2. The amount expended in the erection or purchase of the building, and the materials of which it is constructed, with particulars of any further proposed expenditure thereon.
3. The amount already contributed by the Government, specifying the years.
4. The amount locally subscribed, distinguishing between the sums subscribed before and since the last return.
5. Whether the land is the property of the institution, and whether granted by the Crown or purchased.
6. The number of books.
7. The number of visitors during 1874 to 31st July.

REGULATIONS PROVIDING FOR APPEAL AGAINST RECOMMENDATIONS OF LOCAL
LAND BOARDS, AND FOR APPLICATIONS FOR FORFEITURE OF LICENSES.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1869 it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor shall have power from time to time to make rules, regulations, and orders for providing for all proceedings, forms of grants, leases, licenses, and other instruments, and for the execution of all other matters and things arising under and consistent with the said Act and not therein expressly provided for, and for the more fully carrying out the objects and purposes and guarding against evasions and violations of the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the regulations following :—

APPEALS FROM LOCAL LAND BOARD.

1. Any person who may be dissatisfied with the recommendation of a Local Land Board may appeal against the same to the Minister, provided that the ground of objection to such recommendation be set forth in writing and forwarded to the Minister not later than seven (7) days after the sitting of the Local Land Board, with request that such appeal may be heard. No verbal application will be entertained.
2. If the Minister be of opinion that the grounds of objection set forth in such beforementioned statement are good and sufficient, he will order the appeal to be set down for hearing by himself, or by persons whom he may appoint to hear the same and report thereon in writing to him, and due notice will be given to all parties who appear to be interested in such appeal.
3. In order to afford time for the collection and examination of papers relating to the subject of appeal, and for the transmission of notices as hereinbefore provided, no appeal, unless otherwise expressly directed by the Minister, will be set down for hearing before the expiration of fourteen (14) days from the date of sitting of the Local Land Board.
4. Unless otherwise expressly directed by the Minister, an appeal will only be allowed when based on the following or similar grounds, viz. :—
 - 1st. That the appellant had not received due notice to attend at, or that a fair opportunity was not afforded by the Local Land Board for statement of his case; or,
 - 2nd. That the Local Land Board refused to hear material evidence; or,
 - 3rd. That any member or members of the Local Land Board were interested in the case.

FORFEITURES.

No application for forfeiture of any license issued under *The Land Act* 1869 on the ground that the licensee has been guilty of fraud, illegality, or of a violation of the said Act, or has committed a breach of or has not fulfilled any of the conditions of such license, will be entertained, except as hereinafter provided.

Any person may deliver or send to the District Surveyor in whose district the land held under license is situated an application for forfeiture thereof, with a statutory declaration setting forth the grounds and particulars on which such application is made under the following heads :—

- 1st. The time when the selection was made, the situation and area of the land, and name of licensee thereof.
- 2nd. The nature of improvements (if any) on the land.
- 3rd. The name or names of the person or persons (if any) resident on the land.
- 4th. The use to which the land has been applied.
- 5th. The conditions of the license which the applicant for forfeiture thereof alleges to have been broken or not fulfilled, or particulars of any alleged acts of fraud, illegality, or violation of the Act on the part of the licensee.
- 6th. The occupation of the applicant, and the extent of land (if any) held by him under conveyance, Crown grant, or lease, or license, and the use to which it is applied.

The District Surveyor shall report thereon to the Minister, who, if he considers the facts adduced such as to justify public enquiry, may call upon the licensee to show cause against forfeiture of his license, and refer the matter to a Local Land Board to hear the same.

If such hearing result in a recommendation of the Local Land Board that the license be forfeited, and forfeiture be declared, the applicant for such forfeiture, if in other respects eligible to obtain a license, may be recommended by the Local Land Board for priority in consideration of any applications for license to occupy the land in respect of which such forfeited licenses had been issued, provided that within one week after the notice of forfeiture in the *Government Gazette* he makes application for same in the manner prescribed in regulations then in force, and gives in writing an undertaking to deposit with the District Surveyor, within one month after demand, in payment for any improvements on the land, such sum as such District Surveyor may determine to be the value thereof; and the money so deposited shall be paid either into the general revenue, or to the person whose land has been forfeited, or partly into the one and partly to the other, as the Minister upon recommendation of the Local Land Board may direct.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC PARK AND GARDEN KNOWN AS THE BOTANICAL GARDEN OR EASTERN PARK.

WHEREAS by section 108 of *The Land Act* of 1869 it is enacted that the Board of Land and Works shall have power from time to time to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves: Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the Rules and Regulations following, to be observed and enforced in respect of the public park and garden in the town of Geelong known as the Botanical Garden or Eastern Park:—

1. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or birds therein, or throw stones, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter, or light fires therein, or smoke when walking off the paths, or in the nursery, or any other reserved place.

2. No person shall be allowed to climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or to cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, pavilions, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or to write thereon.

3. No person shall be allowed to bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, and all goats or poultry found at large therein may be destroyed.

4. No person shall be allowed to offer for sale refreshments or goods of any description, except by the written consent of the mayor on behalf of the Town Council of Geelong.

5. No children under ten years of age shall be admitted to the nursery or special reserve unless accompanied by an adult.

6. No person shall be allowed to train or exercise any horse or other animal within the park.

7. No person shall ride or drive over any portion of the grass land therein, but shall keep to the portions laid out as carriage drives, and shall not at any time ride or drive at a greater speed than six miles an hour.

8. No thoroughfare through the park to the limekilns, butts, cricket ground, or elsewhere, will be permitted, except by a gate provided for such purpose, and of which the superintendent of the park has control by lock and key.

9. The park shall be opened daily (except as provided hereunder) from October 1st to March 31st, both days inclusive, from 6 o'clock a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m.; and from the 1st of April to September 30th, both days inclusive, from sunrise to sunset, and any unauthorized person found therein after these hours may be treated as a trespasser.

10. During wet weather the carriage entrance gates to the park will be closed for such time as may be necessary to preserve the carriage drives.

11. No person shall be permitted to enter, or to remain in the said park or garden, who offends against decency, as regards his dress, language, or conduct.

12. All picnic parties shall be located in such portions of the park as may be arranged between the managers of such parties and the superintendent, under instructions from the mayor, such arrangements to be made at least one day previous; and all such parties must, through their managers, deposit a money guarantee (in accordance with the nature of accommodation required) for the removal of all rubbish, &c., as provided in clause 1 of these Regulations.

Offenders against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act* 1869, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and any person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such Regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
