RESTRICTIONS ON THE IMPORTATION OF CATTLE INTO TASMANIA.

THE following information has been received from the Government of Tasmania:—

All cattle imported into Tasmania from Victoria for slaughter must be landed at the Cattle Jetty, Hobart Town, after inspection by the proper officer (Mr. George Propsting), and at once placed in the proper slaughter-yards until killed.

All cattle which appear, on inspection, to be infectiously diseased will be immediately killed and disposed of as the inspecting officer may direct.

Cattle not for slaughter may be imported from Victoria if landed at the Steamers' Jetty, Hobart Town, or the Steamers' Wharf, Launceston (but not elsewhere), if on inspection they are considered free from infectious disease.

All cattle so landed are to be at once removed to such place, and there detained for such time as the inspecting officer may direct; and should any infectious disease appear in any such cattle before permission has been given for their removal, they will be immediately killed and disposed of as may be directed.

In all cases forty-eight hours' notice of a desire to land cattle not for slaughter must be given by letter or telegram to the proper officer at Hobart Town or Launceston (as the case may be), viz.:—

The penalty for removing cattle from any slaughter-house or yard without permission is £50 a head.

LYRE BIRD (MENURA SUPERBA) TO BE DEEMED NATIVE GAME.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the thirty-first year of Her Majesty's reign, intitled *An Act to protect Game* (31 Vict. No. 311), it is among other things enacted, that for the purposes of the said Act the term "game" shall mean and include all birds and other animals mentioned in the first schedule to the said Act, and the terms "native game" shall mean and include all birds and other animals mentioned in the second schedule to the said Act; provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time after the passing of the said Act by proclamation to name any other bird or animal which shall be included in such first or second schedule respectively, and after the publication of any such proclamation in the *Government Gazette* and the expiration of the period mentioned in such proclamation for the time of its coming into operation, the birds or other animals so named shall be deemed and considered as being thenceforward included in such schedule; and it is also enacted that the period of the year during which the said Act shall be in operation as regards all or any of the birds and other animals mentioned in the second schedule shall be from and after the first day of August until the thirtieth day of November in each year, or such other period as the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time direct: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby name the "Lyre Bird (*menura superba*)" as a bird which shall be included in the second schedule to the said Act annexed, upon the expiration of the period hereinafter mentioned for the coming into operation of this proclamation; and that the period of the year during which the said Act shall be in operation as regards the Lyre Bird aforesaid shall be from the first day of August to the thirty-first day of January in each year, both days included: And with the advice aforesaid I do appoint that this my Proclamation shall come into operation upon the expiration of seven days from the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

REGULATIONS RELATIVE TO LIME SITES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the third day of May 1875.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Administrator of the Government.

Mr. Kerferd

Mr. Ramsay.

WHEREAS by section 50 of *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to make rules and regulations for the purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the Regulations by Order in Council of the eighth day of April last past, relative to Licenses for Lime Sites at Geelong, and in lieu thereof doth make the Regulation following:—

REGULATION.

The licenses for Lime Sites at Geelong shall be issued subject to the following conditions, and shall only be renewable annually on the said conditions being fulfilled:—

Conditions of License.

1. The portion of surface soil required to be removed shall be carefully preserved and shall be placed apart by itself within the boundaries of the site, and all waste soil and debris shall be deposited in such places as may be directed by the Town Surveyor of Geelong.
2. The road may be diverted for the purpose of quarrying for limestone and relaid with the concurrence and under the direction of the Town Surveyor aforesaid.
3. Kiln sites can only be obtained east of those now under license.
4. Quarrying operations shall not be carried on within the boundaries of the land under license in such a manner as will in the opinion of the Town Surveyor endanger the public safety.
5. Quarrying or other operations by the licensee must not in any way interfere with or obstruct the public safety.
6. The licensee shall, within one month, commence to quarry the limestone on the site for which he shall hold a license, and convert the limestone so raised into good marketable lime, and shall, at the expiration of three months from the date of his license, and during each and every week thereafter, while his license or any renewal thereof is in force, make and produce from the stone so quarried 900 bags (if required) of good marketable roche lime per week from each site; provided that there shall always be on hand at the kiln ready for sale to the public in the order in which applications may be made or lodged, not less than 500 bags of such lime to supply the demands of the public.
7. That each bag of lime shall contain not less than three bushels of well-burned, screened, marketable lime; and not more than two shillings and threepence per bag shall be charged if delivery be required at the kiln, or into boats as is now the practice in connection with the Limeburners' Company, at Geelong; and three shillings per bag if delivery be required at the wharf in Melbourne. The bags shall be the property of the licensee, who will be entitled to charge one shilling per bag, which amount will be refunded, provided the bags be returned in good order within ten days.
8. That if at any time during the currency of a license, or of any renewal thereof, the license has not worked, and is not working the lime site fully and fairly according to his license, or has wilfully failed and neglected to have on hand at the kilns not less than 500 bags of lime to supply the requirements of the public as aforesaid, or that the lime prepared by the licensee is not good marketable roche lime, pure in quality, and that the bags do not contain three bushels of lime as aforesaid, due allowance being made for waste by transit to Melbourne, or that more has been demanded for each bag of lime than two shillings and threepence or three shillings at the respective places of delivery as aforesaid; then and in

such case, after the licensee shall have had an opportunity of showing cause against such forfeiture, in the manner provided by the 100th section of *The Land Act 1869*, the license may be forfeited, and thereupon all moneys previously paid by the licensee, together with all erections, improvements, plant, and materials then on the lands mentioned in such license shall become and be the property of the Board of Land and Works; and the production of a copy of the *Government Gazette* containing a notice, purporting to be signed by the Minister of Lands, of the forfeiture of the license shall be conclusive evidence that such license has been lawfully determined and annulled.

3. Orders received on or before Saturday the 22nd May will be supplied, as far as practicable, on the 1st June next, before which date no trees will be delivered: and orders received after that date will be supplied in turn, to be regulated by the post date upon the envelope enclosing it, and when two or more orders shall bear the same date, then alphabetically.

4. When an order cannot be supplied in full, a refund shall be made to the person whose name appears in the deposit-receipt; but such refund shall be made only on the certificate of the Superintendent of the State Nursery, and shall be only for the amount named in his certificate.

5. The Superintendent of the State Nursery will pack, address, and deliver the trees at the Macedon railway station, unless any purchaser should select personally to superintend the same or should appoint another to do so in his behalf, but in such case no deduction in the prices will be made as an allowance for cost of packing.

6. All charges levied upon the trees subsequent to their delivery at the railway station, Macedon, shall be borne by the consignee.

7. This department will deliver the trees in good order at the Macedon railway station, but it will not undertake any liability in respect of the loss, miscarriage, detention, non-delivery, damage, or decay of the same subsequent to their delivery thereat.

The return of deaths this week compares very favorably with that of any preceding week since the end of November last. Bronchial affections are reported at Hawthorn, Brunswick, and Prahran, and diarrhoea at Footscray and Prahran; with these exceptions the districts are healthy. Of the 91 deaths 36 or 39 per cent. were children not exceeding 3 years of age, 19 or 20 per cent. being under the age of 1 year, and 17 or 18 per cent. being of the ages of 1 to 3 years. Of the 14 deaths at Richmond 13 were children, 11 being under the age of 1 year, but there is no particular disease to account for this large number. The following deaths occurred in public institutions:—At Kew, 1 in the Asylum; at South Melbourne, 5 in the hospital and 1 in the immigrant's home; at Prahran, 4 in the hospital.

SHIRES OF BULLEEN AND NUNAWADING.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the third day of May 1875.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it is amongst other things enacted, that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council may, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding, upon a rate not exceeding one shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Act, the sum of five hundred pounds, a shire; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may make Orders altering for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of conterminous municipal districts, being shires, without any notice; and it is further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act shall be published in the *Government Gazette* and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, signed by not less than fifty inhabitants of the part of Victoria described in such petition (being a portion of the Shire of Nunawading), each of whom possesses rateable property therein, praying that such part should be constituted a municipality by the name of the Shire of Bulleen: And whereas such petition has been published in the manner directed by the said Act and no counter-petition in opposition thereto has been presented: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make Orders constituting and describing a shire to be named the Shire of Bulleen and defining the boundaries of the conterminous Shire of Nunawading in manner following, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF BULLEEN.—Bounded by a line commencing at the centre of the Yarra-yarra River opposite the south-west corner of the parish of Bulleen, county of Bourke; thence up the centre of the said river to opposite the north-west corner of section xii., parish of Warrandyte, county of Evelyn, east to the said corner, south to the south-east corner of section xxiv., same parish; west to the south-west corner of the same section; thence south to the Mullum-mullum Creek; down this creek to a point east of the south-east corner of the parish of Bulleen; west to the said corner and along the south boundary of the said parish to the commencing point.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken for the boundary line.

SHIRE OF NUNAWADING.—Bounded by a line commencing at the south-west angle of portion 58, parish of Nunawading, county of Bourke; thence by a line bearing north to the Koenung-koenung Creek, up said creek to the north-east angle of portion 66, parish of Nunawading; thence east to the Mullum-mullum Creek, up said creek to the north-east angle of allotment 128A, parish of Nunawading; thence south to the Dandenong Creek, down that creek to the south-east angle of portion 110, parish of Nunawading; thence by a line bearing west to the commencing point.

Whenever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

And the Administrator of the Government, with the advice aforesaid, doth, further order and direct that the Council of the said shire of Bulleen shall consist of six members, and that the said shire shall not at present be subdivided.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

MUNICIPAL SURVEYORS' BOARD.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1874* the Administrator of the Government, in Council, has by Order of the 3rd of May 1875, made the following regulations, viz:—

REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH CERTIFICATES WILL BE ISSUED TO MUNICIPAL SURVEYORS BY THE "MUNICIPAL SURVEYORS' BOARD" APPOINTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE "LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1874."

1. Examinations of candidates for certificates of "Competency," "Service," or "Qualification" will be held in Melbourne, at a place to be from time to time hereafter appointed, commencing at Ten o'clock a.m. on the first Tuesday in the months of February, May, August, and November in each year.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

2. Candidates must be in attendance in the Examination Room punctually at the hour named each day, and in the event of any adjournment at the hour named for such adjournment.

3. Every candidate must forward, fourteen clear days at least before the day of examination on which he intends to present himself, to the secretary to the Board, notice in writing of such intention, and at the same time must enclose his Articles of Indenture, or satisfactory certificates (with copies of same on foolscap paper) of not less than three years' preliminary service in the offices of some, one or more, competent engineer or surveyor.

4. Satisfactory evidence must be produced, if required, of the age and respectability of character of any candidate, and no candidate shall be eligible for examination under the age of twenty-three years, or who has been convicted of a breach of trust.

5. Regulations Nos. 3 and 4 being duly complied with the candidate will receive a notice from the Secretary that his preliminary papers have been accepted or rejected, as the case may be, and if accepted must, upon receipt of notice to such effect, forward to the Secretary the sum of (£2 2s.) Two pounds two shillings; the production of the receipt for which will be the candidate's passport to the examination room.

6. Two classes of certificates of competency will be issued (marked A and B), B being the ordinary certificate, and that marked A denoting that the candidate has passed with credit.

7. If a candidate presents himself more than twice, and is successful at the third or any subsequent examination the last fee will be returned to him.

8. Gentlemen holding the B certificate under this or previous statutes may present themselves for the purpose of obtaining the A certificate, on payment of a fee of (£1 1s.) One pound one shilling, and giving notice to the secretary, not less than fourteen clear days before the day of examination, of intention to come forward for said certificate.

9. Candidates must provide themselves with drawing instruments, scales, and a book of logarithms.

10. Each examination will occupy the space of three days, during which six sets of questions will be issued to each candidate.

The 1st, 3rd, and 5th sets of questions will be issued at 10 a.m. each day, and the replies thereto must be handed to the secretary before 1 p.m. The 2nd, 4th, and 6th sets of questions will be issued at 2 p.m. each day, and the replies thereto must be handed to the secretary before 5 p.m.

The answers to the questions must be written on one side only of each sheet of paper, signed by the candidate, arranged in consecutive order, with the question sheet on the top, and pinned together.

Any candidate detected in the act of using books or notes (except a book of logarithms), or of giving or receiving assistance will be dismissed from the examination room:

14. Cheques will not be accepted, in any case, in payment of the fees demanded.

15. Every applicant whether for certificate of competency, service, or qualification, must legibly give his name in full, and postal address in the margin of his letter of application.

SHIRE OF KYNETON.

BYE-LAW No. IV.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Kyneton, made under section 213 of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered IV., for regulating the due management of the business of Council of the Shire of Kyneton, and the conduct of their officers and servants.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the president, councillors, and ratepayers, of the Shire of Kyneton order as follows:—

That Bye-law No. 1, for providing for the due management of the affairs of the council, and regulating the conduct of their officers and servants, heretofore existing, be and the same is hereby repealed.

The president, councillors, and ratepayers, of the said shire doth further order that Bye-law No. IV. shall be in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

1. In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages, of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall be signed as by the "Local Government Act 1874" required.

3. After the signing of the minutes aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but, for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

1. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
2. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
3. Reading and ordering on reports of committees and officers.
4. Payments.
5. Receiving deputations.
6. Orders of the day.
7. Extraordinary business under new rules and regulations.
8. Motions of which previous notice has been duly given.
9. Notices of motion.
10. Tenders.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

DIVISIONS.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman; and, if requested by any councillor present at the meeting when such division takes place, the names of the councillors voting on the division shall be recorded in the minutes of the said meeting. And any councillor present and not voting—not being disabled by law—shall be guilty of an offence.

ADDRESSES TO GOVERNOR.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the president and the secretary of the shire, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

PETITIONS AND MEMORIALS.

6. No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day. And every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall acquaint himself with its contents, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that its contents does not violate any bye-law or provision hereof, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.

7. No debate shall take place upon any petition or memorial except as to its being received and taken into consideration as an order of the day, or at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

DEPUTATIONS.

8. Deputations from ratepayers wishing to be heard before the council in support of any petition or otherwise must acquaint some one of the councillors representing them, or the secretary, of their intended interview.

ORDERS OF THE DAY.

9. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council; any business which the president may think fit to bring under consideration; and any matter arising out of the correspondence, reports, memorials, read or presented during the same day, if by special motions ordered to be considered.

MOTIONS.

10. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given to the secretary, and by him read at the close of the meeting at which they are handed in.

11. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved shall be struck out.

12. No motion shall be proceeded with, in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

13. The mover of every motion appointing a committee, shall be a member of such committee.

14. Unless in cases of emergency no sum exceeding the amount of Five pounds (£5) shall be expended by the council, unless by notice of motion duly given.

15. It shall be competent for any councillor, by notice, to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of any subject at the next meeting or any subsequent meeting, and due notice thereof shall be given by the secretary to each councillor, by post or otherwise, of the day for which this order of the day or notice of motion, for which such call is made, is set down for consideration, and any councillor not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question or any amendment thereof, shall be guilty of an offence, unless reasonable cause for such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the council.

DEBATE.

16. Every councillor, including the president, shall stand up while addressing the council.

17. The president's ruling shall be final in all matters of order or practice.

18. Any councillor desirous of making a motion, or amendment, or taking part in a discussion, shall rise and address the chairman and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down, until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

19. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

20. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

21. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

22. A councillor moving or seconding a motion or amendment shall not be held to have spoken thereon.

23. The councillors in meeting of council assembled shall designate each other by the official titles, namely, that of president or councillor, as the case may require.

24. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

25. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

26. A councillor called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

27. No councillor shall use offensive or disorderly language, and every councillor so doing shall, upon being called to order by the chairman, apologize for such conduct and withdraw such language, and on his refusal so to do, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

28. Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may on his order be forthwith removed, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

29. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

30. The mover of every original proposition and amendment shall have a right to reply immediately, after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

31. One amendment only shall be discussed at a time, but, if lost, one other may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other amendment thereon.

32. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the council; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negative, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on the motions moved and seconded, or on any order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the council at the point at which it was so interrupted.

COMMITTEES.

33. Minutes of all proceedings of committee shall be entered in the committee's minute book, and, being signed by the chairman of committee, shall be presented to the council.

PROTESTS.

34. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall be given forthwith, on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council, by the protesting councillor, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given, previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

APPOINTMENTS, ETC.

35. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the shire inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

36. The salary or allowance attached to the offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, before advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

37. The shire office shall be open every day (except Sundays and bank holidays) between the hours of Ten and Three, and Saturdays from Ten till Twelve noon; during which hours shall attend to transact the business of the council. The engineers and inspectors shall attend during the hours of every council meeting, and at such committee meetings as they may be required.

TENDERS, ETC.

38. The security in all cases of contracts shall be ten per cent. upon the amount of contract, except contracts under £20, on all of which a uniform deposit of £1 shall be required, and shall be paid over by the contractor to the treasurer of the council, which amount shall be lodged in the bank with the other moneys of the council, and only repaid to the contractor when he obtains a final certificate that the works under such contract are satisfactorily completed.

39. All contractors tendering for any works under the council, failing to take up their contracts the tenders for which have been accepted by the council, shall be disqualified from receiving any contracts for works under the said council, as follows:—For contracts amounting to £50 and upwards, twelve months, and for contracts under £50, six months.

40. Applications from contractors for extension of time on contracts, or remission of fines imposed thereon, shall not be entertained or allowed by the council unless carried by a two-thirds majority of the councillors present at the meeting at which such applications are made.

41. The secretary of the council shall have the custody of the common seal of the corporation, and shall be responsible for the same, and verify each impression by his signature, except in cases of powers of attorney and other legal documents not relating to the corporation, the signatures to which require to be verified before the president by declaration; and in any such case the said seal shall and may be affixed by the

secretary to the president's certificate accompanying the same, on receipt of a fee of Ten shillings and sixpence for each attestation.

42. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this Bye-law may be suspended *pro tem.* in cases of emergency, and with the consent of two-thirds of the councillors present at any meeting.

PENALTY.

43. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance, or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission, contrary to any provision contained in this Bye-law, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.
