THE subjoined Rule of the Supreme Court of Victoria, having been duly laid before Parliament, is now published in compliance with the requirements of the 32nd section of the Act 15 Vict., No. 10.

REGULA GENERALIS.

WHEREAS it is expedient to repeal the Rule of the said Court passed on the third day of December 1872, being No. 18 of chapter II, and to substitute another rule instead thereof.

It is therefore ordered as follows:—

18. *Candidates not previously admitted.*—Every person, except as hereinafter provided, must, before he enter into articles in the colony of Victoria, produce to the Board of Examiners for Attorneys a certificate of his having passed at a matriculation examination in the University of Melbourne in six, at least, of the subjects fixed for the time being by statutes and regulations of the said university for the matriculation examination, of which subjects Latin must be one, and must lodge, with the said board, a copy of such certificate. And must also, after he has entered into his articles of clerkship, pass two other examinations with an interval of at least one academic year between each. The first of such examinations to be in "History of the British Empire" and "The Laws of Obligations," as prescribed respectively for the second and third examinations for the Degree of Bachelor of Laws of the said University. The second of such examinations to be in "Constitutional Law" and "The Law of Property," as prescribed for the third examination for such degree. Provided that if any such person shall produce to the said Board of Examiners of the Supreme Court for Attorneys a certificate of his having passed at a matriculation examination in any university recognized by the University of Melbourne, or of his having passed the preliminary or any intermediate examination which clerks articulated in England, Scotland, or Ireland may be required to pass, and lodge with the board a copy thereof, it shall not be necessary for him to submit to such examination as aforesaid. Provided also that every articulated clerk who may have passed any examination under the rule hereby repealed shall have credit for the same, and if it shall be necessary for him to pass any other examination in the university he shall pass the same in subjects named as those for the second examination under this rule.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Statute 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the Courts of General Sessions of the Peace at the undermentioned places to be holden on the days hereinafter mentioned, for and in lieu of the days appointed by a former Proclamation for the holding of the said courts, that is to say:—

At Hamilton, on Wednesday the ninth day of September next, instead of Tuesday the eighth day of the said month.

At Ararat, on Monday the fourteenth day of September next, instead of Tuesday the fifteenth day of the same month; and on Tuesday the eighth day of December next, instead of Saturday the twelfth day of the same month.

At Stawell, on Tuesday the fifteenth day of September next, instead of Thursday the seventeenth day of the same month; and on Wednesday the ninth day of December next, instead of Tuesday the fifteenth day of the same month.

At Warrnambool, on Wednesday the twenty-fifth day of November next, instead of Tuesday the twenty-fourth day of the said month.

At Geelong, on Tuesday the fifteenth day of December next, instead of Tuesday the eighth day of the said month.

At Ballarat, on Friday the twenty-fifth day of September next, instead of Friday the eleventh day of the same month; and on Tuesday the fifteenth day of December next, instead of Tuesday the eighth day of the same month.

Dunn and Hope's quarantine farms, near Clunes, I have not yet seen, but will visit and report upon them immediately. During the quarter no sheep have been released from quarantine, and no sheep have been placed in quarantine.

BRENANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Brenanah and Coyora Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glensalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingover run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1869 it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor may by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as are permanently reserved around any lakes, lagoons, rivers, creeks, bays, or fronting the Southern (Ocean or Bass Straits, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers or any of them conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act.

NOTICE PURSUANT TO SEC. 139 OF "THE FRIENDLY SOCIETIES STATUTE 1865."

To Mrs. ISABELLA NASH, Secretary of the Independent Order of Shepherdeses, Station Hotham No. 1.

TAKE notice that the transcripts of rules lodged with me on or about the 1st of June instant, and signed by yourself, Jessy Carlyle, Adelaide Goslin, and Jane Cormack, are inconsistent with *The Friendly Societies Statute* 1865 and the laws in force in Victoria, in the following particulars:—

1. That the objects of the society are stated to be, among other things, "the establishment of a fund for supplying books, stationery, and such articles as may be necessary for the management of the society and paying the expenses of such management, also for the mutual improvement and amusement of its members," some of which objects are among the purposes for which a society may be established under the Statute as enumerated in the 4th section thereof.
2. That the objects of the society are stated to be, among other things, the establishment of a fund for the interment of its deceased members without any reference to the restrictions contained in the 21st section of the Statute.
3. The rules do not specify any place as the "place of business of the society."
4. The rules do not provide any mode of appointing a committee of management.
5. The provisions for appointing and removing officers of the society and filling up offices, and for making new rules and altering or repealing existing rules, are insufficient and obscure.
6. There is no provision as to the number of shares to be held by any one member.
7. There is no provision for the publication of a general balance of the assets and liabilities at least once a year.
8. The species of security to be given by the secretary and treasurer is not specified.
9. There is no provision for winding-up the affairs of the society and dissolving the same, and distributing the assets thereof.
10. The rules are throughout obscure and inconsistent, and in particular the words "station," "society," and "order," are used without its appearing whether they are intended to have the same or different meanings. And the same is the case with the words "member" and "sister." There is no explanation of the phrase "financial member" at all. It is provided that the treasurer is not to hold in her hands more than £20 of the station money without providing what she is to do with the surplus. It is also provided that trustees should in certain events be expelled, while a trustee cannot consistently with the rules be a member of the society.

And take further notice that, unless amended rules are submitted to me, complying with the requirements of the Act, within fourteen days after the receipt by you of this notice, I shall cause a copy thereof to be published in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, as directed by the 13th section of the said Statute.
