REGULATIONS FOR REFINING OPIUM IN BOND.

THE accompanying Regulations for Refining Opium in Bond,
which have been approved by His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, in Council, in accordance with
the 9th section of the Act 38 Vict. No. 503, are published for general information.

1. The refining of opium in bond will be allowed for home consumption or exportation upon the following conditions:

2. Applications to be made in writing, specifying the building in which it is desired that refining opium in bond shall be carried on.

3. The buildings shall be subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs. The refining-house shall be capable of being secured under the locks of the Customs department as well as all other places for the storage of opium above mentioned.

4. The proprietor or occupier shall provide, at his own cost, all such locks and weighing-machines as the Collector of No. 22—Applie 1, 1876—1.

No. 22.-APRIL 2, 1875.-1.

Customs may require, and a suitable "Locker's Office," and shall keep the same in good repair.

5. Optim may be transferred from any bonded warehouse to the refining-house, into which it must be weighed, and a correct account thereof kept by the officer in charge; but at no time shall there be more than one hundred and sixty pounds stored in the refining house inclusive of the raw opium and opium in process of being refined or packed.

6. The refined opium, when repacked, must at once be replaced in a bonding warehouse, and residue must be placed in a store appointed for the purpose; and none of the residue shall be removed except it be destroyed to the satisfaction of the landing surveyor.

7. The refined opium must be repacked into tins without any brand or mark thereon, unless with the special approval of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, and only in whole or complete packages, each containing not less than forty-five pounds net weight.

8. The hours to be observed for the refining of opium and for receiving and delivering opium or residue for home consumption or exportation shall be the same as in bonding warehouses.

9. The men employed in the refining house to be searched when deemed necessary by the locker or other proper officer of customs.

There is a marked improvement in the general health of the districts this week. Of the 108 deaths 56 or nearly 52 per cent, were children not exceeding the age of 3 years, of which there were 37, or 34 per cent, under 1 year; and 19, or 17 per cent, of the ages of 1 to 5 year; the principal causes of mortality among them being diarrhea, and dysentery, and measles, but thatter is decidedly on the decline. Two cases of diphileria and one of typholi faver are reported from Richmond. In South Melbourne ten of the deaths occurred in public institutions, in Trahran three occurred in the Hospital, and in Kew four occurred in the Lunatic Asylum.

#### VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

Bye-law as to the Storage and Regulation of Traffic at the Lowell-Level Sidings, Batman's Hill, which are marked on Plan 10' 6" Level.

WHEREAS the ground at Batman's Hill now used for the traffic in logs, piles, firewood, &c., is required for other purposes: And whereas it has become necessary to take measures for the more prompt and efficient despatch of the said traffic: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and autherities vested in it by The Public Works Statute 1865, doth hereby make the following Bye-law for the removal of the said traffic to the lower-level sidings hereinafter mentioned, and for its regulation there:—

  1. Consignments of stone, lay, timber, firewood, or other material from country stations to Melbourne will be delivered, as hitherto, upon the present wood sidings up to 30th April 1875; but, on and after 1st May 1875, delivery of consignments upon these sidings will be discontinued, and trucks will be discharged only upon the lower-level sidings hereinafter mentioned. All consignments delivered upon the present sidings up to 30th April must be removed therefrom before 31st May 1875; and if not so removed, the department will, on 1st June 1875, remove and warehouse, at the cost and risk of the owner, all consignments which are then found upon the present wood sidings, or upon any grounds adjacent thereto, and on the same level which is marked on plan as the 24' level.

At the said lower-level sidings, storage will be charged upon all consignments allowed to remain on the ground over twelve hours after the truck is unloaded, and payment of the said storage at the rate hereinafter mentioned will be required on demand before the consignments are removed off the ground; but it shall be lawful for the Board to lease any portion or portions of the said lower-level sidings, upon such terms as to rent as may in writing be agreed upon; and the payment of the said rent under agreement shall be in lieu of the storage rate hereinafter mentioned chargeable under this bye-law.

  4. The area of the said lower-level sidings is shown on plan as divided into allotments of 25 ft. frontage, and a portion thereof will be offered by public tender for lease. Upon allotments for which tenders are accepted, hereinafter termed "Store Allotments," the Department will require payment of rent monthly in advance. The limits of each store allotment, or of contiguous store allotments held by one and the same person, will be marked on the ground by a post fixed at each of the four corners of the area, but all consignments de-

livered, whether upon store allotments or otherwise, must be according to the description thereof shown on the said plan,

The rate of storage applicable to all consignments deposited upon other than store allotments—i.e., upon allotments for which no tenders are accepted, and upon which rent is not payable monthly in advance as aforesaid—is 1s. 6d. per diem per allotment of 25 ft., frontage. Any portion of a day exceeding twelve working hours after a truck has been unloaded is to be computed a day, and any portion of an allotment to be computed as an allotment. And this charge applies to each foot of frontage which at any portion of its depth is occupied by consignments—that is to say, this charge for storage will not be increased or reduced by reason that the cubic capacity for stacking on the said frontage may or may not be made fully available.

The lessee of store allotments must, immediately trucks are unloaded, throw back such portions of the consignments as are within four feet from the rails at any portion of the entire frontage of his allotments; also stack his consignments highest at that portion of the allotments from the rails, and upon the whole area of his allotments stack the consignments to such a height that the storage area will hold all his consignments without obstructing the economical discharge of trucks by the Department. And the stacking up or levelling down of consignments, or the clearing them back from the rails must keep pace with the rate at which trucks are being unloaded; and should the lessee not have men in readiness, or not have men in sufficient number for this work, then the Department may at once, without further notice, do this work, and charge is per hour per man for the time so occupied. And in respect of consignments arriving for store allotments which are fully stacked, so that roon thereon or room enough cannot be made for the discharge of additional trucks, then such consignments will be delivered on any allotments convenient to the Department, and will be strictly subject to the rates of storage and conditions applicable to other than store allotments.

Upon other than store allotments, the said space of four feet from the rails must always be kept clear by the consignee immediately a truck is discharged, or in his default the work will be done by the Department, at a cost to the consignee of s. per hour per man for the time so employed; and if necessary for the quick and economical discharge of trucks, the aforesaid work of stacking up or levelling down must also be done by the consignee.

  8. A receipt must be given for each truck load or consignment when the truck is at its place of discharge. Should the lessee or the consignee not be present by himself or his agent to give a receipt, the unloading of each truck shall nevertheless proceed, and the lessee who is not present, or neglects to give a receipt within twelve hours after the truck is discharged, shall be held as infringing the conditions of his lease. And upon other than store allotments, consignments for which no receipts have been given, or for which the railway charges have not been paid on demand, or which have not been removed from the ground within twelve hours after the truck is

discharged, shall be liable to the storage charges aforesaid, or to be removed from the ground within twelve hours after the truck is discharged, or to be warehoused, or to be sold at the cost and risk of the said consignee. And no claims shall be recognized by the Department on account of trucks unloaded for which no receipts have been given; and after receipts have been given; the lessee or consignee shall be bound to observe the regulations as to gate passes.

9. No carts will be allowed to pass away loaded from the said lower-level sidings unless the carter produce to the gate-keeper, and leave with him, a gate pass signed by the consignee, showing the nature, ownership, and amount of the loading. The gate pass must be on forms which will be supplied by the Department on application. When the consignee, being absent from the sidings, sends a carter only, he must provide him beforehand with a signed gate pass, to show that the carter is the authorized agent of the consignee, and to enable the carter to pass the gate. In the case of lessees who are not present, but have always their men on the ground, they must notify the Department in writing as to the persons authorized to sign gate passes for them, and on such signature loads will be passed out on their account.

10. At other than store allotments, storage upon consignments not removed will commence to accrue twelve hours after the truck is discharged; but at any time after the expiry of the said twelve hours the department may, without any notice, sell the said consignments, or, remove the same to a timber-yard, warehouse, or store, there to be held at the cost and risk of the owner.
