NOTE.—In the quarter under review 4,888 persons arrived from the neighboring colonies, 1,670 from the United Kingdom, and 180 from foreign ports, as against 4,479 who left for the neighboring colonies, 423 for the United Kingdom, and 365 for foreign ports. The increase by excess of births over deaths was 4,491, viz. —2,916 males and 2,405 females; and that by excess of arrivals over departures was 1,471, viz. —1,016 males and 455 females. The sum of these amounts gives a total gain to the population of 5,892, viz. —3,032 males and 2,860 females, as shown in the table.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:

Pursuant to Order of 28 April 1873.

BRENANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Brennanah and Coyora Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

POWLETT'S PLAINS QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Powlett's Plains run).—Commencing at a point on the River Loddon, being the north-east angle of allotment 62, parish of Kinypanial; thence southerly along the said River Loddon to the northernmost angle of the Salisbury Plains run; thence westerly and southerly to the northernmost boundary of the Brennanah run; thence westerly along the said boundary to the eastern boundary of the Torpichen run; thence northerly along the said boundary to the southernmost boundary of the Edgar Plains run; and thence easterly to the point of commencement.

PROTECTORATE QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Protectorate run).—Commencing at the north-east angle of Waranga run; on the west by that run; on the south by Postlethwaite run on the east by the Goulburn River for about seven miles; thence by a line running north-west to the commencing point.

SANDHURST DISTRICT, FREEHOLD PROPERTIES IN THE Parish of Powlett—Clancy.—Comprising allotments 10 and 12, lying on the north side of the main road from Salisbury Plains pre-emptive right to Kinypanial in the county of Gladstone.

Teel's 42nd section block, being also the south-east angle of allotment 3A, section 7, parish of Eddington, being a point on the Tullaroop Creek; thence west to the south-west angle of the land granted to William Heer; thence southerly along the three-chain road to its junction with the one-chain road leading to Maryborough, and by that road in a south-westerly direction to its intersection with the western boundary of the parish of Eddington; thence south along the said parish boundary one mile and twenty-eight chains; thence east one mile and fourteen chains; thence southerly along the three-chain road fifteen chains; thence east one mile and five chains to the Tullaroop Creek; thence northerly by that creek to the point of commencement.

WARANGA QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the south-east corner of Toolamba run, on the Goulburn River; thence by the southern boundaries of that run and Wanalta East run to Gohareep run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to Colbinabbin South run; thence by a portion of the northern and eastern boundaries of that run to Postlethwaite run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; and thence by that river to the point of commencement: Provided that the road from Corop to Rushworth and Whroo shall form no part of the said quarantine district.

ALBERT PARK.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ALBERT PARK AND LAKE.

WHEREAS by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Board of Land and Works shall have power from time to time to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves: Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, do hereby, in addition to all existing rules and regulations relating to the Albert Park, make the following rules and regulations to be observed and enforced in respect of such park, particularly relating to the lake therein, and for the guidance and observance of licensees and owners of boats and boathouse sites therein.

1. No boat shall be placed on the lake until permission be given by the Board of Land and Works.

2. Persons holding licenses for boathouse sites are hereby permitted to place boats, the sole property of the licensees, upon the lake. The owners of other boats must obtain express permission from the Board.

3. No person will be allowed to convey into or through the park any goods or materials, or implements of any kind, unless he be the holder of a boat license, or the holder of a license for a boathouse site from the Board of Land and Works, or be allowed ingress and egress with any articles required for boating purposes.

4. No stakes or posts of any kind shall be driven into the bed of the lake, except where necessary for pier or jetty purposes.

5. All boats shall be moored with flagstones or other like moorings, with chain or rope attached, placed so as not to impede or endanger the navigation of the lake.

6. All buildings constructed around the margin of the lake, or in the park, and all piers or jetties constructed in the water, shall be in strict accordance with the plans marked "Albert Park, Nos. 1, 2, and 3," and with the specification attached thereto, deposited in the office of Lands and Survey, unless permission be otherwise given by the Board, and shall be constructed to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works, who shall have power at any time to cancel any license, or to require any building or erection to be altered or removed.

7. No refuse, rubbish, or debris of any kind shall be deposited in, around, or in any way so as to affect the lake; or in any other part of the park.

8. All works or buildings of any kind shall be constructed so as to leave a clear road of thirty-three (33) feet around the margin of the lake.

9. Offenders against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any of the foregoing regulations, or who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or by a constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
