49. Any officer may, at the discretion of the Officer Com-

The uniform to be worn by officers on these lists will be
prescribed in the dress regulations of the force.

50. The services of unattached officers are at all times to be

TOWN OF TUNGAMAH.—County of Moira, parish of Tharabegga: Commencing at the south-east angle of Anne Barr's 19th section block, No. 78; thence by that block and by a line bearing west one hundred and ten chains; thence by lines bearing respectively south sixty chains and east one hundred and ten chains; and thence by a road bearing north sixty chains to the point of commencement. The bearings are from the true meridian.—(L.P. 1136.) (74.P.25628.)

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Act; and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to and increase the Common hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

BURKE, DRUMMOND, AND EDGEcombe UNITED FARMERS' COMMON:—The Burke, Drummond, and Edgecombe United Farmers' Common, proclaimed by Order of the 3rd December 1866, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.: Commencing at a point on the western bank of the Kangaroo Creek where it is intersected by the north side of the road forming the north boundary of allotment 2 of section 4, parish of Burke, bounded thence by that road

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and may from time to time, after one month's notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works may issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee, as shall from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: And whereas by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the twenty-seventh day of May One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, a certain area was proclaimed a reserve for the preservation and growth of timber, under the designation of the Grampian State Forest: And whereas by another proclamation bearing date the sixth day of July One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four the said reserve was diminished: And whereas it is expedient to make an addition to the said reserve: Now, therefore I, the administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, do hereby, alter the proclamation firstly hereinbefore mentioned, and do, with the advice aforesaid, proclaim as an addition to the said reserve for the preservation and growth of timber, designated the Grampian State Forest, the land hereinafter described, that is to say:—

**KOROIT PUBLIC GARDENS.
REGULATIONS.**

WHEREAS, by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, it is among other things enacted, that the Board of Land and Works shall have power, from time to time, to make and alter, or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves: Now, therefore, the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power now conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the rules and regulations following, to be observed and enforced in respect of the Koroit Public Gardens:—

1. The gardens, under the management or control of the Council, and ground appertaining thereto, herein called the Gardens, shall be open from sunrise to sunset on each day of the week.

2. No person shall pluck any of the flowers or walk on the beds, or borders, or climb upon or get over the fences, or remove any of the tallies, or disturb, damage or destroy any property or thing in the gardens.

3. No person shall carry fire-arms through the gardens, or shoot, snare, or destroy any wild fowl either in the gardens or in or on any water adjacent thereto, or bathe within such distance from such gardens as shall be fixed by any regulation of the Council to be made in that behalf in such water.

4. No cart or other vehicle used for the conveyance of goods shall, without the authority of the Borough Council, be driven through the gardens.

5. Such plants, seeds, or cuttings as are commonly purchasable at nurseries in Victoria, shall not be supplied from the gardens to any person unless in exchange, or for public institutions, or for benevolent purposes.

6. No visitor shall interrupt the gardeners or labourers by conversation or otherwise.

7. Children under the age of ten years, not being under the control of some competent person, shall be removed from the gardens.

8. All dogs and goats, and all poultry found within the gardens may be destroyed by any Crown Lands bailiff or police constable, and the owner shall make compensation to be recovered before any justice for any damage done.

Offenders against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulation, and who shall not after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown Lands, or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Orders of 23 December 1874.

BERNANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Bernanah and Cooyma Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpiehen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

ENGAGEMENT OF FOREIGN SEAMEN ON BOARD BRITISH SHIPS.

THE attention of British shipmasters, and of foreign seamen wishing to ship on board British vessels, is hereby called to the provisions of the laws of certain countries with regard to military and naval service, which forbid the engagement of

the subjects of those countries on foreign service unless they are provided with certificates from the competent authorities to the effect that there is no objection to their accepting such service.

Masters of British ships, and seamen, being the subjects of foreign countries, are therefore warned that unless the latter are provided with the certificates from the authorities above referred to, any engagements they may make to serve on board British vessels may be considered illegal, according to the laws of those countries, and that the whole responsibility and consequences of concluding such engagements will have to be borne by the parties to the contract, who must not expect any interference on their behalf on the part of Her Majesty's Government or of any British consular officer.

Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid) addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated in words as well as figures.

Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

TENDERS are hereby invited, and will be received until Noon of Thursday the fifteenth day of April 1875, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails as undermentioned, from the 1st July 1875 to 30th June 1876.

The covers of Tenders for these services must be endorsed "Tenders for Second Call."

Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid) addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated in words as well as figures.

Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them on application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.

In the event of a portion of railway affecting any particular service being opened for traffic during period of contract, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the place of departure for the mail coaches shall be altered in such way as the Postmaster-General may from time to time

direct; a rateable reduction shall be made in the amount paid for the service as then rendered by the contractors, such reduction to be computed on the basis of the average mileage rate of the lump tender or the average mileage rate of the single tender, in whichever form the tender may be accepted.

Persons tendering are requested to state the description of the vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

A separate tender must be sent in for each service; but notwithstanding this condition, any offer will be entertained for the performance of any number of services for a lump sum. IRON CASTINGS.

TENDERS will be received until Ten a.m. on Tuesday the 16th March 1875, from persons willing to furnish Iron Castings, in such quantities as may be required for the Government Railways from 1st July 1875 until the 30th of June 1876.

The castings are required for locomotive engine work, carriage work, &c.

Whenever specially ordered the castings shall be run from the very best "cold-blast iron," and of such particular brand, quality, and mixture as may be described in the order; or of such other substituted mixture as may be approved or directed by the General Overseer of Locomotives, so as to produce a hard, close, soft, or other description of metal.

The castings are to be clean, sharp, free from surface scale, shell, cold shuts, blow holes, honeycomb, cinder, or any other imperfections, and are to be sound in every respect and thoroughly close in grain. When specially ordered the castings are to be run with heads or runners of such weight as may be requested, and no extra charge shall be made or allowed for same, and the contractor will be required to remove the head or runner from the casting where possible, and charge the casting at the net weight only, trimmed and cleaned. In cases where it is necessary to cut off the head in a lathe or machine, such head will be cut off by the Government, and returned to the Melbourne Station, there to be delivered to the contractor free of cost or carriage.

Whenever ordered, the castings are to be moulded in loam without a pattern, and loam price will be paid according to

schedule, but no extra charge will be allowed for patterns, strickles, or loam boards. The orders will express the kind or description of casting according to the schedule distinction; and the rates there filled in opposite each item will be allowed accordingly.

The Government will supply all patterns, and deliver the same to the Melbourne Station free of cost, from whence the contractor must fetch them when required and when due notice of same has been given in writing, and no cost for carriage from Spencer-street Station to the contractor's place of business will be allowed. Any pattern lost by the contractor must be replaced by him.

Whenever only one or two castings are required, and they can be moulded from the broken originals, the contractor will be bound to mould from such patterns without requiring the Government to supply a wooden or other pattern for same, and no extra price will be allowed.

All pipes and bends must be moulded in loam whenever required, and a loam pattern made. A loam pattern must be struck up for any casting when a pattern cannot be supplied, and when only one casting or so is required, and when of that simple form that it can be made from a loam pattern; and no extra rate or charge will be allowed for the loam pattern beyond the loam price stated in schedule. The Government will supply all necessary striking boards, but no plates or cramps.

All patterns, loam boards, &c., supplied by the Government must be returned by the contractor in good order to the Government with the castings, and delivered to the Railway Stores, at Williamstown, and no allowance will be made for return carriage.

Forms of tender, schedules of the articles required, and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Railway Storekeeper, Williamstown.

Security will be required in the amount of £100 for due fulfilment of the contract, either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by bank notes, or a bank draft in favor of the Secretary of the Tender Board, for ten per cent. of the amount of security required, which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security must be completed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

In the event of the contractor failing to carry out the contract, the contract security money will be absolutely forfeited, and the contractor disqualified from tendering for a period of twelve months.

CONDITIONS.

1. All orders for supplies under these contracts must issue from the Secretary of Railways, and all goods must be delivered free of charge to the Railway Stores, Williamstown, unless otherwise ordered by the Secretary.

2. Notwithstanding the delivery of any castings into the store and a receipt having been given for them, should such castings turn out unsound, not in accordance with pattern or instructions, or in any way whatever defective, or of different quality of iron to that ordered, they must be taken away from the Railway Store at Williamstown at the expense of the contractor, and other castings must be supplied in lieu thereof, without delay, and without additional charge.

3. Tenderers must fill in opposite to each particular item in the schedule the price at which he undertakes to execute the work, according to the specification and conditions.

4. Should the contractor, in the opinion of the Engineer-in-Chief or the General Overseer of Locomotives, fail to furnish work in accordance with the specification, then, in seven days after due notice to that effect shall have been given in writing, the Secretary for Railways shall have full power to re-advertise and re-let this contract to any other person the Government shall think fit; and at the expiration of seven days after such notice shall have been given to the contractor this contract shall become null and void.

5. The contractor must furnish with each delivery detailed invoices or bills of parcels, in duplicate, showing quantity, rate, and value, also the number of the order of the goods, otherwise they will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered at one time.

6. The contractor will prepare his own account on the prescribed form, and render the same to the Railway Storekeeper for certification, previously to payment at the Treasury.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer requiring the supply as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the Commissioner of Railways, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. Any expense incurred on account of the rejection of supplies by a board of survey will be charged to the contractor.

8. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to the contractor.

9. The Railway Storekeeper will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior character, or
