The duties of the Inspector of the Departments of Lands and Agriculture will be—

1. To see that all Acts of Parliament bearing on the administration of the Department, and all regulations in force for its guidance, are enforced and complied with in the transaction of its business, and to report any deviation therefrom.

2. To examine all regulations and orders before acted upon, and to point out any particulars in which they may appear to clash with those already in force, or with the law; and to deal in like manner with all papers prepared for submission to the Governor in Council, and to the Board of Land and Works.

3. To examine all accounts both of revenue and expenditure kept by the Department in the head office, and, when necessary, in the country districts, and to report any errors or irregularities which may occur in the same.

4. To examine and inspect the preparation of Crown grants, leases, and licenses, in order that no such instruments may be issued until full value therefor, as required by law, shall have been received by the Crown.

5. To examine all requisitions for furniture, stationery, and stores, and to object to any item that may appear irregular, unnecessary, or wasteful.

6. To scrutinize closely the working of the Department in all its branches. To call attention to any weak points, and suggest such remedy as may appear to meet each case as it may arise.

7. The Inspector will not be allowed to take any part in the administrative duties of the Department, or in the preparation of the documents which it will be his duty to examine.

8. The duties of the Inspector will commence on the 2nd November 1874.

Any person taking up a claim upon a worked and abandoned quartz reef shall be entitled to occupy an area not exceeding 160 yards in length, on the supposed course of the reef, by 150 yards in width across such course; and shall keep constantly employed upon such area not less than two men.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish, or town, by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighteenth day of February 1861, the town of Donnybrook was amongst others proclaimed and the boundaries thereof were defined: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the name thereof: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby alter the name of the town designated Donnybrook in the said Proclamation, and do proclaim that the name by which such town shall be distinguished and recognized shall be as follows, that is to say:—

THE TOWN OF KALKALLO.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Act; and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the Common hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

BELVOIR AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON.—The Belvoir Agricultural Area Farmers' Common, proclaimed by Order of the 3rd October 1868, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of section 1, parish of Belvoir West, where it is intersected by the Fell-timer Creek; thence up that creek to the summit of a hill at the source thereof; thence by a line bearing north-easterly to the south-western angle of allotment 2 of section 5; thence by that allotment and by a line bearing south-easterly to allotment 1 of section 3; thence by that allotment and by allotments 3 and 4 bearing south to the land applied for by W. Haensler; thence by that land bearing west, south, east, and north-easterly to allotment 4 aforesaid; thence by that allotment, by a line, by allotments 1 and 6 of section 2, and by a line bearing east to the south-western angle of allotment 7 of section 16, parish of Wodonga; thence by a line and by allotment 4 of section 17 bearing south to J. Sutton's licensed land; thence by that land and by a line bearing west and south to the northern boundary of section 1

aforesaid; and thence by that section bearing west to the point of commencement. Area of extension, 1600 acres, more or less, as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(74.O.B.3658.)

ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF GOLDFIELDS COMMONS IN THE ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

At a meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ararat, held on the twenty-first day of September One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, the following rules and regulations were adopted by the said Board, that is to say:—

1. Every holder of a miner's right, business license, or any special license, resident within the boundaries of the common shall be entitled to depasture cattle, horses, sheep, and goats on the goldfields common within the Ararat mining district, subject to the following conditions:—
2. The following scale of fees shall be in force on the several goldfields commons in the Ararat mining district:—
For each mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule,
per annum ... 4s. 0d.
For each cow, steer, heifer, or ox, per annum ... 4s. 0d.
For each goat, per annum ... 1s. 4d.
3. Every holder of a miner's right or business license shall be entitled to depasture any number of cattle not exceeding twelve (12).
4. Holders of miners' rights actually engaged in mining, residing on or near to the boundaries of any goldfield common, may be permitted to depasture thereon, on making application in writing to the managers.
5. The managers may issue special licenses to dairyman to depasture any number of large cattle not exceeding forty (40), for dairying purposes, and shall pay fees as specified in clause two (2).
6. The managers may issue to butchers and slaughtermen special licenses to depasture, for slaughtering purposes only, any number of sheep not being less than twenty (20) nor more than two hundred and fifty (250), at the rate of 1s. 4d. per head per annum; and for any number of large cattle not exceeding thirty (30), on payment of the fees specified in clause two (2).
7. All licenses shall be issued in the form of Schedule A hereto annexed.
8. During the months of August and February in each year, or as soon thereafter as possible, all holders of stock on the common shall be required to muster such stock in their own yards, or in some other more convenient place to be determined by the managers, within forty-eight (48) hours after receiving notice in writing, and to assist in branding them with the common brand; horses and sheep only exempt from being branded.
9. Previous to the depasturing of stock, the owners thereof shall register the same, with brands and descriptions, in the herd-book; and such registration shall be renewed half-yearly, and shall be made previous to the branding of such stock.
10. Holders of licenses may substitute cattle for others removed from the common during the currency of their license by giving notice in writing to the herdsman, containing the brands, number of cattle so substituted, a record of such notice to be kept by the herdsman.
11. All fees must be paid half-yearly, in advance. Licenses to date from the first day of August and the first day of February in each year.
12. All stock depastured on any goldfield common, if not registered, branded, and duly paid for, may be impounded by the managers.
13. The progeny of cattle, horses, or goats depastured on any common shall be exempt from fees if under six months old.
14. No swine, or entire animal, shall be depastured on any common, without permission of the managers.
15. Sheep specially licensed shall only be depastured on such parts of the common as the managers shall appoint; being depastured beyond those limits, they shall be deemed to be trespassing, and may be impounded.
16. No license shall be transferred without the permission of the managers.
17. When any animal is infected with disease, the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the common within twelve hours after receiving notice from the managers or herdsman; and such animal shall not again be put upon the common without the special permission of the managers.

18. After due notice has been given, the managers shall, at the owner's expense, have power to remove all diseased animals; and also, at the owner's expense, to remove, bury, or destroy all dead carcasses found on the common.

19. Persons occupying purchased land, or land held in respect of any lease or license, within the boundaries of any goldfields common, shall not be allowed to drive sheep across any portion of any goldfield common to any waterhole, creek, or river, or to any detached allotment of land held under lease, license, or otherwise, without first obtaining permission of the managers.

20. A herdsman or herdsmen of each common shall be appointed in writing, under the hand of the chairman of the managers of such common; and the herdsman so appointed shall perform such duties as the managers may lawfully require.

21. The managers shall keep all necessary books and accounts, and shall at all reasonable times produce the same for the inspection of the public when required.

22. Travellers intending to drive cattle or sheep across or through any goldfield common shall, before entering upon such common, deliver at the residence of one of the managers or herdsmen of the common, a notice of his intention so to drive such cattle or sheep; and shall by such notice state from whence he has brought the same, and whether he is driving them. And all cattle shall be driven every day a distance of not less than ten miles, and all sheep shall be driven every day a distance of not less than six miles in the direction of the place mentioned in the notice as the place to which it is intended to drive such cattle or sheep respectively. Travellers depasturing any stock on any common shall be allowed to run the same free of charge for twenty-four hours, but shall be liable to pay twopence per day for each head of horned cattle or horses, and one half-penny for each sheep depastured beyond that time; but the managers shall have the power at any time to prevent travelling flocks or herds remaining beyond the twenty-four hours.

23. Every person offending against any regulation for the management of a common shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

24. The managers of any common may sue for and recover any fees for depasturing stock on such common, or any penalty for breach of any regulation for management of such common.

25. Managers of every common shall, within one month of the termination of each financial year (ending on the 31st day of July in each year) publish, in a newspaper circulating in the district wherein the common is situated, a certified account of their receipts and expenditure for the year, in the form prescribed in Schedule B hereunto annexed. A certified copy of the same to be also forwarded to the clerk of the mining board.

26. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

27. The rules and regulations dated 31st day of August 1870, passed by the Ararat Mining Board, for the management of goldfields commons in the Ararat mining district, are hereby repealed.

The births of 726 children, viz., 389 boys and 337 girls were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of September. In the month of August 662 births were registered, or 64 less than in the month under review.

The deaths in September numbered 294, viz., 171 of males and 123 of females, the births thus exceeded the deaths by 432. The deaths were fewer by 107 than those in August, but exceeded the average of September during the previous ten years by 34. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population they will be found to have been 26 less than that average.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 69.4° on the 24th, the lowest was 34.0° on the 12th. The mean temperature of the month (50.5°) was nearly three degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (30.1°) was on the 13th, viz., from a maximum of 66.5° to a minimum of 36.4°. The least range (7.3°) was on the 2nd, viz., from a maximum of 58.7° to a minimum of 51.4°. The mean daily range was 15.9°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.795 inches) was more than a tenth of an inch (.122 in.) below the average.

Males contributed 58 per cent. and females 42 per cent. to the mortality of the month. The proportion of deaths of children under five years of age was unusually small, amounting to only 25 per cent. of the whole as against 36 per cent. in September 1873, 31 per cent. in September 1872, 37 per cent. in September 1871, 32 per cent. in September 1870, 33 per cent. in September 1869, 37 per cent. in September 1868, 40 per cent. in September 1867, 41 per cent. in September 1866, 51 per cent. in September 1865, and 33 per cent. in September 1864.

The month has been unusually fatal to old people, no less than 19 having died during that period at the age of 75 years or upwards, a number which was only reached on one former occasion, namely, in the month of June of the present year. The particulars are as follow:—A female, aged 75, died of paralysis; a boot factor, aged 75, a jeweller aged 76, and a male of occupation not stated aged 78 died of heart disease; a laborer aged 76 died of phthisis; a shoemaker aged 77 and a female aged 78 died of pneumonia; a female aged 78 died of congestion of the lungs; a female aged 81 died of erysipelas; a mariner aged 82, and a shepherd aged 83, died of bronchitis; a cooper aged 73, a tailor aged 80, a male of occupation not stated aged 84, a laborer aged 85, and three females aged respectively 80, 83, and 87, died of old age; a laborer aged 87 died of cerebral effusion and softening of the brain.

The violent deaths which occurred during the month numbered 15, of which 12 were set down as accidental, and 3 as homicidal. The particulars are as follow:—A boy aged 11 years broke his neck by falling from a cart; a female aged 42 fractured her skull by falling down stairs; a groom aged 47 died of the effects of injuries to the hip; a carter aged 49 was killed by a dray-wheel passing over his neck; a boy aged 10 was drowned in a water-hole; an able seaman aged 27, a female servant aged 28, a news-vendor aged 30, and an engineer aged 51 were drowned in the River Yarra, and a female aged 48 was drowned at Footscray; a painter aged 41 died of lead poisoning; and a male infant aged 7 weeks was suffocated in bed. A newly-born male infant was murdered by suffocation; the body of a female infant aged about 14 days was found dead near the Botanical Gardens (verdict "wilful murder" against some person or persons unknown); a seaman aged 27 was murdered by being stabbed in the belly.

Seventy-eight deaths, or 27 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—82 in the Melbourne Hospital; 4 in the Immigrants' Home; 9 in the Alfred Hospital; 8 in the Lying-in Hospital; 1 in the Childrens' Hospital; 8 in the Benevolent Asylum; 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 12 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 74, of which 46, or 62 per cent., were of males; 28, or 38 per cent., were of females. Of those who died 58 were under one year of age, 6 were between one and two years, 6 were between three and four years, and 4 were between four and five years.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 220. Of these 125, or 57 per cent., were males and 95, or 43 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 6 were between fifteen and twenty, 10 were between twenty and twenty-five, 22 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty-five, 25 were between thirty-five and forty, 21 were between forty and forty-five, 19 were between forty-five and fifty, 21 were between fifty and fifty-five, 11 were between fifty-five and sixty, 12 were between sixty and sixty-five, 7 were between sixty-five and seventy, 7 were between seventy and seventy-five, 9 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 10 were upwards of eighty.

The number of deaths in the quarter ending 30th September 1874 was 1073, and the mean temperature in the shade was 48.2°. The deaths numbered 252 more than the average of the corresponding quarter during the previous ten years, or if allowance be made for the increase of population they will be found to have been 63 more than the average. The mean temperature of the quarter was two degree below the average.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:

Pursuant to Order of 28 April 1873.

BRENANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Brenanah and Coyocra Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.
