THE TOWN OF HOTHAM.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute* (33 Vict. No. 359) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor if he shall think fit by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any borough whose gross revenue for the year preceding was not less than Ten thousand pounds by such name as in and by such order shall be assigned thereto to be a town, and by such notice to proclaim any borough whose gross revenue for the year preceding was not less than Twenty thousand pounds to be a city, and such borough shall thereupon be called such town or city accordingly; provided that no borough after the proclamation thereof as such city, save as herein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of wards, shall be united with any other city or with any shire; and it is also enacted that every town or city shall after the proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and to have been such and the same borough (to all intents and purposes) as such town or city was at the time of such proclamation; and save as aforesaid, and save where herein otherwise expressly provided, all the provisions of this Act relating to boroughs shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such town or city and be read accordingly: And whereas the gross revenue of the Borough of Hotham for the year ending the thirtieth day of September 1874 was not less than Ten thousand pounds: And whereas the boundaries of the said borough are amongst others described in the first schedule of the Act hereinbefore recited, and it is deemed expedient to proclaim the said borough to be a town: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, by this notice proclaim the Borough of Hotham to be a Town, by the name in and by the Order in Council made in this behalf assigned thereto, that is to say—

PUBLIC ROAD WITHIN THE SHIRE OF GLENELG.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved or used for a road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public road within the meaning of this Act, and such land reserved or used for a road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public and reserved for public use as a public road within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; provided that no such proclamation shall be deemed to be a proclamation as a main road as hereinbefore provided; and provided further that every and any such proclamation may be at any time revoked, if necessary, by the Governor: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim to be a public road within the meaning of the said Act the land reserved or used for the road, highway, or thoroughfare within the Shire of Glenelg, the limits of which are hereinafter described, viz. :-

The road from the west boundary of the parish of Nangeela to the south boundary of the parish of Mazeppa, within the shire of Glenelg.

TELEGRAPHIC WEATHER INTELLIGENCE.

The following notice is to be substituted for that contained in Circular No. II, March 1872, relating to additions and alterations in the International Code of Signals Book.

The Meteorological Office issues to ports and fishing stations approved of by the Board of Trade, notices of atmospheric disturbances on or near the coasts of the British Islands.

Signals.

The fact that such a notice has been received at any station is made known by a signal, which is hoisted on the receipt of the message, and remains hoisted, but only during the day-time, for the space of 48 hours and no longer, counted from the time the message is sent out.

The signals are made by means of two canvas shapes, a cone and a drum.

The cone is three feet high and three feet wide at base, and appears as a triangle when hoisted.

The drum (or cylinder) is three feet high and three feet wide, and appears a square when hoisted.

Southerly Gale.

The cone point downwards means that strong winds are probable, at first from the southward (from S.E. round by S. to N.W.).

Northerly Gale.

The cone point upwards means that strong winds are probable, at first from the northward (from N.W. round by N. to S.E.).

Very Heavy Gales.

The drum will be hoisted with the cone whenever a very heavy gale, either southerly or northerly, as the case may be, is probable.

The drum will not be used without the cone.

Sudden Shifts of Wind.

No signal is employed to indicate a wind which is likely to shift suddenly, but it must be remembered that a southerly wind is much more likely to veer a point north of west than a northerly wind is to veer to a point south of east.

Accordingly, when the south cone is hoisted, and the anchorage or harbor is exposed to the north-west, it is advisable to make preparations for a north-west gale.

On Hoisting the Signals.

The signal is to be kept flying until dusk, and then lowered and hoisted again next morning; and so on until the end of 48 hours from the time the message has been issued from London (which is always marked on the telegram), unless orders are received previously to lower the signal.

At dusk, whenever a signal ought to be flying if it were day-light, a night signal may be hoisted in place of the cone, consisting of three lanterns hung on a triangular frame, point downwards, or point upwards, as the case may be. It is not considered necessary to hoist lanterns to represent the drum. They should be kept burning till late in the evening, say 9 or 10 o'clock.

These signals may be made with any lanterns, showing white or any color, but *alike*. Red is best. Lamps are better than caudles. The lanterns should be good rope, and protected from chafing. The lanterns should hang at least three feet apart.

No warning messages can be issued on Sundays, as the telegraph offices are almost all closed after 10 a.m. on that day, so that the signal must sometimes be kept flying on Sundays longer than is necessary. Storms, first showing signs of their approach on Sunday, will sometimes come on before Monday, so that the warning cannot be issued in time to be of service.

Meaning of Signal.

The hoisting of any of these signals is intended as a sign that there is an atmospheric disturbance in existence which will probably cause a gale from the quarter indicated by the signal used in the neighborhood (say, within a distance of 50 miles) of the place where the signal is hoisted, and the know-

ledge of which is likely to be of use to the sailors and fishermen on that part of the coast. Its meaning is simply "Look out! It is probable that bad weather of such and such a character is approaching you."

Hitherto it has been found that at least three out of five signals of approaching storms (force upwards of 8 Beaufort scale, a "fresh gale"), and four out of five signals of approaching strong winds (force upwards of 6 Beaufort scale, a "strong breeze"), have been fully justified.

In every case some of the principal reasons which have led to the hoisting of the signal are explained in the telegram, which should always be kept posted up for public inspection while the signal is flying.

It must be remembered that only the greater and more general disturbances of the atmosphere can be made known by this method. Local changes of less extent may be indicated to observers by their own instruments and by local signs of weather, &c.

A regular study of the Daily Weather Report will be found very useful, as showing what weather has lately been prevalent generally.

The signal will sometimes be kept flying after the gale is over: this is the case because often one gale is followed by another before the 48 hours are out. In every case when it is thought at the Meteorological Office that immediate danger is over, orders are issued to lower the signal at once.

ALTERATIONS AND ADDITIONS.

In the event of the discovery of any error of translation or otherwise, or if any alterations and additions are required in the Code to meet the wants of any particular country, it is requisite that before they are adopted notice of such should be sent to the Assistant Secretary, Marine Department, Board of Trade, London. This course of proceeding is absolutely necessary in order to secure uniformity in all editions of the Code.

When any alteration or addition has been made by the Board of Trade, notice of it will be sent by that Board to the country which had suggested it, and also to all the countries in which the Code has been adopted and translated.

LAND REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of December 1874.

PRESENT :

WHEREAS by the 110th section of *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the subjoined regulation, viz.:-

The following schedule shall be in lieu of schedule xxix., annexed to the Regulations of the 26th of May 1873, viz.:-

SECTION XX., LAND ACT 1869.

THIS Indenture made the day of A.D. 187 between Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria of the one part and (hereinafter called the "lessee") of the other part: Witnesseth that in consideration of the rent hereby reserved and the covenants and conditions herein contained and on the part of the lessee his executors administrators and assigns to be observed and performed Her Majesty doth by these presents grant and demise all that piece of land in the colony of Victoria containing or thereabouts and described in the schedule hereunder written and shown with the measurements and abutments thereof in the map or diagram drawn in the margin of these presents and in such map or diagram colored yellow To hold the said piece of land unto the lessee his executors administrators and assigns from the day of the date hereof for the term of years Yielding and paying for the same unto Her Majesty the Queen her heirs and successors during the said term the rent of per annum for every acre and fractional part of an acre of the said land such rent to be always paid by half-yearly payments in advance on the day of and the day of in each year And the next half-yearly payment thereof to be made on the day of next

Excepting however unto us our heirs and successors all gold and auriferous earth and stone and all mines containing gold within the boundaries of the said land And also reserving to us our heirs and successors full liberty and authority for us our heirs and successors and our and their agents and servants at any time or times hereafter during the said term to enter upon the said land and to search and mine therein for gold and to extract and remove therefrom any gold and any auriferous earth or stone and for the purposes aforesaid to sink shafts erect machinery carry on any works and do any other things which may be necessary or usual in mining Provided always that it shall be lawful for us our heirs and successors at any time during the said term on paying full compensation to the said his heirs executors administrators or assigns for the value other than auriferous of the said piece of land or of so much thereof as may be resumed as hereinafter mentioned and of the improvements upon the said piece of land or the part so resumed such value in case of disagreement to be ascertained by arbitration to resume the said piece of land or any part thereof for mining purposes And that the terms conditions and events upon which such land may be resumed and the manner in which such arbitration may be conducted may be determined by Regulations in such manner as the Governor in Council may from time to time direct or if at any time no such Regulations shall be in force then by the Regulations concerning the resumption of land for mining purposes in force at the date of this grant unless Parliament shall otherwise determine And the lessee for himself his heirs executors administrators and assigns doth hereby covenant with Her said Majesty her heirs and successors that he the lessee his executors administrators or assigns will during the said term pay unto Her Majesty her heirs and successors the rent hereby reserved by half-yearly payments in advance on the days hereinafter appointed for the payment thereof And also that the lessee his executors administrators and assigns will not at any time during the continuance of the term hereby granted search in the land hereby demised for or take therefrom any metal or mineral Provided further and these presents are upon this express condition that no assignment or transfer of these presents or other instrument affecting the premises hereby demised shall have any effect or validity whatsoever unless and until the Governor acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council sanction the same and further until the same be registered in the office of Crown Lands, and all such instruments as aforesaid shall have and take priority not according to their respective dates but according to the priority of the registration thereof Provided also and these presents are upon this condition that in case the rent hereby reserved or any part thereof shall not be paid in accordance with the covenant for payment hereinafter contained although no demand for payment shall have been made or in case the lessee his executors administrators or assigns shall not faithfully observe and perform all and every

the covenants and conditions herein contained and on his or their part to be observed and performed it shall be lawful for Her Majesty to enter forthwith or at any time thereafter upon the land hereby demised and the same to repossess and enjoy and from thenceforth the said term hereby granted shall absolutely cease and determine And it is hereby agreed and declared that in any such case it shall be lawful for Her Majesty and for any bailiff of Crown lands or for any other agents or officers authorized in that behalf without any demand whatsoever to enter upon the land hereby demised and the lessee his executors or administrators and all persons claiming under him or them for ever to expel and remove therefrom without any legal process whatsoever and as effectually as any sheriff might do in case Her Majesty had obtained judgment in ejectment for recovery of possession of the said land and a writ of *habere facias possessionem* or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law And that in case of such entry and any action being brought or other proceedings taken for or on account of the same by any person whomsoever the defendants or defendant to such action may plead leave or license in bar thereof and these presents shall be conclusive evidence of the leave and license of the lessee his executors or administrators and all persons claiming under him or them to Her Majesty and any bailiff of Crown lands and all persons acting in the matters complained of or of any such bailiff for the entry or trespass or other matters complained of in such action or other proceedings.

In witness whereof His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of Victoria hath on behalf of Her Majesty the Queen caused this demise to be sealed with the seal of the said Colony and the said lessee hath set hereto his hand and seal. (L.S.)

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish, or town, by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby alter the names of the respective places hereinafter referred to, and do proclaim that the names by which such places shall be respectively distinguished and recognized shall be as follow, that is to say:-

The name of Abraham's Bosom, on Ticonderoga Bay, near Point Nepean, is hereby altered to WEROONA BAY.

The name of the township of Middleton, at Apollo Bay, is hereby altered to KRAMBROOK.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourteenth day of December in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and in the thirty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

PROPOSED ALTERATION OF THE GRAMPIAN STATE FOREST.
