at the north angle of allotment 8 of section K, parish of Wooragee; thence by William Davie's 19th section block, No. 3348, to the east angle thereof; thence by a line bearing N. 56° 23' E. about thirty chains to the summit of a range; thence by that range northerly to a point bearing N. 87° 10' E. from the south-eastern angle of the parish of South Barnawartha; thence by a line and the said parish boundary to a point bearing N. 9° 50' W. from the north-east angle of allotment 1 of section N, parish of North Wooragee; and thence by the north-eastern boundaries of sections N and K south-easterly to the point of commencement. Area of extension about 1100 acres.—(74.N.1178.)

Bear and Ford's estate, being the Tabik pre-emptive right, and allotments 31, 32, 33, 34, and 51, all in the parish of Tabik; also Mr. Thomas Blaney's farm "Lissennelly," being allotments 2A and B, section F, and allotments 3A and B, section F, parish of Avenel; also Mr. George Morrison's farm "Craigielee," being allotment 7, section D, 8 B section D, 4 A section E, 3 A section E, 8 section E, parish of Avenel; also Mr. James Morrison's farm "Woodburn," being allotment 12, section E, parish of Avenel; also Mr. Thomas Blaney's farm "Goulburn Grove," being allotments 25 and 26, parish of Tabik; also Mr. Thomas Frederick Griffith's farm "Melrose," being allotment 11, parish of Avenel, together with allotments 9 and 31, parish of Mangalore, shall form no part of said quarantine district.

**CLEAN DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."**

IN pursuance of the 66th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Clean Districts hereinafter mentioned and has ordered that the portions of Victoria hereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined shall be Clean Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE SUPERVISION OF WORKROOMS AND FACTORIES STATUTE."

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the subjoined Regulations.

THE Central Board of Health, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by section No. 4 of the Act of the Parliament of Victoria No. 466, do hereby make the following regulations respecting factories or workrooms, viz.:

1. *Space*.—No workroom shall at any time have employed therein a greater number of persons than one person for every five hundred (500) cubic feet of space in such workroom.

2. *Warmth*.—Every workroom shall be provided with means and appliances for efficiently warming the same.

3. *Ventilation*.—Every workroom shall, independently of any doors, windows, or fireplaces therein, be provided with means for ventilation by openings for the inlet and outlet of air, in the proportion of not less than twelve square inches of inlet openings and twelve square inches of outlet openings for each person employed in such workroom, such space to be calculated exclusive of all bars, ornamentation, or other obstruction thereto. Such inlet openings shall be provided either in the upper portion of the windows, by means of fixed louvres, or in the walls at a height of, as nearly as may be practicable, seven feet from the floor level of such room; and such outlet openings shall be provided either in the walls of such room as close to the ceiling thereof as may be practicable, or else in the ceiling, and in the latter case there shall be connected with each such opening an open tube or shaft of equal superficial area with that of the clear space of such opening leading through and above the roof of the building, and having its

upper end terminating in a louvred lantern or other similar contrivance. All inlet and outlet ventilation openings shall be at all times kept clear of any obstruction, and free from accumulations of dust or dirt.

4. *Cleanliness*.—Every factory or workroom shall be provided with properly appointed lavatories, sufficient in number to provide the means of free ablutition for the persons employed therein; and where persons of both sexes are employed, separate lavatories shall be provided for the persons of each sex.

5. *Sanitary requirements*.—Every factory or workroom shall be provided with proper privy or closet and urinal accommodation in the proportion of one separate privy, or closet for every twenty persons employed therein, and where persons of different sexes are employed such privy or closet accommodation and such urinals shall be distinctly separate for the persons of each sex. All privies or closets and urinals shall at all times be kept clean and in an inoffensive condition.

This license shall not be deemed to prevent the land comprised therein or any part or parts thereof from being sold, leased, or licensed under any of the provisions of parts I., II., or III. of *The Land Act 1869*, except subdivision vii. of the 47th section thereof, or proclaimed a common, or occupied by virtue of any miner's right or business license, or alienated or dealt with under the authority of *The Land Act 1869*, or any other Act now or hereafter to be in force, otherwise than for pastoral or depasturing purposes, or resumed by order of the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, for railways, roads, telegraph lines, dams, reservoirs, races, catch-water drains, pipe tracks, quarries, or other public purposes; and no licensee shall in any such case be entitled to compensation other than the return of such portion of the fee paid by him as the Minister may think fit.

2. If the licensee or any person claiming an interest through or under the licensee in the land comprised in this license, shall, at any time during the period for which the license has been issued, employ any person to apply for a license of an allotment under *The Land Act 1869*, contrary to the true intent of the provisions thereof, or shall make or cause to be made any agreement or contract, or shall give or take, or cause to be given or taken, any negotiable security for the purpose of defeating or evading the provisions of, or shall in any way whatsoever, directly or indirectly, commit or be privy to a fraud upon the said Act, this license shall be void.

3. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this license, and no land temporarily or permanently reserved, shall be deemed within the operations of this license.

4.
