## HYDROGRAPHICAL MEMORANDUM, NO. 11.

THE accompanying Hydrographical information, relating to places on the Australian Station, which I have received from various sources, is hereby promulgated for general information and guidance.

Extracts from Remark Book, Navigating Lieutenant H. W. Campion, H.M.S. *Blanche*, 31st December 1874.

*Samoa, Apia*.—There are several rocky patches further out than the main reef. We passed over one in 5 fathoms or less, Apia Mountain S.E. by E. (Samoa Islands, chart No. 1730).

*Auckland, N.Z.*—Britomart Point is fast being cut away for reclaiming the sea between it and Wynyard pier for the railway, it is therefore of little use as a leading mark. (Chart No. 1970).

*Wangaroa, N.Z.*—One of the safest harbors in New Zealand; the entrance is narrow, but plenty of water. It is one of the principal ports for Kauri pine.

*French Passage, N.Z.*—The tides must be carefully attended to; it would be impossible to go through against the tide. Turnings very narrow and circuitous.

*Duke of York Island to New Ireland*.—On passage experienced a southerly set of two knots an hour along the coast of New Ireland.

*Rotumah Island, Lee Bay*.—Sighted the island at a distance of 32'. The N. point of island, plan 987, marked "Bluff," is a low well-wooded point, the Bluff being the N.W. point forming the W. point of Lee Bay; it is of red sandstone, and rises abruptly from the sea to about 600 feet. Water cannot be obtained in Lee Bay. Landing can only be effected at high water. The reef off the N. point extends two cables further to the N.W. than shown.

*Ellice Group, Funafuti Island*.—The S.W. point and west sides of this lagoon are laid down incorrectly on P. Chart 766. The group of islands off the S.W. point run in a N.N.W. direction. The westernmost island of the Lagoon Reef extends nearly 4' further to the westward than marked. The two channels marked on S.W. side of Lagoon are not navigable for large vessels. There are two good ship channels—one on the N. side, the other on the S. side. *Rosario* entered lagoon by the N. channel, least water 5 fathoms. To enter this channel it is necessary to bring the extreme of large island to bear S. 40° E. + S. 80° E., you will then be close off the entrance. On the west side is a small sand cay with a few coconut-trees on it; on east side is much larger cay, well wooded, (having the appearance of two islands at high water). The deepest water is near the west shore, about one-third the breadth from the W. islet. When through the passage a S.E. by E. course, with slight deviations, will take you to a position off the Mission Station, distant about 7', passing four or five shoal patches visible when the light is favorable. Good anchorage in 11 fathoms sand, with Mission houses (remarkable white-washed buildings) S. 63° E.; S. point of large island S. 22° W.

Between 3rd and 4th islets off S.W. point of large island, is a good ship channel, having 7 fathom in the deepest part, which is nearer to the 3rd island or eastern shore. Between this passage and the Mission House Station, there is only one shoal, and that is near the passage.

*Gilbert Group, Taputonea or Drummond Island*.—Anchored off N.W. side of island, N. point N. 6° E., and south extreme of land S. 61° E., in 15 fathoms sand. I should recommend a vessel not to go inside 17 fathoms, where there is a fine sandy bottom about two cables outside the first break on the reef. This is a fair anchorage with the wind east of south, and has the advantage of enabling a ship to stand clear of the north reef to sea, in case the wind should shift to the westward, when it would no longer be a safe anchorage. Communication with the shore is difficult—not enough water at low tide, and heavy rollers at high tide. Traders have to wait their opportunity to ship cargo. No water procurable. High water, F. and C. 6 hours 15 minutes. Flood stream sets to the southward.

*Nonouti Island*.—The distance from the north point to south point about 20'.

Traders anchor along the S.W. reef in 20 fathoms. It is reported that the S.W. point of reef extends much further to the southward than shown on chart 731; a S.W. course should be steered for 10' from south point to clear it. Were unable to verify report, on account of the unfavourable position of the sun.

*Gilbert Group, Apaiang Island*.—Entered the lagoon by the Bingham Channel at half ebb; found the stream running nearly 4 knots; anchored 2 cables inside in 10 to 12 fathoms, sand and coral uneven bottom. Both entrances to this lagoon are too shallow for vessels drawing more than 12 feet. You carry 4 to 5 fathoms till nearly through, when there is a bar with numerous boulders on it; between these boulders there is from 2 to

3 fathoms. To anchor outside this channel you would be in the strength of the tide, which runs with great force during the full and change.

*Tarawa Islands*.—Sailing along the N.W. point of Tarawa, observed a line of sandspits running to S.W. from north point, probably 2' further than shown on plan.

There is a shoal just inside the entrance; you can pass on either side. After passing the sea reef, you have a number of shoal patches ahead; to avoid them haul well to the southward, skirting along the inside of sea reef, not less than 6 fathoms.

To find the passage, bring S.W. Islet of Tarawa to bear S. 26° E., and a small sand islet with a few coconut-trees on it in the lagoon S. 80° E.; the passage will then be in line with the islet. The tide does not run very strong. After clearing the passage you may choose your anchorage.

*Rosario's anchorage* marks W. and of S., West Island S. 34° W., E. end of ditto S. 8° E., Sand Islet N. 80° E. No supplies or water procurable.

*Taritari or Touching Island*.—Long. 172° 47' E. The plan of this island is a good guide. There are only two channels, divided by a small islet; the southern one being the deepest, about 4 cables wide; least water between sea reefs, 9 fathoms. There are numerous shoal patches inside—which are easily avoided when the light is favorable—with deep water between them. The course in would be about N.E. until inside all the shoals; then stand towards the remarkable house (270 feet long and 70 feet high) S. 26° E.; anchor in 13 fathoms sand and coral, with house S. 26° N. of South Island S. 60° W. Brackish water in small quantities can be obtained. (The longitude of this island, viz., 172° 4' E., given in Hydrographical Memo., No. 7, is incorrect.)

*Marshall Islands, Milli or Mulgrave Islands, Port Rhin*.—The best route in is to keep along the west reefs, passing between them and a reef 2 cables to the eastward; haul to the S.W., and anchor as convenient in about 15 fathoms, mud and sand, 2 cables S. of Towkowa reef, with centre of Bar Island N.W.

*Marshall Islands, Arhno or Pedder Island*.—The east channel into the lagoon has 3½ fathoms least water at half flood. This is a good channel for vessels drawing not more than 15 feet. There are several boulders, with 3½ fathoms on each side of the deep 4½-fathoms passage. The eastern side of the lagoon appears to be pretty clear of dangerous reefs. *Rosario* sailed through Boat Passage, west of High Island; least water, 5 fathoms, about 1 cable wide. West side of lagoon is said to be very foul.

The next passage, west of the one taken by the *Rosario*, is also marked "Boat Passage," and has a deep channel, with a reef just inside.

A dangerous shoal, with only 6 feet, lies about 1½ mile S. of High Island, right in the fair way from Taka-lip passage to Trading Station.

*Marshall Islands, Elmore Islands*.—The south coast of Elmore Islands runs east and west for nearly 12'; in the centre is a good ship passage. Coming from the westward the passage opens out bearing N.E. by N. A village stands on the east bank of passage, with two remarkable coconut-trees towering above the surrounding trees. Least water obtained in passage, 10 fathoms.

When passing between the islands, steering about N.N.E., a reef will be seen right a head, inside the lagoon. When inside the islands two channels present themselves—one to the eastward, the other to the N.W. by N.

*Rosario* took the north-westerly passage, which is about ¼ long and 150 yards wide. After clearing the passage, haul to the S.S.W., and anchor in 22 fathoms sand and coral, off a small islet on the reef. The tide does not run strong. The channel is straight.

*Arecifos or Providence Islands*.—Correct longitude, 160° 56' E.; that given in Hydrographical Memo. No. 7 (viz., 160° 35') is incorrect, and is to be altered. The passage into the lagoon is on the south side, in the middle of the group. On the west side of the passage is a large islet, having the appearance of two islets from the east; on the east side there is a small islet.

This channel is supposed to be clear, with 4 fathoms least water, the west shore being the deepest.

Anchorage may be had just inside the lagoon, under the west islet, in 18 fathoms; a better one about 4 miles to the eastward, in 11 fathoms.

*Strong Island, Chabrol Harbor*.—Chabrol Harbor is by far the best one for a man-of-war, being easy of access at all times and open to the sea breeze, well protected from the heavy S.W. winds which prevail.

All the dangers are visible at low tide, but, from the muddy nature of the bottom, are not generally seen at high water, especially after rain.

Extract from "Remark Books" of Lieutenant Sanders and Navigating Sub-Lieutenant Sabben, of H.M. schooner *Alacrity*.

*A Rock*.—A rock of reddish appearance, about 3 feet above water, was seen by the schooner *Melaine* in August 1870. The master places it in lat. 21° 26' S., and long. 170° 57' E.; determined from position at noon.

*New Hebrides Islands, Erromango Island, and Elizabeth Bay*.—Elizabeth Bay is not recommended, on account of its deep water, 14 fathoms to within 200 yards of the shore; bottom, coral and sand; with a westerly wind a vessel could not lie there. Dillon's Bay, which is 7' further south, has nearly the same disadvantages, but is not so deep, having 3 to 7 fathoms sand; it is more frequented by traders.

*Solomon Islands, San Christoval Island, Makira Harbor*.—Makira Harbor is difficult to make out from seaward; the best leading marks would be Phillip Island to the southward, and Ergo Island the northward; the latter is a peculiar little island rising to a knob at one end.

Off Observatory Point there is a detached rock with a small tree or shrub on its summit; this rock seen with its tree just clear of those overhanging from the shore clears passage ledge. The harbor ridge being often obscured by clouds is not to be trusted as a leading mark. A shoal patch extends from the outer south point of entrance towards Phillip Island, about 1 mile, with apparently not more than 1 to 2 fathoms over it. Between Phillip Island and the main land the water is full of shoals.

**Hermit Islands.**—The Hermit group consists of 17 islands, enclosed by a reef which extends about 12' north and south by 16' east and west. There are four entrances through this reef, two on its east and two on its west side. The largest island, which is the only high land visible, lies in the S.W. part of the group, not N.W., as marked in the Directory. Its centre bearing about S.W. by W. will lead through the northernmost of the eastern entrances, steering a W. by S. course with about 8 fathoms in passage till the N.E. islet, which is rather more than a mile from the entrance, bears N.W. by W., then steer for it, anchoring about half-way between it and the entrance, in 8 fathoms, sandy bottom. The other passage on this side is about 400 yards further south, and is preferable as a passage, I think, its limits being more clearly defined; but there is a patch with only a few feet of water on it, lying just inside, and with a northerly wind there would not be working room. Either of these passages could be easily taken by directions from the mast-head.

At the anchorage the only tide that is felt is for about four hours after low-water, when it runs nearly 3 knots in a south-westerly direction. There appears to be but one tide a day. It would not be advisable to attempt either of these passages while this strong tide lasts, unless favored by a strong steady wind; the tide ripples make it difficult to discern the reefs.

**L' Echiquiers Islands** are described by a trader as consisting of 37 islands, enclosed by a narrow reef, through which there are several passages; the one chiefly used being on the N.E. side. The natives number 800, and are frequently at war with the Hermit Islanders.

**Rennell or Kennell Island.**—The master of a vessel that was wrecked on the Indispensable Reef reports having landed on Rennell Island in search of water, but could find none. This island is marked on several charts as of doubtful existence.

Extracts from Captain's and Navigating Lieutenant's Remark Books, of H.M.S. *Dido*, 1874.

**Conway Reef.**—No vegetation could be seen on the cay.

**L' Enfant Perdu.**—Passed over the position of this island, without seeing anything from the masthead.

**Fiji, Viti Levu, Sarua Harbor.**—After passing the opening into Grandby Harbor, south coast of Viti Levu, the island in Sarua Harbor will be seen just clear of the mainland. The island is composed of two hills of moderate height and a low gap between them. On it is a large native village. The break in the reef just east of the island leading to Sarua Harbor is clear, and a good anchorage may be found in 15 fathoms. The gap in the island N. 80° W. This harbor is well sheltered by the sea reefs. A few miles east of Sarua is a large break in the reef, having a small sand islet on its eastern side.

Extracts from a Letter from Messieurs Capelle and Co.

**Bonham Islands, Marshall Group.**—This Atoll, called by the natives "Jaluij," is composed of a large number of islets, more or less extensive, surrounding a spacious lagoon. Its position is from 5° 47' to 6° 18' N. lat., and from 169° 25' to 169° 49' E. long. On the east side there are four good passages, and on the west one. Of these, the best is undoubtedly the S.E. or "Barossa Passage"; it is short, easily entered, and has at least 8 fathoms water in its shoalest part. On rounding the islet forming the south side of the passage a vessel can at once find an anchorage in a perfectly safe and commodious harbor. The depth of water varies gradually from 4 to 25 fathoms, with a sandy bottom.

#### PART II. OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDING STATUTE 1867" EXTENDED.

##### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and the Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310), it is amongst other things enacted, that Part II. of the said Act shall apply to all portions where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, has been in force, and all or some of the provisions of the said Part shall also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council may at any

time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the above recited Act, 31 Vict. No. 310, shall apply to the respective shires hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF NUNAWADING,  
THE SHIRE OF BULLEEN.

# QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

*Pursuant to Orders of 23 December 1874.*

**BRENNANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT** (including Brennanah and Coyoora Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and southern boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

**POSTLETHWAITE OR BAILESTON QUARANTINE DISTRICT**.—Commencing at the point where the southern boundary of the Protectorate run abuts on the Goulburn River; thence by the southern boundaries of that run and the Waranga run, the south-eastern boundary of Colbinabbin South run, and by the northern and eastern boundaries of Cherrington run to Compton's Creek run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; and thence down that river to the commencing point.

**POWLETT'S PLAINS QUARANTINE DISTRICT** (including Powlett's Plains run).—Commencing at a point on the River Loddon, being the north-east angle of allotment 62, parish of Kinypaniel; thence southerly along the said River Loddon to the northernmost angle of the Salisbury Plains run; thence westerly and southerly to the northernmost boundary of the Brennanah run; thence westerly along the said boundary to the eastern boundary of the Torpichen run; thence northerly along the said boundary to the southernmost boundary of the Edgar Plains run; and thence easterly to the point of commencement.

**PROTECTORATE QUARANTINE DISTRICT** (including Protectorate run).—Commencing at the north-east angle of Waranga run; on the west by that run; on the south by Postlethwaite run on the east by the Goulburn River for about seven miles; thence by a line running north-west to the commencing point.

**SANDHURST DISTRICT, FREEHOLD PROPERTIES IN THE Parish of Powlett—Clancy**.—Comprising allotments 10 and 12, lying on the north side of the main road from Salisbury Plains pre-emptive right to Kinypaniel in the county of Gladstone. Parish of Kinypaniel—Mackins.—Comprising allotment 95 on the River Loddon, in the county of Gladstone.

**WARANGA QUARANTINE DISTRICT**.—Commencing at the south-east corner of Toolamba run, on the Goulburn River; thence by the southern boundaries of that run and Wanaita East run to Gobareep run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to Colbinabbin South run; thence by a portion of the northern and eastern boundaries of that run to Postlethwaite run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; and thence by that river to the point of commencement: Provided that the road from Corop to Rushworth and Whroo shall form no part of the said quarantine district.

*Pursuant to Order of 12 April 1875.*

**MANSFIELD QUARANTINE DISTRICT**.—Commencing at the source of the Howqua River in Mount Howitt; thence down that river to Tarika run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to Jamieson River; thence down that river to Goulburn River; thence down that river to its junction with the Delatite River; thence up that river to Wapman run; thence by the southern boundary of that run north-westerly to the eastern boundary of Mount Pleasant B run; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the Maitongoon West B run; thence by that run easterly to the Delatite River; thence down that river and the Goulburn River to Balham Hill run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run, Killingworth, Murrindindi East, Island, and Muddy Creek A runs to the Main Dividing Range; and thence by that range easterly and northerly to the point of commencement: Provided always that the Upper Thornton run shall form no part of said quarantine district.

## CLEAN DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 66th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Clean Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined shall be Clean Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

*Pursuant to Orders of 23 December 1874.*

**GERLONG CLEAN DISTRICT**.—Commencing at Cape Otway; thence by a line bearing northerly to the south-east angle of the Forrest run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Pirron Yallock runs to the shore of Lake Corangamite; thence by the eastern boundary of that lake to the Junction Creek

which forms the southern boundary of the Poliah run; thence by the said southern boundary and the north-eastern boundary of said run to the Frenchman's station; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Glenfins runs, and by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Nairngal run; thence by a portion of the eastern boundary of Nairngal run and the eastern boundary of Mount Rute run to the south-east corner of allotment 80 parish of Manubadar; thence by a straight line easterly to the junction of a small creek with the River Leigh about twenty-six chains north of the Mount Mercer Cattle Station pre-emptive right; thence down the said River Leigh to the boundary of Golf Hill property easterly and southerly to the boundary of Native Creek property; thence southerly by the boundary of said property to the Burnside property; thence southerly and westerly by the boundaries of Barwon Park, Murdiduke, Ingelby, and Yan-yan Gurt properties to the west corner of allotment 20 A, parish of Bambara; thence southerly by the surveyed road to Loutitt Bay, and thence south-westerly by the sea shore to the point of commencement.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and the Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Act; and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to and increase the Common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

WICKLIFFE TOWN COMMON.—The Wickliffe Town Common, proclaimed by Order of the 6th November 1865, is hereby

increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries described as follows, viz.:— Commencing at a point on the northern bank of the River Hopkins where it is crossed by the road from Dunkeld to Strathlam; thence by that road bearing north-westerly to the western boundary of the township of Wickliffe; thence by the township boundary bearing south, east, and north to a point bearing east from the north-east angle of the Cemetery reserve; thence by the existing common bearing west to the River Hopkins aforesaid; and thence down that river to the point of commencement. The following is a description of the country indicated on the tracing, viz: Bounded by a line commencing at the junction of the McAllister and Thomson Rivers; thence down the latter to the west boundary of the parish of Sale, north along this boundary to the corner of allotment A 25, parish of Bundalaguah, on the Sale and Maffra road; thence to the south-east corner of that allotment; thence north to the north-east corner of allotment B 13 same parish; thence west along a two-chain road to allotment 6 A, the south-east corner of the parish of Wa-de-Lock; thence north to allotment 7, and east along that parish boundary to the River Avon; east across that river to the south-east corner of Raymond's section; thence north and partly west to allotment 20, section IV.; thence north to the northern boundary of the parish of Stratford; thence north by the two-chain road on the eastern boundary of the parish of Briagolong direct to Mount Wellington; thence by the county boundary of Tangil to Donnelly's Creek; thence south to the Thomson River; thence down this river to the starting point.

## SHIRE OF MANSFIELD.

## BYE-LAW No. IX.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Mansfield, made under section 213 of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered 9, for controlling and managing and preserving commons.—(12th May 1875.)

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the president, councillors, and ratepayers of the Shire of Mansfield ordain as follows:—

1. This bye-law shall regulate the controlling, managing, and preserving of the "Mansfield United Town and Ford's Creek Farmers' Common," and all other commons the management whereof may hereafter devolve upon the council.

2. In this bye-law—save where there is something in the context inconsistent therewith—

"The managers" shall mean the members of the council for the time being, or a quorum of not less than three of their number.

"The secretary" shall mean the secretary of the council for the time being.

"The herdsman" shall mean any person appointed by the managers to take charge of cattle licensed to depasture on any common.

"Large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, colts, fillies, geldings, asses, and mules.

"Small cattle" shall mean goats only.

"The fees" shall mean all charges made for the privilege of depasturing any cattle on any common, and the money recovered from the owners of cattle trespassing on the area of any common.

3. The fees chargeable per annum for depasturing cattle upon any common shall be payable half-yearly (in advance), according to the following scale, viz.:—

	£	s.	d.
For each mare, gelding, colt, filly, or ass	0	5	0
For each cow, heifer, oxen, or steer	0	4	0
For each goat	0	1	0

4. No charge shall be made for cattle under six months old running with their dams.

5. Residents within five miles of any common only shall be entitled to depasture cattle thereon.

6. Persons occupying land not exceeding twenty acres shall be entitled to depasture on any common five head of large cattle, or ten head of small cattle; and if exceeding that number, one head of large cattle in respect of every additional six acres of land occupied above twenty acres.

7. No person shall be entitled to depasture more than fifty head of large cattle or ten head of small cattle on any common.

8. No entire horse or bull over nine months old, or male goat over six months old, shall be allowed to depasture in any common, without the consent of the managers in writing.

9. Dead or diseased cattle found on any common the owner whereof shall neglect or refuse to remove or burn the same within twenty-four hours after receiving notice thereof in writing by any person authorized in that behalf by the managers, shall be so removed or burned by direction of the managers at the expense of the owner.

10. No cattle shall be received on any common until the fees in respect of the same are paid, and a depasturing license under the hand of the secretary has been issued.

11. Cattle licensed to depasture on any common shall be delivered to the herdsman of such common at the yards of the shire pound, and be branded as the managers may direct.

12. No person shall remove any cattle from off any common without the permission in writing of the managers or the herdsman, and then only to the nearest yard for drafting.

13. Any cattle found trespassing shall be impounded by the herdsman or other person authorized by the managers in that behalf.

14. The managers may from time to time appoint a herdsman or other persons to give effect to these regulations, as they may think proper or necessary, and from time to time remove them and appoint others in their places, and may, out of the common fund, pay such salaries or remuneration as the managers shall think reasonable.

15. The herdsman of every common shall collect the fees due, and account for the same once at least in every month, to the secretary, or to the managers if there be no secretary, furnishing at the same time a detailed statement of the number of licenses issued, the cattle depastured on any common, the names of their respective owners, and the amount of fees received and paid over to the secretary in respect of the same.

16. After the coming into operation of this bye-law all previously made regulations, resolutions of the council, and all contracts and agreements relating to the management of the Mansfield United Town and Ford's Creek Farmers' Common shall be and are hereby rescinded.

17. The managers shall have power from time to time to alter and amend the foregoing regulation in any way they may deem right or necessary, in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Act 1874. No. 1697

## TOWN OF COLLINGWOOD.

## BYE-LAW No. 37.

A Bye-law of the Town of Collingwood made under section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874" and numbered 37 for the prevention and the suppression of the nuisance resulting from the storage of large quantities of petroleum and other volatile fluids in ordinary stores and buildings.

IN pursuance of the power conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874": The Mayor Councillors and Burgesses of the Town of Collingwood order as follows:—

I. That from and after the date of this bye-law coming into operation no greater quantity than one hundred and fifty gallons in the whole of petroleum naphtha turpentine or other similar volatile fluid or fluids shall be placed or retained at any one and the same time in any one building and the yards offices and appurtenances thereof unless in any building which shall be situated at a distance of not less than one hundred feet from any other building and which shall be of the description following that is to say either a shed divided into compartments of moderate dimensions well ventilated at the top and having the floor thereof sunk to any depth that may be preferred so as to be of sufficient capacity to contain the fluid contents of such shed and not being less than three feet. Or a ground floor shed properly ventilated at the top surrounded by a trench three feet deep by two feet wide at a distance equal to the height of the walls of such shed having guiding drains into the said trench down which in case of fire the burning liquid may flow into the said trench and surrounded beyond such trench by a brick wall without break or opening and of not less than one-half the height of the walls of such shed.

II. Any person who being the occupier or having the use or control of any building or tenement of whatsoever description within the town of Collingwood (not being a building situated and constructed in manner described in the first section of this bye-law) who shall place or cause or permit to be placed or allow to remain within such building or its yards or offices at any one and the same time a quantity of any one or more of the volatile fluids specified in this bye-law greater in aggregate measure than one hundred and fifty gallons shall upon conviction of every such offence before any one or more justices of the peace having jurisdiction forfeit and pay a penalty of not more than Ten pounds nor less than Five pounds: Provided that no second or after prosecution for the placing or retaining of any one and the same quantity of such fluids contrary to the provisions hereof shall be commenced on the same day as the preceding complaint shall have been made.

III. Nothing herein contained shall apply to the storing of alcoholic spirits.
