# AID TO BUILDING FUND OF FREE LIBRARIES, 1874-5.

APPLICATION for a share in the sum of £2000 granted by the Legislature in Aid of the Building Fund of Free Libraries will be received at this office until the 15th September next.

No grant to any library is to exceed £500, nor is any grant to be made to any institution in Melbourne.

N.B.—To entitle any institution to share in this Grant, such institution must be *bona fide* a free library, that is, a library open to the public daily free of charge, as is the case with the Melbourne Public Library.

The following particulars must be furnished, viz. :—

1. The name of the institution, which should clearly indicate that it is a Free Library.
2. The amount expended in the erection or purchase of the building, and the materials of which it is constructed, with particulars of any further proposed expenditure thereon.
3. The amount already contributed by the Government, specifying the way.
4. The amount locally subscribed, distinguishing between the sums subscribed before and since the last return.
5. Whether the land is the property of the institution, and whether granted by the Crown or purchased.
6. The number of books.
7. The number of visitors during 1874 to 31st July.

## PURCHASE OF RE-MOUNTS FOR THE BENGAL ARMY.

THE subjoined notice, regarding the purchase of re-mounts required for the Bengal army, is published at the instance of the Government of India.

### NOTICE.

In continuation of the notification by the Government of India, Calcutta, dated 4th February 1873, notice is hereby given that re-mount agents or committees at the several stations noted in the margin, are prepared to purchase about 1000 horses suitable for army purposes, during the current year and up to the 1st April 1876.

In 1875-76, 650 horses, more or less, will be bought.

Except under very exceptional circumstances, purchases will be made only between the 1st October and 1st April.

The requirements of subsequent years will be made known hereafter.

Horses of all breeds, Cape, Australian, Arab, Persian, country bred and northern, will be accepted if up to the required standard. Mares as well as horses will be taken, and if the former are of a good stamp, the preference will be given to them.

They must be within the prescribed ages, four to seven years. The standard price for Cavalry and Field Artillery remounts is 500 rupees—for Horse Artillery 600 rupees. Every horse presented for purchase will be separately valued, and in special cases higher prices than the standard price may be given; provided the average of the purchases does not exceed the above limits.

No exhibition of horses will be held in Calcutta in the ensuing cold season, but prizes for the best horses and mares for stud and army purposes will be awarded at several up-country stations, the details of which will be published shortly.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognised as a county, parish, or town, by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fourth day of March 1861, the town of Belvoir was amongst others defined and named: And whereas the locality in which the said town is situated is therein described as the parish of Belvoir: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the names of the said town and parish: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the nomenclature of the town and parish of Belvoir, and do hereby alter the names of the said town and parish and proclaim the altered names thereof to be as follow, that is to say:—

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make the following Bye-Law for fixing the Charges and Classification of Goods to be carried by the Railways vested in the Board, to take effect on and after the 7th September 1874.

In the following Goods Classification, the First, Second, Third, and Fourth Class mentioned are those severally referred to in the Goods Tariff, Class 1, 2, 3, 4, shown beneath.

N.B.—All goods are carried by dead weight of 2240 lbs. to the ton, except where otherwise specified on classification.

Less than a truck load to be charged as a full truck, or else at first-class rates.

Piles and logs, derrick cranes, and wind-mills, to be charged at sawn timber rates. Red gum, 25 cubic feet only to be allowed to the ton if rough or in log; if sawn, 30 feet.

All timber in lengths requiring 2 trucks to be charged 5 per cent. additional; 3 trucks, 10 per cent.; and 4 trucks, 15 per cent. additional. *This applies to all lines.*

Parcels containing articles and property of a description not mentioned or specified in the first section of the Act of the Parliament of Victoria numbered 78, such articles and property being over £10 in value, shall, in addition to the amount chargeable by the foregoing scale of rates, be charged a further sum equal to one per centum upon the declared value thereof.

Furniture and musical instruments shall be charged an amount for the same distance and weight equal to double the above scale of rates.

Packed parcels shall be charged an amount for the same distance and weight equal to four times the above scale.

Corpses will be charged for at the rate of 6d. per mile, subject, however, that the sum of £1 shall be the minimum charge in any case.

Parcels containing newspaper despatches will only be charged at one-half the above scale of rates, if the amount to be charged exceed 6d., and 6d. shall be the minimum charge for such parcels. Hat-boxes, empty, in nests, or containing hats, double rates. All parcels to be at the forwarding station fifteen minutes previous to the departure of the train for which they are intended.

The department will not be responsible for any damage accruing to parcels containing glass, when only packed in paper.

Upon the Special Conditions and at the Rates mentioned below.

The following charges are made, and the gold dust or coin will be carried on condition of its being in charge of owners or persons bringing the same, and at their risk, and that the Board of Land and Works will not be responsible for any loss or damage thereto, unless arising from gross negligence by the Board or their servants, or by reason of any defect and insufficiency in the carriage or truck provided by the Board.

## CARRIAGES.

Carriages, gigs, dog-carts, and vehicles of a similar description will be charged for at the rate of 6d. per mile, subject, however, that the sum of £1 shall be the minimum charge in any case. Two vehicles belonging to the same owner, and loaded on one truck, 9d. per truck per mile. Three vehicles on same terms, 1s. per truck per mile; minimum, Twenty shillings. For vehicles sent for repair, return tickets available for four weeks will be issued at 50 per cent. additional on these rates.

## EXCESS LUGGAGE IN CHARGE OF PASSENGERS.

First-class passengers are allowed to carry 84 lbs., second-class passengers 56 lbs., free of charge, the same to consist of personal luggage only; all excess above that weight will be charged at the "Excess Luggage" rates. All passengers having "Excess Luggage" must send it to the Booking-office fifteen minutes before the starting of the train, so as to give sufficient time to have it weighed and stowed. No luggage will be allowed to be placed in the carriages unless of such size that it can be placed under the seat without inconvenience to other passengers; but the department does not hold itself liable for the loss of luggage unless the same has been delivered to their servants, and placed in the guard's van.

Passengers must have their names, and the station to which they are proceeding, distinctly marked on their luggage, and satisfy themselves that it is placed on the trains.

## CLOAK ROOM CHARGES.

## PASSENGERS' LUGGAGE.

WHEREAS the luggage of passengers is often lost, misappropriated, or wrongly delivered from the want of any means of establishing the ownership thereof: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by the Public Works Statute, doth hereby make the following Bye-law for regulating the carriage of passengers' luggage upon railways vested in the said Board, that is to say—

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARRIAGE OF PASSENGERS' LUGGAGE.

1. On and after 1st September 1874 the department will not undertake any liability in respect to the loss, miscarriage, detention, or non-delivery of passengers' luggage, carried or to be carried by railway free or at excess rates, unless the owner thereof has complied with the following regulations:—
2. No parcels, boxes, carpet-bags, portmanteaus, or other packages or luggage shall be received or carried, free or at excess rates, at the risk of the department, unless 15 minutes before the time of starting the luggage has been delivered to the station porter; to be weighed, paid for, and labelled accordingly, if the luggage is in excess; also to be labelled to the passenger's destination, and that the person paying such excess rates may obtain a receipt for the same; or, if the luggage is carried free, that he may require from the said porter a numbered check or checks for the said luggage, one check for each parcel, according to the description of the checks here following; and the department will not be liable for any loss, detention, miscarriage, or damage through the neglect by passengers of these regulations, whether such neglect arise through insufficiency of time or other cause not attributable to the default of the department.
3. A luggage check complete, and when not in use, consists of a leather tie about half an inch broad and from 6 to 10 inches long with a slit at each end in which is fastened a disc or check of block-tin. Both checks are stamped with the same number. When in use the passenger is in possession of one of the checks, and the other is attached to his portmanteau or other free luggage, which will not be delivered except to the person giving up the check of the same number as that attached to the luggage.
4. Railway servants, on receiving luggage from passengers, will first ascertain and require payment for the excess weight, if any, attaching in such case to each parcel the "excess label," as also the yellow label, showing the destination, and hand at the same time to the passenger a receipt for the excess rates showing the total number of packages. If the luggage is carried free the porter receiving it will hand to the passenger a numbered check as before mentioned for each parcel. No check is required for excess luggage, nor is it to be issued for free luggage, until the yellow label showing the passenger's destination has been affixed; but from the time that the passenger obtains a receipt for excess rates or receives a check or checks for free luggage it is entirely at the risk of the department, and if carried free it is the duty of the porter to attach to each parcel a check correspondingly numbered. Finally, the station porter will see that the luggage thus labelled and checked is placed in the proper van in charge of the guard.
5. Luggage checked as above will be carried at the risk of the department to the place of destination, but it will devolve upon the passenger to claim it there and to prove the ownership by giving up the numbered check or checks for the same. The duplicate check or checks will then be detached from the luggage prior to delivery. Luggage put out of the van on to the platform will be delivered, if carried free, as checks are presented, and if carried at excess rates, upon the presentation of the receipt for the same. All luggage unclaimed will be held by the station-master and be forwarded to Melbourne if not claimed within one month.
6. After checks are issued for luggage about to be carried free no package or parcel is to be delivered, even temporarily, at any station to the owner thereof unless he has returned the check or checks for the same; and it is the duty of the porter, on delivering the said luggage, and after removing the checks therefrom, to fasten the two checks of the same number upon the leather tie, one at each end, as above mentioned, so that the check is complete and ready for future use.
7. No officer or servant of the department has authority to undertake any charge or responsibility in respect of luggage left temporarily at a station unless the same has been booked at cloak-room charges; or to place luggage in the van at the risk of the department, or to take any responsibility in respect of the same, unless it has been checked or paid for at excess rates as above mentioned.
8. These regulations do not apply to parcels taken by passengers with them in the carriage at their own risk. But no luggage will be allowed in the carriages unless of such a size that it can be placed under or over the seat without inconvenience to other passengers.
9. A supply of checks will be issued to each station, and all officers and servants using the same are enjoined to see that the two discs or checks of the same number for each fastening, are properly secured thereon when not in use. If luggage is delivered without the passenger giving up his disc, or without detaching the corresponding disc from the luggage, the check becomes incomplete and useless. For every disc lost 2s. 6d. will require to be paid by the officer or servant responsible for such loss.
10. For all purposes of ownership or delivery of luggage, free or at excess rates, the checks issued represent the parcels carried free, one check for each, and receipts for excess rates represent excess luggage; but both checks and receipts are transferable, and passengers are not bound to see in person after their luggage, either in paying for it, checking it before it is put in the van, or in obtaining delivery. Passengers may

do this through any person not an officer or servant of the department. But luggage will not be carried in the van at the risk of the department unless these regulations have been complied with, nor, except as hereinafter provided, will luggage be delivered unless the checks or receipts for excess rates are produced; but any person producing them will receive the luggage as and for the owner.

11. Any passenger losing his checks or receipt for excess rates, may be required, before he can obtain his luggage, to make a declaration to that effect, giving the numbers of the checks and a description of the luggage; also to guarantee the department against any loss or claim from wrong delivery. And should the evidence as to ownership appear to the department insufficient, it will be in the power of the department to detain the said luggage.

12. No officer or servant of the department is authorized to act as agent of the passengers in collecting checks or "excess" receipts at a station to obtain luggage from the guard. The passengers, personally or by their agents, must give up the same and claim delivery.

13. All unclaimed luggage kept at a station twelve hours after its carriage by railway will be charged cloak-room rates for each package, and the department will sell the same if unclaimed after six months.

14. When a disc or check is lost the one remaining must be forwarded to the traffic-manager with a report. The number on the check forwarded will be altered by the addition of A or B, &c., and a fresh check similarly numbered will be supplied, the altered number to take the place of that previously used. This may be done monthly or as often as required by the traffic-manager.

15. Passengers with luggage breaking their journey will do so at their own risk as to any delay in delivery thereof, unless they have directed the luggage to be labelled accordingly, since guards can only be guided by the labels as to the arrangement of luggage in the van. If a passenger from Melbourne to Sandhurst, for example, has his luggage labelled and checked thereto, yet breaks journey at Castlemaine, the Department will not be responsible to put out his luggage there. Passengers who intend to break their journey should have their luggage labelled and checked accordingly before starting.

16. Guards, porters, and others must be careful in handling luggage neither to injure labels nor to detach checks. The leather tie is not to be nailed or tacked to luggage; but when there is no handle or attachment a cord must be used for that purpose round the parcel.

17. Officers and servants will report without delay to the traffic-manager any loss by passengers of their checks, or of receipts for excess rates, so that delivery may be stopped to any other holder. Should wrong delivery be made before the loss is known the department will not be responsible.

18. Receipts given to passengers for payment of excess luggage rates must invariably specify the number of parcels making up the luggage. Any infringement of this rule to be reported to the traffic-manager.

19. It is optional with passengers to require checks according to these regulations; but should they delay or omit to do so, luggage will be entirely at the passenger's risk whether lost, carried, or left behind.

At a meeting of the Council of the Shire of Dundas, held at their offices in Hamilton, on the sixth day of May One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, it was ordered and directed that all those several pieces of land in the Shire of Dundas, and hereinafter described, recently purchased by the Council of the said Shire, under the provisions of the *Shires Statute*, from John McLellan, of Cape Wrath Station, in the County of Normanby, sheepfarmer, for the purpose of making a new road, and being respectively all that piece or parcel of land, portion of the pre-emptive section of Cape Wrath Station, situate in the parish of Monivae, County of Normanby, commencing at a point bearing south eighty-two degrees ten minutes east thirteen chains from the western boundary of said section, and which last-mentioned point is again distant twenty-two chains and six links north from the south-west angle thereof and bearing from said commencing point north eighty-one degrees fifty-five minutes east seventy chains ninety-seven links; thence south seven degrees fifty minutes west one hundred and four links; thence south eighty-one degrees fifty-five minutes west seventy chains seventy-one links; and thence north eighty-two degrees ten minutes west three chains sixty-two links to the commencing point. And also all that piece or parcel of land, being portion of subdivision A of allotment nine of section eleven, in the said parish of Monivae, commencing at a point

on the west boundary line thereof bearing south seven degrees fifty minutes west thirty-six chains sixty-one links from the north-west angle of said allotment; bearing thence south eighty-two degrees forty minutes east twelve chains seventy-eight links; thence south two chains two links; thence north eighty-two degrees forty minutes west thirteen chains five links to the said western boundary line of said subdivision; and thence north seven degrees fifty minutes east two chains to the commencing point. And also all that other piece or parcel of land, being portion of subdivision B of said allotment nine of section eleven, parish of Monivae, commencing at a point on the western boundary line of said subdivision B thirty-nine chains forty links from the north-west angle thereof; and bearing thence south eighty-two degrees forty minutes east nine chains thirty links; thence south fifty-seven degrees thirty minutes west three chains nine links; thence north eighty-two degrees forty minutes west six chains sixty-seven links to the said western boundary of said subdivision B of said allotment; and thence north two chains two links to the commencing point, or by such other descriptions as may more accurately define the said several pieces of land respectively, should be a Road within the meaning of the Shires Statute from the thirtieth day of June One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four.

And the said Council thereby directed that such road should be in lieu of the former road, over all that piece or parcel of land commencing at a point bearing south eighty-two degrees ten minutes east thirteen chains from a point on the western boundary of the pre-emptive section of the Cape Wrath Station, in the said county of Normanby, and which point is again distant twenty-one chains north from the south-east angle of the said section and bearing from said commencing point south eighty-two degrees ten minutes east fifty-five chains or thereabout to the eastern boundary of the said section; thence bearing north fifty-seven degrees thirty minutes east thirty-one chains twenty links; thence west two chains thirty-six links to the southern boundary of allotment nine of section eleven of the said parish of Monivae; thence south fifty-seven degrees thirty minutes west twenty-five chains eighty-eight links to the said eastern boundary of the said pre-emptive section; thence south along the said eastern boundary one chain thirty-six links; thence north eighty-two degrees ten minutes west fifty-one chains thirty-eight links; and thence south eighty-one degrees fifty-five minutes west three chains sixty-two links to the commencing point, or by such other description as may more accurately define the said former road.

THE Governor in Council has directed that all that portion of the Shire of Wimmera which lies between the 36th parallel of latitude, and a line commencing from the South Australian boundary and proceeding eastward along the southern boundaries of the following pastoral runs, viz.:—Tallageira North, Natteyip, Beewar South, Heath Springs West, Heath Springs East, and Drumbanagher South to the south-eastern extremity of that run; thence due east to the Yarriambyac Creek, proceeding then along that creek northwards to where it meets the western boundary of the Shire of St. Arnaud, shall form the School District of Central Wimmera, No. 297; and that all that portion of the Shire of Wimmera which lies to the south and east of the line above described shall form the School District of South Wimmera, No. 298; and that each of the above described School Districts shall have a Board of Advice consisting of five members.

The Governor in Council has directed that the School District of the Shire of Wimmera, No. 262, be abolished.
