REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC PARK KNOWN AS THE OCEAN PARK.

AS THE OCEAN PARK.

WHEREAS by section 108 of The Land Act of 1869 it is amongst other things enacted, that the Board of Land and Works shall have power from time to time to make, and alter, or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all Public Parks and Reserves: Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind all exjisting rules and regulations relating to the Public Park in the parishes of Nepean and Fingal, known as The Ocean Park, and doth thereby make the Rules and Regulations following, to be observed and enforced in respect of such Park:

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall disturb the soil within the said park in any manner or for any purpose, or erect any tent, pavilion, or other temporary structure, until-an-application be made to, and approved by the committee of management; nor any structure of a permanent character without such approval and 'the written consent of the Board of Land and Works thereto.

18 2. No person shall kindle or maintain any fire within this park without leave of the superintendent appointed by the said committee, and then only in such place as such superintendent shall point out; and no person shall cut or in any way injure or interfere with the timber, trees, shrubs, flowers, wells, or birds therein, or with any indigenous vegetation therein; or break or damage the rocks in the caves and arches therein, or commit any nuisance, or leave any bottles, paper, or other litter therein.

3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates; or cut, carve, break, or in any way injure the seats, buildings, bowers, posts, fences, gates, pavilions, or other erections therein; and all goats or poultry found at large therein may be destroyed by any bailiff of crown lands.

4. No person shall be allowed to offer for sale refreshments or goods of any description within such park, except upon the authority of the committee of management to be evidenced by the written consent of the chairman for the time being of such committee.

2.5: No person shall ride or drive over any portion of the park, except upon the portions laid out as carriage drives.

6. No person shall be permitted to enter or remain in the said, park who offends against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

Offenders against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of "The Land Act 1869," on conviction before

any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding (£5) Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wiffully offend against any of the foregoing regulations, or who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of crown lands or by a constable, desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding (£10) Ten pounds.
